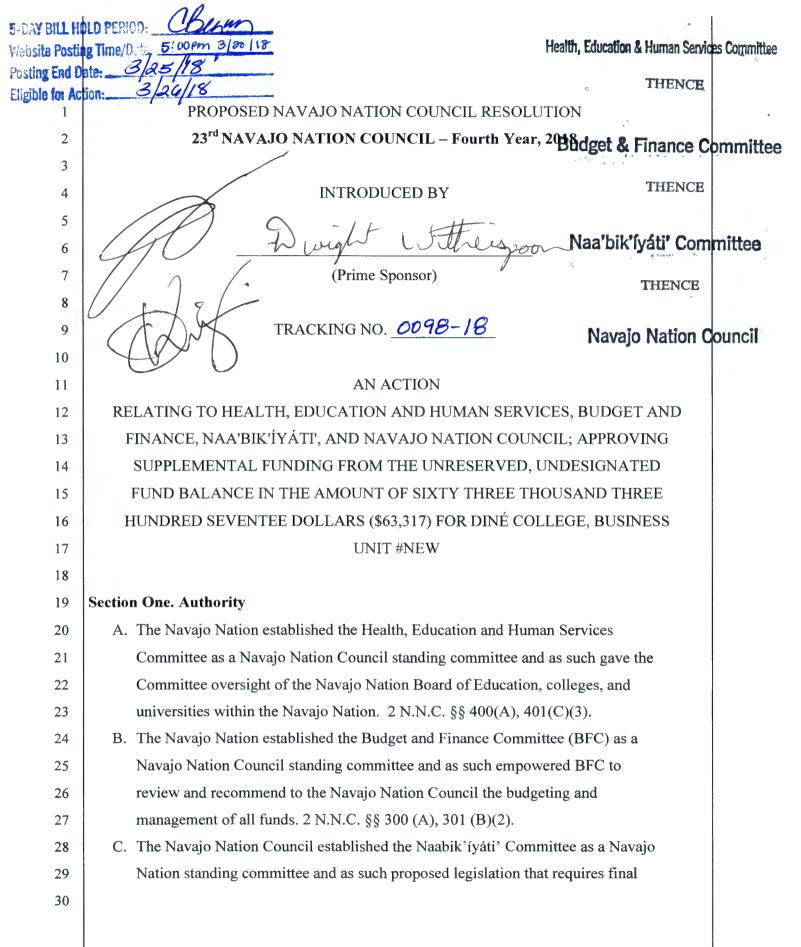
#### LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY SHEET Tracking No. 0098-18

**DATE:** March 15, 2018

**TITLE OF RESOLUTION:** AN ACTION RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAA'BIK'ÍYÁTI', AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF SIXTY THREE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED SEVENTEE DOLLARS (\$63,317) FOR DINÉ COLLEGE, BUSINESS UNIT #NEW

**PURPOSE:** This legislation approves supplemental funding from the UUFB to Diné College to support a Community College Coordinator position for the purpose of determining the feasibility and success of a college in the Pinon region.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

focus on working with students to develop programs and courses based on community needs, secure funding to support student educational costs, craft general and marketable strategies to attract students, and promote the proposed college. D. The supplemental funding request forms are attached as Exhibit A. E. The Office of Management and Budget provided a budget impact analysis pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M). The memorandum is attached as Exhibit B. F. The Office of the Controller has provided a memorandum dated February 14, 2018 indicating the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as of February 14, 2018 is \$27,717,798. This memorandum is provided to meet the requirements of 12 N.N.C, 820 (L), however the Controller of the Navajo Nation has not designated the funds at recurring or non-recurring. This memorandum is attached as Exhibit C. G. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Dzilvijiin Region and community residents in need of educational opportunities to approve this supplemental appropriation request. Section Three. Approving the Supplemental Appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the Amount of \$63,317 for Diné College A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to Diné College, Business Unit #NEW for \$63,317 to support a Community College Coordinator for the Pinon Community College Project. B. This supplemental appropriation of \$63,317 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to Diné College, Business Unit #NEW. Section Four. Effective Date The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has reviewed the above packet and provides the following:

- Because of the limited availability of funds, OMB advises the Branch Chiefs to prioritize all supplemental funding proposals pursuant to the FY 2018 Budget Resolution CS-53-17 (paragraph 'L'), the FY 2018 Budget Instructions Manual (Section XIV), and the Appropriations Act § 800 (A). This activity should be completed by the three branches to determine priorities. In a memorandum dated October 2, 2017, OMB informed the Branch Chiefs and the Navajo Nation Council that there are 30 UUFB (Undesignated, Unreserved Fund Balance) proposals totaling more than \$46 million. Since then, there are more than 45 proposals and the new total amount requested is \$60.6 million. Again, what are the priorities?
- 2. OMB recommends compliance with the Navajo Nation Appropriations Act regarding Supplemental Appropriations (Section 820, L). This has not been done. Compliance includes:
  - a. Branch Chief's concurrence of the supplemental request (NN President).
  - b. Non-recurring expenses only. Personnel salary is a recurring expense.
- 3. The documents seems to indicate that this is a supplemental request from the UUFB. The documents attached indicate a different amount. The memo authored by Delegate Witherspoon has an amount of \$63,317 but the budget forms has an amount of \$54,006. It is difficult to determine which one is correct.
- 4. Division of Community Development (DCD) should provide the available fund balance in the general funds for Pinon Chapter who is currently a LGA certified chapter.

Subject: Controller's Financial Update As of January 31, 2018

I am pleased to present to you the following information related to General Fund financial data up to January 31, 2018.

#### The General Fund Financial data is as follows:

The gross General Fund Revenues (see Exhibit "A") as of January 31, 2018 is \$99,205,877, and the total set asides total \$33,057,058. The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$66,148,819, which is 44.45% of the projection.

The total expenditures by branch are shown on Exhibit "B".

- The Legislative Branch has expenditures of \$4,736,197, encumbrances of \$540,894 with a remaining budget of \$11,563,745.
- The Executive Branch expenditures are \$60,501,243 encumbrances are \$5,813,170 with a remaining budget of \$109,189,810.
- The Judicial Branch expenditures are \$3,933,787 with zero encumbrances and remaining budget of \$9,914,134.
- Total General Fund expenditures are \$69,171,228; total encumbrances are \$6,354,064 with an overall remaining budget of \$130,667,690.

The updated UUFB as of February 14, 2018 is \$27,717,798 (see Exhibit "C"). There have been two supplemental appropriations during Fiscal Year 2018 in the total amount of \$3,909,557.

The Navajo Nation Department of Justice (DOJ) has reviewed the above-mentioned document and deems the document to be "insufficient." As you know, all supplement requests must be made consistent with the Budget Instruction Manual (BIM) Section XI(E), and Appropriation Act (Act), 12 N.N.C. § 800 et. seq. Ι have attached a checklist that I have created for all supplemental appropriation requests that do not involve capital The checklist reflects the requirements of the BIM projects. and Act.

First, in reviewing the documents, it is not clear how the Pinon Community College Project would be organized and setup. The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and Office of the Controller (OOC) make reference that this is under Pinon Chapter and under the Division of Community Development (DCD). However, in reviewing the brief overview of this request, it appears that it could be a separate program that is not under Pinon Chapter or DCD. It is recommended that this inquiry is clarified. Second, please review the attached checklist as there are requirements that are lacking and those requirements need to be submitted. Third, the Supplemental Appropriation form was signed by yourself and concurred by Speaker Bates. Considering the signatories on the above-mentioned form and that the request may not be from the Pinon Chapter or DCD, the budget forms should reflect the same signatories as provided on the Supplemental Appropriation forms. The current budget forms are currently signed by yourself and concurred by Carl Smith, Executive Director, DCD. Fourth, OMB, in a memorandum dated November 15, 2017, noted that the requesting amount is different than what is reflected on the budget forms. In your cover letter, it is noted that your request is in the amount of \$63,317.00 yet the budget forms reflect \$54,006.00. It is recommended that this requesting amount is clarified.

Lastly, as noted by OMB and OOC, this request is deemed as a recurring expense. Pursuant to the Act, 12 N.N.C. §820(L), supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes. Generally, personnel costs are deemed as recurring expenses. However, it is not clear whether the Coordinator specifically limited to position is a temporary one-year If so, the facts could be revaluated to determine position. that it is non-recurring expense. Nevertheless, it should be noted that while the Department of Justice (DOJ) may make this position about whether this is a recurring or non-recurring expense and could advise OOC as such, the Act, § 820(L) clearly makes it OOC's responsibility to make that determination. Without more information to substantiate a strong argument in favor of it being a non-recurring purpose, DOJ is deferring to Willie's determination that it is recurring. is Mr. It recommended that there is clarification regarding this program and the expense.

Subject: Legislation 0098-18: OMB Budget Impact Analysis Regarding Funding From the UUFB in the Amount of \$63,317 for a Grant to Dine' College

The above subject document was reviewed by the Office of Management and Budget and the findings are documented below. An initial review was completed by the Office of Management on November 15, 2017 (a little more than four months ago) and it appears that some of the findings have been addressed with revisions to the budget.

- The Navajo Nation Grant Application form needs to be completed since this appears to be a grant funding arrangement with an entity external to the Navajo Nation government. The appropriate signature of the authorized signature from Dine' College should be provided at the bottom of the form. Refer to the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget Instructions Manual in Appendix G on page 71 for the form and the form to be completed is also on the OMB website. In addition, other instructions are provided in the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XI, on page 13.
- 2. The completed budget forms in the budget package will require certain corrections, as follows:
  - a. The Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary should have the signature of the Superintendent from the Department of Dine' Education rather than the Division Director of the Division of Community Development, again, since the funding will be as a grant to Dine' College. The Department of Dine' Education will provide certain recommendations on the grant as well as to monitor the grant funds and activities. This requirement is in the FY 2018 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XI, B, second paragraph on page 13. Related provisions are also in the Appropriations Act, Section 820, (P), 2.
  - b. The amount budgeted in object code 8000 should be shown in object code 2001 which indicates that a position or positions is being funded rather than for public assistance. When the expenditure reports are submitted to the grant administrator by the grantee to be charged to the account, the personnel account will be used for this purpose rather than the public assistance object code.

- c. The use of the UUFB for recurring cost is questionable since the funds requested are considered nonrecurring. This needs to be addressed by the Controller before consideration of this proposed budget.
- d. Budget Form 1 at the bottom of the page for the Program Manager's signature should have the appropriate official from Dine' College signature rather than the Division Director from the Division of Community Development.
- e. Same with Budget Form 2 as above. The Program Manager's signature should have an appropriate official's signature from Dine' College rather than the Division Director from the Division of Community Development.
- f. Budget Form 2 in Part III should include the activities or tasks that will be performed by the position during the funding period. It appears that the funding period will be only in the fourth quarter and the activities or tasks to be performed are not specified sufficiently to know what will be accomplished other than simply completing the task as written in the Program Performance Criteria portion of Part III.
- g. Budget Form 4 needs to be re-done to budget object code 2001 Personnel in column (B) and object code 2110 in column (A) both for \$63,317.
- 3. The Navajo Nation Department of Dine' Education (NNDODE), it appears, has not been consulted on this proposal as no documentation is included in the proposal from them. This proposal should also be routed through the NNDODE and have the Superintendent sign any supplemental forms as required by the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget Instructions Manual.
- 4. The proposal lacks an updated UUFB funds availability report from the Controller. Since some supplementals have been approved by the Navajo Nation earlier, the UUFB has been reduced by the approved supplementals. OMB's estimate of the UUFB funds is about \$10.8 million now rather than \$27 million as previously reported by the Controller as supported by the outdated report attached to this supplemental request.
- 5. The Dine' College should have more than sufficient funds from their FY 2018 Navajo Nation general fund setside allocation of \$4.2 million to provide funds for this request.

This proposed budget and attached documents was reviewed by Mr. Emmett Francis, Budget Officer and, if needed, he is available on any questions regarding this memorandum.

- The un-audited balance in the UUFB is \$10,875,206 (see attached Exhibit A) as of March 20, 2018. There are additional supplemental requests that will be considered by the Navajo Nation Council in the near future. This supplemental request is for \$63,317 for feasibility studies for potential community college structure in the Dzilyijiin region.
- 2. The costs for this project are determined to be NON-RECURRING costs.
- 3. <u>Important Note</u>: Our office is currently monitoring the Nation's current actual minerals revenue versus the projected revenues for FY 2018. Additionally, our office has started the revenue projection task for the upcoming 2019 operating budgets. As a result of minerals revenue levels decreasing, we recommend the Nation spend the UUFB in a prudent and conservative manner. The Nation's current actual minerals revenue vs. the projection for FY 2018 is a significant concern going forward as well as for the upcoming Fiscal 2019 and may create a shortfall in revenue in the near future which would affect UUFB.
