- 4. The Winslow Indian Health Care Center, Inc. (WIHCC) is seeking compacting for the planning, design and construction of the new Dilkon Alternative Rural Health Center. The WIHCC is a self-governance tribal organization within the Navajo Nation. See Exhibit "A."
- 5. White Cone, Leupp, Tolani Lake, Indian Wells and Tsidi To ii (Birdsprings) chapters are recommending and supporting the Winslow Indian Health Care Center, Inc. (WIHCC) is seeking compacting. See documents included with Exhibit "A."



### **Information Report Only**

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Program Justification Document (PJD) for the new Dilkon ARHC was approved in October, 2006. With construction funding imminent in FY 2016, IHS began updating the information on the user population, workload, staff, and space requirements from the Projected Planning Year (PPY) 2006 to PPY 2025 by producing PJD Amendment # 1.

The PJD describes the local health care system and current available resources for health care, discusses future needs for the local population, and justifies to the U.S. Congress why the new health facility is needed. The Program of Requirements (POR) is a document that provides in detail requirements for space, equipment, and furnishings for each departmental function in the new facility.

### **DISCUSSION/HIGHLIGHTS:**

### 1. Federal Construction Budget

The I.H.S. FY 2016 budget includes a Congressional appropriation of \$12,000,000 for the new Dilkon facility. An additional \$20.5 million was requested for the new Dilkon ARHC from US DHHS Non –Recurring Expenses Fund (NEF) and is available. The total FY 2016 funding for Dilkon is \$32,500,000.

As noted in previous updates to the Board of Directors, funding is contingent on the approval of the PJD Amendment and POR. Funds cannot be transferred or obligated and design cannot be solicited and initiated without funds to support the facility construction contracts.

I.H.S. issued an updated Annual Facilities Planning (Five Year Plan) on May 31, 2016 which includes more recent project costs for the Dilkon project. The revised total cost for Dilkon is \$187,000,000, which is an increase from the 2015 Five Year Plan of \$173,000,000 for the project. See the attached 2016 Five Year Plan.

### 2. PJD Amendment and POR

The approval and signing of the PJD Amendment and POR is currently the top priority for I.H.S. OEH and the NAIHS Planning Office. Navajo Area IHS submitted the PJD Amendment No. 1 and submitted the document to I.H.S. Headquarters on May 12, 2016. The draft POR was

submitted to I.H.S. Headquarters on May 10, 2016. I.H.S. Headquarters provided comments on June 1, 2016 and NAIHS is incorporating the comments into a final draft. I.H.S. is working to approve the documents as soon as it is feasibly possible, so that the 2016 Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) can be issued.

3. Program Justification Document for Quarters (PJDQ)

The 2006 approved PJD has 109 staff quarters for Dilkon. I.H.S. will continue to plan for this number. I.H.S. has determined that a new or revised PJDQ will not be necessary at this time. If there is a need identified for more housing as the planning documents are finalized, I.H.S. will reevaluate the staff housing needs.

Navajo Area I.H.S. will continue proceeding with securing the approval of the PJD Amendment and POR as the top priority.







Further, the Teesto Chapter requests and recommends that WIHCC be fully supported in this huge and critically important historic endeavor by the Navajo Nation President and Vice President, the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, the Navajo Nation Council and the Navajo Department of Health.
- 3. Finally, the Teesto Chapter requests the Indian Health Services, Navajo Area Indian Health Service and the Navajo Department of Health to provide its support and guidance in and during the negotiations of funding and other necessary agreements in the securing of a Compact Project Funding Agreement by and between WIHCC and the Indian Service for the planning, design and construction of the DHC.

#### Resolution of the Dilkon Health Center Steering Committee

Supporting and Recommending the Compacting of the Design and Construction of the Dilkon Health Center by Winslow Indian Health Care Center, Inc. as Authorized by the Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJY-33-10 on July 21, 2010

- 1. The Dilkon Health Center Steering Committee (DHCSC) has been in existence for approximately 40 years as a grassroots and voluntary organization supported by surrounding southwest chapters to plan, lobby and advocate for the design and construction of the Dilkon Health Center; and
- 2. The DHCSC is comprised of representatives from District 5 chapters (Leupp, Tsidii Toli and Tolani Lake) and District 7 chapters (Dilkon, Teesto, Indian Wells, White Cone and Jeddito) who are formally elected by its respective chapters and conveyed by chapter resolutions to the DHCSC; and
- 3. The DHCSC and the Winslow Indian Health Care Center, Inc. (WIHCCI) and its Board of Directors (BOD) have collectively work together on various relevant issues that affect the planning and advocacy for the Dilkon Health Center that include sometimes sensitive issue and political in nature but the entities have managed to maintain a good professional working relationship; and
- 3. As the funding of the Dilkon Health Center (DHC) is becoming more and more imminent, there are some basic options relating to the design and construction that the Navajo Nation, DHCSC and WIHCCI need to hopefully arrive at a consensus in the design and construction of the DHC including Title V Compacting of the design and construction by WiHCCI as a P.L. 93-638 Title V entity; and
- 4. The DHCSC and WIHCC Board of Directors, WIHCC Administration, NAIHS staff, Navajo Nation Council Delegates, OPVP representative and other interested parties attended and participated in Title V Compacting Training and Work Session on December 10-11, 2015 at Twin Arrows Casino to gain insight, learn, educate and understand what Title V Compacting entails including the advantages and disadvantages to this option; and
- 5. The most basic advantages realized include the ability for WIHCCI to design and construct a health center from the communities perspectives, values, needs and priorities; the ability of direct funding; the ability to retain, maintain and apply interest collected from direct funding as the entities see fit and just the overall direct participation in the design, planning and construction of a health care facility of and by the people as a basic principle of self-governance; and
- 6. After much consideration by the DHCSC membership, the committee arrived at the decision to support the concept of Title V Compacting by the WIHCCI pursuant to the proposed delineation of roles

and responsibilities that reflected an active participation by the DHCSC in the compacting design and construction process as presented by WIHCCI consultants; and

7. The OPVP representative informed both DHCSC and WIHCCI that a report will be provided back to the President and Vice President with the recommendation to convene a meeting between the President and the two entities that would hopefully establish a consensus as a Nation to allow the WIHCCI to compact the design and construction of the Dilkon Health Center; something never done before but the key is a unified front to foster success to realize a dream come true, one that is long overdue, for the Dine People of the Great Southwest Navajo Nation.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Dilkon Health Center Steering Committee hereby declares its support and recommendation to allow the Winslow Indian Health Care Center, Inc., as a P.L. 93-638 Title V entity, to spearhead the design and construction of the Dilkon Health Center as authorized by the Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJY-33-10 acted upon on July 21, 2010.
- 2. The Dilkon Health Center Steering Committee is confident both the DHCSC and WiHCC Board of Directors, many of whom are former leaders with wealth of knowledge and experience will provide the necessary leadership and oversight in making a success the design and construction of the Dilkon Health Center.
- 3. The WiHCC Administration and staff have proven its credibility in operating and maturing as a Title I program; and now have operated as a Title V '638 program since 2010 and have gained incredible experience with respect to the have design and construction of a multi-million dollar Medical Office Building.
- 4.
