**PURPOSE:** This resolution, if approved, will approve supplemental funding from the unreserved, undesignated fund balance (UUFB) in the amount of \$19.112.74 to replenish the Tsé Lichii' Chapter Emergency Funds Account Number 17-6806 which had been designated for the ALERT building for the Tsé Lichii' Chapter Community. The \$19,112.74 was used to repair the chapter's sewer system.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

21	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to 2	
22	N.N.C. § 102 (A); and	
23	B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), a proposed resolution that requires final action by	
24	the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee before it	
25	is heard by the Navajo Nation Council; and	
26	C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C)(1)(3) and (4) the Budget and Finance Committee is	
27	authorized to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the

- E. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for budget impact analysis, which was done on March 31, 2015. The OMB budget analysis is attached as Exhibit C; and
- F. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), the Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, (1) if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set for in § 820(J) or (2) when the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance is in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J); and
- G. The \$19,112.74 from the Tsé Lichii' Chapter Emergency Funds Account Number 17-6806 which had been designated for the ALERT building for the Tsé Lichii' Chapter Community was used to repair the chapter's sewer system. An Executive Summary explaining the broken sewer pipes and the emergency situation that arose is attached as Exhibit D. A letter dated March 5, 2015 from the President of Tsé Lichii' Chapter is attached as Exhibit E. Tsé Lichii' Chapter resolution number RRC-016-2015-027 approving the use of Account No. 17 Emergency Fund is attached as Exhibit F. Expenses for the repair of the broken sewer line are attached as Exhibit G. The Sewer Pipe Line Repair Ledger is attached as Exhibit H. A February 19, 2015 Emergency Meeting to discuss the broken sewer pipeline was held and the agenda, attendance sheet, and minutes are attached as Exhibit I. The Office of Environmental Health/Code Enforcement Order of Closure is attached as Exhibit J.
- H. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest to approve Supplemental Appropriations to replenish the Tsé Lichii' Chapter Emergency Funds Account Number 17-6806 which had been designated for the ALERT building for the Tsé Lichii' Chapter Community.

SECTION 2. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF

#### \$19,112.74 TO REPLENISH THE TSÉ LICHII' CHAPTER EMERGENCY FUNDS ACCOUNT NUMBER 17-0806

- A. The Navajo Nation Council, having received certification by the Office of the Controller, attached as Exhibit B, of the availability of certain funds from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) for supplemental appropriation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation of \$19,112.74 for the Tsé Lichii' Chapter to replenish the Chapter's Alert Building funds which were used to repair the Chapter's sewer line, as further described in budget documents attached as Exhibit A.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$19,112.74 shall be to Tsé Lichii' Chapter Emergency Funds Account Number 17-6806 and from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the UUFB.



The Office of Management and Budget has reviewed the above referenced document. Upon review of the proposed supplemental proposal, OMB notes the following;

- 1. The Office of the Controller, by memorandum dated March 2, 2015, states there is an available Undesignated, Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) of \$18,299,774. However, there was an additional appropriation made by the Navajo Nation Council since then as follows: Resolution CMA-06-15 in the amount of \$317,891 for a Special Election with a revised UUFB balance of \$17,981,883.
- 2. Per Navajo Nation Council resolution CAP-18-14, the Chapters' Infrastructure Improvement Priority Projects Listing was approved, how does this project fit into the Five Year C.I.P. Plan? The Appropriations Act, Title 12, Section 820, (I), states that all capital improvement budget requests shall be in compliance with the Capital Plan and shall not be approved if it is not.
- 3. The Division of Community Development should provide current Chapter balances because some Chapters appear to have sufficient balances to fund these needs.
- 4. The proposed Budget Form 1 needs correction. The budget fund type in Part III should reflect "1" for general funds since the proposed funding source is the UUFB. The proposed Budget Form 2 also needs corrections as the proposed funding will be for the last 2 quarters only.

OMB recommends that the above mentioned concerns be addressed before the proposal is further reviewed or considered. If you have any questions contact OMB at (928) 871-6571.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Tse'Lichii Chapter is respectfully requesting the recover of funds spent on a broken sewer pipeline repair from the honorable 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council in the amount of \$19,112.74 from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) to be returned to Tse'Lichii Chapter's Emergency Funds Account #17-6806, which had been prior designated as a matching fund for the purchase of an ALERT building for the community. This was an abrupt, untimely, and difficult incident that disrupted the critical services and operations of Tse'Lichii Chapter. The chapter president released a resolution declaring an emergency for Tse'Lichii Chapter. Funds to repair the broken sewer pipeline in the amount of \$19,112.74 was approved by the chapter president after incessant requests for funds from various tribal agencies proved unsuccessful.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On February 9, 2015, the Office of Environmental Health (OEH) shut down the Tse'Lichii Chapter compound after determining that it posed an immediate health hazard to the health and welfare of the staff, visitors, children, and facility users. The main sewer pipeline had broken over the weekend, discharging raw sewage and wastewater into a nearby arroyo. The bank of this arroyo gave way and the weight of the collapse severed the main sewer pipeline. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) shut off the water supply to the chapter compound facilities and to neighboring homes in accordance to Title 40 of the Code of Federal Register §122.1(b), the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Program. These closures are in effect until complete repairs have been made to the chapter's broken sewer system and repairs must meet federal EPA standards. Failure to comply will result in levied fines, revocation of sanitation permits, and perpetual shutdown of all facilities. Tse'Lichii Chapter, is therefore, respectfully requesting the recover of funds spent on a broken sewer pipeline repair from the honorable 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council in the amount of \$19,112.74 from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance.

#### **ADVERSE IMPACTS**

The repercussions of the chapter facilities shutdown seriously impacted the Tse'Lichii Chapter, the community, the Head Start program, the Senior Citizens Center, and

neighboring homes. The Head Start program serves 34 children and the closure is going into its fifth week, severely disrupting the learning progress of all the children at Tse'Lichii Head Start. Parents are concerned that their children are falling behind academically and may not be fully prepared for kindergarden. Head Start is concerned that they will not meet the 45-day criteria for dental, vision, and hearing screenings for their children. In addition, they may also be falling behind on their child contact days criteria.

The Tse'Lichii Senior Center has been transporting a few seniors to Bááháálí or Chichiltah Chapters for meals and services, however, these transport vans have very limited capacity. Meals are being served and delivered from Chichiltah's Senior Center on a daily basis. These host chapters are being inundated by Tse'Lichii's seniors and Tse'Lichii's program is dealing with unexpected costs, which are rapidly putting a strain on their limited budget. Some seniors have not been fed adequately since the senior center had been shutdown. This creates a potential serious health risk for high-risk senior patients.

All public services provided by the Tse'Lichii Chapter to its community had been suspended since it was shutdown on February 9. There has been no public meetings or events since the closure. The chapter was unable to provide vital assistance to its community during the most critical, cold-winter weeks. Daily chapter operations were disrupted and all services had been halted, including firewood distribution. Water had been shut-off to the home of a 90 year old grandma with varied health problems. She is absolutely dependent on a reliable, clean water source for her portable oxygen concentrator machine and for sanitation purposes. Other community members with similar health problems and limited mobility have also been seriously impacted by the water shutdown. It is on behalf of all these citizens that Tse'Lichii Chapter is respectfully requesting the recover of funds spent on a broken sewer pipeline repair from the honorable 23rd Navajo Nation Council in the amount of \$19,112.74 from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance.

#### REQUEST FOR RECOVERY OF EMERGENCY FUNDS

To no avail, Tse'Lichii Chapter incessantly requested funds from various tribal and federal agencies to help cover the costs for repairs made to their broken sewer pipeline. The Navajo Head Start (NHS) program funds had recently gone through sequestration and

budgets had already been set for fiscal year 2015, thus, NHS did not have any funds available to assist Tse'Lichii Chapter's sewer line repair costs. Likewise, the Indian Health Services (IHS) and the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) both denied fiscal assistance for repairs. The Senior Citizens Center also had no available funds to contribute. Furthermore, the Navajo Department of Emergency Management could not help fund Tse'Lichii Chapter either since their services are more focused on cataclysmic events and not sewer line breakages, no matter how severe.

Therefore, Tse'Lichii Chapter is respectfully requesting the recover of funds spent on a broken sewer pipeline repair from the honorable 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council in the amount of \$19,112.74 from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance to be returned to Tse'Lichii Chapter's Emergency Funds Account #17-6806, which had been prior designated as a matching fund for the purchase of an ALERT building for the community. The Tse'Lichii Chapter President released a resolution declaring an emergency for Tse'Lichii Chapter. Funds to repair the broken sewer pipeline in the amount of \$19,112.74 was approved by the chapter president after incessant requests for funds from various tribal agencies proved unsuccessful. Supporting resolutions were also passed by all seven chapters within the District 6 Joint Council, requesting the recover of funds spent on a broken sewer pipeline repair from the honorable 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council in the amount of \$19,112.74 from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance. We respectfully ask the honorable 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council to act accordingly.

Let this letter serve as a support for the Honorable Seth Damon, District 6 Council Delegate to legislate the reimbursement/replenishment of funds request by Tse'Lichii' Chapter; the Tse'Lichii' Chapter utilized its account #17-Emergency Fund to do repair work to the sewage pipe breakage at the main manhole crossing the Breadsprings Wash just east of the Chapter house that serves waste water to the Chapter and its resource programs.

The Tse'Lichii' Chapter recently encountered a sewer pipe breakage that caused the Chapter and its resource programs to be shut down for business by the Office of Environmental Health (OEH) on February 9, 2015 and since then the repair was completed by NTUA and waiting for OEH/EPA to approve to reopen the Chapter for business; the Chapter has to be open for business to provide community services to its community on a daily basis without any interruption and in this case it was necessary for closure for reason an emergency situation aroused at the Chapter compound that created shut off with clean water, waste water that became an issue in protecting the health of the community.

The Tse'Lichii' Chapter receives its Fiscal Year Annual Distribution from the Navajo Nation Government with restrictions for expenditures and the Tse'Lichii' Chapter utilized its Emergency Fund to repair the sewer lagoon breakage – to replenish the expenditures made by the Chapter in an emergency situation with its limited funds it is only fair to have the Chapter look to the Navajo Nation Government to request for assistance to replenish the Chapter's Emergency Fund account in the amount of \$19,112.74.

Therefore, the Tse'Lichii' Chapter is issuing a letter of support to the 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council requesting for a reimbursement/replenishment of the funds used to repair its sewer pipe breakage – copies of expenditures and approved resolution by the Chapter membership are attached for supporting documents.

Your favorable decision on behalf of the Chapter would surely be beneficial to the community membership of the Tse'Lichii' Chapter. Thank you in advanced the Honorable 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council for all the hard work that you do with respect for the voting membership of the Navajo Nation.





Thomas Bayle, NTUA said that they can work on it, with the help of NECA. Installing temporary septic tank for the chapter. But the Chapter needs to provide the septic tank service cleaning. And will need the estimate cost of the service.

Lociano Diaz, Septic Service- Good Morning, thank you for inviting me to this meeting, I'm from Diaz Septic service and the owner. We can work with the chapter in cleaning out the septic tank that is being installed. We work a 24/7 bases. The cost will be \$150.00 every time we pump.

Delores Lorreto, OEH- The chapter needs to lower down on the chapter usage, and have the Senior Center only have eat twice a week at the chapter, and eat at another chapter.

Anderson Lee, CSC- I have a question for OEH, we have community members that want to use the chapter for emergency meeting for a family donation meeting. The chapter is asking if they can use the meeting room for these kind of meeting that pertain to emergencies. Due to the chapter closure community members are calling the chapter for assistance and the younger generation are calling and cussing out my assistant and AMS.

Delores Loretto, OEH- OEH needs to know how many people are living in the three (3) homes that had their water shut off. OEH is willing to work with the chapter, on the sewer pipeline issue or if the chapter does decide to put in the temporary septic tank. And as far as the chapter meeting room being open to the public, the chapter has to remain close to the public for health reasons, the OEH is very concern about issues like this. And have to follow guide lines and laws.

Thomas Bayle, NTUA-The temporary septic tank maybe the best way for the chapter right now. I have made phones calls to four corners, they have a large septic tank that can hold 6,000 gallons, and total cost of the four (4) septic tanks over the phone call is \$7,000. As far as the construction I have talked with OEH/NECA, Shiprock Office to see if they can do the construction and donate their time, but as of today I have not received a response back from them.

Evert Bigthumb, OEH- I wanted to see the problem of the pipeline breakage, but as I seen the photos, I think that NTUA should fix it, as temporary fixing.

Environmental protection Agency, Window Rock-We (EPA) have a booklet here that will need to be looked at by the chapter. This has the guidelines that chapter needs before they decide to put in the septic tanks. The chapter septic tank needs a permit forehand. Also how long will the chapter be using the temporary septic tank? Is it for 12 months? The Engineers proposal that we received doesn't have the pipeline of the chapter and the residences on the plans of the proposal.

Thomas Bayles- The pipelines of the chapter, from my understanding will be using the same pipelines, that's the reason why the proposal doesn't have that in place.

Seth Damon, 23rd Council Delegate-Hello, everyone that's attending this meeting. I have been running around yesterday and today. I just got off the phone with the Honorable Navajo Nation Speaker, Lorenzo Bates. Mr. Bates said that we can add this as an amendment to get all supporting documents and add this to the NABI meeting that is schedule for today. Also we need all documents from NTUA, the price quote cost of the Temporary septic tank, also documentation from NECA. I will also need written documents from Anderson Lee, CSC and other supporting documents that states there is no source for funding from the departments, and Emergency Management Navajo Nation. Document letter from the Three (3) community members that got their water shut off, stating that they are high rick patients, and elderly. Have them sign the letter to indicate their condition.

Adrian John, Office Specialist-I can make the letter for them and do an assessment, and hand carry the letter to them for signatures.

Anderson Lee, CSC- The Administration can have these documents by noon. Im requesting that OEH, NTUA, OEH/NECA, and Head Start to all write a memo as a supporting letter from all the departments.

Seth Damon, 23<sup>rd</sup> Council Delegate- We should shoot for Tuesday so that we can retrieve all documentation, and put this in Legislation as soon as possible. My suggestion that the chapter pays NTUA, so the Navajo Nation can reimburse the chapter. If, NTUA is going to concur the bill, NTUA will not get the reimbursement

Thomas Bill, NTUA-Yes, NTUA can do the bill to the chapter and the chapter can work with the Navajo Nation.

Louise Hoskie, Chapter SEC/TRES- My question is, will the bridge to the chapter hold the delivery of the septic tank? Is it stable to hold the load?

Thomas Bayle, NTUA- Yes, The load of the septic tank will be heavy for the bridge, because the load will be carrying four (4) septic tanks.

Anderson Lee, CSC- The Administration can work on the passage way for the delivery of the septic tank. We will also provide a map to the chapter.

Seth Damon, 23<sup>rd</sup> Council Delegate-How long is the timeline of the project? And will all documents be in by Tuesday and sent to me. Requesting that NTUA and NECA work together.

Thomas Bayle, NTUA- Yes, we are willing to work with the EPA and NECA, so that we can have the chapter re-open to the community members.

Delores Loretto, OEH- once everything is in place, we will be going by EPA recommendation and will issue to the OEH, Window Rock to open the chapter.

EPA, Window Rock- The packet that we have needs to fill out by the chapter and will be working with NTUA to have all the documentation in place. And provide assistance to the departments.

Information having been presented to the Navajo Division of Health, therein the Office of Environmental Health/Code Enforcement, duly designated as the Regulatory Authority, and the Indian Health Service, therein the Division of Environmental Health Services, duly designated as the Health Advisor, that a condition posing an imminent health risk has been found to exist at the REDROCK CHAPTER HOUSE, REDROCK SENIOR CENTER AND REDROCK HEAD START I & II, BUILIDNG AND KITCHEN FACILITIES in Redrock, New Mexico specifically:

On February 9, 2015 our office was notified that the Redrock Chapter main sewer line adjacent to the sewage lagoon is broken, due to the shifting of soils/water erosion. The Redrock Chapter House, Redrock Senior Center and Redrock Head Starts I & II Building and Kitchen facilities are recommended for closure, due to the following: 1) the main sewer pipe to the lagoon across the wash is broken and damaged and may draw sewage discharge into the wash



and the outside grounds. 2) The Chapter needs to improve the operations and maintenance of the sewer and lagoon to prevent reoccurrence. 3) The Chapter needs to repair/upgrade the system to meet U.S. EPA guidelines.

Therefore, the Redrock Chapter House, Redrock Senior Center, Redrock Head Start I & II Building and Kitchen facilities poses an imminent health hazard to the health and welfare of the staff, visitors, children and facility users. The facility will resume operation until all critical violations are corrected and approval from the Health Advisor to commence operations.

Upon review of the information presented an unfavorable decision has been rendered which affects your operation, therefore:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT YOU ARE HEREBY ORDERED TO CLOSE THE OPERATIONS OF THE REDROCK CHAPTER HOUSE, REDROCK SENIOR CENTER, REDROCK HEAD START I & II BUILDING AND KITCHEN FACILITY OPERATIONS.

Further, notice is given that an Order issued you from the Health Advisor on February 9, 2015 is hereby sustained by this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT RESUMPTION OF THE REDROCK CHAPTER
HOUSE, REDROCK SENIOR CENTER, REDROCK HEAD START I & II BUILDING
AND KITCHEN FACILITY OPERATION SHALL NOT BE AUTHORIZED UNTIL SUCH
TIME THE FACILITIES ARE IN COMPLIANCE.

On February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2015 our office received a report that the main sewer line leading to the adjacent sewage lagoon at Red Rock Chapter broke. The break in the system was reportedly due to shifting soils and water erosion. Due to the extent of the break and the corresponding issues that arise out of a non-functioning sewage system, our office recommends the temporary closure of all affected facilities until repairs can be made.



This memorandum will serve as an official notice that the Chapter has been closed by Office of Environmental Health. Due to the main sewer line breakage that leads to the sewer lagoon across from the Chapter. The breakage was due to the shifting of the arroyo and water erosion. In addition the OEH has temporarily closed the chapter till we fix the sewer line. I am working with NCS Engineers to fix this issue and have the chapter open to community membership soon as possible.

Dear LoDonna:

Yesterday, Navajo EPA's Water Quality/NPDES Program was at a meeting at the Red Rock Chapter House concerning the collapsed sewerline that crosses Breadsprings Wash. This sewerline serves the chapter house compound as well as three nearby residences. On February 9, 2015, one bank of the wash caved in resulting in the sewerline being severed. The Navajo Nation Office of Environmental Health has forced the closure of the facilities on the chapter compound, meaning there is no water use. However, the three residences connected to the sewerline are still generating wastewater that is flowing in the damaged sewerline and accumulating in Breadsprings Wash.

According to Title 40 of the Code of Federal Register § 122.1(b), the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program requires permits for the discharge of "pollutants" from any "point source" into "waters of the United States." The untreated wastewater fits the definition of pollutants. The sewerline which is releasing the untreated wastewater is considered a point source outfall. The Breadsprings Wash fits the definition of a water of the United States. The release of untreated wastewater from the sewerline is considered an unpermitted discharge of pollutants.

I am requesting that NTUA turn off the water supply to these three residences to prevent untreated wastewater from entering Breadsprings Wash. The residences are Bert Woods, Mary Begay, and Verlinda Thomas. I understand that Red Rock Chapter has notified these residences of the impending action. The Red Rock Chapter is taking action to repair the damaged sewerline but it will likely take 2-3 weeks. Water service can be restored once the opportunity to discharge is terminated.

As you are aware the Red Rock Senior Center is closed for several weeks due to problem with the sewer system. In the interim, the program is serving and delivering meals from the Chichiltah Senior Center on daily basic. Many of the senior clients are transported while others are encouraged to visit the other available senior centers, but the cost of gas is affecting their own limited budgets. Although this arrangement is temporary the cost and time to serve and transport meals is taking its toll as the program's budget much more rapidly than anticipated, including environmental and health concerns. Many senior citizens are feeling discouraged of the changes; and are requesting the chapter leaders implement the new senior citizen center proposal to begin the design, construction, and move in of the new center. The proposal had been completed but in need of funds to complete the phases of the planning, design and construction. The development of the new center is imperative because the growing senior population in the community. In addition, Red Rock Chapter also is planning to relocate the Red Rock Senior Center to old and renovated Head Start Building at Twin Buttes area west of Gallup, NM. Again this is a temporary arrangement which will significantly impact the program in the long run. The alternative to this dilemma is advocate for funds to begin the development of the new Senior Center. The Red Rock Chapter has been advocating for a new facility for many years without any development until this year. With the new proposal the advocacy for funds imperative and critical for the Red Rock Senior to survive and thrive in the long run.

Ya'at'cch. This letter is to serve as a supporting document on behalf of Tse'Łichii Chapter, which is currently in the process of repairing the main sewer line situation. I know that this situation is beyond our control, however, it has drastically impacted both Red Rock Head Start Center I & II.

On February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2015, Head Start Center II opened its door to 10 enrolled children. Head Start Center II was only in full operation for one week providing to children ages 3 to 5 years old, when main sewer line collapse causing our school to shut down. Since then, we have made some home visitation and recruiting for more children. Thus far, we recruited 4 additional children making our total enrollment to 14.

Now going into week 4 of school closure, our children are at home awaiting for school to reopen. The closure has impacted our food delivery, parent teacher conference, child contact days as well as the 45 days deadlines to meet Navajo Head Start criteria for dental, vision and hearing screening. Furthermore, Center II has cancelled Spring Break and school will continue to operate into the end of June to compensate our little children. Finally, it is taking time away from my duty as a teacher to provide to these children's learning, especially the ones who are going into Kindergarten next school year. Ahe'hee'.



**RE: Funding Request for New Chapter House** 

Dear Honorable Delegates:

In the early morning hours of September 6, 2014, Teesto Chapter house was burned to the ground due to arsonists. Since then, the Chapter government has been in a state of turmoil and instability while trying to provide services to the community. Like other Chapter houses, Teesto Chapter House is the central area for government services. The Chapter is temporarily using a former pre-school building ,which has half the space of the former Chapter House. Safety issues arise when the capacity level is exceeded especially during Chapter meetings.

Although Teesto Chapter is a self-governing entity, it still depends on the Navajo Nation for funding. It generates very little revenue on its own, due to lack of economic development and tax revenue. The Office of Risk Management is still on the process of reviewing the insurance claim; but indication is that the claim will not be anywhere near the cost for a new building. Therefore, a request for funding is hereby submitted to the Navajo Nation Council from the undesignated reserve for design and construction costs estimated at \$2,922,425. The final insurance settlement/claim will be given back to the Navajo Nation's Undesignated Reserve Fund.


The Navajo Nation Design and Engineering Services Department will lead the project team and serve as the Construction Manager. Due to the emergency nature of this project, the project team recommends the "design-build" project delivery approach. The design-build can save time and money for the owner, and streamlining project delivery through a single contract between the owner and the design-build team transforms the relationship between designers and builders into an alliance, which fosters collaboration and teamwork.

### 1. Introduction




Figure 1: General Location of Teesto Chapter House.

Teesto Chapter is located in the south-central region of the Navajo Nation in northeast Arizona, Navajo County, a strikingly beautiful place surrounded by vast grasslands and rolling hills that are interrupted by volcanic buttes and cinder cones. The Teesto Chapter House Tract is located one mile east of the junction of Arizona State Highway 87 and Navajo Route 60 (Figure 1). The Chapter serves over 1,250 people including the population within the Chapter's boundary, as well as members of the Chapter that live in areas known as Hopi Partition Lands.

On September 6, 2014, Teesto Chapter underwent a shocking and devastating event when its Chapter House burnt to the ground in the early morning hours, leaving the chapter in a state of turmoil and instability. Important documents and irreplaceable treasures such as old Navajo Rugs were lost in the fire. Since then, the Chapter has been utilizing a former preschool building, which is only half the size. The meeting hall regularly exceeds the capacity during chapter meetings and large gatherings, which raised safety concerns.

For the past few months, Teesto Chapter and Navajo Nation Design and Engineering (NNDES) have been collaborating on the development of a new Chapter House project and has completed the initial planning stage. The Chapter Members passed a resolution supporting a funding request to the Navajo Nation Council that is presented in **Appendix A.** 

The purpose of the project is to build a new Chapter House that meets the needs of the its members. It is an opportunity to provide a building that is more functional, energy efficient, and meets current building codes. The total cost estimate the design and construction phases will be \$2,922,425. A cost break down is provided in **Appendix B**. The proposed floor plan and utility plans are presented in **Appendix C**.

The total size of the Chapter tract is 27 acres; however, the proposed chapter house project will impact less than 2 acres in the southeast corner of the tract. Other community facilities are also situated within the tract. The tract was formally withdrawn and land withdrawal documents are presented in **Appendix D**. The tract is located across the street from NHA Housing Subdivision. Surrounding these central developments are family grazing lands and scattered-pattern housing developments.

### 2. Need Statement

Like other Chapter houses, Teesto Chapter House is the central area for government services. The senior center, for example, was one of the programs that was administered in the Chapter House. It's a place to gather for meetings, check your mail, have lunch (if you're a senior citizen), or just visit people coming and going.

The total number of people that the Chapter services is estimated to be 1250, based on the U.S. census count in 2010 for Teesto Chapter, plus a five-year population growth estimate, and Chapter members who reside in the Hopi Partition Lands (areas that were formally part of Teesto Chapter), but are not counted in the census count for Teesto Chapter.

Since the incident, the Chapter's administration offices have been trying to recompile important documents while providing services from a former preschool building with less than 3,200 square feet. The temporary facility has three small offices, a small meeting hall, a small conference room, and a contracted postal unit (local post office). The meeting hall regularly exceeds the capacity during chapter meetings and large gatherings, which raised safety concerns.

The Chapter House facility was insured under the Navajo Nation's Risk Management Program. Due to the older building, its value is nowhere near the amount for a new building. In fact, the NNRM states that the insurance claim will not meet the entire project cost. Although Teesto is a self-governing entity, it still depends on the Navajo Nation for funding. It generates very little revenue on its own mainly due to lack of economic development that can otherwise generate revenue for governmental purposes. For this reason, Teesto is seeking an emergency funding request to the Navajo Nation Council. The funding source will be the Navajo Nation's undesignated reserve.

### 3. Scope of Work

Since the fire, the Chapter (officials and staff) have held a number of meetings with Navajo Department of Risk Management, DES, CIO, and Office of the President and Vice President. The NNDES has lead the project team to the completion of the planning stage where the project scope, budget, and schedule have been identified.

The scope of work is to build a new Chapter House that meets the needs of the its members. It is an opportunity to provide a building that is more functional, with modern mechanical systems, and meets current building codes. The building will be 8,250 square feet. A conceptual building plan and utility plan are presented in **Appendix B**.

Due to the emergency nature of this project, the project team recommends that the "design-build" project management approach be applied. The Navajo Nation Design and Engineering Services Department will lead the project team and serve as the Construction Manager. The project management approach will be "design-build," due to the emergency nature of the project.

The design-build construction approach changes the traditional sequence of work, which can save time and money for the owner, while providing the opportunity to achieve innovation in the delivered facility. "Design-build" is a method of project delivery in which one entity – the design-build team – works under a single contract with the project owner to provide design and construction services.

Streamlining project delivery through a single contract between the owner and the design-build team transforms the relationship between designers and builders into an alliance, which fosters collaboration and teamwork.

## DESIGN-BUILD PROJECT DELIVERY:







Owner manages only **ONE** contract with a single point of responsibility:

- Designer and contractor are on the same team, providing unified recommendations
- Changes are addressed by design-build entity, not used as excuses

The design-build method places the responsibility for design errors and omissions on the design-builder, relieving the owner of major legal and managerial responsibilities and the burden for these costs and associated risks are transferred to the design-build team.

The sequence of the work is approach for the work will generally follow the sequence below:

- 1. Conceptual Plan development
- 2. Advertise RFP for Design-Build Project
- 3. Selection of Design-Build team
- 4. Construction
- 5. Monitoring and Inspection
- 6. Close out.

## 4. Budget

The total cost estimate the design and construction phases will be \$2,918,849. The cost estimate is based on recent Navajo construction projects where: (1) square footage cost for construction is near \$267; (2) Architect/Engineering costs (A/E) are about 10% of construction, and (3) additional costs and contingencies are included. A cost break down is provided in **Appendix A.** 

#### 5. Schedule

The project time schedule is 12 months. This is under the design-build approach that can often save time and money.

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. The Teesto chapter is a Local Governance Act certified chapter pursuant to 2 N.T.C sec 4045 (a) and 26 N.T.C. 103 established to review all matters affecting its constituents and community; and
- 2. The Teesto chapter is vested with certain authorities and responsibilities to consider and take actions on matters of local concerns that are in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of its chapter members and residents; and
- 3. The Teesto chapter house burned to the ground on in the early morning hours on September 06, 2014 losing all equipment, files, furniture, etc. that included the CHR's office and the Senior Citizen Center Office, kitchen, table, chairs, and so forth; and
- 4. The local headstart center is now the chapter office and chapter meetings are held in this small 3,200 square foot building. The Chapter Manager, AMS, CHR and Planner all share one half of the room and there is a front office for the clerical and post office and post office staff; and
- 5. The meeting hall is what use to be the classroom that is about 30' x 26' room where chapter meetings are held. These small spaces clearly violate the rules and regulations of public facilities but there is no alternative but to conduct chapter and program business in these very limiting spaces; and
- 6. Two old vintage stone buildings are being renovated but would be of generic nature. One for community meetings that would be more adequate in size than the classroom and other building is for administrative offices and post office that would also be more adequate; and
- 7. The Teesto chapter administration and chapter officials have been meeting with the Division of Community Development, Design & Engineering Services, Risk Management and the Department of Justice to plan for a new chapter house; and
- 8. It is estimate a new chapter house can take as many as 4-5 years that the community cannot afford to wait that long. This is an emergency situation and emergency planning, funding and allocation priority has to be considered. There is no Navajo Nation protocol that exists to address emergency situations such as a burnout of what is the reference point for any community which is the chapter house.






PRELIMINARY ARCHITECTURAL CIRCULATION SCHEME Not to scale

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 2 N.T.C., Section 695 (b) (5), the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to give final approval of all land withdrawals for residential subdivisions, rights-of-way, including all surface easements and other clearances related to, but not limited to powerline, waterline and sewerline extensions; and
- 2. The Teesto Chapter proposes that the Resources Committee withdraw 8.91 acres of Navajo Tribal Trust land for community development purposes. The requested acreage will be added to the 19.067 acres previously withdrawn by the Advisory Committee by Resolutions ACS-305-72 and ACJA-11-73. The Advisory Committee resolutions are attached hereto and incorporated herein respectively as Exhibits "A" and "B"; and
- 3. The Teesto Chapter passed a resolution on April 13, 1992 in support of the proposed land withdrawal for community development. The Teesto Chapter resolution is attached and marked as Exhibit "C"; and
- 4. The lands proposed to be withdrawn are located within Section 10, Township 24 North, Range 18 East, G&SRB&M. The Survey Section with the Navajo Land Department has resurveyed the previously withdrawn area, including the additional 8.91 acres, consisting of 27.88 acres, more or less, as the new total area for Teesto Chapter House Tract. The survey plan and legal description of the resurveyed area is attached and marked as Exhibit "D"; and
- 5. There are no affected land users in the area being proposed for community development. The field clearance certification with the appropriate chapter officials is attached and marked as Exhibit "E"; and
- 6. The archaeological clearance and environmental assessment have been completed for the 8.91 acres being proposed for development. The archaeological clearance and environmental assessment are attached and marked respectively as Exhibits "F" and "G"; and

- 7. The Transportation and Community Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council will be in a position to consider the proposed comprehensive land use plan for the Teesto Chapter when the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council formally withdraws the requested acreage; and
- 8. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation that said lands be withdrawn for community development purposes.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the withdrawal of 8.91 acres, more or less, of Navajo Tribal Trust lands as additional acreage to be added to the 19.067 acres previously withdrawn for Teesto Chapter for community development purposes. Said lands being withdrawn are those lands not previously withdrawn but which are included in the resurvey of the combined areas consisting of 27.88 acres, and are located within Section 10, Township 24 North, Range 18 East, G&SRB&M, as more particularly described on the survey plat marked as Exhibit "D", attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 2. The Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council further approves that the lands being withdrawn for community development purposes shall remain in a withdrawn status for so long as it is used for the purpose authorized.



#### **ABSTRACT**

This report is an Environmental Assessment (EA) of the impacts resulting from the construction of a post office, day care center, senior citizens center, a multi-purpose building and a solid waste transfer station on 8.9 acres adjacent to the Teesto Chapter complex.

This EA has been prepared to comply with the requirements as set forth in the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), and the Navajo Nation under the Fish and Wildlife Permit #930604-039 issued to CSWTA, Inc.

This EA describes only one project action alternative and the required no action alternative. We have characterized the existing environment in terms of physical resources, biotic resources, including threatened and endangered species, socioeconomics, archaeological resources, and cultural resources of the project area. Mitigation procedures are recommended.

No significant impacts to archaeological, biotic, or physical resources would occur as a result of the implementation of Alternative A. A Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) is recommended.

#### PROPOSED ACTION

#### A. Project Description

The Teesto Chapter proposed to enhance the community by construction of five (5) needed services: a post office, a day care center, a senior citizens center, a multi-purposed building, and a solid waste transfer station.

#### B. Purpose and Need

Presently, Teesto has a contract Post Office with the US Postal Service. The post office facility is situated within the Chapter office and comprises of 306 mail boxes. The Chapter employs a part-time Postal Clerk to handle some daily mail delivered from Winslow. A majority of residents either receive mail forty-five (45) miles in Winslow or get their mail at roadside mail boxes. Essentially, a post office is needed due to lack of space at the current Chapter House and increasing demand for mail services.

A day care center would allow more women to apply for outside work, and would provide care for children while their parents are away. It could also provide occasional relief for parents suffering from stress, as at the death of a relative, or when medical problems arise. Traditionally, grandparents or other relatives have been called upon for child care, but this situation is not always possible or desirable.

A senior citizens center is desirable as a place for the elderly to gather, to visit and to receive care that they might not have access to otherwise.

The Teesto Chapter has long sought a multi-purpose center as a locus for youth activities, for area-wide fairs and other activities requiring a large seating space as needed for the popular basketball games and dances.

In compliance with a US EPA mandate to close all open landfills in the Navajo Nation, a solid waste transfer station is needed to fulfill that requirement. This is desirable to eliminate airborne pollutants and blowing trash from the community. A solid waste transfer station is planned for easy access adjacent to the chapter house.

#### C. Location

The five service centers mentioned will be constructed along Navajo Route 60 just south of the Teesto Chapter house. The 8.9 acre project area is located on the USGS Egloffstein Butte Quadrangle, 7.5 minute series map in Township 24 North, Range 18 East, Section 10.

#### D. Vicinity Maps




Figure 1. The Teesto Chapter project area in the vicinity of Teesto on Navajo Tribal Trust Lands, Fort Defiance Agency, Navajo County, Arizona.




Figure 2. The Teesto Chapter proposed project plotted on Egloffstein Butte Quadrangle, 7.5 minute series, Navajo County, Arizona.





Figure 3. Detailed plan for the Teesto Chapter proposed project.






Figure 4. Photographs of the Teesto Chapter proposed project area.




Figure 5. Detailed plan for the Teesto Chapter solid waste transfer station.

Figure 1 shows the Teesto Chapter project area in the vicinity of Teesto on Navajo Tribal Trust Lands, Fort Defiance Agency, Navajo County, Arizona. Figure 2 shows Teesto Chapter proposed project plotted on Egloffstein Butte Quadrangle, 7.5 minute series, Navajo County, Arizona Figure 3 shows a detailed plan for Teesto Chapter proposed tract. Photograms of the proposed project area are shown in Figure 4. Figure 5 is a detailed site plan of the solid waster transfer station.

#### II. ALTERNATIVES

#### A. Alternative A - Preferred Alternative

The Teesto Chapter proposed to construct a US Post Office, day care center, senior citizens building, multi-purpose building, and a solid waste transfer station on 8.9 acres of Navajo Tribal Trust Lands adjacent to the Teesto Chapter house. Water and electricity will be provided by the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) and sewage will be handled by an existing sewage lagoon northwest of the Chapter which serves the Teesto Navajo Housing Authority Housing. It may be possible to extend a sewer line and tie into this system (Appendix). Access will be from Navajo Route 60, as is currently allowed for.

#### B. Alternative B - No Action Alternative

Alternative B presents the NEPA-required alternative of no action. Under this alternative, the Teesto Chapter would not construct the desired service facilities; the previously described purpose and need would not be met.

#### III. AFFECTED ENVIRONMENT

#### A. Topography

The proposed project site is on the first terrace above Teesto Wash at an elevation 5700 feet, but the nearby Hopi Buttes rise to just over 6700 feet. The subject 8.9 acre parcel is itself relatively flat, sloping about 4 degrees from south to north, toward Teesto Wash.

#### B. Climate

Teesto has a semi-arid continental climate with occasional sub-zero winter temperatures and frequent summer temperatures of over 100 degree Fahrenheit. The mean monthly temperature is 54 degrees Fahrenheit. Monsoon rains in July and August usually exceed winter precipitation that generally comes from the southwest with breezes ranging from 4.8 to 15.3 mph.

#### C. Air Quality

The air quality within the project area is generally quite good, with no major sources of anthropogenic emissions. Stock raising and homesites have depleted ground cover upwind of the Teesto Chapter house, but wind blown contaminants are less that they would be if the site were downwind from sandy Teesto Wash. Within the project area no TSP levels have been determined. The annual Federal Primary air quality standard is 75 ug/m3, Federal Secondary standard is 60ug/m3; there is no evidence that these standards are exceeded in the project area.

#### D. Geology

The bedrock geology of the area is composed of Mesozoic sandstones of the Chinle formation, overlain by Quaternary volcanic forms such as dikes, plugs and lava flows (Chronic 1983).

#### E. Soils

The project area is in the Palma-Clovis soil association. It consists of reddish-brown (Munsell 5 YR) sandy soils formed in mixed aeolian and alluvial materials from sandstone. Slopes range up to 15 percent on the high plains and escarpments surrounding Teesto. Palma soils have reddish-brown sandy loan or loamy sand surface layers and reddish-brown shady loam or fine sandy loam subsoils and substrata. They occur on low ridges and undulation plains within slopes of 0 to 15 percent. Hummocky areas occur where wind

has deflated around clumps of vegetation. Clovis soils have brown or reddishbrown sandy loam or loam surface layers and sandy clay loam subsoils that grade to calcareous fine sandy loam below 30 inches. The study site is dominated by colluvial sandy loams with localization of basalt gravels.

#### F. Water (Ground and Surface)

The Hopi Buttes region north of Teesto is drained by the Little Colorado River, about 45 miles south of Teesto. Local drainage to the Little Colorado is through Teesto Wash. Ground water depth in the Teesto area is generally greater than 500 feet. Snow melt is the major contributor for groundwater recharge because sporadic rainfall is lost due to rapid run-off, sparse vegetation and high evaporation rate.

#### G. Vegetation

Teesto is in a transition zone between the Great Basin Desert Scrub Formation and the Plains and Great Basin Grassland Formation of the Colorado Plateau (Brown 1982). Table 1 presents a complete list of plants in the Teesto area, but the following predominate on the project area: rabbitbrush (Chrysothamnus nauseosus), snakeweed (Gutierrezia sarothrae), galleta grass (Hilaria jamesii) and a few specimens of thin leaf yucca (Yucca angustifolia). Although Teesto Wash lies at the northeast edge of the project area, it is so dry that it hardly qualifies as a riparian environment; not even the salt cedar (Tamarisk), which is ubiquitous in riparian environments in the southwest, is present at Teesto.

The field survey consisted of walking east-west transects through the site, and an additional walk along the drainage on the northeast edge of the site. Table 1 list those plant species observed during the survey.

#### H. Resource Use Patterns

Teesto has been a "central place" or locus of Navajo activity for over a century, with the old J. C. McJunkin Trading Post as a hub of commerce. Since the demise of that post, residents have travelled to nearby communities like Dilkon, or to larger commercial centers like Winslow or Flagstaff for goods and services. Stock raising has been a staple of life support, with rug weaving as a supplemental endeavor.

Limited livestock grazing occurs in the region; however, it is limited by low forage value and lack of surface water. Electrical power to the site will be provided by NTUA via a three phase power line. There is a sewer lagoon northwest of the Chapter that serves the Teesto Navajo Housing Authority

Housing. It may be possible to extend a sewer line and tie into this system.

#### Wildlife

The wildlife value of this virtually suburban area is low. Located as it is adjacent to the Teesto Chapter House, a moderately well traveled paved road and situated just across that road from a housing development, the site provides low quality habitat for even common species of wildlife such as rabbits. No tracks or scat of any wildlife were seen, not even rabbits. There were not even burrows of the almost omnipresent kangaroo rat (*Dipodomys*). Table 2 list those species observed during the field survey.

#### J. Domestic Livestock

There was evidence that horses and sheep had traversed the area in the recent past. A heavily used livestock path parallels the fence line along the eastern boundary of the Chapter House, passing down to Teesto Wash from the highway.

#### K. Threatened, Endangered and/or Sensitive Species

The Hopi Buttes may provide habitat for Threatened, Endangered and/or Sensitive Species of plants and animals, but there is no habitat for any of them in the vicinity of the Teesto Chapter project area, and a careful pedestrian survey of the project acreage revealed no evidence of any T&E species of plants or animals. Before the survey, the investigator visited the Arboretum of Flagstaff to refresh his memory of the salient features of T&E flora.

#### L. Socioeconomics

The proposed construction is not expected to have any negative impact upon the Teesto community. On the contrary, local people may be expected to be employed for the duration of the construction and subsequent life of the five service facilities.

#### M. Archaeological

An archaeological survey of the Teesto community was conducted during April 16, 1989, to June 16, 1989, by John E. Bradley with San Juan College. Archaeological clearance was approved in April 1994. Bradley result that thirteen (13) prehistoric and two (2) historic sites were reported. Bradley reported that all thirteen (13) of the prehistoric sites were "potentially eligible for the National Register of Historic Places." All construction related activities will occur within the specified 8.91 acres. Additionally, the proposed undertaking will have no effect provided that construction activities avoid site SJC-1898 by a minimum of 15 meters (50 feet).

#### N. Other Values

The clerk of the Teesto Chapter house was interviewed with regards to possible cultural values, such as ethnobotanical use of the subject area or sacred places. She was not aware of any, nor did she believe that any of the elders present at the Chapter House knew of any Traditional Cultural Properties. All utilities already to exist of the proposed project area.

#### IV. IMPACTS

#### A. Physical Impacts

Impacts to the physical environment are not expected to involve all 8.9 acres. All five service buildings will be built along the south edge of the Chapter area, fronting Navajo Route 60. Use of heavy equipment will result in short term air pollution from exhaust and increased dust, and possible from contaminants such as fuel, grease, radiator fluid and break/transmission fluids. Construction waste such as lumber, plywood, insulation, cement, roofing, and paint will need to be hauled to an approved dump site.

#### B. Biotic Impacts

Some native plants will be destroyed by construction, but no Threatened and/or Endangered species are included nor are any plants of ethnobotanical importance known to be present. New power lines will offer perching sites for raptors, but it is unlikely that any raptors would choose to alight in the middle of the bustling Teesto community other than kestrels.

#### C. Threatened and Endangered Species Impacts

No impacts to threatened or endangered species nor habitat for same are present in this urban environment; no negative impacts are expected.

#### D. Socioeconomic Impacts

It is anticipated that only positive, long-term socioeconomic impacts will result from the proposed construction as local people will be employed in construction as local people will be employed in construction and operation of the service facilities.

#### E. Archaeological Impacts

No impact to archaeological resources is likely to occur because all are potentially eligible sites listed in report SJC-88-151 will not be affected by the proposed undertaking.

### F. Tribal Cultural Impacts

No adverse impacts to tribal culture are anticipated from the proposed project.

#### V. MITIGATION MEASURES

#### A. Physical Resources

Regular watering of the project site may be advisable during construction to control dust which may bother people at the Chapter House. Trucks and other heavy equipment should be kept on the immediate construction site to avoid damage to the already fragile vegetative community surrounding the site. Revegetation with native grasses and shrubs would reduce wind-blown dust, erosion and surface wash. Such landscaping should be addressed in the Master Plan.

#### B. Biotic Resources

Construction staging area and work crew parking areas should be located on the Chapter House property that has already been denuded of vegetation. Heavy equipment parking should be restricted from the roadside drainage area which would speed silt from erosion into Teesto Wash.

#### C. Socioeconomic Resources

If any local residents can be employed for any aspect of the construction and operation of facilities, then they should be given opportunity for said employment.

#### D. Archaeological Resources

Clearance was approved on April 1994. All construction related activities will occur within the 8.9 acres. In the event of a discovery ("discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources including but no limited to archaeological deposits, human remains, or locations reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices) all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified at (602) 871-7132.

#### E. Tribal Culture Resources

The proposed project is expected to positively impact the Teesto community. However, any objections raised by local residents should be given serious consideration and should be resolved.

#### F. Other Resources

No other mitigations were considered.

#### VI. CONCLUSION REGARDING SIGNIFICANCE

No significant impacts to resources of concern are expected to result from construction of the five community service facilities on the subject property in Teesto. Therefore, based upon the information made available to and collected by CSWTA, Inc., we conclude that a Finding of No significant Impact (FONSI) be recommended for this project.
