## BE IT ENACTED:

## Section One. Authority

A. The Law and order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §600(A).
B. The Law and Order Committee serves as the oversight committee for the Division of Public safety. 2 N.N.C. §601(C) (1).
C. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 300 (A).
D. The Budget and Finance Committee has the oversight authority to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the Nation's financial resources. 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C) (1) and (4).

Section Two. Findings
A. On September 8, 2014 the Law and Order Committee and the Budget and Finance Committee approved the Navajo Department of Public safety Fund Management Plan relative to Navajo Department of Public Safety providing services at Navajo gaming facilities to protect the Navajo Gaming Enterprise, its guests, employees and assets. See Exhibit A, BFCS-22-14.
B. The Memorandum of Agreement approved in BFCS-22-14 states that the Navajo Department of Public Safety shall provide law enforcement presence at the Casino facilities operated by the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise, including the Fire Rock Navajo Casino, Flowing Water Navajo Casino, Northern Edge Navajo Casino and Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort. See Memorandum of Agreement, dated January 2013 attached to BFCS-22-14.
C. The Memorandum of Agreement, approved in BFCS-22-14, states that the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise will compensate the Navajo Department of Public Safety, for providing law enforcement presence at Fire Rock Navajo Casino, Flowing Water Navajo Casino, and Northern Edge Navajo Casino, with a total monthly payment of $\$ 36,000$ with an aggregate amount over a one-year period to equal $\$ 432,000$; and the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise will compensate the Navajo Department of Public Safety, for providing law enforcement presence to Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort, with a total monthly installment of $\$ 25,000$ and the total amount over a one-year period to equal $\$ 300,000$. The compensation paid by the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise to the Navajo Department of Public Safety is pursuant to the fund management plan with deposits made to the Office of the Controller. See Memorandum of Agreement, dated January 2013 attached to BFCS-22-14.
D. The Fund Management Plan, amended in BFCS-22-14, states the Navajo Department of Public Safety will use the funds generated to support the operation needs of Navajo Department of Public Safety officers and the Department of Corrections, including using the fund for personnel related expenses for overtime, training, lodging, meals, travel, equipment, supplies and awards; in addition the funds will be used to purchase new patrol vehicles and for associated expenses, including fees, insurance and repair work. See Fund Management Plan attached to BFCS-22-14.
E. The Fund Management Plan amended in BFCS-22-14, states the Navajo Department of Public Safety Division Director, in a manner prescribed by Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule and regulation, shall prepare an annual budget for the fund and that the budget will be reviewed and approved by the appropriate offices and authorities. See Fund Management Plan attached to BFCS-22-14. Department of Public Safety - Special Revenue Gaming Budget forms attached as Exhibit B.
F. The Office of the Controller verifies the unaudited balance of the DPS-Special Gaming Fund is $\$ 1,631,269$. See Memorandum of the Office of the Controller, dated July 14, 2016, attached as Exhibit C.
G. The Office of Management and Budget has reviewed the budget request and raised concerns; the Navajo Division of Public Safety addressed the concerns. See Memorandum of the Office of Management and Budget and Response Memorandum of the Division of Public Safety, dated June 28, 2016 and September 12, 2016 respectively, attached as Exhibit D-1 and D-2.

## Section Three. Approval

A. The Navajo Nation, having received certification by the Office of the Controller of the availability of certain funds, hereby approves the Department of Public Safety - Special Revenue Gaming Budget for Fiscal Year 2017 at $\$ 1,631,269$ as found in Exhibit B.
B. The appropriation of $\$ 1,631,269$ shall be to the Division of Public Safety, Business Unit Number 507010, as identified in Exhibit B.

## RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER AND BUDGET AND FINANCE; APPROVING THE AMENDED NAVAJO DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN

BE IT ENACTED:
Section One. Findings and Purpose

1. On April 23, 2013, the Law and Order Committee approved the 2012 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise (NNGE) and the Navajo Division of Public Safety (NDPS), BFMY-15-13.
2. Also, on April 23, 2013, the Law and Order Committee approved the NPDS Fund Management Plan with an amendment that fund expenditures include the Department of Corrections personnel, BFMY-15-13.
3. On May 7, 2013, the Budget and Finance Committee approved both the MOA and NPDS Fund Management Plan with the Law and Order Committee's amendments, BFMY-15-13.
4. In January 2013, the NNGE and NDPS amended the MOA to include NDPS services at Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort and increased the termination notice from ninety (90) days to one hundred twenty (120) days, EXHIBIT B.
5. Additionally, the NDPS amended the Fund Management Plan to include the Law and order Committee's 2013 amendments, fund expenditures include the Department of Corrections personnel, EXHIBIT C.
6. The NDPS amended Fund Management Plan also requires the Navajo Nation Controller's Office to establish a new fund, "special revenue", separate from the NDPS Administration General Fund Account \#ll6018, EXHIBIT C.
7. The "special revenue" fund "is used to account for general government financial resources that are restricted by law or contractual agreement to specific purposes other than debt service or major capital projects." EXHIBIT A, Controller's Memorandum.

Section Two: NDPS Fund Management Plan.

1. The Navajo Nation, having received certification by the Office of Management and Budget, Office of the Controller, and Office of the Attorney General, EXHIBIT A, hereby approves the NDPS amended Fund Management Plan.
2. The Navajo Nation hereby directs that all expenditures from the NDPS Fund Management Plan be in strict compliance with the provisions contained therein.

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT <br> BETWEEN <br> THE NAVAJO NATION GAMING ENTERPRISE <br> AND <br> THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY 

Amendment No. 1

### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise ("Enterprise") is established as a legal entity wholly owned by the Navajo Nation with authority to conduct gaming operations within the Navajo Nation under the auspices of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, the Navajo Nation Gaming Ordinance, gaming compacts between the Navajo Nation and the States of Arizona and New Mexico, and regulations and policies related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Navajo Division of Public Safety (NDPS") is responsible for enforcing applicable federal and Navajo Nation laws within the territorial jurisdiction of Navajo Indian Country, as defined by 7 N.N.C $\$ 254$ and 18 U.S.C. §1151, to provide effective and efficient law enforcement services and to protect life and property, and

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation has established gaming facilities at "Fire Rock Navajo Casino" located within Church Rock Chapter, McKinley County; "Flowing Water Navajo Casino" located within Tse Daak' $a$ án Chapter, San Juan County; "Northern Edge Navajo Casino" located within Upper Fruitland Chapter, San Juan County; and "Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort" located within Leupp Chapter, Coconino County; and

WHEREAS, the presence and operations of the gaming facilities thereby requires an increased law enforcement presence to ensure the safety and security of the Enterprise guests and surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, the law enforcement demands on NDPS have proportionately increased such that NDPS must endeavor to maintain its usual law enforcement coverage while responding to the increased need for law enforcement at and near the gaming facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agnee as follows:
This Agreement shall be effective on the date signed by all Parties and is entered into so that NDPS can provide law enforcement presence at the gaming facilities to protect the Enterprise, its guests, employees and assets. Attached bereto as Exhibit $A$ is the Operating Protocol, which defines key terms of the Agreement, and the Weekly Activity Report Form.

### 2.0 AUTHORITIES

This Agreement is entered into under the authorities granted to the Parties by Navajo Nation statutes, laws and ordinances.

The Enterprise is authorized by 5 N.N.C. §1705(E) to enter into and to make agreements for lawful purposes of the Enterprise.

NDPS is responsible for enforcing applicable federal and Navajo Nation laws within the territorial jurisdiction of Navajo Indian Country, as defined by 7 N.N.C $\$ 254$ and 18 U.S.C. $\$ 1151$.

### 3.0 SCOPE OF AGREEMENT

NDPS shall provide law enforcement presence at the Casino facilities operated by the Esterprise including Fire Rock Navajo Casino within Church Rock Chapter, McKinley County, Flowing Water Navajo Casino within Tse Daak'adin Chapter, Sen Juan County, Northem Edge Navajo Casino within Upper Fruitland Chapter, San Juan County, and Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort within Leupp Chapter, Coconino County.

### 4.0 ERFECTIVE DATE, TERM, AND TERMINATION

The terms of this amended Agreement shall become effective on the date signed by all Parties Commeacing April 15, 2013, NDPS shall begin providing services to Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort.

This Agreement shall remain in effect for so long as the Enterprise's conduct of gaming on the identified sites continues.

This Agreement may be terminated by either Party with (120) days written notice of intent to terminate the Agreement. Notice to NDPS shall be forwarded to the Executive Director of NDPS via certified mail, return receipt requested at the Navajo Division of Public Safety, P.O. Box 3360, Window Rock, Arizona 86515. Notice to the Enterprise shall be forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer via certified msil, retum receipt requested at Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise, P.O. Box 1700, Church Rock, New Mexico 87311 , or such ofher address as either Party may designate in writing to the other at some future data.

### 5.0 LAW ENFORCEMENT PRESENCE AND COMTPNSATION

The Parties understand and agree that NDPS will provide law eaforcement presence at the gaming facilities as part of normal NDPS law enforcement coverage. NDPS Personnel shall remain under the ultimate supervision and control of their respective NDPS Supervisors and Commanders. In the event any law cnforcement emergency arises in the Police District from which the Police Officers operate, and such emergency requires the assistance of the assigned Police Officers, the Police Officers will assist in
the emergency and will resume gaming facility patrol as soon as feasible. If however an emergency arises simultancously in a Police District and at a gaming facility, the Commander or Supervisor will, at his or her discretion, assign coverage in accordance with standard operational guidelines.

### 5.1 Law Enforcement Presence - Fire Rock Navajo Casino ("FRNC")

The Parties agree that at least two NDPS Personnel will be present at FRNC during the Casino's peak hours of operation which are 4 p.m. to 4 a.m. each day. NDPS Police Officers will provide this coverage in accordance with normal NDPS shifts. Generally, NDPS Personnel will be Police Officers, unless a Criminal Investigator is necessary to investigate criminal activity at the Casino. NDPS Law Enforcement Persomel will work out of the office space provided by FRNC, referred to in Section 6.0. NDPS Police Officers will patrol the FRNC parking lot, respond to calls fiom the Enterprise or FRNC, and process all detentions or arrests. A Criminal Investigator will investigate any criminal activity that may occur on the Casino property in accordance with applicable laws.

The NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will check in with FRNC Shift Manager upon his or her arrival and prior to his or her departure. During the shift, NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will maintain opea lines of communication by radio frequency, and, prior to signing off his or her shift, will provide a daily briefing to the FRNC Shift Manager and Security Supervisor. NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will alent FRNC Security personnel and advise their NDPS superiors of any unusual circumastances at FRNC and of any anticipated problems that may require enhanced police presence at the Casino facility.

### 5.2 Law Enforcement Presence - Flowing Water Navajo Casino ("FWNC")

The Parties agree that at least one NDPS Police Officer will routinely patrol the FWNC parking lot during the Casino's peak hours of operation which are $4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. to 4 am . each day. This coverage will be obtained by NDPS Police Officers working normal NDPS shifts. The NDPS Police Officer will consult with FWNC Shift Manager at least once during his or her patrol. The NDPS Police Officer will alent the FWNC Shift Manager and advise his or her NDPS superiors of any wnusual circumstances at FWNC and of any anticipated problems that may require enhanced police presence at the Casino facility.

### 5.3 Law Enforcement Presence-Northern Edge Navajo Casino ("NENC")

The Parties agree that at least two NDPS Personnel will be present at NENC during the Casino's peak hours of operation which are 4 p.m. to 4 a.m. each day. NDPS Police Officers will provide this coverage in accordance with normal NDPS shifts. Generally, NDPS Personned will be IPolice Officers, unless a Criminal Investigator is nocessary to investigate ariminal activity at the Casino. NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will work out of the office space provided by NENC, referred to in Section 6.0. NDPS Police Officers will patrol the NENC parking lot, respond to calls from the Enterprise or NENC,
and process all detentions or arrests. A. Criminal Investigator will investigate any criminal activity that may occur on the Casino property in accordance with applicable laws.

The NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will check in with NENC Shift Manager upon his or her arrival and prior to his or her departure. During the shift, NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will maintain open lines of communication by radio frequency, and, prior to signing off his or her shifh, will provide a daily briefing to the NENC Shift Manager and Security Supervisor. NDPS Law Enfoncement Personnel will alert NENC Security persomel and advise their NDPS superiors of any unusual circumstances at NENC and of any anticipated problems that may require enhanced police presence at the Casino facility.

### 5.4 Law Euforcement Presence - Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort ("TANCR")

The TANCR shall include the hotel, conference rooms, and other non-gaming amenities, as well as the gaming areas.

The Parties agree that at least two NDPS Personnel wrill be available at TANCR twentyfour hours a day, seven days a week. The NDPS Personnel present at each shift shall hold a current Arizona police officer standards and training certificate. NDPS Police Officers will provide this coverage in accordance with normal NDPS shitts. Generally, NDPS Personnel will be Police Officas, unless a Criminal Invertigator is necessary to investigate criminal activity within and around the resort including the Casino, hotel, and parking lot. NDPS Law Enforcement Persomel will work out of the office space provided by TANCR, referred to in Section 6.0. NDPS Police Officers will patrol the TANCR property and parking lot every 3 hours, respond to calls from the Enterprise or TANCR, and process all detentions or arrests. A Criminal Investigator will investigate any criminal activity that may occur on the TANCR property in accordance with applicable laws. The NDPS Personnel at TANCR shall establish intelligence liaisons with the Tribal Gaming Office and the Arizons Department of Gaming. NDPS shall cooperate with the Arizona Departmeat of Gaming as required by the Arizona Tribal State Gaming Compact and the Interagency Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit B.

The NDPS Law Enforcement Persomel will check in with TANCR Shifl Manager upon his or her arrival and prior to his or her departure. During the shit, NDPS Law Enforcement Persomel will maintain open lines of communication by radio frequency, and, prior to signing off his or her shith, will provide a daily briefing to the TANCR Shitt Manager and Security Supervisor. NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will aleat TANCR Security personned and advise their NDPS superiors of any unususl circumstances at TANCR and of any anticipated problems that may require enhanced police presence at the TANCR facility.

The Enterprise will compensate NDPS for providing law exforcement presence to FRNC and NENC/FWNC pursuant to a Navajo Nation fund management plan by depositing monthly installments of $\$ 18,000.00$ for FRNC and $\$ 18,000.00$ for NENC/FWNC for a total of $\$ 36,000.00$ to the Office of the Controller, on behalf of NDPS, at P.O. Box 3150, Window Rock, Navajo Nation (Arizona) 86515-3150. The aggregate amount over a oneyear period will equal Four Hundred and Thirty-Two Thousand Dollars ( $\$ 432,000.00$ ) The first deposit shall be made on March 1, 2012; and thereater, on the $1^{2}$ of each month. The deposit schedule for the first year of this Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit C.

### 5.6 Compensation - TANCR

The Enterprise will compensate NDPS for providing law enforcement presence to TANCR pursuant to a Navajo Nation fund management plan by depositing monthly installiments of $\$ 25,000.00$ to the Office of the Controller, on behalf of NDPS, at P.O. Box 3150, Window Rock, Navajo Nation (Arizona) 86515-3150. The total amoumt over a one-year period will equal Three Hundred Thousand Dollars ( $\$ 300,000.00$ ). The first deposit shall be made on August 1, 2013; and thereafter, on the $1^{\text {a }}$ of each month. The deposit schedule for the first year of this Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit C.

### 5.7 Compensation for Special Events

When the Enterprise requires law enforcement presence, beyond what is set forth in Sections 5.1 - 5.4, for special large-attendance events, this shall constitute additional law exforcement presence. The Enterprise shall compensate NDPS for providing additional law enforcement presence by invoice, based upon an hourly, overtime, or, if appropriate, holiday rate, consistent with current Navajo Nation pay schedule. These payments will be over and above the annual compensation agreed to under this Agreament. The Enterprise agrees to notify the NDPS Chief of Police in writing at least two weeks before a need for additional law enforcement preseace at the identified Casino facilities is anticipated.

OFFICE AND PARKING SPACES

### 6.1 Fire Rock Navajo Casino

The Enterprise shall provide office space and designated parking for two NDPS vehicles at FRNC. The office will have Intemet access and a secure method to store documents or evidence. NDPS will have 24-hour access to this office and parioing space.

### 6.2 Northern Edge Navajo Casino

The Enterprise shall provide office space and designated parking for two NDPS vehicles at NENC. The office will have internet access and a secure method to store documents or evidence. NDPS will have 24-hour access to this office and parking spsce.

### 6.3 Twitu Arrows Navajo Casino Resort

The Enterprise shall provide office space and designated parking for two NDPS vehicles at TANCR. The office will have Internet access and a secure method to store documens or evidence. NDPS will have 24-hour access to this office and parking space.

### 7.0 DISPATCHING

### 7.1 Fire Rock Navajo Casino

For police emergency services, all Emergency-911 calls from the FRNC shall be received by the McKinley County Metro Dispatch center and promptly dispatched to the Crowapoint Police District.

### 7.2 Northerr Edge Navajo Castio

For police emergency services, all Emergency-911 calls from the NENC shall be received by the San Juan County Communications Center and promptly dispatched to the Shiprock Police District.

## 73 Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort

For police emergency services, all Emergency-911 calls from the TANCR shall be received directly by the Dilcon Police District and promply dispatched to the appropriate NDPS Police Officerls.

### 8.0 ASSIGNMENTS/SUBCONTRACTS

Except as may be expressly provided herein, the Parties agree not to assign, sell, transfer, and subcontract or sublet rights, or delegate responsibilities under this Agreement, in whole or in part, without the prior written approval of the other Party bereto.

### 9.0 SUCCESSORS IN NTTEREST

The provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and imure to the benefit of all Partics to the Agreement and the respective successors and assignees, regandless of any change in Navajo Nation or Enterprise administration, umless the Agreement is terminated as provided in the Agreement.

The Parties and their employees and agents agree to abide by all laws, regulations, and ordinances of the Navajo Nation, and all applicable laws, regulations and ordinances of the State of New Mexico, the State of Arizona, and the United States, now in force or as may be hereafter in force and effect, while performing work under this Agreement.

### 11.0 GOVERNING LAW AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Except as expressly prohibited by applicable federal law or the Tribal State Gaming Compacts, the laws of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of this Agreement. The Parties shall endeavor to resolve claims, disputes and any other matter in question between them by informal good faith regotiation. In the event the Parties are unable to reach informal resolution, either Party, or both, may notify the other in writing of intent to terminate the Agreement in accordance with Section 4.0 of this Agreement and any and all obligations encumbered through the termination date shall be honored.

### 12.0 NO WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY

Nothing set forth in this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation including the Enterprise.

### 13.0 NOTICES AND CONTACT INFORMATION

Contact information for the General Managers, Casino Shitt Managers, and Secority Personnel of the FRNC, FWNC, - NENC and TANCR is attached hereto as Exhibit D, and will be timely provided to NDPS when and as may be revised.

### 14.0 FORCE MAJEURE

No Party to this Agreement shall be held responsible for delay or default caused by fires, riots, acts of God and/or war which is beyond the reasonable control of the Parties.

### 15.0 SEVERABILTTY

If any provision of this Agreement is declared unlawful, invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining terms and provisions shall remain in effiect and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be construed as valid and enforced.

### 16.0 AMENDMENTS

The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented, or ameaded except npon written approval of the Parties.

### 17.0 RNTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, including any Attachments and Exhibits, incorporates all the agreements, covenants, and understandings between the Parties. This Agreement supersedes any and all other prior, simultaneous, oral, or written agreanents, covenants, and understandings between the Parties pertsining to subject matter of this Agreement.

## 1800 THIRD PARTY BENEFICLARY

This Agreement does not and is not intended to create rights in any person(s) or eatities other than the Partics to this Agreement.

### 19.0 ANNUAL REVIEW

The Parties should conduct a mutual, good faith annual review of this Agreement to evaluate the operating procedures and financial terms. Any such annual review may be done one year from the effective date of this Agreement and amually thereatter.

IN WITNESS WHRREOF, this Agreement shall take effect on the date the last signature is affixed as indicated below. This Agreement may be executed by up to three counterparts; each to be treated as the original.

## OPERATING PROTOCOL

## 1. PURPOSE

This Operating Protocol establishes the procedural requireanents for NDPS Persomnel pursuant to Section 5.0 of the MOA betweea the NNGE and NDPS.

## II. DEEINTTIONS

DETENTION - detaining a person temporarily on Casino property pending any further action by Law Enforcement Persomel.

LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL - a Navajo Nation Police Officer or a Navajo Nation Crininal Investigator.

PEAK HOURS - a twelve hour period starting at 4:00 p.m. and ending at 4:00 a.m.
SHIFT for NDPS Law Enforcement Persomed - a fixed period of woriplace hours: 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.; 2:00 p.m. - 10:00 p.m; 3:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m.; 6:00 p.m. - 2:00 a.m., 10:00 p.m. - 6:00 a.m.; 6:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.; or, 10 hours/4 days a week.

## III. SHILITC PROCEDURE ROR FRNCNENC and TANCR

A. Upon beginning his or her shith, the NDPS Law Enforcement Persontel will park his or her police unit in front of the Casino cither under the Porte Cochere or in a designated parking space. Upon entering the Casino through the main entrance, he or she will sign in the date and time of arrival in the Sign In/Sign Out Log which will be kept in the Security Operation Center (SOC). Both the NDPS Personnel and Casino Shit Manager will sign the Sign $\ln /$ Sign Out Log.
B. To maintain open lines of communication at all times with the Casino Shift Manager during the shith NDPS Law Enforcement Persounel, upon beginning each shift, will either be issued Casino radio equipment or open frequency lines using NDPS issured radio equipment.
C. If he or she was issued Casino radio equipment, NDPS Law Enforcement Persomnel will return the Casino redio equipment to the SOC prior to ending his/her shitt. His or her depstare time will be documented in writing using the Sign In/Sign Out Log signed by both the NDPS personnel and Casino Shif Manager.

## IV. DETENTION AND/OR ARREST

A. To minimize disruption within the casino, any person detained and/or arrested shall be escorted through the employee entrance, unless circumstances are such that make this requirement impractical.
B. Indian suspects arrested within the Navajo Nation's territorial jurisdiction by NDPS officers shall be immediately taken to the appropriate Navajo Police District for booking.
C. Non-Indian suspects arrested by NDPS officers shall be taken to the appropriate State or County detention facility for booking.
D. In the event an arrest is made, or conld be made, under 18 U.S.C. $\S 1152$ or 1153 or for any federal felony within the Navajo Nation's territorial jurisdiction by an NDPS officer, that officer shall immediately notify an NDPS Criminal Investigator or FBI Agent who will then proceed with the case.

## v. WEEKIX ACTIVITY REPORT

The NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel will provide a Weekly Activity Report. The Weekly Activity Report will document parking lot patrols, responses to calls from the Enterprise or Casino, and any other law enforcement activities or incidents that took place the prior week. The Weekly Activity Report will include pertinent information such as the date, time, nature of activity, response and disposition. The Weekly Activity Report will be submitted by the designated NDPS Law Enforcement Personnel to the Casino General Manager, Shit Manager and Security Manager. The report may be submitted eititer in person or via email. The Weekly Activity Report will include copies of all arrests reports, if applicable.

This Interagemey Agreement (the "Agrocment") ts entered imo by and belweca the Navajo Departuren of Publio Safety ("NDPS") of (P.O. Box 3360, Window Roct, AZ 86515) and the Arizona Department of Caming ("ADG").

## RBCTCALS

WHEREAS, from time to time it may become mecossary for the Navajo Department of Public Saluty ("NDPS") and the Arizona Departurnt of Garning ("ADG") to share certain investigative information grathared by their respective ugencies on'individuals and entities involved in Indian ganing or other gaming operations; and

WHBRRAS, ADG's insolligence unit will gather, coontinate, eentralize, and disseminates and
WHIRREAS, the puppose of this Agreement is to establish the process for sharing information required for investigation purposest and

WHERREAS, both Parties are pubic ageacies in the State of Arizona as defined in Asieona Revised Statortes ("A.R.S.") 811-951; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in onter to establish eflicieat procedures for the distribution of such information, the Navido Departurent of Public Safcty amd ihe Arizons Departuent of Oaming apree to the following:

1. Subjen to the terms and conditions of this Agreemem, the parties agrec to share certain investigative information pertaining to individuals or entities involved in indian ganning or other gaming operations, who are under investigation for illegal aectivities, upon roquert.
2. Type af intompation Information that shall be shared between the NDPS and ADG includes current intelligenec information pertaining to criminal ectivity that may thrcaten patrons, employess, or assets of the Tribal Gaming Facility and documence, filies, intivview statements,
photographs and surveiliance videos as may be gathered during the process of investigntion.
3. Raquests
A. Requests for access and production of informstion shall be made in a writiag signed by a AZPOST certilied peace officer of the requesting agency to the Administrator of the NDPS of the Dicretor of the ADG, or desigrees secting on their behalf.
B. A record of the request shall be maintained by the sgency providing information.
C. The requesting agency shatl ensure that mocest to all provided information is restricted to AZPOST certified offieses direaly involved in invertigations relaned to the individual or catities which are the subjeat of the request, or to persons under the dircet control and masagement of an AZPOST certified officer.
D. The requesting agency stedl not diselose any huformation provided under this Agremeat outaide that agency withosit the prior, written consent of the agency providing information.
E. Any information received by the requesting agency shall be stored and maintainad in such a manmer as to safeguard the information agginst unsuiturived access and dissemiation.
4. Conmiletndinumtigating. Following receipt of ressosable notice, the entire investigative file of a eompleted investigation pertaining to eriminal activity that may throaten patroxss, employees, or assets of the Tribal Gaming Facility etrall be made available for inspection by representatives of the requesting agency in the effice where the documents are maintainced.
5. On-going invertinations Following recsipt of reasonable notice, the entire investigative Itle of an ongoing investigation pertinining to erimion welivity that may cheraten patrons, erngloyeas, or aseuts of the Tribal Caming Pacilly will be made available for inspection by rcpirmentatives of the requesting agency in the oflioe where the documents are mainained unkess, in the discretion of the agency providing the reeorts, tt is determined that reasonstile circumstasces exist which mecessitate maintsinfing the eonfidentisfity of cerlata imformation, in which ease ofly that eertain information which reasonshly must be fept confideatial will be withheld.
6. Copiss. Upan reasonable motice, copies of documporsa, files, interview statements, photographs, sarvaillance videos and other items as may be gashered during the process of investigation relating to completed and ougging lavestigations will be provided w the requesting agency unless, in the discretion of the sagency providing the reconds, cervain of the documents or iterns ure resurasbly deturnined to be too sconsitive to permit copying, in which case copics of
oaly those certain sensitive documents and items will be withbeld.
7. No information provided under this Agreemert shall bo introduced by the requesting agency in a coust of law or administrative hearing without the prior, witten consent of the agency providing the information.
8. Iimployeos, past and prosent, of the providing agency shall not be called as witresses to testify reganding information provided under this Agreemeat before any court or in any administrative hearing, except in extraordinary circumstances as determined by the agency providing the information.
9. All Tribal. records, and copies thereof, shall remain the property of the TRIBE intespective of their location. All such records, and information derived from suech records, are confidential and proprietary information of the TRUBR Access to all Tribal reeords, or copies thereof in the possession of ADG shall be limited solely to the employees of ADG and TGO and ADC shall not disclose such recorda and documents to other persoas within the State government or to third parties provided however that disclosure shall be authortaed when made purguant to an order of a corurt of comperent jurisdiction. ADO shall immediately notify the TOO of the receip of any request for mecoss to any such records from any person outside ADO. Any request for access to intormation provided under this Agreement by the individual who ls a subject of the information, shall be roferred to the agenciy providing the information for processing and an appropriato sespansis pursuant to this Section 9 and applicable laws.
10. Any rudrinistrative costs associated with the Agreement shall be borne by the ageney providing the requested information and shall be viewed as a routine cost of businesis. Such costs shall inclurde those for photocopying, telephone and telefax communieations.
11. This Agreement, upon crecution by both the NDPS and the ADG, shall remain in effect unlods ameinded by mutual consent or terminated upon writuen notice to the other party.

## NAVAJO DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN (Amended)

## I. ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby established the Navajo Division of Public Safety Fund Management Plan for use by the Navajo Division of Public Safety.

## II. CRITERIA

1. The Navajo Nation, through the en behalfof the Navajo Division of Public Safety ("NDPS"), has entered into a Police Sevices Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") with the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise ("NNGE") to provide police services to Navajo Gaming Facilities. Attached hereto as Exhibit A.
2. The MOA requires that on-site police services be provided to the "Fire Rock Navajo Casino" located in Church Rock, Chapter, McKinley County; "Flowing Water Navajo Casino" located within Tsé Daak'aan Chapter, San Juan County; and "Northern Edge Navajo Casino" located within Upper Fruitland Chapter, San Juan County and "Twin Arrows Navaio Casino Resort" located in Leupp Chapter, Coconino County.
3. The total negotiated fee for this service is $\$ 36,000$ per month or $\$ 432,000$ per year for "Fire Rock Navajo Casino", "Flowing Water Navaio Casino", and "Northern Edge Navajo Casino". The total negotiated fee for this service is $\$ 25,000$ per month or $\$ 300,000$ per year for "Twin Arrows Navaio Casino Resort". The term of the agreement MOA is perpetual, unless otherwise terminated pursuant to the requirements set forth in the MOA.
4. The Navajo Division of Public Safety NDPS will use the funds generated to support the operation needs of enhance-and-improve the working conditions for NDPS police officers and the Department of Corrections. This includes using the fund for personnel related expenses for overtime, training, lodging, meals, travel, equipment, supplies and awards.
5. The-Navaje Divisien of Public Safety NDPS will also use the funds to purchase new patrol vehicles. The funds will also be used to pay associated expenses, including fees, insurance and repair work.
6. The funds generated paid under the MOA cannot be expended or allocated to uses other than those described in paragraphs 4 and 5 .
7. The funds expenditure and use of all revent-generated-will be expended in accordance with Navajo Nation law, including the Navajo Business Opportunity Act.
8. Unexpended revenue generated shall revert to the-Nawjo-Nation General-Fund at the end of eacheare no -expiring and remain in the account until fully expended.

## III. EXPENDITURE REQUIREMENTS

All revenue-generated-pursuant to the funds paid under this Police Service MOA shall be deposited with the Office of the Controller and to the Nawjo-Division Public Safety Administration General-Funds Account \#116018 the NN Controller's Office shall establish a new fund, separate from the general fund. All deposits to this new fund will be credited to NDPS and all expenditures to this new fund will be dedicated to the use of NDPS Police Services and the Department of Corrections. All funds received both existing and forthcoming shall be credited to this new account.

1. The Division Director, in the manner prescribed by Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule and regulation, shall prepare an annual budget for the fund. This budget will be expenditure plan for reviewed and approvaled by the appropriate offices and authorities. The budget shall include a projection of the revenues funds that will be generated set out in the MOA and-the expenditure must be consistent will be allocated and expended consistent with Sections II (4) and (5).
2. The Accounting Manager(s), Office of the Controller and Office of Management and Budget, in a manner prescribed by Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule and regulation, shall (1) establish a Revenue Fund Account for the of reses deposit of funds described in Section II(3) above; (2) review and regulate expenditures from such fund to ensure compliance with existing Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule or regulations regarding the fund; and (3) maintain an accurate accounting of all transactions.

## IV. AMENDMENTS

This Fund Management Plan may be amended from time to time by the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council upon the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Public Safety.
