# RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 24th Navajo Nation Council --- Second Year, 2020

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; AMENDING RDCD-124-17 TO INCREASE ACREAGE OF REACH 10-PUMPING PLANT NO. 7, NAVAJO GALLUP WATER SUPPLY PROJECT LOCATED ON TRIBAL TRUST LANDS IN TWIN LAKES CHAPTER (MCKINLEY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO)

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B) (2), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to grant final approval for all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The United States Bureau of Reclamation, 1235 La Plata Highway, Farmington, New Mexico 87401 has submitted an application to amend RDCD-124-17 which was approved by the Resources and Development Committee on December 11, 2017. The request is to amend RDCD-124-17 to increase the acreage of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) Reach 10, Pumping Plant No. 7 site from 5.35 acres to 10.39 acres on, over and across Navajo Nation Trust Lands in McKinley County, New Mexico. The application is attached and incorporated as Exhibit 4 and RDCD-124-17 is attached as Exhibit 5.
- B. "The Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009, Title X, Part III (Public Law 111.11) (Act) authorizes the Bureau of Reclamation to construct the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) that includes water treatment plants, pipeline, several pumping stations and ancillary facilities. Once completed, the NGWSP will deliver a reliable source of potable water, sourced from the San Juan River, to Navajo communities in northwestern New Mexico, the City of Gallup, NM, and the southwest portion of the Jicarilla Apache

Reservation for municipal and industrial use. The NGWSP will connect to existing and future water distribution systems operated on the reservation by the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA), and in Gallup, by the City of Gallup. The high quality, treated water provided by the NGWSP will bring immediate benefits, including improved health and well-being to tribal members." **Exhibit 5** (Application).

- C. The February 27, 2020 Bureau of Reclamation letter accompanying Bureau of Reclamation application states: "The increase in acreage is necessary to accommodate an increase in the anticipated build-out size of the pumping plant resulting from engineering design changes, and additional space needed for the construction of a turnout facility that will supply water the NGWSP to the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, to supply treated water to the community of Twin Lakes and the surrounding area, through its water distribution system." Exhibit 5 (Application).
- D. The proposed amendment consists of Navajo Nation Trust Lands located in Twin Lakes Chapter (McKinley County, New Mexico) and the location is more particularly described on the survey maps attached and incorporated as **Exhibit 2**.
- E. The Navajo Nation Department of Justice memorandum dated January 25, 2019 regarding land user consents and the Consent to Use Navajo Nation Lands Forms are attached as **Exhibit 3**.
- F. The February 27, 2020 Bureau of Reclamation letter accompanying Bureau of Reclamation application states: "It should be noted that field clearances have already been obtained for this parcel with the work that was completed on the Reach 9B-11 consent for ROW [DNR No. RDCJN-61-17], that was granted June 27, 2017, and the BIA grant of ROW on November 16, 2017, that is registered as TAAMS No. 791 4200063668. A significant amount of the increased acreage will overlap the Reach 9B-11 ROW." Exhibit 4 (Application) and Exhibit 3 (Consent Forms).
- G. Resources and Development Committee Resolution RDCD-124-17 is attached as Exhibit 5.
- H. Bureau of Indian Affairs memorandum dated January 11, 2018 approving the grant easement BIA TAAMS No. 791 4200069180 is attached as **Exhibit 6**.

- I. The United States Department of the Interior Bureau of Reclamation, letter dated April 25, 2016 regarding the National Historic Preservation Act Section 106 Consultation for The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project, Class III Inventory and Ethnographic Summer for the San Juan Lateral, Volume II: Reaches 9-11, Navajo Nation and McKinley County, New Mexico, is attached as **Exhibit 7**.
- J. The Biological Resources Compliance Form NNDFW Review No. 17usbr01 is attached as Exhibit 8.
- K. The Navajo Nation President's letter dated September 8, 2016 to the Assistant Secretary of Indian Affairs regarding the Navajo Nation's support of the waiver of the bond requirement, 25 C.F.R. § 169.103 for the Gallup-Navajo Water Supply Project rights-of-way is attached as Exhibit 9.
- L. The Bahastl'ah Chapter resolution BAHAS-11-06-03-322 supporting the design and construction of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project is attached as **Exhibit 10**.
- M. The Executive Official Review Document No. 014276 is attached as **Exhibit 11**.

#### SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby amends RDCD-124-17 to increase the acreage of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) Reach 10, Pumping Plant No. 7 site from 5.35 acres to 10.39 acres on, over and across Navajo Nation Trust Lands in McKinley County, New Mexico. The location is more particularly described on the map attached hereto Exhibit 2.
- B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the Right-of-Way subject to, but not limited to, the terms and conditions incorporated herein as **Exhibit 1**.
- C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives valuation and waives compensation because it has determined that accepting the agreed-upon compensation and waiving valuation is in its best interest of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to Title 25 C.F.R. § 169.110.

- D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives the requirement for a bond, insurance or alternative form of security on the part of the Grantee, based on the determination that the Reach 10, Pumping Plant 7 of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project benefits the Navajo Nation and such a waiver is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to Title 25 C.F.R. § 169.103(f)(2).
- E. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes the President of the Navajo Nation to execute any and all documents necessary to affect the intent and purpose of this resolution.

#### **EXHIBIT "E"**

### NAVAJO NATION RIGHT-OF-WAY TERMS & CONDITIONS: BUREAU OF RECLAMATION (GRANTEE)

(Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project Reach 10 - Pumping Plant #7)


- The term of the permanent right-of-way shall begin on the date it is granted by the Secretary of the Interior (Secretary) and shall continue as long as the Grantee Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) or its successors, or assigns uses the right-of-way for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project (Project).
- The annual consideration for the use of land is assessed at \$7481.00 (annually adjusted),
  which shall be the Navajo Nation's contribution to the Project because the Project will
  provide water to the Navajo Nation.
  - The Grantee must obtain the approval of the Navajo Nation if any portion of the right-of-way is used for any other purpose than authorized by the approval of this right-of-way.
- 3. The Grantee may develop, use, and occupy the right-of-way for the purpose(s) of constructing, operating, and maintaining the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project. The Grantee may not develop, use, or occupy the right-of-way for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions, or withheld at the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
- 4. In all activities conducted by the Grantee within the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall abide by all applicable laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect, including but not limited to the following:
  - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 169;
  - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, including compliance with the Programmatic Agreement for the Consideration and Management of Effects on Historic Properties Arising from Construction of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's regulation, last date of execution by all signatories being November 21, 2011, and any amendments thereto.
  - c. BOR shall give employment preference to qualifying Navajos and other Indians in accordance with applicable Navajo and federal law. BOR shall utilize Navajo contractors and Navajo businesses (to purchase goods and materials) in accordance with applicable law.
  - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq., to the extent that it is applicable. Grantee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.

- The Grantee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the right-ofway.
- The Grantee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the right-of-way to the extent compatible with the purpose of the right-of-way, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.
- 7. The Grantee shall reclaim all surface lands disturbed related to the right-of-way, as outlined in a restoration and re-vegetation plan, which shall be approved by the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA) prior to any surface disturbance. The Grantee shall comply with all provisions of such restoration and re-vegetation plan and shall notify the Director of the NNEPA immediately upon completion of the surface disturbance activities so that a site inspection can be made.
- 8. The Grantee shall at all times during the term of the right-of-way and at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the right-of-way and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
- The Grantee shall obtain prior written permission to cross existing rights-of-way, if any, from the appropriate parties.
- 10. The Grantee shall be responsible for and promptly pay all damages when they are sustained provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to increase the liability of the United States beyond the provisions of the Federal Tort Claims Act, Act of June 25, 1948, 62 Stat. 982 (28 U.S.C. § 1346(b), 2671 et seq.) or other applicable law.
- 11. The Grantee shall not assign, convey, or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the right-of-way or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the right-of-way or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the right-of-way, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance, or transfer without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions, or withheld at the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. Congress has authorized BOR to transfer Project title under P.L. 111-11 1062 (f). It is anticipated that after Project title is transferred to the Navajo Nation, the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority will operate and maintain the Project. Therefore, the Grantee may assign and transfer the right-of-way to the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority as authorized by federal law without further approval of the Navajo Nation or the Secretary.
- 12. At the relinquishment of this right-of-way, the Grantee, other than the United States shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental site assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of the said premises. This provision 12 shall not apply to the United States as Grantee.

13. Holding over by the Grantee after the relinquishment of the right-of-way shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Grantee any rights hereunder or in or to the land subject to the right-of-way or to any improvements located thereon. This provision 13 shall not apply to the United States as Grantee.

(**x** - 1)

- 14. The Navajo Nation and the Secretary shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the right-of-way, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.
- 15. By acceptance of the grant of right-of-way, the Grantee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive, or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare of the Navajo people) over all lands, persons, and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the right-of-way or to the Navajo Nation.
- 16. Any action or claim brought against the Navajo Nation arising out of the injury to person or property (tort) may be heard in the Courts of the Navajo Nation in accordance with applicable Navajo and federal law. No action or claim shall be brought against the Navajo Nation in any state court.
- 17. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern
  the construction, performance, and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained
  herein.
- 19. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees, and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Grantee, and the term "Grantee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees, and agents.
- 20. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the right-of-way; and the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way shall remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.








Beginning at a point on the north right-of-way line of Navajo Service Route 9 from which the East Quarter Corner of said Section 34 bears South 66°50'47" East a distance of 1475.45 feet; Thence from the Point of Beginning along the north right-of-way line of Navajo Service Route 9 South 63°03'05" West for a distance of 100.00 feet to a point lying on the north right-of-way line of Navajo Service Route 9; Thence North 26°56'55" West for a distance of 62.38 feet; Thence South 62°46'51" West for a distance of 454.77 feet; Thence North 56°46'18" West for a distance of 313.74 feet; Thence North 33°13'42" East for a distance of 798.53 feet; Thence North 74°45'21" East for a distance of 288.12 feet; Thence South 81°10'18" East for a distance of 134.17 feet; Thence South 29°26'25" East for a distance of 115.32 feet; Thence South 33°13'42" West for a distance of 358.68 feet; Thence along a non-tangent curve to the right with a length of 187.04 feet, radius of 195.04 feet, delta angle of 54.9446°, with chord bearing South 21°01'09" East 179.95 feet; Thence South 06°27'11" West for a distance of 59.05 feet; Thence along a tangent curve to the left with a length of 55.41 feet, radius of 95.04 feet, delta angle of 33.4017°, with chord bearing South 10°14'52" East 54.63 feet; Thence South 26°56'55" East for a distance of 18.46 feet to the Point of Beginning.





The Bureau of Reclamation hereby submits the enclosed application, and requests that Resolution No. RDCD-124-17, that was granted December 11, 2017, be amended to increase the acreage of the NGWSP Reach 10, Pumping Plant No. 7 site from 5.35 acres to 10.39 acres. Also enclosed are additional pertinent documents on CD format, that are respectfully submitted for your review and processing.

The increase in acreage is necessary to accommodate an increase in the anticipated build-out size of the pumping plant resulting from engineering design changes, and additional space needed for the construction of a turnout facility that will supply water from the NGWSP to the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, to supply treated water to the community of Twin Lakes and the surrounding area, through its water distribution system.

It should be noted that field clearances have already been obtained for this parcel with the work that was completed on the Reach 9B-11 consent for ROW [DNR No. RDCJN-61-17], that was granted June 27, 2017, and the BIA grant of ROW on November 16, 2017, that is registered as TAAMS No. 791 4200063668. A significant amount of the increased acreage will overlap the Reach 9B-11 ROW.

Reclamation understands that the Navajo Nation is waiving all customary fees and consideration for the ROW in accordance with the authorizing legislation in the Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009, Title X, Part III, Section 10602(c)(2) (Public Law 111-11).

Reclamation and the Navajo Nation have negotiated terms and conditions for the ROW and TCE; it is our understanding that the applicable document entitled "Terms and Conditions" will be added to this application by the Navajo Nation.

### 2. Tract(s) or parcel(s) affected by the right-of-way:

### 3. General Location:

<u>Parcel No. RCH 10 – Pumping Plant No. 7– Tribal Trust – 02(P)</u>: a Permanent Easement for ROW, being described as a parcel of land lying on Navajo Nation Tribal Trust land, Tract No. 792 T 8183, in the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 34, Township 18 North, Range 18 West, N.M.P.M., McKinley County, New Mexico, located in the area of the Twin Lakes Navajo Tribal Chapter.

4. <u>Purpose</u>: this request to amend Resolution No. RDCD-124-17, that was approved by the Navajo Nation Resource Development Committee (RDC) on December 11, 2017, is submitted to request an increase to the acreage of the Reach 10, Pumping Plant No. 7-Tribal Trust-02(P) permanent easement from the existing 5.35 acres to an area of 10.39 acres.

The increase in acreage is necessary to accommodate an increase in the anticipated build-out size of the pumping plant that has resulted from engineering design changes, and to acquire additional space for the construction of a turnout facility that will supply treated water from the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) to the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) to supply project water to the community of Twin Lakes and the surrounding area through its water distribution system. The easement is illustrated on Drawing No. 1695-529-60169 that is attached hereto, and by reference is made a part hereof.

5. <u>Authorizing Legislation</u>: The Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009, Title X, Part III (Public Law 111-11) (Act) authorizes the Bureau of Reclamation to construct the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) that includes water treatment plants, pipeline, several pumping stations and ancillary facilities. Once completed, the NGWSP will deliver a reliable source of potable water, sourced from the San Juan River, to Navajo communities in northwestern New Mexico, the City of

Gallup, NM, and the southwest portion of the Jicarilla Apache Reservation for municipal and industrial use. The NGWSP will connect to existing and future water distribution systems operated on the reservation by the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA), and in Gallup, by the City of Gallup. The high-quality, treated, potable water, sourced from the San Juan River being supplied by the NGWSP will bring immediate benefits, including improved health and wellbeing to Tribal members.

- 6. ROW: The Permanent Easement for ROW will be used for the construction, operation, maintenance and/or replacement of a pumping plant facility and the Twin Lakes turnout with ancillary features and appurtenances thereto, that will include but not limited to water storage and regulation tanks, chlorine injection facility, and water transmission pipeline. Ancillary appurtenances necessary for the safe and efficient operation of the pumping plant and pipeline may also include vaults, valves, fiber optic supervisory control and data acquisition systems (SCADA), cathodic protection systems, single phase and three phase utility power to support the operation of the pumping plant and turnout facility, a gravel and fenced yard, a driveway for ingress and egress, and a patrol road.

### BE IT ENACTED:

### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section §501 (B)(2), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give final approval of all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation land and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The United States Bureau of Reclamation, 1235 La Plata Highway, Farmington, New Mexico 87401 has submitted a right-of-way application to construct, operate and maintain the Reach 10 Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project located on, over and across Navajo Nation Trust Lands in the Twin Lakes Chapter vicinity, McKinley County, New Mexico attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".
- B. The proposed permanent right-of-way consists of Navajo Nation Trust Lands located in McKinley County, New Mexico and the location is more particularly described on the survey map attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "B".
- C. The General Land Development Department, memorandum dated October 8, 2017, attached as Exhibit "C", has determined that "Pumping Plant #7 will be included into Reaches 9 through 11 ROW package, and the additional consent for the same area is

- not required, since the grazing permit holders had already
  consented to use the land within those areas."
- D. The Bureau of Reclamation requests a waiver of the consideration because the project will provide a public benefit to the Navajo Nation.
- E. The Resources and Development Committee finds a waiver of the bond requirement, 25 C.F.R. § 169, is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation. See, Exhibit "D" which are letters from the Navajo Nation President and the Acting Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- F. The Resources and Development Committee finds a waiver of valuation, 25 C.F.R. § 169.110, and that the waiver of valuation is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation.
- G. The environmental and archaeological studies have been completed and are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- H. The application for the Right-of-Way as submitted by the United States Bureau of Reclamation has been reviewed by the Fish and Wildlife; Historic Preservation; Minerals; Navajo Nation Environmental Protection; Division of Natural Resources and the Department of Justice and "Approved" or found "Sufficient". See Exhibit "F".

### SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby grants approval of a Right-of-Way to U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to construct, operate and maintain Reach 10 Pumping Plant No. 7 of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project located on Navajo Nation Trust Lands in the Twin Lakes Chapter vicinity, McKinley County, New Mexico. The location is more particularly described on the map attached hereto as Exhibit "B".
- B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives the consideration for the Right-of-Way because the Reaches 10 Pumping Plant No. 7 of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project will provide a public benefit to the Navajo Nation.

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) is a priority project of the United States and the Navajo Nation; therefore, the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, the Navajo Nation, and the Bureau of Indian Affairs are working as partners to streamline the processes, as necessary, to meet all project deadlines. Reclamation therefore respectfully requests that this application for NGWSP Rights-of-

Way be prioritized accordingly, and that the application is processed when received.

Please note that the acquisition of tribal consent is time sensitive. Reclamation respectfully requests that the consent to this easement be granted on or before **August 1, 2017** to allow for additional processing by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA).

COMES NOW THE APPLICANT: The Bureau of Reclamation, Four Corners Construction Office, having a principle place of business at 1235 La Plata Highway, Farmington, New Mexico 87401, who on this 8th day of June, 2017, hereby petitions the Navajo Nation Land Department, and respectfully files under the terms and provisions of the Act of February 5, 1948 (62 Stat. 17; 25 USC 323-328), and Departmental Regulations 25 C.F.R., Ch. 1, Subchapter H, Part 169, Subpart C § 169.102(a), a request for Tribal Consent to a Grant of Permanent Easement for Right-of-Way (ROW), without limitation in term, and for as long as the easement is used for the intended purpose as described herein.

The ROW requested in this application for Reach 10 – Pumping Plant No. 7 of the NGWSP will contain 5.35 acres, more or less.

The Purpose of the Proposed Action: The Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009, Title X, Part III (Public Law 111-11) (Act) authorizes the Bureau of Reclamation to construct the NGWSP that includes water treatment plants, pipeline, several pumping stations and ancillary facilities. Once completed, the NGWSP will deliver a reliable source of potable water, sourced from the San Juan River, to Navajo communities in northwestern New Mexico, the City of Gallup, NM, and the southwest portion of the Jicarilla Apache Reservation for municipal and industrial use. The NGWSP will connect to existing and future water distribution systems operated on the reservation by the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA), and in Gallup, by the City of Gallup. The high quality treated water provided by the NGWSP will bring immediate benefits, including improved health and wellbeing to Tribal members.

<u>Authorization</u>: Reclamation is authorized by the Act, under Part III, Section 10602, Subsection (c)(1) and (2) which states: "As a condition of construction of the facilities authorized under this part, the Project Participants shall provide all land or interest in land, as appropriate, that the Secretary identifies as necessary for acquisition under this subsection at no cost to the Secretary". Therefore, Reclamation hereby respectfully requests that this application be processed so as to acquire ROW that is deemed necessary and appropriate, in order to accommodate the construction, operation, maintenance, and replacement of the main and ancillary facilities of the NGWSP Reach 10.

ROW Type, Size and Purpose: Reclamation hereby requests a grant of permanent ROW for Pumping Plant No. 7, Parcel No. Rch 10-Tribal Trust-02 (P), containing 5.35 acres more or less, on Navajo Tribal Trust Land, Tract No. 792-T8183, in the area of the Twin Lakes Navajo Tribal Chapter, located in McKinley County, New Mexico. The ROW for Pumping Plant No. 7, is illustrated on ROW drawing no. 1695-529-60169, that is attached hereto and by reference, made a part hereof.

Ownership of Permanent Improvements: Pumping Plant No. 7, located on Tribal Trust Land, will consist of water storage and regulation tanks, a pumping plant facility with a chlorine injection facility, associated pipeline, and ancillary features and appurtenances that will be constructed and owned by the Bureau of Reclamation. It is Reclamation's intent to transfer the operation, maintenance, and replacement (OM&R) responsibility of the Project to the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA). It is envisioned that Reclamation would retain title to the facilities for the foreseeable future, however, the Act does provide authority for eventual title transfer to the Navajo Nation.

Landowner Consent: The Navajo Nation gave its concurrence to permission to survey the San Juan Lateral of the NGWSP on August 14, 2009. On March 1, 2010, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Defiance Agency granted Reclamation Permission to Survey over, across and through Reaches 9, 10, 11, and 12, for the purpose of conducting surveys and studies to determine a final pipeline alignment. The final pipeline alignment across said Reaches is illustrated on the alignment map of Reach 9 through 11, dated December 15, 2016, and the aforementioned ROW and Plan and Profile Drawing attached hereto (CD).

Reclamation requested a Title Status Report (TSR) for the subject Tribal Trust Lands on July 21, 2016 in order to verify the ownership status of the lands to be crossed by Reaches 9 through 11 that includes Pumping Plant No. 7. The TSR was received at Reclamation on August 8, 2016, and verifies that all lands being crossed by Reaches 9 through 11 are Tribal Trust Lands. Please see the TSR which is attached hereto and by reference is made a part hereof. The final pipeline alignment across said Reaches is illustrated on the alignment map of Reach 9 through 11, dated December 15, 2016, and the aforementioned ROW and Plan and Profile Drawings attached hereto (CD).

Reclamation hereby requests the consent of the Navajo Nation to a grant of Permanent Easement for ROW for Pumping Plant No. 7, on the aforementioned Tribal Trust Land, and that in granting said consent, the Navajo Nation waives compensatory consideration of the fair market value of the easement, and agrees to forego the requisite appraisal of the ROW because the NGWSP will provide a direct public benefit to the Navajo Nation.

Environmental Clearance: The Record of Decision (ROD) and Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) (Bureau of Reclamation 2009) for the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project, is attached hereto (CD) and by reference is made a part hereof. The ROD and FEIS can also be viewed on the world-wide web at <a href="http://www.usbr.gov/uc/envdocs/eis/navgallup/FEIS/index.html">http://www.usbr.gov/uc/envdocs/eis/navgallup/FEIS/index.html</a>. The alignment of Reaches 9 through 11 has not changed substantially from what was presented in the FEIS and ROD.

As discussed with Pamela A. Kyselka, Wildlife Biologist, Navajo Natural Heritage Program, Department of Fish and Wildlife, on December 7, 2016, Reclamation will conduct a NEPA Sufficiency Review over Reaches 9 through 11, to include the location of Pumping Plant No. 7, to determine if the proposed action would have any new potentially significant impacts, not already discussed and considered in previous NEPA documentation.

Biological Resource Compliance: Please see attached BRCF — NNDFW Review No. 17usbr01, dated February 14, 2017 that documents the approval by the NNDFW that the NGWSP Block 9 through 11 proposed to be constructed in the area of the Naschitti and Tohatchi Navajo Chapters is in compliance with Tribal and Federal laws protecting biological resources including the Navajo Endangered Species and Environmental Policy Codes, U.S. Endangered Species, Migratory Bird Treaty, Eagle Protection and National Environmental Policy Acts. The NNDFW concurs with the mitigation recommendations outlined in the BE, Section 6.5 and is approved by Ms. Gloria M. Tom, Director, Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife.

<u>Cultural Resources Compliance</u>: Please see letter dated April 25, 2016 that includes a summary of the Class III Inventory Report and eligibility determinations for Reaches 9 through 11, attached hereto, and by reference made apart hereof. The survey was conducted by PaleoWest under the authority of Navajo Nation Cultural Resources Permit No. B13543. The inventory identified a total of 292 cultural resources, including isolated occurrences, archaeological sites, in-use sites, Navajo Traditional Cultural Properties, and Jishchaa' within the Reach 9 through 11 Area of Potential Effect.

Reclamation submitted said report to the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department and concurrence was received from the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer on August 30, 2016, said letter is attached hereto, and by reference, made a part hereof. The report was also consulted upon with all NGWSP signatory and consulting parties in compliance with the Programmatic Agreement for the NGWSP. Following the completion of consultation with Navajo Nation and the NGWSP Programmatic Agreement parties, a final version of the report, with the changes noted in the Navajo Nation's August 30, 2016, concurrence, was submitted to all participants on October 11, 2016.

Per the internal BIA memo from the Supervisory Environmental Protection Specialist, Branch of Environmental Quality, Act Compliance and Review, written to the Supervisory Civil Engineer, Engineering & Technical Support Division, dated October 29, 2015, attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof, the subject report, with concurrence from the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department, is considered acceptable for compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

Waiver of Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, 25 C.F.R. Part 169.103 (Bonding Requirements): The Bureau of Indian Affairs, in cooperation with the Bureau of Reclamation and with the support of the Navajo Nation, requested a waiver from the Assistant Secretary – Indian Affairs under 25 C.F.R. § 1.2 and 25 C.F.R. Part 169 § 169.103 bonding requirement, for all NGWSP ROW's.

Said waiver of Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, 25 C.F.R. Part 169.103 (Bonding Requirements) was approved by the Principle Deputy Assistant Secretary – Indian Affairs in a memo dated November 22, 2016. A copy of said waiver is attached (CD), and by reference is made a part hereof.

The Bureau of Reclamation, an agency of the Federal Government, hereby assures that it will pay damages promptly, when they are sustained, under the provisions of the Federal Tort Claims Act (June 25, 1948, Ch. 646, Title IV, 62 Stat. 982, "28 U.S.C. Pt. VI Ch.171" and 28 U.S.C. Part 1346(b)).

### SAID APPLICANT UNDERSTANDS AND EXPRESSLY AGREES TO THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS:

- To construct and maintain improvements within the right-of-way in a professional manner consistent with industry standards;
- To pay promptly all damages and compensation, in addition to bond or alternative form of security made pursuant to 169.103, determined by the BIA to be due the landowners and authorized users and occupants of the land as a result of the granting,, construction and maintenance of the right of way;
- To restore the land as nearly as may be possible to its original condition, upon the completion of
  construction, to the extent compatible with the purpose for which the right-of-way was granted, or
  reclaim the land if agreed to by the landowners;
- 4. To clear and keep clear the land within the right-of-way, to the extent compatible with the purpose of the right-of-way, and dispose of all vegetative and other material cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during construction and maintenance of the project;
- 5. Comply with all applicable laws and obtain all required permits;
- 6. Not commit waste.
- 7. Operate, repair and maintain improvements consistent with the right-of-way grant;
- 8. Build and maintain necessary and suitable crossings for all roads and trails that intersect the improvements constructed, maintained, or operated under the right-of-way;
- Restore the land to its original condition, as much as reasonably possible, upon cancellation or termination of the right-of-way, or reclaim the land if agreed to by the landowners;
- 10. At all times keep the BIA, and the tribe, for tribal land, informed of the grantees address;
- 11. Refrain from interfering with the landowner's use of the land, provided that the landowner's use of the land is not inconsistent with the right-of-way;
- 12. Comply with the following due diligence requirements:
  - Obtain bids and establish contracts: July 11, 2017
  - Award Contract: August 28, 2017
  - Issue notice to proceed: September 25, 2017
  - Begin construction: October 30, 2017
  - Complete 50% of construction: November 26, 2018
  - Complete construction: December 2, 2019
- 13. Notify the BIA, and the tribe, for tribal land, if it files for bankruptcy or is placed in receivership.
- 14. Comply with all applicable federal and tribal law.

### THE APPLICANT FURTHER STIPULATES AND EXPRESSLY AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

To conform and to abide by all applicable requirements with respect to the right-of-way herein applied for. The applicant agrees to conform to and abide by the rules, regulations, and requirements contained in the *Code of Federal Regulations*, Title 25 Indians, Part 169, as amended, and by reference includes such rules, regulations and requirements as a part of this application to the same effect as if the same were herein set out in full.


BLOCK 9-11 LAND STATUS MAP REACHES 9A, 9B, 10 AND 11



Dear Assistant Secretary Roberts:

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) is the cornerstone of the Navajo Nation San Juan River Basin in New Mexico Water Rights Settlement Agreement (Settlement). The Navajo Nation has been working closely with the Bureau of Reclamation and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to ensure the project's completion by 2024, the deadline mandated by the authorizing legislation. As such, and through a financial assistance agreement with Reclamation, the Nation has taken an active role in designing and constructing a portion of the project on the Cutter Lateral.

One of the major undertakings involved in getting the project built is the acquisition of the right-of-way (ROW) necessary to construct, operate, and maintain the project. On April 21, 2016, new 25 C.F.R. Part 169 ROW Regulations took effect which differ in a significant way for purposes of NGWSP project completion from the pre-existing 25 C.F.R. §169 Regulations that had been in effect when Reclamation and the Nation began seeking consents from allottees for ROW across individual Indian allotments. The new regulations omitted BIA's authority to directly waive the bonding requirement when seeking ROW. The new regulations do allow grantees to seek a waiver from individual Indian allottees and tribes, but in the case of NGWSP, going back and seeking this consent for waiver now would result in significant delays and added expenses to the project.

We understand that Reclamation and BIA are in the process of seeking a waiver, under 25 C.F.R. § 1.2, of the 25 C.F.R. § 169.103 bond requirement for all NGWSP ROWs not issued prior to April 21, 2016. whether the ROW-holder is a federal agency or an agency of the Navajo Nation. The Nation fully supports their request and believes it is in the best interest of the Nation and its people. A waiver will help ensure that Reclamation's and the Nation's ROW acquisition process is not delayed on NGWSP which will result in the project getting completed within the legislated deadline which will benefit the Nation and its people.

Project

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) in northwest New Mexico is the cornerstone of the Northwestern New Mexico Rural Water Projects Act, Pub. L. 111-11, § 10301 et seq. (March 30, 2009) (the Settlement Act) and the 2010 Navajo Nation San Juan River Water Rights Settlement Agreement between the Navajo Nation (the Nation), the State of New Mexico, and the United States. The NGWSP is a major infrastructure project comprising about 280 miles of pipeline, 24 pumping plants and two water treatment plants, as well as numerous water regulation and storage facilities, that altogether will provide a long-term, sustainable and reliable municipal and industrial water supply from the San Juan River Basin to more than 43 Chapters on the Navajo Reservation, to the southwest portion of the Jicarilla Apache reservation, and to the city of Gallup, New Mexico. The Settlement Act provides that all project features are to be completed no later than December 31, 2024, mandating an aggressive construction schedule for a project of this scale.

On October 11, 2011, President Obama designated the NGWSP as one of 14 federal infrastructure projects to be expedited through permitting and environmental review processes, in order to improve the efficiency of federal reviews needed to help infrastructure projects move as quickly as possible from the drawing board to completion. NGWSP was the only project within the Department of the Interior (Department) to be designated among these priority projects, which came as a result of a Presidential Memorandum dated August 31, 2011, in which President Obama directed agencies to expedite environmental reviews and permit decisions for a select number of high priority infrastructure projects.

In accordance with the President's directive, the Department has worked diligently to advance the NGWSP from the drawing board to completion, and in 2012, the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) in coordination and cooperation with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) began the process of preparing rights-of-way (ROW) applications, including seeking consent for the ROW's from individual Indian allottees and the Nation. Reclamation has received the necessary consents from individual Indian allottees on 25 allotments where ROW's are needed for the project. This represents all of the allotted land required for the project. In addition, Reclamation has received consent from the Navajo Nation for two parcels of Navajo tribal land, and will be seeking consent for approximately seven more ROW applications across Navajo tribal land over the next two to three years for the remaining portion of pipeline to be constructed (approximately 100 miles).

While all of the necessary consents on allotted lands were received prior to April 21, 2016, the date the new 25 CFR Part 169 Right of Way Regulations took effect, and not all applications for ROW's across allotted lands have been submitted to BIA. For instance, Reclamation has not yet completed applications for four out of the 25 parcels of allotted lands for which it has obtained consents. In addition, Reclamation recently received consent from the Navajo Nation on two tribal land parcels and another one is pending, but the associated ROW applications for those parcels were not submitted to BIA before the new ROW regulations took effect.

The timing of the submission of these post-April 21, 2016, ROW applications has introduced a critical issue because the new ROW regulations differ in a significant way for purposes of NGWSP project completion from the pre-existing 25 CFR Part 169 Right of Way Regulations that had been in effect when Reclamation began seeking consents for the NGWSP Project and the President identified the NGWSP as a high-priority project.

The old ROW regulations at 25 CFR § 169.5 (2015) permitted BIA to grant waivers to federal agencies for the bond requirement for ROWs, in recognition that the Anti-Deficiency Act prohibits federal agencies from contracting to broad-based indemnification terms. (See 25 CFR § 169.5 (2015) "When the applicant is the U.S. Government or a State Government or an instrumentally thereof and is prohibited by law from executing any of the above stipulations, the Secretary may waive the requirement that the applicant agree to any stipulations so prohibited.")

The new ROW regulations omitted BIA's authority to directly waive the bond requirement in recognition of federal agencies' Anti-Deficiency Act limitations. (See 25 CFR § 169.103.) Instead, the new ROW regulations subject federal agencies to the bond requirements applicable to all other parties, and provide only two more nuanced avenues for waiver of the bond requirement; a 25 CFR §1.2 waiver from the Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs, or a 25 CFR §169.103(f) waiver that requires allottees to request the waiver or for the BIA to defer to the Nation to the maximum extent possible for a determination that the waiver is in its best interest (depending upon whether the ROW is sought from allottees or the Nation). (See 25 CFR § 1.2 "[T]he Secretary retains the power to waive or make exceptions to his regulations as found in chapter 1 of title 25 CFR in all cases where permitted by law and the Secretary finds that such waiver or exception is in the best interest of the Indians;" and 25 CFR § 169.103(f) "We may waive the requirement for a bond, insurance, or alternative form of security: (1) For individually owned Indian land, if the Indian landowners of the majority of the interests request it and we determine, in writing, that a waiver is in the Indian landowners' best interest considering the purpose of and risks associated with the right-of-way, or ... (2) For tribal land, deferring, to the maximum extent possible, to the tribe's determination that a waiver of a bond, insurance or alternative form of security is in its best interest.")

While 25 CFR § 169.103 provides for the waiver of the requirement for a bond, insurance, or alternative form of security so long as consent for such waiver is received from the tribe (for tribal trust land) or the majority of interests of individual Indian landowners (for allotted land), this was not sought for the pending NGWSP ROW applications because the consent process was initiated well before the new rules took effect (and 25 CFR Part 169 (2016) contained clear waiver language).

Reclamation and BIA recognize that although the consent process for the NGWSP ROW's was initiated well before the new ROW regulations were proposed, the agencies could seek a determination from the Navajo Nation that waiver of the bond requirement for remaining or future trust land ROW applications would be in the Nation's best interest, and that it could seek consent from a majority of allottees for a waiver of the bond requirement for remaining or future allottee ROW applications; however, engaging in this process would result in a significant impact to the construction schedule for the NGWSP, which in turn could impact the agencies' ability to complete the project within its legislated deadline of 2024. (See Pub. L. 111 §10701(e)(1)(A)(ix) (March 30, 2009)("NAVAJO-GALLUP WATER SUPPLY PROJECT—Not later than December 31, 2024, the construction of all Project facilities shall be completed.").



### EXHIBIT "E"

## NAVAJO NATION RIGHT-OF-WAY TERMS & CONDITIONS: BUREAU OF RECLAMATION (GRANTEE)

(Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project Reach 10 - Pumping Plant #7)

- The term of the permanent right-of-way shall begin on the date it is granted by the Secretary of the Interior (Secretary) and shall continue as long as the Grantee Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) or its successors, or assigns uses the right-of-way for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project (Project).
- The annual consideration for the use of land is assessed at \$3,852.00 (annually adjusted), which shall be the Navajo Nation's contribution to the Project because the Project will provide water to the Navajo Nation.
  - The Grantee must obtain the approval of the Navajo Nation if any portion of the right-of-way is used for any other purpose than authorized by the approval of this right-of-way.
- 3. The Grantee may develop, use, and occupy the right-of-way for the purpose(s) of constructing, operating, and maintaining the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project. The Grantee may not develop, use, or occupy the right-of-way for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions, or withheld at the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
- 4. In all activities conducted by the Grantee within the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall abide by all applicable laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect, including but not limited to the following:
  - Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 169;
  - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, including compliance with the Programmatic Agreement for the Consideration and Management of Effects on Historic Properties Arising from Construction of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's regulation, last date of execution by all signatories being November 21, 2011, and any amendments thereto.
  - c. BOR shall give employment preference to qualifying Navajos and other Indians in accordance with applicable Navajo and federal law. BOR shall utilize Navajo contractors and Navajo businesses (to purchase goods and materials) in accordance with applicable law.
  - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq., to the extent that it is applicable. Grantee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.

- The Grantee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the right-ofway.
- The Grantee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the right-of-way to the extent compatible with the purpose of the right-of-way, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.
- 7. The Grantee shall reclaim all surface lands disturbed related to the right-of-way, as outlined in a restoration and re-vegetation plan, which shall be approved by the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA) prior to any surface disturbance. The Grantee shall comply with all provisions of such restoration and re-vegetation plan and shall notify the Director of the NNEPA immediately upon completion of the surface disturbance activities so that a site inspection can be made.
- 8. The Grantee shall at all times during the term of the right-of-way and at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the right-of-way and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
- The Grantee shall obtain prior written permission to cross existing rights-of-way, if any, from the appropriate parties.
- 10. The Grantee shall be responsible for and promptly pay all damages when they are sustained provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to increase the liability of the United States beyond the provisions of the Federal Tort Claims Act, Act of June 25, 1948, 62 Stat. 982 (28 U.S.C. § 1346(b), 2671 et seq.) or other applicable law.
- 11. The Grantee shall not assign, convey, or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the right-of-way or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the right-of-way or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the right-of-way, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance, or transfer without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions, or withheld at the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. Congress has authorized BOR to transfer Project title under P.L. 111-11 1062 (f). It is anticipated that after Project title is transferred to the Navajo Nation, the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority will operate and maintain the Project. Therefore, the Grantee may assign and transfer the right-of-way to the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority as authorized by federal law without further approval of the Navajo Nation or the Secretary.
- 12. At the relinquishment of this right-of-way, the Grantee, other than the United States shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental site assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of the said premises. This provision 12 shall not apply to the United States as Grantee.

- 13. Holding over by the Grantee after the relinquishment of the right-of-way shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Grantee any rights hereunder or in or to the land subject to the right-of-way or to any improvements located thereon. This provision 13 shall not apply to the United States as Grantee.
- 14. The Navajo Nation and the Secretary shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the right-of-way, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.
- 15. By acceptance of the grant of right-of-way, the Grantee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive, or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare of the Navajo people) over all lands, persons, and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the right-of-way or to the Navajo Nation.
- 16. Any action or claim brought against the Navajo Nation arising out of the injury to person or property (tort) may be heard in the Courts of the Navajo Nation in accordance with applicable Navajo and federal law. No action or claim shall be brought against the Navajo Nation in any state court.
- 17. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern
  the construction, performance, and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained
  herein.
- 19. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees, and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Grantee, and the term "Grantee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees, and agents.
- 20. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the right-of-way; and the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way shall remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.

The Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency's Public Water Systems Supervision Program ("PWSSP") reviewed Document No. 008150: Application for Consent to Grant Right-of-Way (ROW), Tribal Trust Land, Reach 10, Pumping Plant #7, San Juan Lateral, Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project, Twin Lakes Chapter, McKinley County, New Mexico. The PWSSP recommends approval of this document.

All proposed drinking water projects will need to be permitted by the PWSSP-NNEPA. All proposed drinking water projects (extensions, upgrades, new wells, new public water systems, etc.) must also comply with the design review and construction permit requirements of the PWSSP pursuant §§1501 and 1601 of the Navajo Nation Primary Drinking Water Regulations.

All proposed wastewater projects will need to be permitted by the Domestic Wastewater Program-NNEPA. Extensions, upgrades, new sewer infrastructure, septic tanks, and other wastewater infrastructure must comply with the design review and construction permit requirements pursuant to §201 of the Domestic Wastewater Program.

The Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency Water Quality Program (NNEPA WQ) has reviewed the 164 Document No. 8150: also referenced as BOW ROW Reach 10 Pumping Plant No. 7, Tohatchi – Twin Lakes, New Mexico. This project will provide water line infrastructure carried through Navajo Nation to Gallup, NM. It is suggested that a Clean Water Act Section 401 Certification be applied for and submitted to our office regarding this upcoming waterline project. The information that was provided in the Document No. 8150; the topo maps attached with the 164 packet indicates waterway crossings. It is highly recommended that all future infrastructure developments on Navajo Nation contact our Water Quality office to ensure that the proper certification and permits are followed for these future developments.

#### GRANT OF RIGHT-OF-WAY

The United States of America, acting by and through the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Department of the Interior, Navajo Region P.O. Box 1060 Gallup, New Mexico, 87305, for, and on behalf, with the consent of: The Navajo Nation (the GRANTOR), under authority contained and under the Act of February 5, 1948 (62 Stat. 17; 25 USC 323-328); and Part 169, Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, which by reference are made a part hereof, does hereby grant to: Bureau of Reclamation, Four Corners Construction Office, 1235 La Plata Highway, Farmington, New Mexico 87401 (the GRANTEE).

GRANT. In consideration of: \$\frac{\text{Waived}}{\text{waived}}\$, pursuant to Navajo Nation Resources and Development Committee Resolution No. RDCD-124-17, Pumping Plant No. 7 of the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project will provide a public benefit to the Navajo Nation.

GRANTOR does hereby grant to GRANTEE, a right-of-way for: construction, operation and maintenance and/or replacement of a pumping plant facility with ancillary features and appurtenances thereto that will include but not limited to a water storage and regulation tank, chlorine injection facility and water transmission pipeline; ancillary appurtenances may also include vaults, valves, fiber optic supervisory control and data acquisition systems (SCADA), cathodic protection systems, and three phase utility power to support the operation of the pipeline infrastructure, a gravel and fenced yard, a driveway for ingress and egress, and a patrol road, over and across the land embraced within a right-of-way situated on the following described lands: Northeast Quarter of Section 34, Township 18 North, Range 18 West, New Mexico Principal Meridian, McKinley County, New Mexico.

This right-of-way is limited to and more particularly described to be <u>5.35 acres</u>, more or less, in area, as shown on Exhibit A, attached hereto, and made a part hereof.

2. TERM. This right-of-way is for a term of [without limitation as to tenure], so long as the right-of-way is used for the purpose above specified; PROVIDED, that this right-of-way may be cancelled by the Tribe and Grantee under any negotiated remedies identified in Section 13 (25 CFR §169.403) and/or in whole or in part by the GRANTOR (25 CFR §169.404) or for

any of the following causes upon 30 days written notice, and failure of the GRANTEE within said notice period to correct the basis for cancellation (25 CFR §169.405):

- A. Failure to comply with any term or condition of the Grant, or the applicable regulations.
- B. A non-use of the right-of-way for any consecutive two-year period (for any purpose for which it was granted).
- C. Any conditions or restrictions set out in Tribal Resolution No. <u>RDCD-124-17</u>, dated December 11, 2017.
- 3. MITIGATION MEASURES. (25 CFR §169.123) The GRANTEE agrees to comply with any mitigation measures or conditions described to protect environmental, biological and cultural resources within the right-of-way area defined in the environmental compliance documentation.

Record of Decision for the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project Planning Report and Final Environmental Impact Statement approved by the Secretary dated October 01, 2009.

- 4. RESERVATION OF JURISDICTION. (25 CFR §§169.10, 169.125) The tribe maintains its existing jurisdiction over the land, activities, and persons within the right-of-way and this grant does not diminish to any extent: (a) the tribe's power to tax the land, any improvements on the land, or any person or activity within the right-of-way; (b) the tribe's authority to enforce tribal law of general or particular application on the land subject to and within the right-of-way, as if there were no grant of right-of-way; (c) the tribe's inherent sovereign power to exercise civil jurisdiction over non-members on Indian land; or (d) the character of the land subject to the right-of-way as Indian country under 18 U.S.C. 1151.
- 5. LAWS. (25 CFR §169.9) GRANTEE shall comply with all applicable Federal and tribal law.
- 6. REGULATORY PROVISIONS. (25 CFR §169.125):
  - A. On tribal land, the tribe reserves the right to reasonable access to the lands subject to the grant to determine GRANTEE'S compliance with consent conditions or to protect public health and safety;
  - B. The GRANTEE has no right to any of the products or resources of the land, including but not limited to, timber, forage, mineral, and animal resources, unless otherwise provided for in the grant;
  - C. BIA may treat any provision of a grant that violates Federal law as a violation of the grant; and
  - D. If historic properties, archaeological resources, human remains, or other cultural items not previously reported are encountered during the course of any activity associated with this grant, all activity in the immediate vicinity of the properties, resources, remains, or items will cease and the GRANTEE will contact BIA and the tribe with jurisdiction over the land to determine how to proceed and appropriate disposition.

#### E. GRANTEE must:

- Construct and maintain improvements with the right-of-way in a professional manner consistent with industry standards;
- Pay promptly all damages and compensation, in addition to bond or alternative form of security made pursuant to §169.103, determined by the BIA to be due the landowners and authorized users and occupants of land as a result of the granting, construction, and maintenance of the right-of-way;
- iii. Restore the land as nearly as may be possible to its original condition, upon the completion of construction, to the extent compatible with the purpose for which the right-of-way was granted, or reclaim the land if agreed to by the landowners;
- iv. Clear and keep clear the land within the right-of-way, to the extent compatible with the purpose of the right-of-way, and dispose of all vegetative and other material cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during the construction and maintenance of the project;
- v. Comply with all applicable laws and obtain all required permits;
- vi. Not commit waste;
- vii. Operate, repair and maintain improvements consistent with the right-of-way grant;
- viii. Build and maintain necessary and suitable crossings for all roads and trails that intersect the improvements constructed, maintained, or operated under the right-of-way;
- ix. Restore the land to its original condition, as much as reasonably possible, upon cancellation or termination of the right-of-way, or reclaim the land if agreed to by the landowners:
- x. At all times keep the BIA, and the tribe for tribal land, informed of the GRANTEE'S address;
- xi. Refrain from interfering with the landowner's use of the land, provided that the landowner's use of the land is not inconsistent with the right-of-way;
- xii. Comply with the following due diligence requirements:
  - a. Begin Construction: January 29, 2018
  - b. Construction 50% Completed by: January, 2021
  - c. Construction Competed: April 28, 2023
- xiii. Notify the BIA, and the tribe for tribal land, if it files for bankruptcy or is placed in receivership.

#### F. Unless GRANTEE would be prohibited by law from doing so, GRANTEE must also:

- i. Hold the United States and the Indian landowners harmless from any loss, liability, or damages resulting from the applicant's use or occupation of the premises; and
- ii. Indemnify the United States and the Indian landowners against all liabilities or costs relating to the use, handling, treatment, removal, storage, transportation, or disposal of hazardous materials, or release or discharge of any hazardous material from the premises that occurs during the term of the grant, regardless of fault, with the exception that the applicant is not required to indemnify the Indian

landowners for liability or cost arising from the Indian landowners' negligence or willful misconduct.

- 7. ENCROACHMENT. (25 CFR §169.128) The GRANTEE may not unreasonably withhold its consent for a new right-of-way within its existing right-of-way that does not interfere with the use or purpose of its right-of-way.
- 8. PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS. (25 CFR §169.130) <u>Bureau of Reclamation</u> shall be the owner of any permanent improvements constructed during the term of the grant and said permanent improvements, appurtenances, fixtures and equipment placed within the right-of-way shall be removed or an option for landowner to take possession of and title to the permanent improvements or as otherwise negotiated.
- AMENDMENT. (25 CFR §169.204) This grant may not be amended except as provided in 25 CFR §§ 169.204 – 169.206.
- 10. ASSIGNMENT. (25 CFR §169.207) This grant may not be assigned without prior written consent of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior.

It is envisioned that Bureau of Reclamation would retain Project title to the facilities for the foreseeable future; however, P.L. 111-11 does provide authority for eventual Project title transfer to the Navajo Nation.

- 11. MORTGAGE. (25 CFR §169.210) This grant may not be mortgaged without prior written consent of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior; and within 30 days, a copy of the mortgage and supporting documents will be sent to BIA Division of Land Titles and Records (DLTR) for recording.
- 12. EFFECTIVE DATE. (25 CFR §169.301) Grant will be effective on the date it is approved.
- 13. REMEDIES. (25 CFR §169.403) Any disputes regarding a violation, abandonment, or non-use may be addressed as set forth in accordance with 25 CFR §169.403.
- 14. BINDING EFFECT. The condition for this grant shall extend to and be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors of the GRANTEE.
- 15. BOND, INSURANCE, OR OTHER SECURITY. Request for waiver under 25 CFR §1.2 of the 25 CFR §169.103 Bond Requirement for Right-of-Way of the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project was approved by the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary Indian Affairs dated December 14, 2016 and concurred by the Director of Bureau of Indian Affairs dated December 20, 2016.

The Navajo Nation by letter dated September 9, 2016 supports the request for waiver of bond requirement and confirmed the waiver is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and its people.

Navajo Nation Resolution of the Resources and Development Committee No. RDCD-124-17 dated December 11, 2017 approves waiver of bond requirement.

16. ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS OR RESTRICTIONS. This grant incorporates by reference the conditions or restrictions set out in GRANTOR'S consents, attached here.

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; APPROVING A RIGHT-OF-WAY TO U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION TO CONSTRUCT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN THE NAVAJO GALLUP WATER SUPPLY PROJECT REACH 10 PUMPING PLANT NO. 7 LOCATED ON TRIBAL TRUST LAND IN TWIN LAKES CHAPTER VICINITY (MCKINLEY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO)

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section §501 (B)(2), the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give final approval of all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation land and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

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#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The United States Bureau of Reclamation, 1235 La Plata Highway, Farmington, New Mexico 87401 has submitted a right-of-way application to construct, operate and maintain the Reach 10 Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project located on, over and across Navajo Nation Trust Lands in the Twin Lakes Chapter vicinity, McKinley County, New Mexico attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".
- B. The proposed permanent right-of-way consists of Navajo Nation Trust Lands located in McKinley County, New Mexico and the location is more particularly described on the survey map attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "B".
- C. The General Land Development Department, memorandum dated October 8, 2017, attached as Exhibit "C", has determined that "Pumping Plant #7 will be included into Reaches 9 through 11 ROW package, and the additional consent for the same area is

<u>not</u> required, since the grazing permit holders had already consented to use the land within those areas."

- D. The Bureau of Reclamation requests a waiver of the consideration because the project will provide a public benefit to the Navajo Nation.
- E. The Resources and Development Committee finds a waiver of the bond requirement, 25 C.F.R. § 169, is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation. See, Exhibit "D" which are letters from the Navajo Nation President and the Acting Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- F. The Resources and Development Committee finds a waiver of valuation, 25 C.F.R. § 169.110, and that the waiver of valuation is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation.
- G. The environmental and archaeological studies have been completed and are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.
- H. The application for the Right-of-Way as submitted by the United States Bureau of Reclamation has been reviewed by the Fish and Wildlife; Historic Preservation; Minerals; Navajo Nation Environmental Protection; Division of Natural Resources and the Department of Justice and "Approved" or found "Sufficient". See Exhibit "F".

#### SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby grants approval of a Right-of-Way to U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to construct, operate and maintain Reach 10 Pumping Plant No. 7 of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project located on Navajo Nation Trust Lands in the Twin Lakes Chapter vicinity, McKinley County, New Mexico. The location is more particularly described on the map attached hereto as Exhibit "B".
- B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives the consideration for the Right-of-Way because the Reaches 10 Pumping Plant No. 7 of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project will provide a public benefit to the Navajo Nation.

- C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the Right-of-Way subject to, but not limited to, the terms and conditions incorporated herein as Exhibit "E".
- D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves waiver of the bond requirement.

The Bureau of Reclamation is initiating consultation with your office under the Programmatic Agreement Among The Bureau of Reclamation, The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, The New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officer, The Navajo Nation, The Bureau of Land Management, and The Bureau of Indian Affairs Regarding the Consideration and Management of Effects On Historic Properties Arising from Construction of the Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project, New Mexico (NGWSP PA), an alternative to the implementing regulations of NHPA Section 106 at 36 C.F.R. Part 800. The undertaking and identified historic properties within its area of potential effect (APE) have been addressed in a report by permitted firm PaleoWest Archaeology, LLC., The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project, Class III Inventory and Ethnographic Summary for the San Juan Lateral, Volume II: Reaches 9-11, Navajo Nation and McKinley County, New Mexico, PaleoWest Technical Report No. 15-15. Reclamation submits the draft Class III cultural resources inventory report for your review and comment. The enclosed report addresses identification efforts along Reaches 9, 10, and 11 of the NGWSP San Juan Lateral, encompassing a total APE of 28.4 miles x 400 feet, or 1,377 acres, entirely on Navajo Nation surface.

This inventory resulted in the recording of 131 archaeological sites, 67 isolated occurrences (IOs), 18 in-use sites (IUSs), 11 Traditional Cultural Properties (TCPs), and 8 Jishchaa' locations. Properties and locations other than archaeological sites are reported or summarized in tables within the report. Archaeological sites are discussed in greater detail. Archaeological sites, associated reach numbers, brief descriptions, and tentative determinations of eligibility for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) appear in the three tables below. The




report and forms associated with the Navajo ethnography (TCPs and Jishchaa') are confidential and only submitted to the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD).



Dear Assistant Secretary Roberts:

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP) is the cornerstone of the Navajo Nation San Juan River Basin in New Mexico Water Rights Settlement Agreement (Settlement). The Navajo Nation has been working closely with the Bureau of Reclamation and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to ensure the project's completion by 2024, the deadline mandated by the authorizing legislation. As such, and through a financial assistance agreement with Reclamation, the Nation has taken an active role in designing and constructing a portion of the project on the Cutter Lateral.

One of the major undertakings involved in getting the project built is the acquisition of the right-of-way (ROW) necessary to construct, operate, and maintain the project. On April 21, 2016, new 25 C.F.R. Part 169 ROW Regulations took effect which differ in a significant way for purposes of NGWSP project completion from the pre-existing 25 C.F.R. §169 Regulations that had been in effect when Reclamation and the Nation began seeking consents from allottees for ROW across individual Indian allotments. The new regulations omitted BIA's authority to directly waive the bonding requirement when seeking ROW. The new regulations do allow grantees to seek a waiver from individual Indian allottees and tribes, but in the case of NGWSP, going back and seeking this consent for waiver now would result in significant delays and added expenses to the project.

We understand that Reclamation and BIA are in the process of seeking a waiver, under 25 C.F.R. § 1.2, of the 25 C.F.R. § 169.103 bond requirement for all NGWSP ROWs not issued prior to April 21, 2016. whether the ROW-holder is a federal agency or an agency of the Navajo Nation. The Nation fully supports their request and believes it is in the best interest of the Nation and its people. A waiver will help ensure that Reclamation's and the Nation's ROW acquisition process is not delayed on NGWSP which will result in the project getting completed within the legislated deadline which will benefit the Nation and its people.

#### WHEREAS:

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project (Project) is one of fourteen projects selected nationwide to be a priority of President Obama in October 2011 that will be expedited through permitting and environmental review processes. This is an important step in the Administration's efforts to improve the efficiency of federal reviews needed to help job-creating infrastructure projects move as quickly as possible from the drawing board to completion. The United States Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) is the lead federal agency tasked to construct the Project with the assistance of the Navajo Nation, Jicarilla Apache Nation and City of Gallup. This project is an enormous challenge for the Navajo Nation and is an excellent opportunity for the Nation to showcase their coordination and Programs to President Donald Trump and the United States Government.

The Project will provide a reliable long-term water supply to much of the Navajo Nation within New Mexico. The Project has an estimated construction cost of \$1.131 billion. U.S. Discretionary funding received through FY2016 is \$301 million and FY2017 funding request is \$87 million. BOR has already received \$180 million in mandatory appropriations for Project construction.

This Project is a high priority for this administration and I fully support its expedited implementation and urge cooperation among all Navajo Nation programs to make this Project a reality. This Project is an example of the success brought about by years of hard work by staff and representatives of the Navajo Nation, State of New Mexico and United States.

The foundation of our administration are the four pillars of: Navajo Veterans, Elders and Youth, Infrastructure Development, and Job Creation. These priorities were mandated by the Navajo people and we stand committed to providing progress in these areas for our great Navajo Nation. In July 2015, the Navajo Nation Three Branch Agreement was executed in cooperation with the Legislative Branch and Judicial Branch for the "One Nation, One Voice" initiative. For the first time in our history, the three branches of government stand united in the priority needs of our Navajo Nation. The Navajo-Gallup

Water Supply Project is specifically listed under these Common Priorities of the Navajo Nation.

Over the next several years the Project will be constructed in Reaches (phases). Construction may occur concurrently on several Reaches over the next several years. The legislated completion date for the Project is December 2024. It is important that the Navajo Nation programs align themselves properly to coordinate information and permitting of the various Reaches of the Project. The Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources-Water Management Branch will serve as point of contact for the Project on behalf of the entire Navajo Nation. #### IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The Navajo-Gallup Water Supply Project is a priority project of the Navajo Nation.

The programs within the Executive Branch are hereby directed to promptly process all necessary permits, contracts, and any related matters to this Project for its successful coordination, implementation and construction. The programs and personnel are hereby directed to review and streamline their 164 review process.

#### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT:

I, Russell Begaye, President of the Navajo Nation, by the authority vested in the Office of the President pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (A) and (C)(14), hereby direct this Executive Order shall become effective immediately and remain in effect until rescinded, to be binding upon Navajo Nation Executive Branch Directors, employees, and agents, and to be subjected to enforcement under the Navajo Nation Personnel Polices Manual.

The granting of the waiver will allow the landowners to waive the requirement for an appraisal when the Indian landowners have agreed to waive compensatory consideration of the fair market value and to forego the requisite appraisal. This approval will allow the utility and roadway providers to proceed with the application for rights-of-way for the purpose of installing utilities or roadways. This approved action has been determined to be in the best interests of the landowners.

You are instructed to notify the Tribe and landowners of this decision and provide them with a copy of the decision analysis.

#### ATTACHMENT

To Memorandum to Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs from Director, Bureau of Indian Affairs Requesting to Waive or Make an Exception to 25 CFR Section 169.12

Under the following circumstances, the appraisal requirement in 25 CFR § 169.12 is deemed waived when the landowner upon which the right-of-way will be located waives compensatory consideration and the right to be provided with information as to the fair market value of the right-of-way and:

- The utility/roadway provider is either a federal or tribal government agency or enterprise or an energy cooperative;
- The individual owner will directly benefit from the utility line/roadway;
- The utility line/roadway serves a school, hospital, housing development or other tribal facility that benefits the community;
- The landowner who waives consideration is the tribe or individual owner; or
- The health and safety of the individual owner will be enhanced by the installation of the utility line/roadway.

In all other circumstances, the Regional Director/Superintendent may approve for the Navajo Region the waiver of the appraisal when it is determined that it is in the best interest of the landowner for the utility line/roadway to be installed and the waivers by the landowner of consideration and the request to be provided certain information as to the fair market value of the right-of-way are not due to undue influence or fraud.

Based upon our analysis of the facts in this waiver request and conditions set forth, we concur with the Navajo Regional Director's recommendation. This waiver of 25 CFR § 169.12 is hereby approved as it is determined that this action is in the best interest of the landowners.

Recommendation Accepted and Request for Waiver is Granted.

1.2 - Applicability of regulations and reserved authority of the Secretary of the Interior.

The regulations in chapter I of title 25 of the Code of Federal Regulations are of general application. Notwithstanding any limitations contained in the regulations of this chapter, the Secretary retains the power to waive or make exceptions to his regulations as found in chapter I of title 25 CFR in all cases where permitted by law and the Secretary finds that such waiver or exception is in the best interest of the Indians.

PART 169 — RIGHTS-OF-WAY OVER INDIAN LANDS [ 25 CFR 169 ]

§ 169.12 Consideration for right-of-way grants.

Except when waived in writing by the landowners or their representatives as defined in §169.3 and approved by the Secretary, the consideration for any right-of-way granted or renewed under this part 169 shall be not less than but not limited to the fair market value of the rights granted, plus severance damages, if any, to the remaining estate. The Secretary shall obtain and advise the landowners of the appraisal information to assist them (the landowner or landowners) in negotiations for a right-of-way or renewal.

For NEPA, the following documents would be considered acceptable:

- · Sufficiency Analysis (see attachment);
- "Finding of No New Significant Impact" per 43 CFR § 46.140 (c); or
- "Finding of No Significant Impact" per 40 CRF §1508.13.

As for compliance with the NHPA, the NGWSP does have an executed Programmatic Agreement (PA) concerning historic properties between federal, tribal, and state entities regarding effects on historic and cultural properties. The PA allows for the construction activities to proceed efficiently. In addition, there may be Reach-by-Reach compliance documents considered acceptable provided that the compliance document is signed by the Navajo Tribal Historic Preservation Officer:

- Cultural Resources Compliance Form (CRCF);
- A Bureau of Reclamation letter; or
- A letter from NNHPD.

# LETTER OF AGREEMENT Between THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR BUREAU OF RECLAMATION And BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS

The U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation and Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) are entering into this Agreement to provide an established process for National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) compliance in support of the Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project (NGWSP). The NGWSP is a municipal and industrial water pipeline with associated infrastructure being built to provide water to the Navajo Nation, Jicarilla Apache Nation and the City of Gallup, NM.

The NGWSP is described and analyzed in the NGWSP Project Planning Report and Final Environmental Impact Statement (PR/FEIS) dated July 2009, and the subsequent Record of Decision dated October 1, 2009.

Reclamation and BIA officials in the project area offices have determined that National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) compliance for updated project planning will be determined for independent sections of the pipeline as more refined information of the pipeline route and associated environmental studies are available. This information will be organized into the NGWSP NEPA Sufficiency Review Process (NEPA SRP) Environmental Analysis Form as found in Attachment A to this document. Development of this Form was the result of a collaborative effort between BIA and Reclamation as described in Attachment B (Development of a NEPA Sufficiency Review Process for Long-Term Implementation of the NGWSP.

The outcome of the NEPA SRP, collaboratively completed and signed by both agencies, will determine whether the existing PR/FEIS sufficiently addresses environmental impacts for a particular section of pipeline; or, if it doesn't, that further NEPA action is warranted (e.g., a tiered Environmental Assessment). The results of the NEPA SRP will be signed by appropriate representatives of both agencies with responsibility for determining the need for, and type of, further NEPA action.

If a additional NEPA action is required, Reclamation and BIA will provide joint oversight of the process, with Reclamation designated as the Lead Agency, and BIA designated as a Cooperating Agency according to Department of Interior NEPA guidelines at 43 CRF Part 46.

This Letter of Agreement becomes effective upon signature by authorized officials of Reclamation and BIA.
