RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 24th Navaio Nation Council --- Fourth Year, 2022

AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT;

APPROVING A MISSION SITE PERMIT FOR 1.5 ACRE, MORE OR LESS, FOR REACHING OUT WITH CHRIST'S KINGDOM MINISTRIES, INC. IN THE VICINITY OF HARDROCK CHAPTER, NAVAJO NATION

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1151 (C), the Resources Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give approval for permits for mission sites on behalf of the Navajo Nation.
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B) (2), the Resources Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give final approval for all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Reaching Out With Christ's Kingdom Ministries, Inc. has applied for a mission site within the Hardrock Chapter.
- B. The Terms and Conditions for the Mission Site Permit is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- C. The proposed mission site is located on 1.5 acres, more or less, within the vicinity of Hardrock Chapter, Navajo Nation (Arizona). The survey of the Reaching Out With Christ's Kingdom Ministries, Inc. tract is attached as Exhibit B.
- D. The Grazing Official, in memoranda dated August 31, 2021 stated that the "religious site is located on NPL [Navajo Partitioned Land]." The August 31, 2021 memorandum is attached as **Exhibit C**.

- E. The Hardrock Chapter Resolution HR-02/03-017 dated February 24, 2003 "approve[s] the 1.5 acre tract of lands withdrawn for the ROCK Ministries and request[s] the Navajo Land Department to do all things necessary to complete the processing of this application." Hardrock Chapter Resolution HR-02/03-017 and a signed petition are attached as Exhibit D.
- F. The Biological Resources Compliance Form NNDF&WL Review No. 006-030 is attached as Exhibit E; the Historic Preservation Department Cultural Resources Compliance Form No. HPD-04-314 with the Archaeological Inventory Report Documentation Page and Figures 1, 2, and 3 are attached as Exhibit F; and the Navajo Nation Department of Fish & Wildlife, Natural Heritage Program, memorandum dated May 21, 2004 stating that "[t]he project is not expected to affect any federally listed species or significantly impact any tribally listed species or other species of concern" is attached as Exhibit G. The United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs. Navajo Region, memorandum dated March 1, 2006 stating that "[a] Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) has been determined for the proposed action which will not have a significant impact on the quality of the natural and human environment" is attached as Exhibit H.
- G. The Application for Mission Site (Religious Site), the Certificate of Incorporation, the Articles of Incorporation, and the Council Delegate Acknowledgement Form are attached as **Exhibit I**.
- H. The Executive Official Review Document Number 017279 with reviews by the Department of Justice, Department of Water Resources, Fish and Wildlife, Minerals Management Department, Historic Preservation Department, Division of Natural Resources Administration, the Navajo Land Department; and the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency indicating "approved" or "sufficient" are attached as Exhibit J.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the Mission Site Permit for the Reaching Out With Christ's Kingdom Ministries, Inc., subject to but not limited to the attached Terms and Conditions contained herein as **Exhibit A** which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes President of the Navajo Nation to execute all documents to affect the intent and purpose of this resolution.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR MISSION SITE PERMIT REACHING OUT WITH CHRIST'S KINGDOM MINISTERIES, INC. (PERMITTEE)

- 1. This Mission Site Permit is issued to the <u>Reaching Out with Christ's Kingdom Ministries</u>, Inc. P.O. <u>Box 169</u>, <u>Kykotsmovi</u>, <u>Arizona 86039</u>, to use and occupy Navajo Nation Trust Lands for religious purposes, and shall be subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. The term of the Mission Site Permit is effective beginning on the date the permit is approved by the Resources & Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council or authorized representative. The Permit is authorized by Resources and Development Committee No. _______.
- 2. This permit is revocable at the discretion of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The permit shall immediately be revoked for the failure to use the land herein described for religious purposes. It is understood and agreed that this instrument is 'NOT A LEASE' and is not to be taken or construed as granting any leasehold interest or right in or to the land herein described, but is merely a temporary permit, terminable and revocable.
- 3. The Permittee shall be given at least thirty (30) days written notice before this Mission Site Permit is terminated and revoked. Upon termination of the Mission Site Permit, the Permittee shall have ninety (90) days in which to remove from the site to dispose of any and all buildings, structures, materials and equipment and other personal property owned by the religious organization. After the expiration of the ninety (90) days, the Permittee shall peacefully and without legal process deliver the possession of the premises to the Navajo Nation. All improvements not removed after ninety (90) days will become the property of the Navajo Nation, unless the Navajo Nation demands in writing that the improvements be removed.
- This Permit is not transferable, except with the consent of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
- 5. This Permit shall be reviewed every five (5) years to reevaluate the rent and compliance with the terms and conditions.
- 6. The legal land description of the premises is described as follows:

TRACT DESCRIPTION

A PARCEL OF LAND SITUATED IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF UNSURVERYED SECTION 22 AND THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF UNSURVEYED SCTION 15, TOWNSHIP 31 NORTH, RANGE 17 EAST, GILA AND SALT RIVER MERIDIAN, IN THE VICINITY OF HARD ROCK, NAVAJO COUNTY, STATE OF ARIZONA, SAID PARCEL BEING MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

Commencing at a Bureau of Land Management Cadastral survey brass capped pipe dated 1978 found at the South Quarter Corner of Section 23 of said Township 31 North, Range 17 East; Thence South 89°50'00" West (Basis of bearing per B.L.M. plat R1) A distance of 2637.31 feet (2638.02' R1) along the boundary line common to the survey brass capped pipe dated 1978 found at the witness corner for the

position of the Southwest Corner of said Section 23, from said witness corner, the position of said Southwest Corner of Section 23 bears South 89°50'00" West a distance of 5419.92 feet to a ½ " re-bar with plastic cap stamped "LS 14184" set at the point of beginning; Thence North 66°43'11" West a distance of 208.71 feet to a ½ " re-bar with plastic cap stamped "LS14184" (SET); Thence North 23°16'49" East a distance 313.07 feet to a ½ " re-bar with plastic cap stamped "LS14184" (SET); Thence South 66°43'11" East a distance of 208.71 Feet to a ½ " re-bar with plastic cap stamped "LS 14184" (SET); Thence South 23°16'49" West a distance of 313.07 feet to the point of beginning.

Said parcel of land contains 1.50 acres more or less and is subject to any and all existing easements for underground utilities located therein. Surveyed November 20, 2003.

The annual rental rate will be § 15.00 per year and is due by December 30, prior to the year for which such fees are due, 16 N.N.C. § 1164. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1157, if the Permittee fails to pay the rent when due, this permit shall automatically terminate. The Permittee is responsible to make direct payments to the Navajo Nation Accounts Receivable Section, Post Office Box 3150, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.

- 7. The Permittee may develop, use and occupy the area under the permit for the purpose(s) of Mission Site. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any unlawful purpose.
- 8. In all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 162;
 - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;
 - c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ 601 et seq., and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Law, 5 N.N.C. §§ 201 et seq.; and
 - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq. Permittee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
- 9. The Permittee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the permit.
- 10. The Permittee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the permit area to the extent compatible with the purpose of the permit, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.

- 11. The Permittee shall at all times during the term of the permit and at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the permit and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
- 12. The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and their respective authorized agents, employees, land users and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy or use of the permit area by the Permittee.
- 13. The Permittee shall not assign, convey or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the permit or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the permit, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer of the permit without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon condition or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
- 14. The Navajo Nation may terminate the permit for violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the permit shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation or authorized representative for any of the following causes:
 - Failure to comply with any terms and conditions of the permit or of applicable laws or regulations;
 - b. Non-use of the permit; and
 - c. The use of the land subject to the permit for any purpose inconsistent with the purpose for which the permit is granted.
- 15. At the termination of the permit, the Permittee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
- 16. The Permittee shall give written notice to the Navajo Nation Land Department regarding any change to the Permittee's contact information, address, leadership, organizational name, or any other substantial change to the organization. The notice shall be given within thirty (30) days and delivered to the Navajo Land Department at Post Office Box 2249, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
- 17. Holding over by the Permittee after the termination of the permit shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Permittee any rights hereunder or in or to the land subject to the permit or to any improvements located thereon.
- 18. The Navajo Nation shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the permit, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.
- 19. By acceptance of the grant of permit, the Permittee consents to the full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction to levy fines and to enter judgements for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief,

in connection with all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation or which have a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.

- 20. By acceptance of the grant of the permit, the Permittee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the permit or to the Navajo Nation.
- 21. Any action or proceeding brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the permit shall be resolved administratively under the laws of the Navajo Nation and no action or proceeding shall be brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation, in any court of any state.
- Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the
 construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 24. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Permittee, and the term "Permittee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.
- 25. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the area under the permit; and the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.





RESOLUTION OF THE HARDROCK CHAPTER RESO.NO. <u>HR-02/03-017</u>

APPROVING THE LAND WITHDRAW OF 1.5 ACRES AND RECOMMENDING TO THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS AND THE NAVAJO NATION TO GRANT A MISSION SITE LEASE TO REACHING OUT WITH CHRIST'S KINGDOM MINISTRIES, INC. (ROCK MINISTRIES) FOR RELIGIOUS USE.

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Navajo Nation Council by Resolution CAP-34-98 enacted the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act and codified it under Title 26 of the Navajo Nation Code; and
- 2. Pursuant to Title 26 NCC, Section B-1&2 the purpose of the Local Governance Act is to recognize governance at the local level and to delegate to chapter governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Laws including custom and tradition and to make decision over local matter; and
- 3. Pursuant to Section 103 (D-1) of T-26 the Hardrock Chapter can approve a land withdraw for the purpose of religious use and local land users by consent has petition the chapter their approval; and
- 4. 3. The Ministry's primary purpose is to develop the site, construct buildings for use on various weekdays for the purpose of teaching, counseling, worship, prayer, resource, fellowship and recreation; and
- 5. The permit holder(s) living within the area where the church site is proposed have given their consents to permit the religious organization permission to utilized 1.5 acres of their grazing lands. (see attachment A)

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Hardrock Chapter hereby approve the 1.5 acre tract of lands withdrawn for the ROCK Ministries and request the Navajo Land Department to do all things necessary to complete the processing of this application. Further, should the church liquidate, the permit holder shall reclaim the land taken for religious purpose, and, the site will be re-incorporated back into his or her grazing use of otherwise directed by the Resource Committee of the Navajo Nation.

The Hardrock Chapter request the Navajo Nation and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to approve the site selected and charge the religious group the minimal fee for its ground site.



- mission site with associated utilities for the Rock Ministries Mission within a 208.71 feet by 313.07 feet parcel of land. The corridor for power and water line measures 1,300 feet by 100 feet. The total area of potential effect equals 195,340 square feet or 4.48 acres. Ground disturbance has been intensive and extensive from the use of heavy equipment. The Rock Ministries Mission is in the process of mission site lease approval through BIA.
- b. Existing Data Review: A check of Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD) site files indicated that no sites were previously recorded within one kilometer of the project area. Five projects were reported: #HPD 92-339, #HPD 88-621, #HPD 00-229, #HPD 96-145 and #HPD 00-764.
- c. Area Environmental and Cultural Setting: The project area is situated at an elevation of 6,180 feet above mean sea level. The proposed church mission site is on 1.50-acres of undisturbed land. Vegetation consists of Mormon tea, cedar shrubs, cliffrose, snakeweed, blue grama, yucca, cholla, rabbitbrush, sand puffs, wild carrots, wild onions, Indian ricegrass, and

prickly pear. The nearest water resource is Oraibi Wash to the west and south. The contemporary cultural setting is modern Navajo. The prehistoric use was Anasazi.

- Loretta Flatrock and Carol S. Yazzie-Ward walked subparallel transects spaced 10-12 meters apart to survey for cultural resources. The total area surveyed equaled d. 223,929 square feet or 5.14 acres. Mr. and Mrs. Jelle were interviewed for Traditional Cultural Properties.




Figure 1. General project area on Navajo Tribal Trust Lands, Hardrock Chapter, Western Navajo Agency, Navajo County, Arizona.




Figure 2. The project area plotted on USGS Hard Rocks Quadrangle, 7.5-minute series, Navajo County, Arizona.




Figure 3. The existing Rock Ministries Mission on 1.50 acres of land.

The project is not expected to affect any federally listed species or significantly impact any tribally listed species or other species of concern.

Potential impacts to **wetlands** should also be evaluated. The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) maps should be examined to determine whether areas classified as wetlands are located close enough to the project site(s) to be impacted. 



FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT DOCUMENT, EA-06-008 ROCK MINISTRIES CHURCH SITE PERMIT

REACHING OUT WITH CHRIST'S KINGDOM MINISTRIES, INC.

Location: Hard Rocks, AZ, Quadrangle, USGS 7.5 Minute Series Map Sections 15 & 22, T31N, R17E, G&SRM Hardrock, Navajo County, Arizona

The proposed action is approval of a mission site permit by the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the construction of a new church facility with associated utility extensions on 1.5 acres of Navajo Tribal Trust land in Hard Rock, Navajo County, Arizona. The proposed project will consist of the construction of a church, fellowship hall, guest/staff housing, car garage/shop and parking lot with associated utility extensions and a septic tank system. The proposed project is located along Navajo Route 41 approximately 3.5 miles north of the Hardrock Chapter House. The project is sponsored by Reaching Out with Christ's Kingdom Ministries, Inc., P.O. Box 554, Second Mesa, Arizona 86043.

The environmental assessment (EA) was reviewed in the Division of Environmental, Cultural and Safety Management, Navajo Regional Office. Based on the environmental assessment, and the mitigation measures specified in the document, it is determined that the proposed project will not have a significant impact on the natural and human environment. Therefore, in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act, Section 102 (2) (C), an environmental impact statement will not be required.

The following references, incorporated in the environmental assessment, serve as the bases for this decision:

- 1. Agency and public involvement was solicited, and environmental issues relative to the proposed project were identified. Alternative courses of action and mitigation measures were developed in response to environmental concerns and issues.
- 2. The EA disclosed the environmental consequences of the proposed and the "no action" alternatives.
- 3. In compliance with the Endangered Species Act, informal consultation was held with the Navajo Department of Fish and Wildlife (NDFW), Natural Heritage Program (NHP). The project is not expected to affect any federally listed species or significantly impact any tribally listed species or other species of concern (May 21, 2004 Letter from NDFW). The NDFW issued Biological Resources Compliance Form, NNDF&WL Review No. 006-030 indicating compliance with Tribal and federal laws protecting biological resources (Appendix A-BRCF).
- 4. Potential impacts to floodplains and wetlands by the proposed project have been evaluated in accordance with Executive Orders 11988 and 11990. The Dinnebito Wash is located about 2.5 miles

west of the proposed project site and the Oraibi Wash is about 3.1 miles east of the site. No wetland/riparian habitats occur on or near the proposed project site (EA, Part 3.2.1.). According to the Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources, no floodplain data exists for the proposed mission site area. Based on a site survey, it is highly unlikely that the site is located within a floodplain due to the elevation and distance relative to the nearest drainages (EA, Part 4.8.4.).

- 5. Agriculture-small farms are generally found near the Dinnebito Wash. No farming activities occur on or near the proposed mission site. No prime or unique farmlands are found on or near the proposed mission site (EA, Parts 3.4.3. and 4.4.5.).
- 6. Clean Water Act Compliance CWA, Section 402(p) Storm Water Pollution Protection-during construction, project areas will experience increased run-off rates, localized soil erosion and potential for non-point source pollution during times of heavy precipitation. These impacts will be minor and short-term and shall be reduced through implementation of a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) (EA, Part 4.2.1.).
- 7. In compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, Section 106 consultation, and 36 CFR 800.9 (b), a cultural resources inventory was conducted on the project area by CSWTA on March 27, 2004. The Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD) issued Cultural Resources Compliance Form (CRCF) NNHPD No. HPD-04-314 indicating "No historic properties affected" (Appendix B-CRCF).

In the event of a discovery [discovery means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources including, but not limited to, archaeological deposits, human remains, or locations reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices] all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease, and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified.

- 8. Relative to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, Subtitle C, Hazardous Waste, no RCRA Subtitle C sites occur on or near the proposed project site. No hazardous wastes shall be generated, used, stored, or handled on the mission site (EA, Part 4.7.1.).
- 9. In accordance with the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, Subtitle D, Non-Hazardous Solid Waste, No RCRA Subtitle D sites occur on or near the proposed project site. The solid waste generated by the proposed project shall be disposed at the Hopi Solid Waste landfill located about 5 miles east of the Hardrock community (EA, Part 4.7.2.).
- 10. Relative to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, Subtitle I, Underground Storage Tanks (USTs), no RCRA Subtitle I sites occur on or near the proposed project site. No underground storage tanks shall be installed as part of the operation of the mission (EA, Part 4.7.3.).
- 11. Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) No TSCA sites occur on or near the proposed project site. No toxic substances will be generated, used, stored or handled as part of the operation of the proposed project (EA, Part 4.7.5.).

- 12. Noise -some noise may be generated during construction of the facility. However, the noise will be short-term and will be limited from the hours of 8 am to 5 pm on weekdays. No impacts to existing sound and noise levels are anticipated as a result of granting the mission site permit and subsequent development activities (EA, Part 4.9.2).
- Air Resources the generation of dust during construction of the facilities will slightly degrade the air quality/visibility in the project site area. During construction water shall be applied to the area to reduce dust emissions. No impacts to the existing air quality or visibility are expected as a result of granting the mission site permit and subsequent development activities (EA, Part 4.3.1.).
- Cumulative and secondary effects on soil, water, air, noise, vegetation, cultural resources, and 14. wildlife resources (species and habitat) were considered, and the proposed mitigation measures were found to be acceptable.
- In accordance with Executive Order 12898 on Environmental Justice, impacts to minority 15. and low-income populations and communities have been considered by the Regional NEPA Coordinator, as have impacts to Indian Trust Resources.

The proposed action will provide a permanent place for local residents to meet and conduct worship services.



The name of the corporation shall be Reaching Out with Christ's Kingdom Ministries, Inc.

The purpose for which this corporation is organized shall include any or all lawful affairs for which corporation may be incorporated under the Nonprofit Corporation Act, A.R.S. 10-3202 et seq., including, but not limited to, charitable and religious purposes and to bring honor and glory to our Lord Jesus Christ.

ARTICLE III



According to our conversation, the facility will be utilizing power and water from Navajo Tribal Utility Authorities (NTUA). Power and water lines are 1300 ft north of the proposed location. There are no sewer line within the area, but the facility will be installing a septic tank with a leach field.

Your request for a sanitary clearance for ROCK Ministries Mission is granted for the above location.

When you receive the architect blue print drawing for this facility, please submit your plans to our office for a plan review. The scope of this plan review is to identify environmental health and safety omission(s) from the plan set. It is the intent of this plan review to have required health and safety components included into the construction plans. The building should then be constructed as designed. The scope of this review does not include structural considerations such as roof snow loads and adequacy of foundation strength.
