19	A. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation	
20	Council standing committee and as such empowered the Naabik'íyáti' Committee to	
21	coordinate all requests for information, appearances and testimony relating to	
22	proposed county, state and federal legislation impacting the Navajo Nation. See 2	
23	N.N.C. §§ 700 (A), 701 (A)(6). See also CO-45-12.	
24	B. The Navajo Nation established the Health Education and Human Services Committee	
25	("HEHSC") as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered	
26	HEHSC to review and recommend resolutions relating to health within the Navajo	
27	Nation. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 400 et seq. See also CO-45-12.	
28	C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the State of	
29	Arizona.	
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- D. During the First Regular Session of 2019, Arizona State Senator Heather Carter introduced Senate Bill 1355 to the 54th Legislature. See Arizona SB 1355 attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- E. Arizona Senate Bill 1355 will require the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System ("AHCCCS") administration to seek federal authorization to reimburse the Indian Health Services and tribal facilities to cover the cost of eligible adult dental services. *Id. See also* Exhibit B.
- F. The Fort Defiance Indian Hospital Board Inc., Board of Directors supports the passage of SB 1355 and respectfully requests the Navajo Nation to support the passage of Arizona SB 1355. See Exhibit B.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby supports Arizona Senate Bill 1355 titled "AN ACT REQUIRING THE ARIZONA HEALTH CARE COST CONTAINMENT SYSTEM ADMINISTRATION TO SEEK FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION TO REIMBURSE INDIAN AND TRIBAL HEALTH PROVIDERS" attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby authorizes the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, President of the Navajo Nation, and their designees, to advocate the Navajo Nation's support of Arizona Senate Bill 1355.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona: Section 1. AHCCCS: federal authorization; adult dental services

The Arizona health care cost containment system administration shall 5 seek federal authorization to reimburse the Indian health services and 6 tribal facilities to cover the cost of adult dental services that are 7 eligible for a federal medical assistance percentage of one hundred percent and that are in excess of the limits prescribed in sections 9 36-2907 and 36-2939, Arizona Revised Statutes, and that are received 10 through these entities.

RESOLUTION OF THE FORT DEFIANCE INDIAN HOSPITAL BOARD, INC. (FDIHB) BOARD OF DIRECTORS

RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING THE NAVAJO NATION SUPPORT THE PASSAGE OF SENATE BILL 1355 (S.B. 1355) WITHIN THE STATE OF ARIZONA FIFTY-FOURTH LEGISLATURE

WHEREAS:

- The Fort Defiance Indian Hospital Board, Inc. (FDIHB and Corporation will be used interchangeably), was approved and certified by the Navajo Nation Business Regulatory Department, Division of Economic Development, on July 31, 1995; and
- FDIHB assumed operation and management of the Fort Defiance Indian Hospital, now called the Tséhootsooi Medical Center, Nahata'Dziil health center, and related health programs on March 28, 2010, pursuant to a self-determination contract authorized by the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, P.L. 93-638, as amended; and
- Pursuant to Article IV, Section 1 of the FDIHB Bylaws, the FDIHB Board of Directors (Board)
 is empowered to conduct, manage, and control the affairs and business of the Corporation; and
- 4. Pursuant to Article X, Section 2 the CEO carries out the decisions and instructions of, and administering the policies of, the Board in the day-to-day affairs of the Corporation . . . the CEO shall manage the FDIHB facilities on behalf of the Board; and the CEO is empowered to act in areas where no policy has yet been established and immediate action is required.
- Arizona State Senator Heather Carter sponsored S.B. 1355 titled: "An Act Requiring the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System Administration to seek Federal Authorization to Reimburse Indian and Tribal Health Providers." Attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- S.B. 1355 was first read on February 4, 2019 and has passed the Arizona State Senate on February 28, 2019 and was transmitted to the House of Representatives (House) on February 28, 2019.
- SB 1355 was first read at the House on March 5, 2019. The House then referred S.B. 1355 to the Health and Human Services Committee and the Rules Committee. SB 1355 second reading was on March 6, 2019. Bill Status Inquiry, is attached as Exhibit B.
- 8. S.B. 1355 purpose is to require the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) to seek federal authorization to reimburse the Indian Health Services (IHS) and tribal facilities to cover the cost of adult dental services. Fact Sheet for S.B. 1355 attached hereto as Exhibit C.
- 9. The Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAP) are published annually by the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services (U.S. Secretary of HHS) and used to determine the

amount of federal matching funds for state expenditures for assistance payments for certain social services and state medical insurance expenditures. The U.S. Secretary of HHS additionally prescribes an FMAP specifically for IHS and tribal facilities. The U.S. Social Security Act specifies that services provided to Medicaid-eligible patients at IHS and tribal facilities can be reimbursed at 100 percent of the FMAP (42 U.S.C. § 1905). See Exhibit C.

- 10. S.B. 1355 would require AHCCCS to seek federal authorization to reimburse IHS and tribal facilities for adult dental services at 100 percent of the cost through FMAP (42 U.S.C. § 1905), whereas currently tribal facilities are currently not receiving any reimbursement for adult dental services.
- 11. The Board finds it is in the best interest of the FDIHB to respectfully request the Navajo Nation to support the passage of Senate Bill 1355 within the State of Arizona Fifty-Fourth Legislature.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The FDIHB Board of Directors hereby respectfully request the Navajo Nation to support the passage of Senate Bill 1355 in the State of Arizona Fifty-Fourth Legislature. The FDIHB Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Board to advocate the Navajo Nation to support the passage of Senate Bill 1355 within the State of Arizona Fifty-Fourth Legislature.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
Section 1. AHCCCS: federal authorization: adult dental
services

The Arizona health care cost containment system administration shall seek federal authorization to reimburse the Indian health services and tribal facilities to cover the cost of adult dental services that are eligible for a federal medical assistance percentage of one hundred percent and that are in excess of the limits prescribed in sections 36-2907 and 36-2939, Arizona Revised Statutes, and that are received through these entities.

FACT SHEET FOR S.B. 1355

AHCCCS; dental services; native Americans

Purpose

Requires the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) to seek federal authorization to reimburse the Indian health services (IHS) and tribal facilities to cover the cost of adult dental services.

Background

AHCCCS, Arizona's Medicaid Program, contracts with health professionals to provide medically-necessary health and medical services to eligible members. Currently, AHCCCS contractors are required to provide: 1) inpatient hospital services; 2) outpatient health services; 3) laboratory and X-ray services; 4) prescription medications; 5) medical supplies, durable medical equipment, insulin pumps and prosthetic devices; 6) treatment of medical conditions of the eye; 7) early and periodic heath screening and diagnostic services; 8) family planning services; 9) podiatry services; 10) nonexperimental transplants; 11) up to \$1,000 annually for emergency dental care and extractions per adult member; 12) ambulance and nonambulance transportation; 13) hospice care; and 14) orthotics (A.R.S. § 36-2907).

AHCCCS offers long-term care services for persons who are elderly or disabled through the Arizona Long-term Care System (ALTCS). The ALTCS program provides acute care services, behavioral health services, institutional services, home and community-based services and case management services. ALTCS program contractors are required to provide dental services in an annual amount up to \$1,000 per ALTCS-eligible member (A.R.S. § 36-2939).

The Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAPs) are published annually by the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services (U.S. Secretary of HHS) and used to determine the amount of federal matching funds for state expenditures for assistance payments for certain social services and state medical insurance expenditures. The U.S. Secretary of HHS additionally prescribes an FMAP specifically for IHS and tribal facilities. The U.S. Social Security Act specifies that services provided to Medicaid-eligible patients at IHS and tribal facilities can be reimbursed at 100 percent of the FMAP (42 U.S.C. § 1905).

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the state General Fund associated with this legislation.


Provisions

- Requires AHCCCS to seek federal authorization to reimburse the IHS and tribal facilities to cover the cost of adult dental services that are:
 - a) eligible for 100 percent FMAP;

- b) in excess of the limits on covered services; and
- c) received through the IHS and tribal facilities.
- 2. Becomes effective on the general effective date.
