PURPOSE OF THIS LEGISLATION: to approve \$1,838,798 in UUFB funds for the 110 Chapters to bring their Emergency Fund accounts to the \$25,000 amount.

17	BE IT ENACTED:

19	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
20	A. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee ("BFC") as a Navajo	
21	Nation Council standing committee with the authority to recommend to the Navajo Nation	
22	Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 300(A) and 301(B)(2).	
23	B. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee ("RDC") as a	
24	Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such authorized RDC to oversee the Navajo	
25	Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164(A)(9), 500(A), and 501(C)(1).	
26	C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a standing committee	
27	that considers proposed legislation requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2	
28	N.N.C. §164(A)(9).	
29	D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation with the authority to	
30	approve supplemental appropriations. 2 N.N.C. §102(A) and 12 N.N.C. §820(L).	
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- A. The Navajo Nation Council may approve supplemental appropriations at any time during the fiscal year, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and are also determined to be in excess of the reserve amount required by §820(J). 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
- B. The Navajo Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance costs, from recurring revenues; and long-term debt shall not be used to pay for recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).
- C. The Navajo Nation "shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. §820(F).
- D. The Controller ("OOC") is responsible for designating what are recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
- E. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. §820(M).
- F. On behalf of the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, the Division of Community Development ("DCD") has submitted a Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary, dated August 6, 2021. With this form, DCD is requesting \$1,838,798 out of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to provide the 110 Chapters enough funds to replenish their Emergency Fund accounts back to the established amount of \$25,000. See Appendix K attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A**.
- G. A comprehensive list showing each Chapters' funding need is attached as **EXHIBIT B.** If the total requested amount of \$1,838,798 is approved by the Navajo Nation Council, different Chapters will receive different dollar amounts as shown in Exhibit B - but all 110 Chapters will end up with the same amount of \$25,000 in their Emergency Fund accounts.
- H. On behalf of the Chapters, DCD has provided the required Navajo Nation Budget Forms,

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attached as **EXHIBIT** C (3 pages total).

- I. The OOC has not yet reviewed this supplemental funding request for the amount of \$1,838,798 as required by 12 N.N.C. §820(L). However, the OOC has provided a memorandum dated August 20, 2021 regarding a previous DCD request for Chapters' emergency funds in the amount of \$1,685,344. **EXHIBIT D.** The OOC can present an updated memorandum with a review of this \$1,838,798 funding request, when this legislation is presented for consideration by the Navajo Nation Council. The Controller has identified the Chapters' emergency funding as non-recurring expenditures.
- J. The Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") has not yet reviewed this \$1,838,798 funding request, but the OMB can provide its memorandum, to satisfy the requirements in 12 N.N.C. §820(M), when this legislation is presented for consideration by the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$1,838,798 FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$1,838,798 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters Emergency Fund accounts. Each Chapter shall receive the designated dollar amount as shown in **EXHIBIT B**, so as to bring each Chapter's Emergency Fund account up to the established \$25,000 amount.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,838,798 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the OOC.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and with 2 N.N.C. §164(Λ)(17).

SECTION FIVE. SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any provision of this Act is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation or by any Navajo Nation District Court, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Act shall remain valid as the law of the Navajo Nation.

The Office of the Controller has reviewed the above referenced document.

- 1. The balance of the UUFB is \$25,786,238 as of June 30, 2021.
- 2. This request is for a total of \$1,685,344 to the Navajo Nation Chapters business units 108014 to 108123. This request is to secure Navajo Nation Chapters with financial resources for community emergency response. Currently the Navajo Nation is going through the 2022 budget process the forms being utilized state FY 2021 but the fiscal year term is 10/01/21 to 09/30/22 which is FY 2022.

Nation Chapters' Emergency Response plans in amount of \$1,838,798 from UUFB.

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M) requiring OMB reviewed the subject document and provides the following information:

- 1. The Exhibit 'A' Supplemental Fund Summary page is signed by DCD in early August, 2021, and it refers to 'flood relief for monsoon season. It seems the rainy season is over and perhaps winter snow and freezing will soon be the need. OMB recommends the document be updated.
- 2. The Appropriation Act, Section 820, O; Distributions to Chapter, provides guidance on this. The language is: "Where not otherwise prohibited by existing law, any appropriation intended for distribution to all chapters of the Navajo Nation shall be allocated as follows: fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation voters as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation...." As proposed, a waiver of this section may be required. DOJ should advise.
- 3. Some Chapters have deficit spending in FY 21; e.g. Churchrock (\$9,672.49), Crownpoint (\$11,434.93), Dilkon (\$46,801.68), Iyanbito (\$16,194.74), Thoreau (\$99,688.88). Additional funding would cover these deficits and leave a balance of \$25,000. How do these deficits occur and what controls are used to prevent this? It appears Chapters are allowed to go into deficit and the main government simply covers it.
- 4. Some Chapters have balances far exceeding the \$25,000 threshold amount; e.g. Forest Lake \$56,544, Lukachukai \$50,185, Tsaile/Wheatfields \$40,433, Counselors \$79,693, St. Michaels \$50,130, Beclabito \$56,866, Shiprock \$31,749, Red Valley \$62,518, Oljato \$69,299, and others.
- 5. The Office of Auditor General issued a Report (No. 21-29) on Chapters available balance as of 6/30/21. Some of the balances differ from Exhibit 'A'.

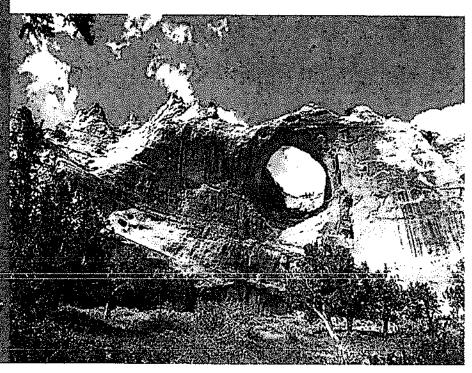

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to inform the Navajo Nation Council, chapter officials and the public on the chapter funds that contain balances at the end of quarter three of fiscal year 2021. The information contained in this report was obtained based on the methodology explained in Appendix A.

REPORT LIMITATIONS

The report provides information on the fund balances for 109 of the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. Information pertaining to Ramah Chapter was deemed unreliable and therefore excluded from this report.

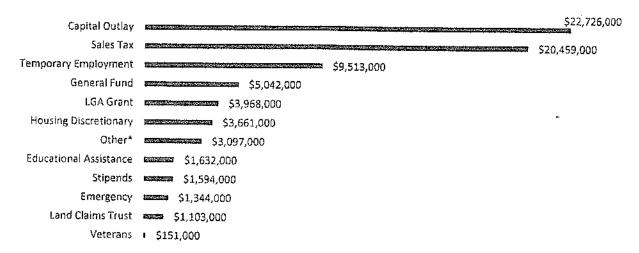
Secondly, the reported chapter fund balances are preliminary (unaudited) because our office did not verify the accuracy of the posted transactions in the chapters' accounting systems.

COMPILATION RESULTS

The 109 Chapters had \$74.3 million available to fund services to chapter community members as of June 30, 2021. The dollars consist of 12 major fund categories as illustrated on the bar chart.

For the Ramah Chapter, we contacted the Chapter to explain the discrepancy that resulted in their fund balances being omitted in this quarterly report. However, the Chapter was not able to address the issue before the issuance of this report. Once the issue is resolved, we hope to be back on track to provide a full report on chapter fund balances going forward.

Lastly, this report does not provide real-time (immediate) information of the chapter fund balances as our current process is limited in obtaining such information. There are financial and technology challenges that need to be considered but we continue to explore other cost-feasible options on how to improve our process.

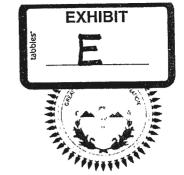

Legislation No. 0206-21: Division of Community Development Budget for 110 Navajo

Nation Chapters' Emergency Response plans in amount of \$1,838,798 from UUFB.

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M) requiring OMB reviewed the subject document and provides the following information:

- I. The Exhibit 'A' Supplemental Fund Summary page is signed by DCD in early August, 2021, and it refers to 'flood relief for monsoon season. It seems the rainy season is over and perhaps winter snow and freezing will soon be the need. OMB recommends the document be updated.
- 2. The Appropriation Act, Section 820, O; Distributions to Chapter, provides guidance on this. The language is: "Where not otherwise prohibited by existing law, any appropriation intended for distribution to all chapters of the Navajo Nation shall be allocated as follows: fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation voters as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation...." As proposed, a waiver of this section may be required. DOJ should advise.
- 3. Some Chapters have deficit spending in FY 21: e.g. Churchrock (\$9,672.49), Crownpoint (\$11,434.93), Dilkon (\$46,801.68), Iyanbito (\$16,194.74), Thoreau (\$99,688.88). Additional funding would cover these deficits and leave a balance of \$25,000. How do these deficits occur and what controls are used to prevent this? It appears Chapters are allowed to go into deficit and the main government simply covers it.
- 4. Some Chapters have balances far exceeding the \$25,000 threshold amount; e.g. Forest Lake \$56,544, Lukachukai \$50,185, Tsaile/Wheatfields \$40,433, Counselors \$79,693, \$t. Michaels \$50,130, Beclabito \$56,866, Shiprock \$31,749, Red Valley \$62,518, Oljato \$69,299, and others.
- 5. The Office of Auditor General issued a Report (No. 21-29) on Chapters available balance as of 6/30/21. Some of the balances differ from Exhibit 'A'.

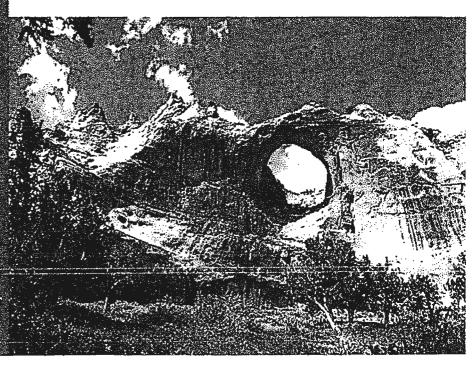

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to inform the Navajo Nation Council, chapter officials and the public on the chapter funds that contain balances at the end of quarter three of fiscal year 2021. The information contained in this report was obtained based on the methodology explained in Appendix A.

REPORT LIMITATIONS

The report provides information on the fund balances for 109 of the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. Information pertaining to Ramah Chapter was deemed unreliable and therefore excluded from this report.

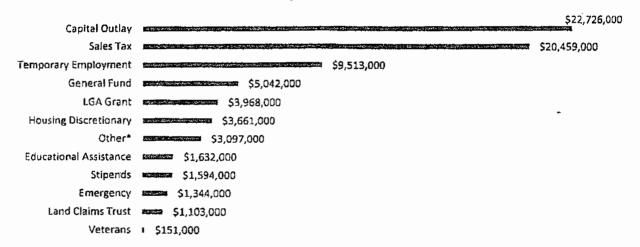
Secondly, the reported chapter fund balances are preliminary (unaudited) because our office did not verify the accuracy of the posted transactions in the chapters' accounting systems.

COMPILATION RESULTS

The 109 Chapters had \$74.3 million available to fund services to chapter community members as of June 30, 2021. The dollars consist of 12 major fund categories as illustrated on the bar chart.

For the Ramah Chapter, we contacted the Chapter to explain the discrepancy that resulted in their fund balances being omitted in this quarterly report. However, the Chapter was not able to address the issue before the issuance of this report. Once the issue is resolved, we hope to be back on track to provide a full report on chapter fund balances going forward.

Lastly, this report does not provide real-time (immediate) information of the chapter fund balances as our current process is limited in obtaining such information. There are financial and technology challenges that need to be considered but we continue to explore other cost-feasible options on how to improve our process.

WHEREAS:

- 1. Casamero Lake is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation established and recognized by the Navajo Nation Council as a foundation of the Navajo Nation government vested with the authority to plan and implement projects in the best interest of the community. See generally 2 N.N.C. §4021 et seq. And 26 N.N.C. S103, and
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. S102 (A), the Navajo Nation Council is governing body of the Navajo Nation; and By resolution CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council approved the "Local Governance Act" wherein the Navajo Nation Council delegated governmental authority to the Chapters of the Navajo Nation to address matters of local concern with Navajo law, custom and tradition; and
- 3. The Casamero Lake Chapter recognizes the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency related to the novel coronavirus ("COVID-19") outbreak on January 31, 2020; and the World Health Organization declared a global pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020; and

The Casamero Lake Chapter recognizes the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the concurrence of Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, declared a Public Health State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation on March 11, 2020 due to COVID-19 in Resolution No. CEM 20-03-11. The Navajo Nation Department of Health has subsequently issued numerous Public Health Emergency Orders. Public Health Emergency Orders 2020-001 through 2021-02 ("Public Health Emergency Orders") are incorporated by reference into this resolution; and

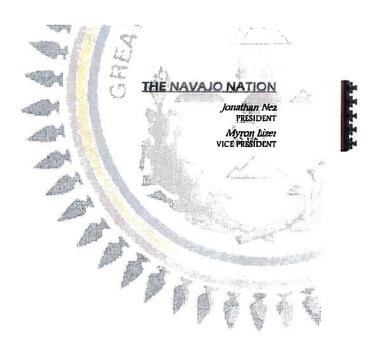

Dear Honorable 24th Navajo Nation Council, President Nez, and Vice-President Lizer,

The Dilkon Chapter supports this legislation to reimburse the chapters for funds expended during the COVID-19 pandemic for emergency services to community members, and the replenishment of emergency funds in the amount of \$25,000.00 to all chapters.

The Dilkon Chapter remained open during the entire year helping community members of District 7 and District 5 Chapters. The majority of the Navajo Nation offices, including the Division of Community Development (DCD), the Dilkon Administrative Services Center (ASC), and some District 7 and 5 Chapters, closed down and did not deliver any services. Below is a summary of what the Dilkon Chapter accomplished when other services were shut down.

- The Dilkon Chapter remained open to assist the Community Health Representatives (CHR) and the Public Health Nurses (PHN) who were closely monitoring and servicing elders, individuals under doctor's care, or were sick from the virus.
- There was no other help available to provide water, food, and supplies so Dilkon Chapter stepped up to assist. The Chapter did not limit these services to only Dilkon Chapter members.
- Dilkon Chapter officials and staff developed a plan to cover specific areas of Dilkon that was close to
 their home location. We then made home visits and provided contact information and health related
 documents to the families to refer to if they got sick. We provided follow up home visits to families
 who needed help, such as, food, water, PPEs, firewood, pellets, blankets, jackets, children or baby food,
 milk, and other miscellaneous supplies.
- We coordinated with Dilkon Community School (DCS) and the Navajo Hopi Covid-19 Relief Fund (NHCRF) organization to distribute food to all and any community members who needed food a total of 27 times.

- Dilkon Chapter coordinated with Dig Deep, Inc. and the Winslow Indian Health Care Center (WIHCC) to distribute water to community members within District 7 and 5 using our water trucks and water from our watering point. Some of the chapters were either closed or were only allowing registered chapter members from their chapter to obtain water from their watering points. We purchased a water trailer and tank to haul water to the most remote locations, where the water trucks were previously unable to deliver water due to the poor road conditions.
- The Dilkon Chapter officials and staff made several more home visits to complete surveys and to check on the health of the people. We relayed this information to WIHCC to help them maintain updated information on their patients. We also worked closely with WIHCC and the CHRs to deliver firewood to the elders and medically-in-need patients and any other supplies, if approved and needed.
- The Dilkon Chapter provided direct services to community members from other chapters, people from various parts of Arizona and many from out of state to complete the Navajo Nation Hardship Application. We hosted many Hardship Application drives with English and Navajo speakers to ensure everyone had the opportunity to apply.
- COVID-19 testing services were available weekly at the chapter. PPE and cleaning supply distributions
 were available at the chapter during the week and weekends. These services were coordinated with
 other resources.
- Dilkon Chapter's postal services increased as community members began to depend on Internet orders and online work. This brought in more packages and mail daily which was overwhelming yet necessary for families to maintain their house hold needs and employment. This also necessitated the office to be open daily. The Chapter worked with a local business to move the postal services there as they were open daily from 7 am to 7pm thus making it easier for community members to pick up their packages.
- The Dilkon Chapter's support to WIHCC was very successful in keeping the COVID-19 numbers down within their service unit area. Providing direct services to the families kept them home and safe.

The emergency expenditure of Dilkon Chapter was submitted through the CARES Chapter Expenditure Budget however all the expenditures and supporting documents were removed and only supplies (did not include requested wood or wood pellets) were delivered to Dilkon Chapter. No CARES funds were provided so the Dilkon Chapter funds were expended and not reimbursed by the CARES fund, which negatively affected other chapter funds and the FY21 budget. Furthermore, the Dilkon Chapter submitted all the personnel cost for reimbursement and none of those expenditures were reimbursed either. The amount of work that it took to complete the reimbursement request did not amount to anything.

This pandemic was a hardship for everyone however the Dilkon Chapter accepted the responsibility to continue providing essential services to the Southwest Navajo Nation. This Legislation will reimburse the Dilkon Chapter in the amount of \$46,802.00 and provide an additional \$25,000.00 for future emergency services. We ask to approve Legislation 0206-21 without Amendments and Line-Item Vetoes.
