TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$3,000,000 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE ("UUFB") FOR 110 CHAPTERS' EMERGENCY FUND ACCOUNTS; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) AND § (F)

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will appropriate \$3,000,000 from the UUFB for 110 Chapters' Emergency Fund Accounts using the 50/50 formula.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review the proposed resolution in detail.

AUTHORITY. 18 A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A). 19 As such, the Council may consider emergency legislation. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16). 20 "[M]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement 21 services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required 22 as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the 23 sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing 24 public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the 25 Council." 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16). 26 B. As the governing body of the Navajo Nation, the Council may approve supplemental 27 appropriations during the fiscal year. "Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within 28 the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and 29 beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess 30

29 30 of the reserve amount set forth at §820(J)." 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

- C. A "supplemental appropriation" is defined as: "[a]n appropriation of funds from the UUFB during the fiscal year, outside of the annual Comprehensive Budget Process." See Section XIV.33 of the FY2023 Budget Instructions Manual.
- D. The Title 12 restrictions on supplemental appropriations from the UUFB include:
 - 1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues, and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. §820(E) and §820(F).
 - 2. Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. §820(J) and §820(L).
 - 3. UUFB funds may be used only after the Controller determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues are added to the UUFB account. 12 N.N.C. §820(F).
 - 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(F) and 880.
 - 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller. Such review is also required because the Controller determines which revenues and expenses are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
 - 6. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Due to the dangerously high temperatures encountered throughout the Navajo Nation recently, the Commission on Emergency Management issued CEM-23-07-25, DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION DUE TO EXTREME HEAT, attached as Exhibit A.
- B. In addition to the extreme heat, the monsoon season is fast approaching and the Navajo Nation has historically faced dangerous flooding this time period. All 110 Navajo Nation

D. The Controller's memorandum required by 12 N.N.C. §820(L), attached as Exhibit E,

indicates that the proposed expenditures are considered "recurring" expenses; therefore, a

waiver of 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) and (F) is required to effectuate this supplemental

E. The Office of Management and Budget has provided a budget impact analysis, as required

F. This legislation is offered as an emergency measure because of the current "pressing public

need" for this funding for all 110 Chapters. These funds will enable Chapters to provide local

services to quickly mitigate dire weather-related emergencies and prevent potential disasters,

A. The Appropriations Act states that "[t]he Nation shall budget all recurring operating

expenses, including maintenance of capital facilities, from recurring revenues" and that

"[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures." 12

SECTION THREE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) AND § 820 (F) CHAPTERS

pursuant to the 50/50 formula mandated by 12 N.N.C. § 820(O).

C. On behalf of the 110 Chapters, the Division of Community Development submitted a

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING EMERGENCY FUNDS FOR CHAPTERS

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$3,000,000 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. Each Chapter shall receive the designated dollar amount as shown in **Exhibit D**, in accordance with 12 N.N.C. §820(O).
- B. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(J), this UUFB appropriation shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund reserve balance in the UUFB as determined by the Controller.
- C. As provided in 12 N.N.C. §820(N), as amended by CD-72-22, the UUFB funds approved herein shall not lapse at the end of Fiscal Year 2023, so long as each Chapter budgets these funds in the subsequent fiscal year for the same emergency purposes.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and with 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(17).

SECTION FIVE. SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any provision of this Action is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation or by any Navajo Nation District Court, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall remain valid as the law of the Navajo Nation.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COMMISSION ON EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION DUE TO EXTREME HEAT

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§ 881 and 883 (A) (C), the Navajo Nation Council established the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management to coordinate emergency and disaster relief service by Navajo Nation and non-tribal entities in conjunction with the Department of Emergency Management; and to recommend to the Navajo Nation Council legislation or other appropriate activity regarding natural and man-made emergencies; and
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 884 (B) (1), the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management is responsible for declaring a state of emergency with the concurrence of the President of the Navajo Nation; and
- Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 884 (B) (2), the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management will assist in seeking
 assistance from federal, state, and other tribal governments, local and private agencies to address emergency and disaster
 related situations; and
- 4. Unprecedented heat extremes have impacted the Navajo Nation, including regional areas throughout the southwest, where above average temperatures have been documented since the onset of summer, with National Weather Service predictions of record-breaking heat in the Four Corners Area through the week ending July 27, 2023; and
- 5. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), National Weather Service Climate Prediction Center's probabilistic outlook of changes in average maximum temperatures expected in the next month, indicates that one of the hallmarks associated with the ongoing heat event affecting the southern tier of the U.S. this summer has been its endurance, and regrettably that aspect looks to change very little heading into late July and early August, with High risk hazard of excessive heat for portions of the Southwest, Southern Rockies, and Southern High Plains, towards the end of July. (https://www.cpc.ncep.noaa.gov/products/predictions/threats/threats.php); and
- 6. Heat extreme events present risks to human health and well -being of people, ecosystems, agriculture, property, livestock, pets, infrastructure, homes, roads, heat dries up sources of surface water for wildlife, potential for wildland fires increases, and existing drought conditions become exacerbated from extreme heat conditions; and
- 7. Vulnerable populations at most risk to heat-related illness are older adults, infants, children, people with chronic medical conditions, pregnant individuals, outdoor workers, athletes, low-income communities and households lacking economic resources to seek and acquire access to adequate heat mitigation measures (CDC Climate & Health Program Heat & Health Tracker); and

8. Individuals, communities, and the Navajo Nation government have some adaptive measures to mitigate extreme heat, but the adaptive measures vary. and additional cross-sectoral collaboration is needed to meet the burgeoning necessity to address heat related impacts, risks, and vulnerabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- That the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management declares a State of Emergency for the Navajo Nation due to extreme heat; and
- 2. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management finds it necessary for appropriate Navajo Nation entities to continue and/or immediately begin cross-sectoral collaboration with relevant entities for use of resources to address extreme heat, including assessments, and identifying areas of impact most in need, coordinating implementation of heat health action plans, and continue to seek solutions to meet the needs of the Navajo Nation; and
- The Navajo Nation shall activate available emergency resources such as community education, assistance, and other
 means as determined fit and feasible to mitigate heat-related impacts for the duration of prolonged and excessively hot
 weather throughout the Navajo Nation; and
- This State of Emergency Declaration will remain in effect through August 31, 2023 unless otherwise extended, modified, or terminated.

- 1. OMB reviewed the Budget Forms and finds the following errors to the subtotals for each agency. The correct amounts are: Chinle \$396,910; Eastern \$782,491; Ft. Defiance \$737,273; Shiprock \$570,081. Western \$513,242. The Grand Total is \$2,999,997.
- Pursuant to resolution CJA-03-23 signed by the President on January 27, 2023, the 110
 Chapters received a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$3,000,000 for
 emergencies. So, if approved a total of \$6 million would be allocated to Chapters in
 addition to carryover balances.
- 3. The Chapter's carryovers and current expenditures and balances should be considered. The DCD and, in the past, the Office of Auditor General used to issue periodic reports. These balances should be a factor in consideration of this proposal.
