### RESOLUTION OF THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

24<sup>TH</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - Fourth Year, 2022

### AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, AND BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEES; APPROVING A CHANGE IN CAP-35-18 FOR HOUCK CHAPTER BY APPROVING THE CHAPTER'S USE OF LEFTOVER FUNDS FOR MORE BATHROOM ADDITIONS AND NEW HOUSE WIRING PROJECTS, AND MOVING THE LEFTOVER FUNDING TO FUNDING YEAR 3

### BE IT APPROVED:

### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to exercise oversight authority over Chapter activities. 2 N.N.C. § 500(C).
- B. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of all funds, and to coordinate and review all fiscal, financial and investment activities of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 301(B)(2) and § 301(B)(5).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council approved Resolution No. CAP-35-18, titled: "Adopting the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan Pursuant to CD-68-14, as Amended by CJA-03-18, and 12 N.N.C. §\$ 2501-2508, as Amended: Waiving 12 N.N.C. §\$ 810(F), 820(I), And (M) And 860(C) Relating to the Capital Improvement Budget and the Capital Improvement Process." CAP-35-15 is incorporated herein by reference.
- D. Section 4(C) of CAP-35-18 specifically provides: "A chapter project, powerline, or waterline project may be changed, including the year funded, or added to Exhibits A through E with the concurrence of the Delegate representing the chapter's Council District and the approvals of the Resources and Development Committee and Budget and Finance Committee, as long as such project has been certified as construction-

ready by CPMD or NTUA and the total Sihasin Funding for the District does not exceed \$4,166,666.67."

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The amount of \$315,000 for the Houck Chapter's "Bathroom Additions" Project was approved in Exhibit D to CAP-35-18. The CAP-35-18 Exhibit D showing the Houck Chapter Project No. D-148 is attached hereto as **EXHIBIT 1**.
- B. The amount of \$353,278 for the Houck Chapter's "Powerline" Project was approved in Exhibit B to CAP-35-18. The CAP-35-18 Exhibit B showing the Houck Chapter Project No. B-26 is attached hereto as **EXHIBIT 2**.
- C. The Houck Chapter has leftover funds from both Projects, and wishes to use these funds (\$258,367.42) for more bathroom additions, and also for several new house wiring projects (\$21,544.88). The Chapter wishes to move all of its leftover funds from Funding Years 1 and 2, to Funding Year 3, for a total amount of \$279,912.30 that would be moved to Funding Year 3. The Houck Chapter resolutions explaining these change request are attached as **EXHIBIT 3**.
- D. On behalf of the Chapter, the Division of Community Development Capital Projects Management Department ("CPMD") has submitted a Síhasin Project Amendment Certification Form describing the Chapter's requested changes. **EXHIBIT 4.** The Síhasin Project Amendment Certification Form shows the signature of the Navajo Nation Council Delegate for the Houck Chapter, in accordance with CAP-35-18 Section 4(C).
- E. As required by CAP-35-18 Section 4(C), the project has been certified by CPMD as construction-ready and the total Sihasin funding for the Council District will not exceed \$4,166,666.67. In fact, the original Sihasin funding amount of \$315,000 for the Chapter's Bathroom Additions Project, and the original amount of \$353,278 for the Chapter's Powerline Project, both of which were approved in CAP-35-18, will remain unchanged.

### SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF CHANGE TO CAP-35-18

A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves a change to Resolution No. CAP-35-18, Exhibit D, Project No. D-148, by approving the

Houck Chapter's use of \$258,367.42 in leftover funds from Funding Years 1 and 2 for more bathroom additions, as shown in **EXHIBIT 4**.

- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves a change to Resolution No. CAP-35-18, Exhibit B, Project No. B-26, by approving the Houck Chapter's use of \$21,544.88 in leftover funds from Funding Years 1 and 2 for several new house wiring projects, as shown in **EXHIBIT 4**.
- C. The Navajo Nation also approves moving the Houck Chapter's leftover funds from Projects Nos. D-148 and B-26, from Funding Years 1 and 2 to Funding Year 3, with no change in the original funding amounts approved in CAP-35-18, as shown in the attached EXHIBIT 4.
- D. The Sihasin Fund may be reimbursed the funds reallocated herein, from funds available to the Navajo Nation from any and all state, federal, or other sources.

### SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Act shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. \$ 2505(A) and CAP-35-18, Section 4(C).

### SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this Act is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the provision(s) not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

The families residing within the sub-standard homes still have pit privies, haul water from untested community shallow wells, and from untreated community wells; and
- 6. Houck Chapter has left-over Sihasin funds available to complete the bathroom addition project for nine (9) individuals as listed, and to be added to the CPMD/DCD "Master Contract:

The families residing within the sub-standard homes still have pit privies, haul water from untested community shallow wells, and from untreated community wells; and
- 6. There are also left-over funds from the Powerline Extension Project in the amount of \$21,544.88, to be utilized for house-wiring for aging homes. Some of the existing homes were built in the year 1950, 1960's, causing unsafe wiring, is considered dangerous and old wiring is not equipped to withstand modern household power usage, which means it poses a greater risk of starting a fire. and;
- 7. The Bathroom Addition and Powerline Project are already funded and it will have a lifelong positive effect on the individuals who currently have no access to a bathroom and faulty house-wiring can be dangerous, sometimes causing the wiring to overheat. This project will assist the personal hygiene of the people be enhanced, but also a more safer and healthier environment will be created for the individuals.
