28	A. The Navajo Nation has significant need for infrastructure repair and replacement.	
29	B. Arizona State Representative Teller, Cano, Chavez, Fernandez, Friese, Longdon,	
30	Pawlik, Salman, Teran, Tsosie and State Senators Peshlakai and Steele are sponsors	

of HB 2611 which, if approved would provide a total of \$14,500,000 for bridge replacement in the Navajo Nation Chapters of Lupton, Steamboat, Greasewood and Chinle. See Exhibit A.

C. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation that this legislation be officially supported by the Resources and Development Committee and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee respectively.
