Thank you to the Navajo Nation Council and Navajo Department of Diné Education for working together to present this resolution in support of our Navajo Head Start students and citizens who utilize the community libraries established in fifty-six (56) Chapter houses across the Navajo Nation. Now, more than ever, internet connectivity is a basic infrastructure need for our Navajo families.

As stated in the Office of the Controller's Memorandum, included in CD-66-22, this funding is a recurring cost; therefore, it should be budgeted for accordingly during the annual comprehensive budget deliberations. The incoming 25th Navajo Nation Council and Administration must keep these fixed costs in mind along with the fiscal responsibility that our leaders share for the preservation of finite Navajo Nation funds. Pursuant to the authority vested in the Navajo Nation President, I am signing Resolution CD-66-22 into law.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FOURTH YEAR, 2022

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES, THE BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$111,554 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE ("UUFB") FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF DINÉ EDUCATION FOR INTERNET COSTS AT 56 SITES; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), AND § 820(L)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council, and serves as the oversight committee for the Department of Diné Education. 2 N.N.C. § 400(A), § 401(C)(1).
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee as a standing committee with the authority to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds, including the Navajo Nation's Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance ("UUFB"). 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. § 300(A), § 301(B)(2).
- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee was created as a standing committee, and all proposed legislation that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council is assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee for its review. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A). As such, the Council may approve supplemental appropriations during the fiscal year. "Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)." 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- E. A "supplemental appropriation" is defined as: "[a]n appropriation of funds from the UUFB during the fiscal year,

- outside of the annual Comprehensive Budget Process." See Section XIV.33 of the FY2023 Budget Instructions Manual.
- F. The Title 12 restrictions on supplemental appropriations from the UUFB include:
 - 1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues, and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F).
 - Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(J), § 820(L).
 - 3. UUFB funds may be used only after the Controller determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues are added to the UUFB account. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
 - 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F), § 880.
 - 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller. Such review is also required because the Controller determines which revenues and expenses are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
 - 6. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The Department of Diné Education ("DODE") is requesting \$111,554 (rounded up) in supplemental funding from the UUFB to cover expenses for internet services and CIPA (Child Internet Protection Act) fees for 56 sites located across the Navajo Nation, starting as of January 1, 2023. DODE explains that Navajo Nation Telecommunication and Utilities has been paying these costs for the previous two years using federal funds from the USAC (Universal Service Administrative Company), but this

- funding is expiring December 31, 2022. DODE's request memorandum is attached hereto as EXHIBIT A.
- B. In Resolution No. NNBEOC-804-2022 the Navajo Nation Board of Education indicates its support for DODE's supplemental funding request, to keep internet services active for the 56 affected Navajo Nation Chapters (community libraries) and Head Start Centers that will lose online internet access as of January 1, 2023. EXHIBIT B.
- C. The 56 sites that will potentially lose their internet services are listed in the attached **EXHIBIT C**.
- D. DODE's required budget forms, and Appendix K "Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary" are attached as **EXHIBIT D**.
- E. The Office of the Controller issued a memorandum to satisfy the requirements in 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). EXHIBIT E. The Controller has identified DODE's proposed expenditures as recurring and therefore a waiver of 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), and § 820(J) is required.
- F. The Office of Management and Budget has provided its budget impact analysis pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M). EXHIBIT F.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$111,554 FROM THE UUFB FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF DINÉ EDUCATION FOR INTERNET COSTS AT 56 SITES

- A. The Navajo Nation Council hereby approves a supplemental appropriation of \$111,554 from the UUFB to the Department of Diné Education to cover expenses for internet services and CIPA fees at the 56 potentially affected Navajo Nation Chapters and Head Start Centers listed in EXHIBIT C.
- B. This supplemental appropriation shall be from those funds that exceed the minimum fund reserve balance in the UUFB required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(J), as determined by the Controller.
- C. This supplemental appropriation shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year, as would otherwise occur pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(N). However, any UUFB funds not spent or encumbered within 12 months of the date such funds are provided to DODE shall revert to the UUFB, unless otherwise approved prior to such reversion by both the Budget and Finance Committee and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION FOUR. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), AND § 820(L)

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), and § 820(L) to allow use of UUFB funds for the DODE expenditures described in **EXHIBITS A-E**. Said waivers are necessary because DODE's proposed expenditures are considered recurring government costs.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective as provided in 2 N.N.C. § 221(B) and 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any portion of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

Honorable Delegate Tso,

On October 6, 2022, the Navajo Nation Board of Education supported and passed resolution to seek internal and/or external funding to continue and aid E-Rate chapter libraries [see attachment 1.]. In 2020, the Navajo Nation received \$53 million from the national E-Rate program, which helped chapter houses become eligible libraries, including Head Start centers. For the past two years, Navajo Nation Telecommunication and Utilities (NNTU) paid monthly costs for internet service and CIPA filtering fees, totally \$9,296.15 per month and \$111,553.80 per year, for 56 sites (Community Libraries) [see attachment 2. for list of sites]. Unfortunately, funding to support these monthly costs are expiring January 2023 by NNTU.

As a result of the upcoming end, DODE has been advocating for various forms of available funding to continue and pay for internet and CIPA filtering fees, but each were not successful. This is a critical situation, and DODE continues its call-to-action campaign to retrieve any available funding to support these accessible resources for our students and community members across the Navajo Nation. Again, there is an immediate need for any internal or external funds to further expedite these payments for all 56 sites, including any new sites that have been approved for USAC Funding Year 2021 and 2022 so that students continue to access the internet and its resources for educational use.

If this is an opportunity of support, we invite you to a meeting to further discuss this situation. We invite your full support and considerations on varying avenues to pursue so that our students continue to be supported following 2022.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION BOARD OF EDUCATION

Relating to Education; Supporting a Request for Internal/External Funding in the Amount of \$111,553.80 Per Year to Expedite Recurring Costs to Maintain 56 Chapter Satellite Libraries Through the E-Rate Consortium

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Navajo Nation Board of Education (hereinafter the "Board") is the education agent in the Executive Branch for the purposes of overseeing the operation of all schools serving the Navajo Nation. 10 N.N.C. § 106 (A). The Board carries out its duties and responsibilities through the Department of Diné Education (hereinafter the "Department"). 10 N.N.C. §106 (G)(3).
- 2. The Department is the administrative agency within the Navajo Nation with responsibility and authority for implementing and enforcing the educational laws of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §1801(B); 10 N.N.C. §107(A). The Department is under the immediate direction of the Navajo Nation Superintendent of Schools, subject to the overall direction of the Board. 10 N.N.C. §107(B).
- 3. In 2020, the Navajo Nation received \$53 million from the U niversal Service Administrative Company commonly known as the E-Rate Program. This funding supports schools and libraries access to broadband services and helped the Navajo Nation Chapter House's establish community libraries that are extension of the Navajo Nation Library located in Window Rock, AZ. This funding also supported the Navajo Head Start in obtaining affordable broadband for their centers. For the past two years, Navajo Nation Telecommunication and Utilities (NNTU) has been paying for monthly recurring costs for internet service and CIPA (Child Internet Protection Act) filtering fees, totally \$9,296.I 5 per month and \$111,553.80 per year for 56 sites (Community Libraries or Navajo Head Start Centers).
- 4. However, funding to support these monthly costs are expiring December 2022 as NNTU can no longer support this cost.
- 5. The Board has reviewed the proposed recurring funding request for internal/external funding in the amount of \$111,553.80 per year (attached as "EXHIBIT A") as being in the best interests of the Navajo Nation, including students, chapters, communities and affected stakeholders.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Navajo Nation Board of Education supports and approves the proposed recurring funding request for internal/external funding in the amount of \$111,553.80 per year (attached as "EXHIBIT A")
- 2. The Navajo Nation Board of Education hereby directs and empowers the Superintendent of Schools to take any actions deemed as necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

SUBJECT: Recurring Costs Shortfall

In 2020, the Navajo Nation received \$53 million from the Universal Service Administrative Company commonly known as the E-Rate Program. This funding supports schools and libraries access to broadband services and helped the Navajo Nation Chapter Houses establish community libraries that are extension of the Navajo Nation Library located in Window Rock, AZ. This funding also supported the Navajo Head Start in obtaining affordable broadband for their centers. For the past two years, Navajo Nation Telecommunication and Utilities (NNTU) has been paying for monthly recurring costs for internet service and CIPA (Child Internet Protection Act) filtering fees, totally \$9,296.15 per month and \$111,553.80 per year for 56 sites (Community Libraries or Navajo Head Start Centers). [See attached list of sites]. However, funding to support these monthly costs are expiring December 2022 as NNTU can no longer support this cost.

The costs for the Navajo Head Start Centers have been in transition to the applicable Navajo Head Start budget. The internet services and CIPA filtering cost for the branch libraries remains unfunded. During the Fiscal Year 2023 Navajo Nation annual budget process, DODE submitted a request for General Fund Fixed Cost Allocation to cover these cost but it was not funded. At this point, we are in the process of requesting for supplemental appropriation to address this shortfall.

There is an immediate need for any internal or external funds to further expedite these payments for all 56 sites, including any new sites that have been approved for USAC Funding Year 2021 and 2022 so that students and community members continue to receive internet and resource accessibility.

If this is an opportunity for support, one suggestion is to draft a resolution for the NNBOE to consider, and each approval should eventually become part of the Navajo Nation Council's discussion.
