25	Section Two. Findings	
26	A. The Navajo Nation entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Navajo	
27	Gaming Enterprise in January 2013 to provide a law enforcement presence at the	
28	Navajo Nation gaming facilities.	
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- B. The Navajo Nation initially approved a fund management plan for the Navajo Division of Public Safety through Resolution BFMY-15-13. The fund management plan was subsequently amended through Resolution BFSC-22-14.
- C. The proposed amendments to the fund management will allow the Division of Public Safety to fully support and pay for the operation and maintenance expenses of the Twin Arrows Public Safety Building not otherwise funded through the Navajo Nation's fixed cost budget.
- D. The proposed amendments to the fund management plan for the Division of Public Safety are attached as Exhibit A.
- E. For reference, a clean copy incorporating amendments to the current fund management plan is attached as **Exhibit B**.
- F. The Navajo Division of Public Safety recommends the approval of the proposed amendments. A memorandum recommending the approval of the proposed amendments is attached as **Exhibit C**.

## Section Three. Approval

The Navajo Nation approves the amendments to the Navajo Division of Public Safety as attached in **Exhibit A**.



# NAVAJO DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN

(Amended) Amendment No. 2

## I. ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby established the Navajo Division of Public Safety Fund Management Plan for use by the Navajo Division of Public Safety.

#### II. CRITERIA

- The Navajo Nation, through the Navajo Division of Public Safety ("NDPS"), has
  entered into a Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") with the Navajo Nation
  Gaming Enterprise ("NNGE") to provide police services to Navajo Gaming
  Facilities.
- 2. The MOA requires that on-site police services be provided to the "Fire Rock Navajo Casino" located in Church Rock, Chapter, McKinley County; "Flowing Water Navajo Casino" located within Tsé Daak'aan Chapter, San Juan County; and "Northern Edge Navajo Casino" located within Upper Fruitland Chapter, San Juan County and "Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort" located in Leupp Chapter, Coconino County.
- The total negotiated fee for this service is \$36,000 per month or \$432,000 per year for "Fire Rock Navajo Casino", "Flowing Water Navajo Casino", and "Northern Edge Navajo Casino". The total negotiated fee for this service is 25,000 per month or \$300,000 per year for "Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort". The total negotiated fee for this service is \$732,000 per year. The term of the MOA is perpetual, unless otherwise terminated pursuant to the requirements set forth in the MOA.
- NDPS will use the funds generated to support the operation needs of NDPS police officers and the Department of Corrections.
- This includes using the fund for personnel related expenses for overtime, training, lodging, meals, travel equipment, supplies and awards.
- NDPS will also use the funds to purchase new patrol vehicles. The funds will also be used to pay associated expenses, including fees, insurance and repair work.
- On an annual basis, beginning in FY 2019, NDPS will use the funds to fully support and pay for the operation and maintenance expenses of the Twin Arrows Public Safety Building, not otherwise paid for from the Navajo Nation's fixed cost budget.

- 7.8. The funds will be expended in accordance with Navajo Nation law, including the Navajo Business Opportunity Act.
- 8.9. Unexpended revenue generated shall be non expiring not lapse and will remain in the account until fully expended.

# III. EXPENDITURE REQUIREMENTS

All funds paid under this Police Service MOA shall be deposited with the Office of the Controller and the NN Controller's Office shall establish a new fund, separate from the general fund. All deposits to this new fund will be credited to NDPS and all expenditures to this new fund will be dedicated to the use of NDPS Police Services and the Department of Corrections. All funds received both existing and forthcoming shall be credited to this new account.

- The Division Director, in the manner prescribed by Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule and regulation, shall prepare an annual budget for the fund. This budget will be reviewed and approved by the appropriate offices and authorities. The budget shall include a projection of the funds that will be generated set out in the MOA and will be allocated and expended consistent with Sections II (4) and (5).
- 2. The Accounting Manager(s), Office of the Controller and Office of Management and Budget, in a manner prescribed by Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule and regulation, shall (1) establish a Revenue Fund Account for the deposit of funds described in Section II(3) above; (2) review and regulate expenditures from such fund to ensure compliance with existing Navajo Nation policy, procedure, law, rule or regulations regarding the fund; and (3) maintain an accurate accounting of all transactions.

### IV. AMENDMENTS

This Fund Management Plan may be amended from time to time by the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council upon the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Public Safety.


