PROJECT

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 1005 (C)(10), action for Legislation CMA-15-16 is being submitted to the Navajo Nation Council, through the Office of the Speaker within the ten (10) day requirement. The Navajo Nation President is empowered with the authority to line-item veto legislations passed by the Navajo Nation Council and such authority is not subject to override by the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 164 (A)(17).

After review of Resolution No. CMA-15-16, Relating to Resource and Development Committee, Budget and Finance Committee and Naabik'íyáti' Committee and the Navajo Nation Council; Approving Supplemental Funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated fund balance in the amount of \$1,746,362.00 for Birdsprings Chapter Northwest Powerline Extension Project, I hereby exercise my line-item veto to:

- 1. Resolution CMA-15-16; Section 2. I line-item veto the supplemental appropriation amount of \$1,746,362.00
- 2. Exhibit "C"
 - a. Project Budget Summary, Part II, I line-item veto the Amount column and TOTAL of \$1,746,362

- b. Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary, Amount Requested, I lineitem veto \$1,746,362
- c. Program Budget Summary, Part II Amount column, I line-item veto the total \$1,746,362
- d. Part III. Budget Summary, Part III, 9000 Capital Outlay, I line-item veto the Proposed Budget Column \$1,746,362 and Differences column \$1,746,362; and I line-item veto the Total Proposed Budget Column \$1,746,362 and Differences Column \$1,746,362
- e. Detailed Line Item Budget and Justification Part II. Detailed Budget, Column C and Column D I line item veto \$1,746,362; and I line-item TOTAL Column C \$1,746,361 and Column D \$1,746,362

The justification to exercise my line-item veto are set forth below:

Infrastructure is one of the four pillars of this Administration, and we support infrastructure, such as powerlines, waterlines, etc. but as elected officials we must also be fiscally responsible to and for our constituents.

I attach three (3) letters, dated December 21, 2015, April 6, 2015 and April 29, 2016 from the Navajo Nation's Office of Management and Budget ("OMB"). Each letter outlines the issues, concerns, inconsistencies within the budget forms and the violations of the Navajo Nation Budget Instructions Manual ("BIM"). In fact, in an effort to save the funding for this project, the Office of the President and Vice-President ("OPVP") returned the Resolution to allow additional time for the budget forms to be corrected and brought into compliance with Navajo Nation law and policy. Unfortunately, when the Resolution was returned on April 21, 2016, the budget forms remained in violation of the BIM and without the required detailed budget and justifications for the funds did not allow for OPVP to save the project.

For instance, one major concern of OPVP is the project summary, Exhibit "E", submitted by the Chapter states the budget needed to complete the project for 38 homes was \$1,513,908. The Chapter was contributing \$10,000 and NTUA was contributing \$50,000. As such, the remaining budget needed for this project was \$1,453,908. The supplemental appropriation requested is \$1,746,362. This leaves \$292,454 beyond the budget to complete the project for the 38 homes. There is no rationale attached to this package to explain the need for the additional \$292,454. The Navajo Nation is facing a budget shortfall and there are many needs across the Navajo Nation for funds. As you are aware, there are a number of requests for supplemental appropriations and it is very important every dollar be accounted for. This is another reason detailed budgets and justifications are important, as we could have used the itemized budget to line-item veto the additional \$292,454.

In addition, this project is awaiting clearances. For example, the NTUA certifications for each home are dated back to 2005 as such the certifications will need to be redone. I have also been informed there are homes in the provided listing that are not project ready. I do not want to see our people's monies not being used for months or years while projects are awaiting clearances when there are many other projects across the Navajo Nation that are ready and simply awaiting funding, this is not the wisest way in using our people's funds. As stated above, we must be frugal in our spending.

Again, infrastructure is important to this Administration, but we must spend the people's monies correctly and conscientiously. There are reasons we have laws, policies, and the BIM to ensure we are not being careless with the people's monies. These violations were brought to the attention of the Navajo Nation Council in December, 2015 which is more than enough time to make the necessary corrections to the budget. However, I will direct the Division of Community Development to work with Birdsprings Chapter to re-submit this budget with corrected and updated forms and justifications as I support this project, but it must be done right.

As President of the Navajo Nation and us as elected officials, we hold fiduciary responsibility to the people in this capacity and I have no other option but to exercise my lineitem veto authority.

The Office of Management and Budget has reviewed the above referenced document. Upon review of the proposed supplemental funding proposal, OMB notes the following:

- 1. The attached copy of the Navajo Nation Capital Improvement Plan 2013-2018, which was approved by resolution CAP-18-14, does list Birdsprings Chapter as an approved project for power line extension in the amount of \$1,746,362.00. The Appropriations Act, Section 820 (I), addresses the Capital Budget requirements in the following language: "All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with an adopted Capital Improvement Plan and shall not be approved unless in compliance with the Plan."
- 2. The Birdsprings Chapter appears to be requesting \$1,746,362.00 from the UUFB for Power Line extension to the northwest portion of the chapter. The total cost shows \$1,763,362.00 on page 9 of the proposal with \$57,000.00 being contributed by NTUA and \$10,000.00 being contributed by the Chapter. If these other fund contributions are correct, the total cost should be \$1,696,362.00 instead of \$1,746,362.00. Throughout the documentation, various amounts for the cost of the project are shown but it is not clear what the actual cost is. NTUA, by its latest letter dated 9/23/13 does not show a cost estimate. NTUA estimates further show cost at less than \$1.6 billion as the total cost.
- 3. The Office of the Controller says the UUFB has an amount of \$14,400,000 available. OMB recently compiled the Fiscal Year 2015 unmet needs list which was submitted by the oversight committees but Birdsprings Chapter is not on the list. There are over a \$100,000,000 in unmet needs requests which need to be considered for funding from the UUFB or other sources. These unmet needs should be considered before other requests.
- According to Resolution No: TT-07-003-15, the Tsidi To'ii Chapter has committed \$100,000.00 to the project. However, the chapter states that it is only contributing \$10,000.00. Other chapter documents show their contribution anywhere from \$10,000 to \$180,000.



- 5. The Capital Project Budget Summary in Part II. Appropriation End Date shows 10/1/2015-9/30/15 which appears to be incorrect. And the Appropriate End Date in Part II does not agree with the end date in Part IV. Project Information. In addition to the same form, Part IV. Budget at LOD 4 and the Amount(s) as well as the Total are all blank. These spaces should be completed with the appropriate information.
- 6. On the Navajo Nation Detailed Line Item Budget and Justification page, the top left Fiscal Year needs to be filled in with FY16 as well as all other forms with blank Fiscal Year(s) spaces.
- 7. The appropriate budget forms for capital projects need to be used. This includes the Project Budget Summary, Capital Project Budget Schedule, and the Detailed Line Item Budget and Justification. The other budget forms are for operating budget requests, not capital projects budget requests.

- 1. The Navajo Nation Capital Improvement Plan 2013-2018 (CAP-18-14), includes Birdsprings Chapter as an approved project for power line extension. The Appropriations Act, Section 820 (I), the Capital Budget states: "All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with an adopted Capital Improvement Plan and shall not be approved unless in compliance with the Plan."
- 2. In Exhibit E, page 9, Birdsprings Chapter funding total cost shows \$1,763,362.00 for but the attached documentation indicates the Chapter, NTUA and CIP as sources to provide funding for this project but the difference is \$50,000.00 when all three funding sources are added together.
- 3. The budget forms are currently lacking the appropriate signatures and some project forms are incomplete as submitted. The budget forms are all not signed are not signed by the appropriate Division Director or Branch Chief. In Exhibit B, the supplemental funding proposal summary does not have the Branch Chief's signature or date. The proposed program budget summary also does not have the appropriate signature, the correct fiscal year and the term of the project. We are currently in FY 16 so the dates should reflect 10/1/15-9/30/16 for the current fiscal year.
- 4. Some of the budget forms are incomplete without proper <u>object codes</u> such that OMB cannot determine where the approved funds will be entered within FMIS as found within the FY 16 Navajo Nation Budget Instructions Manual (BIM) used by OMB and OOC with FMIS. The correct object code should be 9020 Infrastructure under Capital Outlay at a level of detail 6 per the approved Chart of Accounts provided in the FY 16 BIM. Also to further detail the budget, the correct object code at a level of detail 7 is 9020 Powerlines.

- 5. In Exhibit C, the Project Budget Summary, Part III, Budget at LOD 4, does not indicate any amounts or which object codes are to be budgeted.
- 6. In Exhibit C, the Project Budget Summary, Part IV, Project Information, does not indicate the project type or the project manager.
- 7. Many of the above findings were already indicated in OMB's memo dated December 21, 2015 and still were not corrected as of today.

The Office of Management and Budget has reviewed the above referenced document for action by the President and provides the following:

- 1. Although the resolution was received by OPVP on 4/21/16, OMB did not receive a copy for review until 4/28/16; seven (7) days have already run.
- 2. The current available UUFB (Undesignated, Unreserved Fund Balance) is \$13,175,943. The appropriation, if approved herein, will reduce the balance to \$11,429,581.
- Many of the findings indicated below were already indicated in OMB's memo dated December 21, 2015 and still were not corrected as the document went through the legislative review and approval process.
- 4. The budget forms are currently lacking the appropriate signatures and some project forms are incomplete as submitted. The budget forms are not signed by the appropriate Division Director or Branch Chief.
- 5. Pursuant to the FY 16 BIM (Budget Instructions Manual), pages 19-29, Section XIV, Budget Forms and Instructions; Appendix J, Project Budget Forms and Instructions, pages 71-77; and Appendix K, Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary, pages 78 and 79, requires the following information which is lacking in this proposed legislation:
 - a. Exhibit "C" Project Budget Summary Form, Part II, the indicated dates are from FY 2015 and should be for the current fiscal year 2016 which is 10/1/15-9/30/16.
 - b. Exhibit "C" Project Budget Summary Form, Part II, is incomplete. Project Funds/Source does not include all fund sources, appropriation end dates and amounts.
 - c. Exhibit "C"— Project Budget Summary Form, Part III, is also incomplete. There are no budget amounts for object codes at a LOD 4.
 - d. Exhibit "C" Project Budget Summary Form, Part IV, does not indicate a project type or project manager.

- a. Exhibit "C" No Project Justification forms are included in the legislation.
- b. Exhibit "C"— The Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary does not have the appropriate Branch Chiefs signature per FY 2016 BIM XI.B.2.a, page 11.
- c. Exhibit "C" Program Budget Summary, Budget Form 1, Part II, does not identify all funding sources.
- d. Exhibit "C" Program Budget Summary, Budget Form 1, Part III, does not identify the fund type code as listed in the FY 2016 BIM, Appendix B, Fund Types Codes, page 44.
- e. Exhibit "C" Program Budget Summary, Budget Form 1, Part V, does not identify the appropriate program manager per FY 2016 2016 BIM XI.B.2.a, page 11.
- 6. Some of the budget forms are incomplete without proper <u>object codes</u> such that OMB cannot determine where the approved funds will be entered within FMIS as found within the FY 16 Navajo Nation Budget Instructions Manual (BIM) used by OMB and OOC with FMIS. The correct object code should be 9020 Infrastructure under Capital Outlay at a level of detail 6 per the approved Chart of Accounts provided in the FY 2016 BIM, Appendix A, pages 34-43. Also to further detail the budget, the correct object code at a level of detail 7 is 9040 Powerlines.
 - f. Exhibit "C" Detailed Line Item Budget and Justification, Budget Form 4, Part II
 (A) does not have a Level of Detail (LOD) 6.
 - g. Exhibit "C" Detailed Line Item Budget and Justification, Budget Form 4, Part II (B). There are no object codes at the LOD 4 or 7. OMB can't determine where funds should be entered into FMIS.
- 7. In Exhibit "E", page 9, Birdsprings Chapter funding total cost shows \$1,763,362.00 for but the attached documentation indicates the Chapter, NTUA and CIP as sources to provide funding for this project but the difference is \$50,000.00 when all three funding sources are added together which amounts to \$1,813,362.00.

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS

- A. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)."
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), a proposed resolution that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee before it is heard by the Navajo Nation Council.
- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C)(1)(3) and (4) the Budget and Finance Committee is authorized to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the Nation's financial resources.
- D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (C)(1), the Resources and Development Committee is the oversight committee for the Chapters and the Division of Community Development, Capital Improvement Office.

- E. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. On December 21, 2015, the Office of Management and Budget presented its memorandum with regard to this supplemental request for appropriation. The memorandum is attached as Exhibit A.
 - Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council. The attached memorandum, Exhibit B, dated December 30, 2015 from the Office of the Controller has identified the additional revenues.
- F. The purpose of this request is to fund a powerline extension to serve homes in the Northwest Birdsprings community. The Navajo Nation Budget Forms are attached as Exhibit C. Resolution of Tsidi To'ii Chapter No. 02-004-14 requesting an allocation of \$1,746,362 for the Northwest Tsidi To'ii Community Powerline Project is attached as Exhibit D.
- G. The North Tsidi To'ii Power Line Extension Project Plan submitted by Tsidi To'ii Chapter Community Planner is attached as **Exhibit E**. Various Navajo Tribal Utility Authority communications regarding a powerline extension are attached as **Exhibit F**. Various Tsidi To'ii Chapter resolutions and communications with the Navajo Nation Division of Community Development are attached as **Exhibit G**.
- H. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest to approve Supplemental Appropriation for the Birdsprings Chapter Northwest Powerline Extension Project.

SECTION 2. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,746,362.00 FOR THE BIRDSPRINGS CHAPTER NORTHWEST POWERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT

- A. The Navajo Nation Council, having received certification by the Office of the Controller of the availability of certain funds from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) for supplemental appropriation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation of \$1,746,362.00 for the Birdsprings Chapter Northwest Powerline Extension Project as further described in budget documents attached as Exhibit C upon leveraging to this appropriation by NTUA.







REQUESTING THE CAPITOL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT (CIP) TO ALLOCATE \$1,746,362.00 FOR THE NORTHWEST TSIDI TO'II COMMUNITY POWERLINE PROJECT.

WHERE AS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A) the Tsidi To'ii Chapter is a duly recognized certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Part 1, Section 10, and;
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (B) Tsidi To'ii chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction when necessary and make recommendation to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate actions, and;
- 3. The Tsidi To'ii Chapter is a governance-certified Chapter and political sub-division of the Navajo Nation Government, and;
- 4. Approximately 38 homes are located on the north side of N15, which is adjacent to the Tsidi To'ii Chapter and are in need of electrical power, and;
- 5. All 38 homes are wired and ready to receive power, all compliance certificates are files with NTUA, and;
- 6. Some residents are afflicted with health disparities and require refrigeration for medicines prescribed by doctors, to minimize these disparities, electrical power is needed, and;
- 7. Students are in need of power for homework and adequate lighting is essential to help them achieve their educational goals, and;
- 8. Tsidi To'ii chapter has allocated funds for leveraging the construction costs of the power line project, and;
- 9. Clearances including Archeological, Environmental Assessment and legal survey for Right-Of-Way (ROW) acquisition will be completed by Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) before commencement of the power line project.



NOW, THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Tsidi To'ii Chapter respectfully requests CIP to approve funds in the amount of \$1,746,362.00 to be utilized for construction of power line, which will serve 38 homes in the North Tsidi To'ii community.

Phase II of the project begins approximately 1800 ft. north of the Chapter house and extends for 11.67 miles north and west (see attached topo map).

NORTH TSIDI TO'II POWER LINE EXTENSION PROJECT

SUMMARY:

The Tsidi To'ii Chapter is working with Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA), the Capitol Improvement Project (CIP) Department and the residents of the North Tsidi To'ii community to make this project a reality. The project will extend 25.65 miles and will serve 38 homes (Exhibit D under Tab 5).

Phase I of the project will commence approximately 5 miles east of the Tsidi To'ii Chapter house and will run for 13.98 miles to the east, north and west. Phase II of the proposed project will begin approximately 1800 ft. north of the Tsidi To'ii Chapter house and will extend for 11.67 miles north and west (Exhibit G under Tab 8).

Tsidi To'ii Chapter received and estimated cost of \$1,746,362 The construction of the power line extension project, of which Tsidi To'ii Chapter committed \$10,000 to defray costs of environmental clearances and NTUA committed a contribution of \$57,000. Clearances include archeological survey, environmental assessment, and legal survey for acquisition of Right-of-Way (Exhibit C under Tab 4). All 38 homes are wired and ready to receive power, the house wiring compliance certificate are attached (Exhibit F under Tab 7) and are filed with NTUA.

Upon completion of the project the residents will have power available to them to help meet their critical needs such as refrigeration for perishable food items and medical supplies; students will have adequate lighting for homework; families will enjoy air conditioning in the summer time; and heating in the winter time. Electrical power will help enhance the lives of the Tsidi To'ii community people.

The Chapter Officials and Administration will work with local community people, NTUA, and CIP Department to complete the project successfully.

INTRODUCTION:

Profile of Tsidi To'ii Chapter: Tsidi To'ii Chapter, formerly known as "Birdsprings
Chapter" was officially established on December 05, 1955. The chapter is part of District
V and is located within the southwest corner of the Navajo Nation approximately 60
miles east of Flagstaff Arizona and 20 miles north of Winslow Arizona. The 2010 census
shows the chapter population is 795 and 221 housing units; of the 221 housing units, 38
are located to the North of BIA route N15. The chapter land base is divided by the Little

Colorado River (LCR), which flows in a northwesterly direction; to the east of LCR is lives Mesa, which overlooks the multi-colored landscape covered with sparse vegetation; and to the west is the majestic Navajo sacred mountain, the San Francisco Peaks.

Most of the residents depend on work to sustain themselves and their families, while others are self employed, retired or receive assistance such as Social Security Income (SSI) or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF). Those employed travel to Flagstaff, Winslow, Leupp, Dilcon or Little Singer School on a daily basis. Employment is scarce in the community, however a new elderly group home has been built, which will bring some employment to our community.

The Tsidi To'ii Chapter coordinates efforts with Behavioral Health Office, Community Health Representative, Navajo County Board of Supervisor, Coconino County Board of Supervisor, the Leupp Fire Department, Leupp Health Clinic, Navajo Nation Police Department, and Elder Center in serving the needs of the local residents. In the event of emergencies, these are the people that assist the chapter to address the issues.

- History and Background of Planned Project: North Tsidi To'ii has 38 households that are in need of electric power; of the 38 households, 5 are veteran households. The chapter has been soliciting for funds in the form of grant proposals to CDBG and CIP programs since the 1990s. Some of the residents have passed on while waiting for electricity, while others have returned home from living in the cities and some moved to the area. The chapter administration assisted the residents to get their house wiring completed in 2006, and certificates of compliance have been filed with NTUA. In 2010 another proposal was submitted; initially CDBG informed the chapter, they've been funded; the chapter later found out they were not funded due to the leveraging funds being reallocated for another project at the chapter level. Another proposal was submitted in December 2012 but that didn't get funded. The community of Tsidi To'ii is hopeful they will receive power before too long.
- Primary Intent and Outcome of Project: The chapter advocates on behalf of its community to get much needed electric power to those without power. Some residents have photo voltaic systems but these systems are primarily used for lighting and refrigeration; it can't provide enough power to make coffee or to use cooking appliances, or to use hair dryers or operate a cistern system; further, the solar systems cannot produce power under cloudy conditions; so the residents have to ration the amount of power they use on lighting and refrigeration only. Some residents have doctors' referral indicating they need indoor plumbing but in order to obtain cistern systems for their needs, they need adequate power supply which the solar systems cannot provide. In the winter time, some still go outside to take care of their toilet

needs, which increases a potential for a fall and break a bone or two; some of these individuals are in wheelchairs or on crutches, which make it difficult to get to the outhouses. Electric power would reduce these health risks.

Administrative Capacity of the Chapter: The chapter is operated by the chapter
administration with three chapter officials and local grazing official serving as oversight.
The chapter administration is comprised of a community planner that will work directly
with the NTUA in the construction of the power line, the chapter manager and
accountant will assist in working with the local residents and the accounting portion of
the project.

Rosita A. Kelly, Community Planner, possesses a civil engineering degree with environmental emphasis and has extensive experience in management of Human Resources and construction projects. Further, she is knowledgeable in policy analysis and writing. She has the necessary skills in working with people to get projects completed in timely manner (Exhibit I under Tab 10).

Eileen Hardy, Chapter Manager, has many years of experience in management and accounting. She has managed or had oversight of projects such as FEMA projects, electric power extension, house wiring, livestock water line, domestic water line, solar projects, and the development of a new senior center and group home. She also knows the Navajo Nation government system (Exhibit I under Tab 10).

Gloria Curtis, Accountant, has many years of experience in management of chapter accounts. She handles payroll and keeps tracks of funds in each accounts. Gloria is competent in keeping track of receipts and cancelled checks in the event a grant is a cost reimbursement type. She is very savvy in MIP accounting software (Exhibit I under Tab 10).

• Previous Project Management Experience: Projects completed under the guidance of the chapter leadership and administration include house wiring project in the community (over 50 homes received wiring to receive electricity), Photo Voltaic installation for 45 homes, Construction of a new senior citizen center and a new elderly group home facility, a hogan was built for traditional practitioners for those community members that need healing ceremony, and Horseman Park was developed for agricultural activities and to provide training for the community in livestock management. These are successful projects completed under the current administration and leadership. Construction of domestic and livestock water line extension is on-going, as well as development of and providing broadband capabilities to the community through working with NTUA.

Additionally the community planner managed Leupp Schools, Inc. housing project, assisted with the new school construction, 7 miles of road improvement project in

Leupp area, design of a 13-mile livestock water line from Leupp to Tolani Lake, assisted in creating Corrective Action Plans (CAP) for Leupp Schools, Inc. for findings of their financial audits, and worked to get the new elderly group home incorporated under the Navajo Nation.

- Status of the Chapter's Management: Chapter Leadership include: Rosie Larson, Chapter President, Isabelle Walker, Chapter Vice President, and Verna Yazzie, Chapter Secretary/Treasurer. The leadership is very competent and will provide oversight and guidance to the chapter staff. Tsidi To'ii Chapter is managed by a Chapter Manager since the chapter obtained it local governance certification in July of 2011. The Accountant is very competent in coordinating efforts with the Manager and Chapter Officials in controlling the fiscal activity of the chapter. The Community Planner is responsible for working on projects that are assigned by the chapter officials.
- Tsidi To'ii Chapter's Land Use Plan: The chapter's community-based land use planning document has been certified in May 2005. The Land Use Planning Committee is very active in their role as agents of the land use in the community. They are working on revising their master plan of the community. They also work closely with the Community Planner, Chapter Officials, and Grazing Official for proposed developments in the community. The following are proposed developments: New veterans' center, Multipurpose building, Fire station, Police sub-station, Pre-school, addition to the current elderly group home, housing, and a master water development to provide adequate water supply to these developments. Additionally, they have completed locating homes of residents in the Tsidi' To'ii community by GPS units and are nearly completed with the E911 plan in creating roads names. The community members have recently voted in new members of the planning committee.
- The Chapter's Capitol Plan: The chapter's capitol plan is outlined on the WIN System of under the Division of Community Development Program. The priority list is identified as follows: 1. North Power line project, 2. North side waterline extension/bathroom additions, 3. Multi-purpose building, 4. Sewer lagoon addition, and 5. New chapter house. In order to have the chapter's endeavors realized, funds need to be approved to make the number one priority project come to fruition.

NEEDS AND GOALS OF THE PROJECT:

Justification of Need and Extent of Project: The health and well being of community people within the Tsidi To'ii community is held in high regard. There are lots of young parents whose children attend the local schools, i.e. Little Singer Grant/Charter School, Leupp Schools, Inc., Leupp Public School and Winslow Unified School District. Some of the elders care for their grandchildren who attend these local schools. Electrical power is greatly needed and is crucial to the well being and development of these children. In addition, residents purchase perishable foods in scarce amounts due to lack of

refrigeration, often times perishable foods are bought and prepared the same day. Some of the residents are afflicted with health disparities and need refrigeration for their medicines. Having electrical power would certainly enhance the lives of the residents and alleviate some of these problems.

- Number of Homes to be Served: There are 38 homes that are in need of power and all the homes have adequate house wiring completed with compliance certificates filed with NTUA; of these households 24% are in the median range income level and 76% are low income. The income levels were compared to the HUD FY 2012 Income Limits Documentation System for Navajo County and Coconino Counties; however, Navajo County data was used for comparison because most of the intended recipients live in Navajo County (Exhibits D & E under Tabs 5 & 6).
- How the Intended Recipients Were Identified: The intended recipients were identified by location of their homes which is on the north side of BIA route N15, these people have been requesting through chapter resolutions for power line extension. The Navajo Nation CDBG Income Survey form was used to obtain information to complete Form B. Information was gathered through home visits and having coordination meetings with the people at the chapter house.
- Impact and Benefits of the Project: The community residents i.e. students, grandparents, and parents will greatly benefit from this project. The convenience and luxury of having electric power will impact the community in a positive manner, i.e.:
 - 1. Provide proper and adequate refrigeration of food and medication, thus eliminating excessive trips to border town to purchase food. Medicines will meet their shelf life and provide healthier lives for the residents on medication.
 - The level of academic achievement will increase insurmountably with the use of technologically advanced equipment and other instructional media. Most importantly, sufficient lighting will be available for reading, studying and completing assignments.
 - 3. Heating units and cooling systems will be an option in providing comfort during variations of extreme weather temperatures due to climate changes. This will decrease the likelihood of experiencing bouts of heat exhaustion and heat stroke, and in the winter, heat can be instantaneous.
 - 4. Having electricity will assist the residents in higher standards of living in that they will be able to buy perishable or fresh foods, the medicines will meet their shelf life, and more importantly, at the flip of a switch, the children will have adequate lighting for school work, no more kerosene lamps!

• How the Project Will Meet Community Objectives: With successful and timely completion of this project, the Tsidi To'ii Chapter will have demonstrated their ability to work with various agencies in meeting their community prioritized needs. The Chapter will pursue other community projects such domestic waterline extensions, bathroom additions, housing, road improvement projects, and completion of power extension to the southeast side of the Chapter; the last area that will still need electric power, multipurpose building, sewer lagoon addition, and new chapter house. Currently, the community is working on all these projects simultaneously but keeping in mind the priority list the community members approved through resolution. To jumpstart these projects and to meet community needs, the Tsidi To'ii Chapter respectfully requests CIP to approve funds in the amount of \$1,460,931.88. The attached supporting resolutions (Exhibit H under Tab 9) show the community is in support of these efforts and with proper guidance and direction, the project will be completed within 2 years.

SCOPE OF WORK:

- The Role of Key Contributors: The Tsidi To'ii Chapter Administration and Chapter
 Officials will be the primary coordinators of the proposed project. The Chapter will
 provide monitoring and periodic reports as requested by the grantor (CIP). NTUA will
 design and construct the project; they are also responsible for the clearances, which
 include archeological clearance, environmental assessment, and legal survey for the
 Right-of-Way acquisition.
- Project Description and Summary: Phase I of the proposed power line project begins approximately 5 miles east of the Tsidi To'ii Chapter house and extends for 13.98 east and north and west. Phase II of the proposed project begins approximately 1800 ft. north of the chapter house and extends for 11.67 miles north and west (Exhibit G under Tab 8).
- Alternative Methods Considered: The Tsidi To'ii requested the NTUA to conduct a feasibility study of the project. The study indicated there are enough residents that live within one mile of each other to consider the project feasible.
- Operation and Maintenance: Upon completion of the project, NTUA will maintain and operate the power line (Exhibit A under Tab 2).
- Environmental Clearances: The NTUA will be responsible in completing the
 environmental clearances of the project as well as identification of the Right-of-Way
 (ROW); the Chapter has inquired about using other vendors to complete the
 Environmental Assessment (EA) but NTUA explained that is not viable due to possible

changes to the design of the project; NTUA further explained that only their engineers know the most feasible routes of the project therefore, if another vendor completes the EA, they may not be parallel to the engineers' design. The residents are aware that the established ROW of the project will be NTUA's ROW and will be considered easements for any repairs or upgrades to the power line. The same holds true at each individual home. The Chapter has earmarked some funds to help alleviate some of the expense to complete the clearances (Exhibit B under Tab 3).

- House Wiring: The Chapter allocated funds in 2006 for all the homes on the north side
 of Tsidi To'ii to meet wiring specifications from NTUA. As of 2006 all homes have been
 wired and are ready to receive power; compliance certificates are filed with NTUA
 (Exhibit F under Tab 7).
- Major Contributors in Planning the Project: The Chapter coordinated with NTUA and the residents to plan the project. NTUA personnel assisted with the budget formulation and designed the project.



Capital Improvement Vision, Trends, Goals and Project Priority Process

Vision

Birdsprings Chapter foresees a positive future for the community in respect to visioning upgraded resources facilities and expansions along with adequate roads and parking. We also foresee community facilities that will provide intergenerational activities in preserving the culture and traditions of Navajo families. In the first year of our Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan, we are planning to prepare Six-Year Community Plan and we plan to try to obtain funding for equipment. Our equipment needs includes a truck, computer equipment, and GPS equipment. New equipment will add to our insurance, fuel, and equipment repair costs, but those additions costs will be partially offset by a reduction in equipment rental costs and labor costs.

Trends

The Birdsprings Chapter is located in a rural area of the Navajo Nation approximately 15 miles of Leupp, Arizona and about 20 miles north of Winslow, Arizona. The Birdsprings Chapter was certified by the Navajo Tribal Council on December 5, 1955 and is funded largely by Navajo Nation and Federal funds from Bureau of Indian Affairs and Indian Health Services. The Birdsprings chapter serves a population of approximately 800 people.

The Chapter was destroyed by a fire in March, 1995 and rebuilt in 1998, into a 120 feet monolithic concrete dome located by Navajo Housing Authority and N-15. The building has been constructed with Navajo Nation funding. Water Projects in the chapter area are general funded by the Federal Government (Indian Health Service). Population growth has been a trend that has always been a real challenge for us, and we expect that to continue to increase. The growth we have already experienced combined with the barely adequate Chapter facilities have resulted needing to seek funding outside of the Navajo Nation, the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and the Indian Health Service (IHS). The Chapter is working towards achieving Local Governance Act (LGA) Certification with the Navajo Nation which would allow the Chapter agrees to a limited and to seek funding from other sources than those listed above. The tax funds are limited to taxes paid from local business located within the Chapter Boundaries.

Another trend that concerns us is increasing regulation from all levels of government. At the Tribal level, that means additional costs in our projects for right-of-way permit and planning & zoning permits, variances, and reviews. The Highway Department now requires costly surveys and mapping of any work done in their rights-of-way, including tap-ins into existing mains. At the state and especially federal level we are closely watching the new EPA regulations.

Goals

Birdsprings Chapter with energy and euthusiasm we constitute to serve conscientously, our community and citizens in a changing world as we continue into the second cent in flowiding public service that are most effective and efficient in the delivery of services. Through the partners with the citizens of our community, Birdsprings Chapter is committed to protecting the Dine cultural values held by the community, while also responding to the challenges and opportunities of our future and way of life.

Project Priority Process

Birdsprings Chapter has been faced with population growth in the past five years within our chapter boundaries, our Chapter Officials and Staff has developed a list of needed improvements to our community. We prioritized the list based on our most criticalcommunity needs and other factors such as the age, condition, and adequacy of current infrastructure. We then consulted with various Navajo Nation and Federal entities which are associated with projects to refine our prioritized needs list and put in the dollars amounts needed, and then we planned for projects over the next six years in our ICIP.

Tsidi Toii (aka Birdsprings) Chapter in coordination with its community and possible funding agencies (NTUA, CDBG, CIO, and in-kind services from local residents) are attempting to construct a 25.65-mile electrical power line. The small community of Tsid Toii is located within the southwest corner of the Navajo Nation; lying adjacent to the Little Colorado River, approximately 60 miles east of Flagstaff Arizona and 20 miles north of Winslow Arizona. To the north, 38 households have been patiently waiting to receive electric power for more than 50 years. Of these households, 5 are veteran households. If funded, Tsidi Toii Chapter and its community will be successful in bringing power to their people within the next two to three years.

* * *ement of Need:

The health and well being of community people within the Birdsprings community is held in high regard. There are lots of young parents whose children attend the local schools, i.e. Little Singer Grant/Charter School, Leupp Schools, Inc., Leupp Public School and Winslow Unified School District. Some of the elders care for their grandchildren who attend these local schools. Electrical power is greatly needed and is crucial to the well being and development of these children. Currently, the residents purchase perishable foods in scarce amounts due to lack of refrigeration, often times perishable foods are bought and prepared the same day. Some of the residents are afflicted with health disparities and need refrigeration for their medicines. Having electrical power would alleviate some of these problems.





WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A), the Tsidi To'ii Chapter is a duly recognized chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., Part 1, Section 10, and
- 2. The Tsidi To'ii Chapter is a certified chapter government of the Navajo Nation in accordance with the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act, 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (B); thereby, vested with the authority to protect and promote the general health, safety, and welfare of the Chapter membership and make decisions and to govern with responsibility and accountability to the local citizens; and
- 3. The Tsidi To'ii Chapter has been advocating for over 20 years for electrical services to 38 homes located north of BIA Route N15, of which half are elderly, five (5) are veterans, young families, referrals from doctors or socials services for electrical services, and students (elementary, grade school, high school and college students); many families of various socioeconomic backgrounds reside in that region of the community; and
- 4. In 2006, the Chapter provided all 38 homes with electrical wiring and each home was certified, in anticipation that the project would be funded that year; however the project was not funded; and

The need for a power line in this region is paramount; many families have children attending school who have homework, our elderlies are getting older and they need adequate lighting in their homes, families are still utilizing wood burning stoves to warm their homes, refrigeration is much needed to keep perishable food items, as well as medication; and

The Navajo Nation Department of Justice (DOJ) has reviewed the above-mentioned document and deems the document to be "insufficient." As you know, all supplement requests must be made consistent with the Budget Instruction Manual (BIM) Section XI(E), and Appropriation Act, 12 N.N.C. § 800 et. seq. Section XI(E) of BIM requires that all supplemental requests for capital projects are submitted to the Capital Improvement Office (CIO) for proper review pursuant to the Established Capital Plan and Budget Policies and Procedures.

As noted above, the supplemental request has to be in compliance with (1) Capital Plan; and (2) Budget Policies and Procedures. In practice, the Capital Plan has been the and Community Development (TCDC) Objective Transportation Criteria, Resolution No. TCDCJY-77-99. The TCDC Objective Criteria outlines the process to develop a Capital Plan, the required documents that need to be submitted and the duties of various entities that assist in the development and review of the Capital Plan. Additionally, the BIM is the budget policy and procedure handbook, and all budgets must be in compliance with the BIM requirements.

In reviewing the documents, it appears that the budgets are not correct as provided by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). In a memorandum dated December 21, 2015, OMB noted that the budget was not complete and noted other deficiencies. There is no indication that CIO addressed OMB's concerns other than the fact that there is white out on the budget forms. Because it is not clear whether OMB's issues have been correctly addressed, the supplemental request has yet to be in compliance with the BIM.

TCDC Objective Criteria-Capital Plan:

Section XV(F) of the TCDC Objective Criteria outlines the required documents necessary for powerline extensions. One of those required documents are the required clearances such as archeological, environmental assessment and land user consent. In fact, most of the required documents for all Capital Projects require the aforementioned documents, which indicate that the Capital Projects are only the project itself and does not include any clearances. In reviewing a letter dated September 23, 2013 from Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) (there is only a Page three to such letter and appears to be consistent with the memorandums drafted by NTUA), NTUA includes in its budget an amount of \$158,681.25 for archeological clearance, environmental assessment and legal survey. It is not clear whether the Chapter is using the above-mentioned estimate as basis for its supplemental request.

Additionally, it is CIO's responsibility to obtain those clearances as required by Section XV(F)(7). Until the above-mentioned is clarified, it appears that that this supplemental request is not consistent with the TCDC Objective Criteria. If the Chapter is in fact using NTUA's estimate as a basis, it is recommended that CIO work with the Chapter to identify the amount only for the powerline extensions and not any clearances. Once that amount is correctly identified, CIO and the Chapter should be able to resubmit this supplemental request.
