PURPOSE: This resolution if approved will approve \$3,000,000 million dollars to be distributed amongst the Navajo Nation Chapter Veteran Organizations.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed legislation in detail.

UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION
DOLLARS (\$3,000,000) TO THE NAVAJO NATION CHAPTER VETERAN
ORGANIZATIONS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY

A. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), “[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J).”

SECTION 2. FINDINGS

A. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), a proposed resolution that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee before it is heard by the Navajo Nation Council.

1 B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C)(1)(3) and (4) the Budget and Finance Committee is
2 authorized to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the
3 Nation's financial resources.

4 C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (C)(1), the Resources and Development Committee
5 exercises oversight authority over chapter activities for the purpose providing
6 additional funding for programs such as, the Navajo Veterans Organization.

7 D. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

8 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), all requests for annual operating funds and
9 supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and
10 Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. A preview of the appropriation
11 legislation is available to the OMB for their budget impact analysis response.

12 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional
13 sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue
14 projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo
15 Nation Council. The attached memorandum, Exhibit A, from the Office of
16 the Controller has identified the additional revenues.

17 E. The Navajo veteran population on the Navajo Nation is approximately 12,400. *See*
18 www.gpo.gov.

19 F. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(O), *any appropriation intended for distribution to all*
20 *chapters of the Navajo Nation shall be allocated as follows: fifty percent (50%) of the*
21 *appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty*
22 *percent (50%) shall be divided proportionally among the chapters using a percentage*
23 *equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to*
24 *the whole of registered Navajo Nation voters as determined by the most current voter*
25 *registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation. See Exhibit B*
26 *(Program Budget Summary); See also Exhibit C (Funding allocation).*

27 G. Several resolutions in support of the three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to assist all
28 110 chapters facing funding shortfalls and are limited in assisting Navajo veterans
29 within their prospective chapters. *See Exhibit D (Resolution Fort Defiance Agency*
30 *Council); See also Exhibit E (Resolution District #14 Council, Fort Defiance*

Agency); *See also* Exhibit F (Resolution Tohatchi Veterans Organization); *See also* Exhibit G (Resolution of Tohatchi Chapter).

- H. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to appropriate three million dollars (\$3,000,000), under 12 N.N.C. § 820(O), to the 110 chapters to provide additional funding to the Navajo Veterans Organization to assist Navajo veterans.

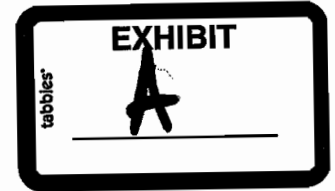
SECTION 3. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION DOLLARS (\$3,000,000) FOR THE NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS

- A. The Navajo Nation, having received certification by the Office of the Controller of the availability of certain funds from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) for supplemental appropriation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for Navajo Nation Chapters, to be distributed pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(O), and as further described in program budget documents attached as Exhibit B; to provide additional funding to the 110 chapters for the Veterans Organization.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) shall be to Business Unit Numbers as identified in Exhibit B, and from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the UUFB.

Subject: Financial Update-(General Fund Revenue, Expenditures, UUFB)

The gross General Fund Revenues, (see Exhibit "A"), as of September 21, 2016 is \$209,199,483, (see Footnote 1). The total General Fund set asides is \$52,855,907 (Footnote 2). The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$156,343,576(see Footnote 3), which is 95.69% of the projection. Please note that the General Fund budget for FY 16 is set at \$172,654,000, (Footnote 4), the General Fund revenue projection is \$163,384,000, and the other amount to cover the General Fund budget is coming from the Tax Suspense Fund in the gross amount of \$13, 000,000. This schedule shows the \$13,000,000 transfer from the Sales Tax Trust Fund, (Footnote 5) and the set asides.

Next, are the total expenditures by Branch, (see Exhibit "B"), as of September 21, 2016. The Legislative Branch has expenditures of \$14,454,602(see Footnote 1a); encumbrances of \$919,643(see Footnote 1b) with a remaining budget of \$3,707,113(see Footnote 1c). The Executive Branch expenditures are \$157,173,286(see Footnote 2a); encumbrances are \$9,803,379(see Footnote 2b) with a remaining budget of \$27,571,194(see Footnote 2c). The Judicial Branch expenditures are \$12,265,364(see Footnote 3a); with encumbrances of \$149,533(see Footnote 3b) and remaining budget of \$1,714,555(see Footnote 3c). Total General Fund expenditures are \$183,893,252(see Footnote 4a); total encumbrances are \$10,872,555(see Footnote 4b) with an overall remaining budget of \$32,992,862(see Footnote 4c).

The updated Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB), (see Exhibit "C") as of September 21, 2016 is \$7,010,037. There are pending legislations that will reduce the amount to \$3,186,195 if passed.

The Tohatchi Chapter and Community recognizes that the Navajo Nation Council and the Office of the President need to acknowledge and recognize that any appropriation of three (3) Million Dollars or less is insufficient in the meeting the needs to be provided to assist the Navajo Nation Veterans effectively; and




- One million dollar appropriation divided and to all 110 chapters = \$9,000.00 per chapter. Estimating (90) Ninety veterans per chapter would equal assistance to (1) one veteran per year = \$100.00.
 - Two Million Dollar appropriation divided and to all 110 = \$18,000.00 per chapter. Estimating (90) Ninety Veterans per chapter would equal assistance to one (1) veteran per year = \$200.00 per veteran assistance.
 - Three Million Dollar appropriation divided and to all 110 = \$27,000.00 per chapter. Estimating (90) Ninety Veterans per chapter would equal assistance to one (1) veteran per year = \$300.00 per veteran assistance.

The Office of Management & Budget (OMB) has reviewed the proposed legislation and provides the following:

1. The Navajo Nation Veterans Administration (NNVA) received the following amounts for Fiscal Year 2017:

1) NNVA General Fund	\$1,511,182
2) NNVA Loan Program Proprietary Fund	\$12,000
3) NNVA Trust Fund - Chapter Veteran Organizations	\$3,516,353
4) NNVA Trust Fund - Housing Projects	<u>\$4,355,500</u>
Total:	\$9,395,035
2. Currently, the veterans funding is administered by the Veterans Administration which is now under the Office of President/Vice President (OPVP). OPVP should be consulted on this proposal.
3. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820 (L) "Upon notification from the Controller of additional project funds, the Budget and Finance Committee may convene budget hearings for the purpose of hearing and considering request for supplemental appropriation". The memorandum attached is dated September 21, 2016 and does not include recent supplemental allocations. The Office of the Controller has not completed the financial close for FY 2016, so the current FY 2017 UUFB amount is not known at this time. The Navajo Nation Council should consider deferring all supplemental proposals at this time until the balance of the UUFB is known.
4. The proposed legislation seeks appropriation for the 110 Chapters. All Chapters are budgeted within the Executive Branch under the Division of Community Development,. Further, the FY 2017 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XIV.B.2 and C, requires Branch Chief Recommendations. There are no recommendations provided in the legislation.
5. Budget Forms 1 and 2 should have the required signatures of the Administrative Service Center (ASC) program manager and the Division of Community Development to comply with the Fiscal Year 2017 Budget Instructions Manual page 22, Part V: Program Budget Summary form and on page 25, Part IV: Program Budget Summary.



A completed Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary should be included with the budget package and the form requires the signature of the NNVA program manager and the Executive Branch Chief or representative.
