**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this legislation is to fund Chapter Heavy Equipment purchases and Emergency Water Projects through the Síhasin Fund.

**This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.**



RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT  
TO 12 N.N.C §§ 2501 – 2508

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).
- B. The Naabik'iyati' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to review all proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9).

1 C. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered  
2 to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting,  
3 appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 301 (B)(2).

4 D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is  
5 empowered to provide oversight over water and chapter activities, as well as  
6 oversight over community and economic development on the Navajo Nation. 2  
7 N.N.C. §501 (C)(1).

8 E. The Navajo Nation Code provides that the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin  
9 Fund (“Síhasin Fund”) is as follows:

10 § 2502 Purpose

11 A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support  
12 and/or financing for:

13 1. The planning and development of economic  
14 development and regional infrastructure supporting  
15 economic development, and community development,  
16 including such infrastructure as, but not limited to,  
17 housing, commercial and government buildings,  
18 waterline, solid waste management development,  
19 powerline projects, and transportation and  
20 communication systems, within the Navajo Nation;  
21 and

22 2. Education opportunities for members of the Navajo  
23 Nation.

24 B. For the Purpose in § 2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for  
25 infrastructure shall not be limited by 12 NNC § 1310(F) or  
26 TCDCJY-77-99.

27 C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match  
28 funding, direct funding in part, and other weighted uses of the  
29 Fund, including loan financing from the Fund, for the purposes  
30 in § 2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct funding in whole.

1 12 N.N.C. § 2502, as amended by CJA-03-18.

2 F. The Sifhasin Fund provides that “Fund Principal” shall consist of all deposits made  
3 to the Sifhasin Fund and that “Fund Income” shall consist of all earnings (interest,  
4 dividends, etc.) generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Fund  
5 Income shall be deposited in and added to Fund Principal until such time as a  
6 Fund Expenditure Plan is duly adopted. 12 N.N.C. §§ 2504 and 2505 (C).

7  
8 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

9 A. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared a Public Health Emergency of  
10 International Concern related to the outbreak of coronavirus (COVID-19), a  
11 highly contagious and sometimes fatal respiratory virus, on January 30, 2020; the  
12 U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health  
13 Emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020; and the WHO  
14 declared a global pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020.

15 B. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the  
16 concurrence of Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, declared a Public Health  
17 State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation on March 11, 2020 due to COVID-19.  
18 Resolution No. CEM 20-03-11. The Navajo Nation Department of Health  
19 subsequently issued numerous Public Health Emergency Orders. Public Health  
20 Orders 2020-001 through 2020-030 are incorporated by reference into this  
21 resolution.

22 C. The U.S. Congress on March 27, 2020, enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and  
23 Economic Security Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (2020) (the “CARES  
24 Act”), which, at Title V, §5001, entitled “Coronavirus Relief Funds”, set aside \$8  
25 billion in emergency aid for Tribal governments for the COVID-19 pandemic.

26 D. As of June 30, 2020, the Navajo Nation has received seven hundred fourteen  
27 million one hundred eighty-nine thousand six hundred thirty-one dollars and  
28 forty-seven cents (\$714,189,631.47) as the Nation’s share of the U.S. Treasury’s  
29 initial distributions of the Coronavirus Relief Fund.

30

- 1 E. The CARES Act provides the Coronavirus Relief Fund shall be used to cover  
2 only those costs that:
- 3 a. are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health  
4 emergency with respect to COVID-19;
  - 5 b. are not accounted for in the Tribal budget most recently approved as  
6 of March 27, 2020; and
  - 7 c. are incurred from March 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020.
- 8 F. Pursuant to the U.S. Treasury “Coronavirus Relief Fund Guidance for State,  
9 Territorial, Local, and Tribal Governments” updated on September 2, 2020,  
10 related to the permissible uses of the Coronavirus Relief Fund, for a CARES Act  
11 expense to have been “incurred” requires that services actually be performed and  
12 goods actually received by December 30, 2020.
- 13 G. The Navajo Nation has enacted Resolutions No. CJN-46-20, CJN-47-20, CJY-67-  
14 20, CS-73-20 and CS-74-20, incorporated herein by reference, allocating the  
15 Nation’s share of the U.S. Treasury’s initial distributions of the Coronavirus  
16 Relief Fund through numerous CARES Fund Expenditure Plans, including the  
17 CARES Fund Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan enacted by CS-73-20 and  
18 the Water Projects Expenditure Plan enacted by CJY-67-20.
- 19 H. The purpose of the CARES Fund Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan was to  
20 provide funding to all Navajo Nation Chapters (both LGA Certified and non-  
21 certified), through the Division of Community Development, to respond to the  
22 COVID-19 pandemic and ensure that Navajo communities have access to the  
23 funding necessary to ensure that community members are adequately protected  
24 from exposure to COVID-19 and able to comply with the Center for Disease  
25 Control (CDC) COVID-19 prevention guidance.
- 26 I. The purpose of the CARES Fund Water Projects Expenditure Plan was to provide  
27 emergency funding to Department of Water Resources to ensure that the Navajo  
28 Nation populace has adequate access to safe potable water necessary to mitigate  
29 the spread COVID-19 and comply with CDC COVID-19 prevention guidance.  
30

1 J. Resolutions No. CJY-67-20 and CS-73-20 include that the progress of all  
2 approved Navajo Nation Cares Fund Expenditure Plan projects, including Chapter  
3 Distribution Expenditure Plan projects and Water Projects Expenditure Plan  
4 projects, shall be reviewed by the Budget and Finance and Naabik'iyáti'  
5 Committees during the month of October 2020 and that the funding for any  
6 project that has not made enough progress to demonstrate that it will be fully  
7 completed by December 30, 2020, will be re-allocated to the Hardship Assistance  
8 Expenditure Plan through Naabik'iyáti' Committee. *See* CJY-67-20, Section  
9 Three (Q) and CS-73-20, Section Three (F).

10 K. On October 30, 2020, the Naabik'iyáti' Committee enacted NABIO-49-20,  
11 incorporated herein by reference, which states that

12 Any remaining CS-73-20, CJY-67-20 and/or CJN-46-20 CARES Fund  
13 Expenditure Plan funds not fully expended, not including encumbered and  
14 obligated funds, by November 20, 2020, regardless of recipient or  
15 intended recipient, shall be automatically reallocated to the Hardship  
16 Assistance Expenditure Plan. Funds still encumbered as of December 15,  
17 2020, shall be unencumbered and unobligated and automatically  
18 reallocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan. The Office of  
19 Management and Budget and Office of Controller shall implement these  
20 reallocations without the need for further authorization.

21 NABIO-46-20, Section Three (D).

22 L. Numerous Chapters have requested that the Division of Community Development  
23 (DCD) use their respective Chapter Distribution funds to purchase heavy  
24 equipment; however, due to COVID-19 business restrictions and shut-downs,  
25 DCD was not able to execute the heavy equipment purchases, set forth in **Exhibit**  
26 **A**, by NABIO-46-20's November 20<sup>th</sup> expenditure mandate and the funding was  
27 automatically reallocated to the Hardship Assistance Expenditure Plan.

28 M. Similar to DCD, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) was unable, due to  
29 COVID-19 business restrictions and shut-downs, to execute the water project  
30 purchases, set forth in **Exhibit B**, by NABIO-46-20's November 20<sup>th</sup> expenditure

1 mandate and the funding was automatically reallocated to the Hardship Assistance  
2 Expenditure Plan.

3 N. Notwithstanding the automatic reallocation to the Hardship Assistance  
4 Expenditure Plan, the purchase of the heavy equipment, as set forth in **Exhibit A**,  
5 is important to both the Chapters' response to COVID-19 and its overall  
6 community development, both short-term and long-term.

7 O. Notwithstanding the automatic reallocation to the Hardship Assistance  
8 Expenditure Plan, funding of the water projects, as set forth in **Exhibit B**, is  
9 important to both the Navajo People' access to safe potable water and overall  
10 community development, both short-term and long-term.

11 P. The Navajo Nation finds that using the Síhasin Fund for the purchase of heavy  
12 equipment, as set forth in **Exhibit A**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. § 2502  
13 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of Navajo communities and the Navajo People.

14 Q. The Navajo Nation also finds that using the Síhasin Fund to fund the emergency  
15 water projects, as set forth in **Exhibit B**, is within the purposes of 12 N.N.C. §  
16 2502 (A) (1) and is in the best interests of the Navajo People and Navajo  
17 communities.

18  
19 **SECTION THREE. ALLOCATION OF \$11,924,571 TO THE DIVISION OF**  
20 **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND ADOPTION OF THE CHAPTER HEAVY**  
21 **EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN**

22 A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates eleven million nine hundred twenty-four  
23 thousand five hundred seventy-one dollars (\$11,924,571) from the Síhasin Fund to  
24 the Division of Community Development to implement the Síhasin Fund Chapter  
25 Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan as detailed in **Exhibit A**.

26 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy  
27 Equipment Expenditure Plan as set forth in this resolution and in **Exhibit A**.

28  
29 **SECTION FOUR. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF CHAPTER HEAVY**  
30 **EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN ADMINISTRATION**

1 The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy  
2 Equipment Expenditure Plan as follows:

- 3 1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the  
4 \$11,924,571 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or  
5 Fund Income or a combination of both;
- 6 2. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall be  
7 distributed to the Division of Community Development within ten (10) days  
8 following enactment of this legislation;
- 9 3. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall be  
10 used solely to purchase the equipment described in **Exhibit A** and any and all  
11 cost-savings shall be returned to the Síhasin Fund once the Chapter Heavy  
12 Equipment Expenditure Plan is completed; and
- 13 5. The funds allocated for the Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan shall  
14 revert to the Síhasin Fund principal if not spent or encumbered within ninety  
15 (90) days of distribution to the Division of Community Development, unless  
16 recommended otherwise by the Resources and Development Committee and  
17 approved by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

18  
19 **SECTION FIVE. ALLOCATION OF \$33,876,114 TO THE DEPARTMENT OF**  
20 **WATER RESOURCES AND ADOPTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER**  
21 **RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN**

- 22 A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates thirty-three million eight hundred seventy-six  
23 thousand one hundred fourteen dollars (\$33,876,114) from the Síhasin Fund to the  
24 Department of Water Resources to implement the Síhasin Fund Department of  
25 Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as detailed in **Exhibit B**.
- 26 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the Síhasin Fund Department of  
27 Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as set forth in this  
28 resolution and in **Exhibit B**.

1     **SECTION SIX. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF DEPARTMENT OF WATER**  
2     **RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN**  
3     **ADMINISTRATION**

4     The Navajo Nation hereby approves administration of the Síhasin Fund Department of  
5     Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan as follows:

- 6         1. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the  
7             \$33,876,114 allocation from the Síhasin Fund will be from Fund Principal or  
8             Fund Income or a combination of both;
- 9         2. The funds allocated for the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects  
10            Expenditure Plan shall be distributed to the Department of Water Resources  
11            within ten (10) days following enactment of this legislation;
- 12         3. The funds allocated for the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects  
13            Expenditure Plan shall be used solely to fund the projects described in **Exhibit**  
14            **B** and any and all cost-savings shall be returned to the Síhasin Fund once the  
15            Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plan is  
16            completed; and
- 17         5. The funds allocated for the Department of Water Resources Emergency Projects  
18            Expenditure Plan shall revert to the Síhasin Fund principal if not spent or  
19            encumbered within one hundred twenty days (120) days of distribution to the  
20            Department of Water Resources, unless recommended otherwise by the  
21            Resources and Development Committee and approved by the Naabik'iyáti'  
22            Committee.

23  
24     **SECTION SEVEN. EFFECTIVE DATE**

25     This legislation and the Síhasin Fund Chapter Heavy Equipment and Department of  
26     Water Resources Emergency Projects Expenditure Plans Expenditure Plan, as set  
27     forth above, shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 2505.

28  
29     **SECTION EIGHT. SAVINGS CLAUSE**

1 Should any provision(s) of this Action be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation  
2 Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the  
3 Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Action shall remain the law of  
4 the Navajo Nation.

5  
6 **SECTION NINE. DIRECTIVES**

7 The Division of Community Development and Department of Water Resources shall  
8 report, in writing, the status of expenditures and project progress under their  
9 respective Expenditure Plans to the Naabik'iyati' Committee and Office of the  
10 President and Vice-President by the fifth day of each month following the enactment  
11 of this legislation.





The Many Farms Chapter has lost the \$500,000 due to late notice back from the CARES Fund administrator and the deadline has pass.





**CHINLE CHAPTER GOVERNMENT RESPECTFULLY REQUESTS TO BE ADDED TO THE SIHASIN FUND CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN, WHICH IS INCLUDED IN THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL LEGISLATION 0309-20, AN ACTION RELATING TO BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE AND NAABIK'YATI COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$11,924,571 FROM THE SIHASIN FUND TO THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT; ADOPTING THE SIHASIN FUND CHAPTER HEAVY EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT TO 12 N.N.C §§ 2501 – 2508; ALLOCATING \$33,876,114 FROM THE SIHASIN FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES; ADOPTING THE SIHASIN FUND DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES EMERGENCY PROJECTS EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT TO 12 N.N.C §§ 2501 – 2508, FOR THE PURCHASE OF A BACKHOE AND CHAPTER HEAVY DUTY TRUCK TO BE USED FOR THE CHINLE COMMUNITY AND LOCAL SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES, IF NEED BE.**

### WHEREAS:

1. Chinle Chapter, a recognized certified local government of the Navajo Nation, vested with the power and authority to advocate on behalf of its constituents for the improvement of health, education, safety and general welfare; and
2. Chinle Chapter Government is a local government established as a Chapter under the Navajo Nation on February 14, 1956 and it is the 32<sup>nd</sup> Navajo Nation Chapter to become LGA Certified out of 110 Chapters; and
3. The U.S. Congress on March 27, 2020, enacted the Coronavirus aid, Relief, Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Pub L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (2020). The CARES Act, at Title V, §5001, entitled Coronavirus Relief Funds which set aside \$8 Billion in emergency aid for Tribal Governments for the COVID-19 Pandemic; The Navajo Nation received from the CARES Act funding in the amount of \$714,189,631.47 to be used to address the COVID-19 Pandemic; From Navajo Nation Council Resolution CS-73-20, an amount of \$90 Million was appropriated for Navajo Nation Chapters and this was approved the Navajo Nation Office of the President & Vice-President; The Chinle Chapter Government was allocated an amount of \$1,814,490.00 under Business Unit Number 10815; Chinle Chapter Government requested through the appropriated funds a Backhoe and Chapter Heavy Duty Truck to haul and transport the backhoe via the NN CARES Act Funds and initially the Navajo Division of Community Development approved such purchase but was denied by the Navajo Office of the Controller; and
4. The Chinle Chapter Government request to the Navajo Office of the Controller detailing the need and warrant as well as price estimate is attached; and
5. The Chinle Chapter Government pursuant to the NNC Legislation 0309-20, want to be added to the Sihasin Fund – Chapter Heavy Equipment Expenditure Plan in the amount of \$175,524.91 and this amount covers a backhoe and Chapter Heavy Duty Truck. (Attached); and
6. The Chinle Chapter is still in need of securing a new backhoe for the chapter as well as the Heavy Duty Chapter Truck as the amount of burial requests due to the COVID-19 Pandemic has increased and the chapter has had to also provide gravesite services to nearby surrounding communities; and
7. The amount of wear and tear on our current backhoe and chapter truck is quite evident and replacement of these units need to be done; and


The Chinle Chapter Government formally submits this letter of request to you for acknowledgement and approval in our request for new equipment for the chapter. The chapter is dire need of a new Backhoe as well as chapter truck due to the COVID-19 Pandemic as the Chinle Chapter has been in constant operation of providing assistance to the general public since the Pandemic was announced, March 2020. As part of the continued operation, the chapter was tagged to be the District Distribution Center for Chinle Agency and given our LGA status, we also provided essential assistance through Burials, Trash Services and distribution of goods and services. All of which required the chapter to use our chapter truck and backhoe for these services and this meant a constant wear and tear and excessive mileage for our chapter equipment.

Also, within the allocation of the Navajo Nation CARES Act, Legislation CS-73-20 was approved and that enacted funding for chapters and through the Guidance of the Coronavirus Relief Fund for State, Territorial, Local and Tribal Governments, it states that that necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) can be considered.

Then within the Navajo Nation CARES Fund Chapter Distribution Expenditure Plan listed in the purpose cites infrastructure equipment like a backhoe for COVID related deceased matters as well as a vehicle which provided the transportation of Pandemic relief of goods and services throughout the Chinle Agency, providing services for up to ten chapters.

In closing, the Chinle Chapter is requesting approval of purchasing a backhoe and chapter truck as replacements for our existing worn, tired and need of replacement equipment. We have determined to have such equipment replaced it will cost, \$175,524.91 and attached is the quotation of such items. 

## Chapter Support Program – Standard Equipment Justification Memo

The Navajo Nation understands that many Chapters have a need for the acquisition of heavy equipment or the repair of existing equipment due to overuse during the pandemic. Such items include backhoes, trailers, and other transportation equipment. Given these are Federal dollars, there are many Federal compliance requirements that accompany the use of funds. As with all uses of payments from the CARES Act, the use of payments to acquire or improve property and equipment is limited to that which is necessary due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. In the context of acquisitions of equipment, this means that the acquisition itself must be necessary. Per compliance requirements, you must:

- Determine the Chapter is not able to meet the need arising from the public health emergency in a cost-effective manner by leasing property or equipment
- Maintain documentation to support this determination.

Additionally, such acquisitions must be completed and the acquisition of equipment be put to use in service of the COVID-19-related use for which it was acquired or improved by December 30, 2020 to support compliance requirements, please provide answers to the following questions for each piece of equipment or vehicles that you would like procured or are requesting reimbursement. <sup>1</sup>

1. Please provide an explanation of how this equipment or heavy machinery will directly allow your Chapter to respond to or mitigate circumstances caused by COVID-19.

The purchasing of the Backhoe will allow the continuance of assisting not only the Chinle Chapter but nearby surrounding chapters with the digging of burial plots for those individuals that passed on due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Given that the Chinle Chapter is an LGA Chapter we have been in continued operation since the start of the Pandemic, March 2020, and this laid the burden of making sure loved ones were properly laid to rest. The wear and tear on our existing backhoe were significant and this included the chapter truck which pulled the backhoe within the Chinle Community and the surrounding communities. The need for backhoe assistance is ongoing and given the increase in positive cases of COVID-19 will not end. The need to have graves dug will last well into the end of 2020 and go directly into 2021. Replacement of the current backhoe is a must and need.

The chapter is also needing to replace its chapter truck that transports the Backhoe as well as they go hand in hand and being able to get the Backhoe to the community cemetery is a must and needed. The size of the Backhoe warrants having to be transported to the cemetery as well as community burial sites and the constant wear and tear on the chapter truck has been evident and a replacement is warranted and needed.



2. Please confirm the vendor will guarantee that the item will be delivered and the Chapter will make use of the item before 12/30. Funds must be expended before 11/30, but all goods must be delivered and operational before 12/30 to be eligible. Note – please also include confirmation from the vendor stating the date of delivery (e.g., a purchase order, invoice).

The chapter is well aware of the parameters and deadlines needing to be met and we will have the backhoe delivered to the Chapter before December 30, 2020 and this also includes the chapter truck and once they have arrived, they will be in full operation as we get requests for burial assistance weekly. Also see the attached emails as well as the individual Quotations which indicate delivery prior to December 30, 2020.

3. Provide an explanation to support that the Chapter is not able to meet the need in a more cost-effective manner (i.e., why there was a need to purchase the backhoe as opposed to rent through December 30, 2020). This analysis should be focused on the covered period (through 12/30) and why there is not a more cost-effective option over the next two months as opposed to purchasing the piece of equipment. As a reminder, the intention of CARES Act funding is for the covered period through December 30, 2020 and future use of the item in 2021 is not an appropriate justification. If the item is not available to rent, that is an acceptable justification.

The cost of renting is not deemed acceptable nor does having to abide by the rules of meeting the necessary expectations of servicing the equipment through that one vendor only. Whereas purchasing of a new backhoe allows more flexibility in service of unit. Also renting of unit is not readily available in our location.

There is no funding to rent or commit to a long term renting agreement and purchasing of a new chapter truck is deemed feasible at this time.
