16	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
17	A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo	
18	Nation Council. See 2 N.N.C. §500 (A).	
19	B. The President of the Navajo Nation appoints and the Resources and Development	
20	Committee confirms the directors to the Navajo Agricultural Products Industry. See 2	
21	N.N.C. §501(B)(9). See also 5 N.N.C. §1603 (A).

23	SECTION TWO. FINDINGS	
24	A. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, pursuant to Navajo Nation Council	
25	Resolution CJA-05-10 which amended the Navajo Agricultural Products Industry's	
26	("NAPI") Plan of Operation: " the President of the Navajo Nation shall appoint a	
27	qualified candidate on or before thirty (30) working days. The [Resources and	
28	Development Committee] of the Navajo Nation Council shall fill vacancies where the	
29	President has not made an appointment within thirty (30) working days by appointing	
30	and confirming a candidate that meets the qualifications stated above."	

B. The five members of the Board of Directors shall possess substantial business experience and be from the Western, Chinle and Eastern Agencies. At least three of the Directors shall have substantial experience in successful agribusiness commercial farming, provided that such experience not be through employment with NAPI. At least one Director shall be educated in the field of agriculture, one director shall reside in District 13 and one Director shall reside within District 19. All Directors shall have at least a Bachelor of Science degree except those Directors representing District 13 and District 19. Preference in the appointment of Directors shall be given to Navajo members. No person who has been employed by NAPI will be eligible to become a Director until six years after the date of separation from NAPI. See NAPI Plan of Operation. See also CJA-05-10.

 C. The President of the Navajo Nation has not submitted an appointee for confirmation to the Resources and Development Committee within the thirty day requirement.

- D. Mr. Danny Simpson has submitted his letter of interest as well as his résumé for consideration for appointment to the NAPI Board of Directors. See Letter of Interest, Résumé and Certificate of Navajo Indian Blood attached hereto as Exhibits A, B, and C respectively.
- E. The former NAPI Board of Director representing District 19 has a term that expired on October 28, 2017. See RDCO-98-14.
- F. The Huerfano and Nageezi Chapters recommend the appointment and confirmation of Mr. Danny Simpsom to the NAPI Board of Directors to represent District 19. See Huerfano Chapter Resolution #HUE-071-18 and Nageezhi Chapter Resolution #NC-18-056 attached hereto as Exhibits D and E, respectively.

G. Mr. Danny Simpson meets the qualifications to be a Director for the Navajo Agricultural Products Industry as required by NAPI Plan of Operation Art. 6 (C).

# SECTION THREE. APPOINTING AND CONFIRMING MR. DANNY SIMPSON AS A DIRECTOR

A.	The Resources and Development Committee hereby appoints Mr. Danny Simpson to

B. The Resource and Development Committee hereby confirms the appointment of Mr. Danny Simpson to the Navajo Agricultural Products Industry Board of Directors representing District 19 for a term of three years to commence on October 28, 2017 and expire on October 28, 2020.
