RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE OF THE 23RD NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL --- FIRST YEAR, 2015

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; ENDORSING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CHUSKA REGIONAL COUNCIL ESTABLISHED BY THE SAILE/WHEATFILEDS, LUKACHUKAI, ROUND ROCK, AND ROCK POINT CHAPTERS.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings:

- A. The Resources and Development Committee is the oversight Committee for the Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§500(C) and 501(C)(1).
- B. The Resources and Development Committee has endorsed the establishment of regional councils including the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council, RDCS-36-11, the Navajo Mountain, Oljato, Shonto, and Ts'ah Biikiin Regional Council, RDCO-38-11 and the Central Regional Council, RDCJN-37-14.
- C. The Chinle Agency Council, and the Tsaile/Wheatfiled, Lukachukai, Round Rock, and Rock Point Chapters have passed resolutions recommending the establishment of the Chuska Regional Council to be composed of the above-named chapters. The chapter resolutions are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit B.
- D. The Chinle Agency Council and the Tsaile/Wheatfiled, Lukachukai, Round Rock, and Rock Point Chapters also seek the endorsement of the Chuska Regional Council Plan of Operation attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit A.
- E. The Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (LGA), 26 N.N.C. §§§ 1 et seq., was enacted for the purpose of recognizing governance at the local level. The LGA provides for certification of chapters. 26 N.N.C. §102. After chapter certification, the chapter may exercise listed powers. 26 N.N.C. §103(D)(4). The listed authorities include entering into agreements with other chapters, entering into

intergovernmental agreements, and entering into contracts with the Navajo Nation. 26 N.N.C. §103(D). The Resources and Development Committee endorsement of a regional council does not alter GLA purposes, certification requirements or authorities. See Navajo Nation Department of Justice memorandum dated January 26, 2015 (Exhibit C) and January 23, 2015 (Exhibit D).

Section Two. Endorsement

A. The Resources and Development Committee hereby endorses the establishment of the Chuska Regional Council established by the Tsaile/Wheatfileds, Lukachukai, Round Rock and Rock Point Chpaters and endorses the Chuska Regional Council's Plan of Operation attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A and as supported by the respective Chapters and Chinle Agency Council as found at Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated hereby reference.

Section Three. Conformance with Local Government Act

The endorsement of the Chuska Regional Council does not waive the purposes, requirements and authorities of the Local Governance Act, 26 N.N.C. §§1 et seq.

CHUSKA REGIONAL COUNCIL PLAN OF OPERATION

I. ESTABLISHMENT

ent in the contract of

- A. The Chuska Regional Council is hereby established under reorganization of the Legislative Branch of the Navajo Nation Government to twenty-four (24) delegates for funding and recognition.
- B. The Chuska Regional Council is hereby established by the Chapters (Comprised of: Tsaile/Wheatfields, Lukachukai, Round Rock, Rock Point and Tsé Chizi Chapters) by the Adoption of the Plan of Operation by Resolution of each Chuska Regional Council Chapter.

C.	The Chuska Regional Council is endorsed by the Resources and Development
	Committee of the Navajo Nation Council per Legislation #

II. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

- A. The purpose of the Chuska Regional Council shall be to advocate for, encourage, and promote community project support, and interact with other local governments; as well as assist the local chapter governments to develop their five management systems for governance certification.
- B. The objectives of the Chuska Regional Council shall be to:
 - 1. Advocate for and to assure that the sovereign status of the local chapter governments will be maintained and strengthen through collective support.
 - 2. Preserve and respect the chapter memberships, of traditional and cultural values, while integrating modern technology and government reform into the current chapter government system.
 - 3. Study and evaluate ways to achieve accountable, representative and responsible local chapter governments.
 - 4. Assess and develop ways to improve the Navajo Nation capabilities for enhanced service delivery.
 - 5. Provide encouragement and ways to assist local chapter governments to develop and implement the five management systems as required by the Local Governance Act, N.N.C. 102.
 - 6. Establish and maintain effective communication with local, state, federal and other authorities on matters related to improving the health, safety and welfare of the Chuska Regional Council Chapters and membership.
- C. To coordinate and communicate effectively with Council Delegate and Staff Assistant.

III. MEMBERSHIP

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- A. The Chuska Regional Council shall consist of all Chapter President; Chapter Vice-President, and Chapter Secretary/Treasurers of the following certified Navajo Nation Chapters:
 - 1. Tsaile/Wheatfields Chapter
 - 2. Lukachukai Chapter
 - 3. Round Rock Chapter
 - 4. Rock Point Chapter
 - 5. Tsé Chizi Chapter
- B. Membership At-Large: Navajo Nation Council Delegate, the Grazing Committee Members and Chapter Community Service Coordinators of the Chuska Regional Council Chapters, shall be members at-large and vote on all matters pertaining to the Chuska Regional Council agenda; however, they shall not be counted towards establishment of a quorum.

IV. ENUMERATED DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The Chuska Regional Council shall:
 - 1. Work cooperatively with their respective Administrative Service Center by providing timelines for tasks as they directly relate to the objectives set forth in this plan of operation and prioritizing the chapter governance certification.
 - 2. Establish and maintain mutually respectful partnership with the Navajo Nation programs, outside entities and community members.
 - 3. Recommend and encourage support resolution to the Navajo Nation Council and the standing committees on community projects, funding, and other matters pertaining to the welfare of the Navajo public.
 - 4. Advise and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council all matters pertaining to issues on sovereignty, water rights, civil rights, etc.
 - 5. Seek consultation with members of the Navajo Nation Council on matters related to the Navajo Nation Operation Budget.
 - 6. Recommend membership to the Chinle Agency Regional Transportation Meeting, the Navajo Division of Transportation and other appointments as necessary.
 - 7. Recommend legislation that affects the local chapter governments to the Navajo Nation Council.
 - 8. Adopt Rules of Order for conducting Chuska Regional Council meetings, and selection of its officers.

- 9. Assist and encourage local chapter governments to develop, adopt and forward their five management systems policies manual to the Office of Auditor General for recommendation to the Resources and Development Committee for final adoption.
- 10. Seek input and guidance from the President of the Navajo Nation, the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, Standing Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, and Office of Government Development regarding major development and issues affecting the Navajo Nation government and the local chapter governments.

V. MEETINGS, ORDER OF BUSINESS AND QUORUM

- A. The Chuska Regional Council shall conduct one (1) regular meeting every quarter or any number of meetings contingent upon the, approved Navajo Nation Fiscal Year Operating Budget.
- B. All Chuska Regional Council meetings shall be conducted within the Region. Any meeting(s) outside the Region must be approved by majority vote of the council at a regular scheduled meeting.
- C. The Chuska Regional Council shall conduct their meetings in accordance with the Rules of Order adopted by the Chuska Regional Council in which there will be the following order of business on the agenda.
 - 1. Call Meeting to Order
 - 2. Roll Call
 - 3. Invocation
 - 4. Review and Adoption of Agenda
 - 5. Reading and Approval of the Previous Meeting Minutes
 - 6. Old Business
 - 7. New Business
 - 8. Receive Reports
 - 9. Time and Place of Next Meeting
 - 10. Adjournment
- D. The quorum of the Chuska Regional Council shall consist of a simple majority of the members of the Council. Membership-at-large is not included in the establishment of a quorum to conduct an official meeting.
- E. All Chuska Regional Council meetings shall be open to the public.

VI. CHUSKA REGIONAL COUNCIL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The Chuska Regional Council presiding officers will be pointed by the Chuska Regional Council, by the majority rule of the council.
- B. Chairperson shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
 - 1. Preside over all Chuska Regional Council meeting.

- Consult with the Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Council Delegate, and the Local Governance Support Center staff in preparation of the agenda for each Chuska Regional Council Meeting.
- 3. Sign all claim forms submitted by the Chuska Regional Council members. The chairperson's meeting claim form shall be signed and verified by the Vice-Chairperson or the Secretary after each meeting.
- 4. Certify all official documents such as resolutions approved by the Chuska Regional Council.
- 5. Work cooperatively with the Administrative Service Center to ensure that all respective Chuska Regional Council actions are appropriately communicated to the appropriate agencies of the Navajo government and local chapter governments.
- 6. Adjourn or postpone a Chuska Regional Council meeting in the event of:
 - a. Lack of quorum
 - b. Disorder at the Meeting
 - c. Unforeseen emergency
- 7. Vote in case of a tie.
- 8. In absence of secretary can appoint a recorder.
- C. The Vice-Chairperson shall:
 - 1. Automatically assume the duties and responsibilities of leadership in the absence of the Chairperson during the Chuska Regional Council meetings.
 - 2. Conduct roll call.
- D. The Secretary shall:
 - 1. Maintain complete and accurate records of all Chuska Regional Council meetings and activities.
 - 2. Prepare and finalize all resolutions, letters and other important documents for distribution to Council Delegate Office and Chuska Regional Council.
 - 3. Take the minutes of Chuska Regional Council meetings and record in detail all resolutions, votes and other official actions of the Chuska Regional Council.
 - 4. Follow up with Council Delegate and Staff Assistant on all referrals of resolutions, correspondence and other related matters.
- E. Council Delegate shall:

- 1. The Council Delegate in consultation with affected chapters can call an emergency or special meeting at a designated meeting place. The emergency or special meeting will not require a quorum.
- 2. Follow-up with tribal, federal and state governments, or their agencies on resolutions, ordinances, recommendations, proposals, and projects of the Chuska Regional Council.
- 3. Maintain records at the Central Office to make appropriate referrals and report to Chuska Regional Council on status of resolution and matters submitted to Council Delegate by Chuska Regional Council.
- 4. Follow up on all resolutions, correspondence and related matters.
- 5. Shall report to the Chuska Regional Council on all matters and activities of the Navajo Nation Council; or in absence, shall designate Staff Assistant to make report.

F. Staff Assistant shall:

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- 1. There shall be a Staff Assistant, provided that the Navajo Nation Council appropriates funds, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Council Delegate.
- 2. Be directly responsible to the Council Delegate and serve as a conduit between the Delegate and Chuska Regional Council Chapters.
- 3. Assist in all Council meetings.
- 4. Maintain the Office at Round Rock Chapter.
- Maintain all records and files
- 6. Represent the Council Delegate a various meetings affecting the Chuska Regional Council Chapter Communities.

VII. COMPENSATION

- A. Council members may be compensated one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for attending the entire Chuska Regional Meeting at the option of the individual chapters. The presiding chairperson shall verify roll call and attendance sheets at the conclusion of the meeting with his or her signature.
- B. The claim forms shall be submitted to the respective Chapter administration, along with a sign in sheet to verify attendance and compensation.
- C. The attendance or sign in sheet can be submitted to the Administrative Service Center for distribution upon request from the local member chapter governments.

VIII. PROCEDURAL RULES FOR MOTIONS

- A. The Chuska Regional Council may adopt standard rules for conducting council meetings:
 - 1. The approval or amendments to the agenda, minutes, reports and resolution(s) shall be done in the following manner:
 - a. Upon presenting the agenda, minutes, report(s), resolution(s) and/or issue(s) of the agenda, the Chuska Regional Council Chairperson shall request a motion to accept the matter before the council membership and recognize a second to the main motion.
 - b. Upon receiving a motion and a second to the main motion, the Chair person shall provide an opportunity to members of the council to address the matters before them.
 - c. Any member of the Chuska Regional Council may propose an amendment to the main motion, which would require a second. The Chuska Regional Council membership shall vote on the proposed amendment motion. If the amendment motion passes, it shall take precedence over the part of the main motion subject to proposed amendment. Only one motion to amend the main motion shall be on the floor.
 - d. Any member of the Chuska Regional Council may propose a substitute motion and if it passes, it shall take the place of the main motion. The substitute motion shall be seconded and voted on.
 - e. Any member of the Chuska Regional Council may propose to table the legislation or issue before the council. The motion to table the matter shall be seconded and voted on. If the tabling motion passes, it shall take precedence over other motions.
 - 2. The Council Chairperson is prohibited from making main motions and making second motion.

IX. AMENDMENTS

The provisions herein may be amended from time to time by the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council at the recommendation of the Chuska Regional Council.

- The Navajo Nation Government will begin to move state, federal, county and tribal programs and funding to Lukachukai, Round Rock, Tsaile/Wheatfields, Rock Point, Tse' Chizi Chapters for services; and
- Local Governance Support Center will mentor with technical assistance to the Chuska Regional Council and Chapter Administration.

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to Nation Nation Council Resolution No. CJ-20-55, dated December 2, 1955, the Tsaile/Wheatfields Chapter is vested with authority and charged with the responsibility to promote, protect and preserve the interest and general welfare, including the health and safety of its community people; and

- 3. It is understood by Tsaile-Wheatfields Chapter and the Chapters of the Chuska Regional Council, pursuant of the Chuska Regional Council Plan of Operation, the established Chuska Regional Council has utilized and adheres to the standards set forth by the Plan of Operation and shall serve primarily as an advisory council to the Council Delegate and has no authority over any of the Chapters, Chapter Officials, or Staff of Churska Regional Council

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED THAT

- 1. The Tsaile/Wheatfields Chapter hereby approves to support and recommend the Navajo Nation to approve the Plan of Operation for Chuska Regional Council.
- 2. The Tsaile/Wheatfields Chapter requests the Navajo Nation Council approve the Plan of Operation Chuska Regional Council and provide funding for stipends for the attending Chapter Officials.

CERTIFICATION

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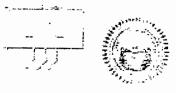

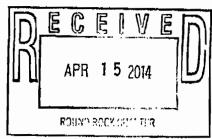

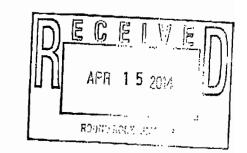

V. Reports:

- A. Council Delegate
- B. Chapter Officials: RECON Oil / NDOT / BIA: Update on Road Repairs toward Yale Point. Mr. Jay R. Nez elaborated on the meeting held with NDOT and BIA Roads Department in regards to repairing 8090 route towards Yale Point and NE of Rough Rock. Alternative options were provided to have NDOT conduct the assessment or have a private consultant pursue the studies. The Chapter was told that if NDOT pursues the project, it will take extended period because of their current projects in place. With that in mind, the Chapter wants to utilize a private firm that will coordinate the project activities because the Chapter does not have the expertise with road projects. The Chapter does have funds available to cover environmental clearances and assessments.
- C. Grazing Representative: Mr. Kee Tom, Jr. expressed his disappointment with Chapter administration for failing to properly announce the Range Management Meeting. He said the Grazing representatives all showed up but there were no community members in attendance. So the meeting was called off and is unsure who took the food that was bought and prepared. Also, he brought up an issue that was noticed by one of the Grazing Representative stating that our Chapter administration is lacking customer service skills. Additionally, Mr. Tom reminded the people that he is prohibited from signing homesite leases located ¼ mile from the right-of-away fencing. Other issues of concerns addressed pertained to the school's open landfill posing environmental hazards and ranchers need to get their tallies done before the end of this month. He said if ranchers do not submit their tallies, they will not be able to sell their livestock this year.

celebration was planned for veterans on October 9, 2014 and that she submitted the proper paperwork for approval which did not happen. Ms. Sylvia Hadley, Chapter Secretary said she attended the Division of Community Development work session at Dine College and was able to get Mr. Leonard Chee's signature on some of the outstanding purchase requisitions. Ms. Hadley said she requested the Chapter to bring all purchase requisitions and RDPs requiring signatures but only a handful was brought over. She said the veterans paperwork were not included in the batch. But everything that Mr. Chee signed was submitted to General Accounting for processing.

- G. Senior Citizen Center: Ms. Pauline Bahe informed the public about relocating the Senior Center operation to the Chapter House until the renovation is completed. Ms. Bahe said she received the sanitation permit that will allow the Center to prepare meals in the Chapter kitchen.
- H. Brown & Caldwell: There is an upcoming meeting on September 29, 2014 at 1:00 p.m. at the Chinle Chapter House.
- RRSB Recall Update: Ms. Marie Etsitty mentioned the Recalling of Rena Mann and Kim Sam are continuing. She said the school belongs to the community and the people have every right to be concerned about the school operation, student achievement, and the overall working environment. Also, she said school policies are not being followed.

VI. New Business:

- A. Resolution approving Gilbert Bedoni's consultancy service to coordinate all activities with BIA Branch of Roads, NDOT, Rough Rock Chapter and other Tribal Programs, in regards to NR 8090 road repairs. Amount of Consultant Service: \$1,100.00. Mr. Bedoni explained that he has been collaborating with the Rough Rock Chapter for two years. He said he was called upon by the late Alfred Yazzie to assist the Chapter with its road assessment and repairs. He said before the actual construction ensues, proper assessments and clearances need to be completed. He said a dozer cannot just come in and start trenching the road. He said there are compliance and safety issues that need to be observed. Mr. Bedoni said he will line up everything that needs to be done, as well as collaborate with respective entities about the proposed project. He said the most important is to get it project ready so it can pass proper clearances for support and funding. Mr. Bedoni will update the Chapter membership as time progresses. Before projects can be considered for funding, they all need to be project ready with proper master planning and designs and land availability Perhaps, during the next planning meeting, the projects will need to be realigned. Also, Ms. Julia Tsosie raised a concern why her son, Lionel Tsosie is not on the project list because she said he has been turning in applications for the last three years and as of today, he has not been served. Mr.

On November 19, 2014, I issued a memorandum regarding my review of the Chuska Regional Council Plan of Operation. This led to a meeting on January 6, 2015 where several issues were discussed in the presence of other Regional Councils. The attached memorandum provides a brief history of the issues related to Regional Councils and also gives a summary of the discussions and understandings made at the meeting.

The Chuska Regional Council's Plan of Operation is significantly identical to the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council's Plan of Operation. Based on the attached memorandum finding Dzil Yijiin's Plan of Operation to be legally sufficient, it follows that Chuska Regional Council's Plan of Operation is also legally sufficient. I will attach a copy of the memorandum dated January 23, 2015 which contains a couple of the "limitations" of Regional Councils. Otherwise, so long as the Chuska Regional Council operates in accordance with the January 23rd memorandum, the Resources and Development Committee may establish it.

In 2011, the Resources and Development Committee (RDC) passed RDCS-36-11 which approved the Plan of Operation (POO) for the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council. Since that time, other Regional Councils have used Dzil Yijiin's POO as a template to create other Regional Councils. Most recently, the Chuska Regional Council submitted its POO for legal review. In a memorandum dated November 19, 2014, I indicated that DOJ had not reviewed Dzil Yijiin's POO and requested a meeting among all Regional Councils. On January 6, 2015, many Chapters of several Regional Councils attended the meeting. At that meeting, you indicated that DOJ did perform a cursory review in 2011. Since there is no record of DOJ's review, you now submit this RFS.

HISTORY

To begin, I feel there is some important history to mention. The first DOJ record of legal review for a Regional Council came in 2012 wherein DOJ reviewed the POO for the District 6 Regional Council (D6RC).² The D6RC POO was identical

to Dzil Yijiin's POO. However, in a memorandum dated December 4, 2012, the POO was found to be legally insufficient. Further DOJ records indicate that after meetings were held, DOJ issued another memorandum on June 24, 2013 indicating that, despite raising some concerns, the D6RC's POO was legally sufficient because it was identical to Dzil Yijiin's POO.

Also in 2013, the Central Navajo Regional Council (CNRC) submitted its' POO directly to the Office of Legislative Counsel (OLC) for RDC consideration. OLC, through memorandum, asked DOJ its position on whether the RDC could create the CNRC.3 OLC expressed a concern that the Navajo Nation Code did not provide for the creation of Regional Councils and therefore questioned the legality of Regional Councils. I issued a response on July 11, 2014 wherein I shared OLC's concern. I also felt that laws should be created to allow for the creation of Regional Councils despite the fact that RDC had already created the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council. One potential problem was the fact that many Agency Councils and District Councils have long been in existence without express statutory authority 4 and if Regional Councils were similar entities, was there a legitimate basis for requiring amendments to the Navajo Nation Code if Regional Councils were simply replacing Agency and/or District Councils?

There are two major concerns affecting the assertion that Regional Councils are simply replacing Agency/District Councils. First, one of the statements in clause II(A) of the POO states that the Regional Council will "partner with other local governments." This is a concern because pursuant to section 103(D)(4) of the LGA, only governance-certified Chapters can enter into agreements with other governance-certified Chapters and because Regional Councils consist of non-governance certified Chapters, there could be a potential unintended violation of the LGA.

The second concern came in March 2014 when the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council sought advice from DOJ to create a non-profit 501(C)(3) corporation. This was a concern for a couple of reasons: One, similar to the one raised above, certain actions by member Chapters would require agreements which the LGA also limits to governance-certified Chapters; Two, the current version of the Navajo Nation Code only allows single Chapters to create non-profit corporations and not multiple Chapters creating a 501(C)(3) corporation. Thus, I recommended that the Local Governance Act and the Navajo Nation Corporation Code be amended.

Essentially, my concern was that Dzil Yijiin and other Regional Councils seem to be attempting to do more than what Agency and District Councils currently do. Thus, I requested a meeting to determine what member Chapters believe the purpose is for Regional Councils.

JANUARY 6, 2015 MEETING

At the outset of the meeting, you provided some history for the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council. First, you indicated that the Deputy Attorney General had performed a cursory review of the POO in 2011. Second, you provided a copy of Resolution No. IGRS-251-01 passed by the Intergovernmental Relations Committee (IGRC) which was a former standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. This resolution indicates that the IGRC approved the POO for the Eastern Navajo Agency Council (ENAC). Essentially, the Dzil Yijiin Regional Council's POO is significantly identical to the ENAC POO and this supports the notion that Regional Councils are similar to Agency/District Councils.

However, there were some statements made by attendees who believed that Regional Councils could perform other tasks. For instance, it is believed that Regional Councils could apply for and receive intergovernmental grants on behalf of member Chapters. It is also believed that a non-governance certified Chapter could provide its Regional Council with funding which in turn could be used for common goal projects of member Chapters. In both scenarios, I explained that such acts would be a violation of the LGA because it would allow a Chapter to enter into contracts with other Chapters without being governance

certified which would unintentionally violate section 103(D)(4) of the LGA. Thus, I stated that Regional Councils could not do either act.

By the conclusion of the meeting, there was an understanding that Regional Councils are not intended to violate the LGA and that in the event a Regional Council had any doubt whether any future action would violate the LGA, it would contact DOJ. Otherwise, I stated that Regional Councils could continue to operate under the Legislative Branch just as Agency and District Councils currently operate.

CONCLUSION

Regional Councils are legally sufficient to the extent that the Legislative Branch is able to create Agency/District Councils without express statutory authority. The fact that Agency/District Councils have been in existence for decades provides support for their legitimacy. Not to mention, in every Regional Council POO, it is expressed that Regional Councils are being established by the Legislative Branch because of the 2010 reduction of the Navajo Nation Council to 24 Delegates. 6 Nevertheless, I still agree with the Office of Legislative Counsel that the best solution to avoid any legal challenges in the future would be to amend Title 2 and Title 26 to allow for Regional Councils. Lastly, while Regional Councils can operate as a Legislative Branch entity, it cannot operate in a manner that would violate any Navajo Nation law, including the LGA as described above. If any Regional Council has any doubt about whether it is violating any law, the Regional Council should contact the Office of Legislative Counsel and/or the Department of Justice.
