TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, AND NAABIK'İYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL, AMENDING 21 N.N.C. §503(N) OF THE NAVAJO TELECOMMUNICATIONS REGULATORY ACT

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will amend 21 N..N.C. § 503(N) of the Navajo Telecommunications Regulatory Act.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

Section Four. Effective Date

The Act enacted herein shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221.

Section Five. Codification

The provisions of this ordinance which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

Section Six. Saving Clause

Should any provisions of this ordinance be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this ordinance which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS REGULATORY ACT

Nevertheless, "the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall introduce [the proposed resolution] into the legislative process by assigning it to the respective oversight committee(s) of the Navajo Nation Council having authority over the matters for proper consideration." 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(5).
