- C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the State of New Mexico.
- D. New Mexico Senate Bill 196: State-Tribal Collaboration Act sought to enhance the government-to government relationship between Indian nations and the state agencies.
- E. On December 17, 2009, the New Mexico Department of Health adopted the State-Tribal Consultation, Collaboration and Communication Policy which sought to improve government-to-government relationships with the Indian nations.
- F. New Mexico Senator Howie C. Morales introduced Senate Bill 79, relating to making an appropriation to the Department of Health to fund County and Tribal Health Councils' efforts to identify and address local communities' health needs. EXHIBIT A.

- G. New Mexico Senate Bill 79 proposes to appropriate nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) from the general fund to the department of health to fund county and tribal health councils' local communities health needs. EXHIBIT A.
