Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL: ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS: APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING **PROJECTS** AND ELECTRIC MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES; **BATHROOM** ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.

- B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that
  - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation . . . . See CJN-29-22, Section Three (B).
  - 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department,

- to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. *See* CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).
- 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
- 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).
- C. All projects listed in the Hon. Brenda Jesus' Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as **Exhibit A**, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Brenda Jesus' Delegate Region Projects Plan does *not* exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Brenda Jesus' Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Brenda Jesus' Delegate Region (Chapters: Oak Springs, St. Michaels) as set forth in **Exhibit A**.

# SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF HON. BRENDA JESUS' DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Brenda Jesus' Delegate Region (Chapters: Oak Springs, St. Michaels) set forth in **Exhibit A.**
- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

### SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

### SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

### SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

## RESOLUTION OF THE ST. MICHAELS CHAPTER No. SMC 2022-040

Approving & Supporting the St. Michaels Chapter requesting for Navajo Nation American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Infrastructure Fund for Construction Costs and/or Equipment Improvement to Renovate and Expand the existing St. Michaels Chapter House Facility in the Amount of six million (\$6Million)

### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A), St. Michaels Chapter is a duly certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government with vested authority and responsibility to provide and address local planning within the community; and
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (8), St. Michaels Chapter is delegated the governmental authority to make decision over local matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction consistent with the Navajo Nation laws and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate actions; and
- 3. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C 101 (A), the St. Michaels Chapter is mandated to adopt and operate under a Five Management System, adopted in July 2010; and
- 4. The St. Michaels Chapter House was built in 1959 and has been providing services to the St. Michaels chapter community over 63 years and in need of renovation with addition to accommodate increased population, modernize communication technology, and new era into the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- 5. St. Michaels Chapter recognizes the allocated Navajo Nation Sihasin Fund to the chapter governance for the chapter house renovation and addition in the amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per the CAP-35-18 Sihasin project list. And with the additional requested fund from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund \$6,000,000 will total \$8,000,000 for the project; and
- The St. Michaels Chapter acknowledges the pre-conference sessions began September 2019, with Buffalo Design Architect, who is awarded the Contract, followed by continuous effective planning meetings for the chapter house addition and renovation project; and

- 7. The St. Michaels Chapter acknowledges the Resolution CEM-20-03-11 that the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management and Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez declared a Public Health State of Emergency on Navajo Nation, March 11, 2020, due to COVID-19 outbreak. - 8. The St. Michaels Chapter acknowledges the assigned Project Manager, Capital Project Management Department, Division of Community Development to the Chapter Addition and Renovation Project retired September 30, 2021, which also resulted in an effort for continuity; and
- 9. St. Michaels Chapter acknowledges the "Notice to Proceed" and Contract became effective January 2022. Therefore, the project was scheduled to move forward on the programming and concept phase, schematic design, design development and construction; and
- 10. The St. Michaels Chapter recognizes during the COVID-19 pandemic, the material cost increased and professional services that resulted in a shortfall to fulfill the project specifically the construction and timeline; and
- 11. The St. Michaels Chapter is considered project ready with the design deliverables in place, architect was solicited and obtained for third-party contract services to complete the project based on the Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJA-03-21 approved timeline extension to four years; and
- 12. The St. Michaels Chapter recognizes the need for additional funds to complete the chapter house addition and renovation which is essential to accommodate the community to conduct their planning and chapter and other meetings to further adequately enhance the growth and enrich their future. The impact of COVID-19 has had an impact to the community and the people need encouragement toward healing through social events in the facility; and
- 13. The St. Michaels Chapter and community members desire to begin plans for a ceremonial "Ground Breaking" event in Spring of 2023 to begin actual construction of the Chapter House Addition and Renovation subsequently.

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

1. The St. Michaels Chapter membership hereby Support and Approve the St. Michaels Chapter requesting for additional funds from the Navajo Nation American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Infrastructure Project for Construction Costs and/or Equipment Improvement of the St. Michaels Chapter House Addition and Renovation in the amount of Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000).

### WHEREAS:

- 1. The Oak Springs Chapter is a recognized Chapter of the Navajo Nation Government organized and consistent with the Navajo Nation Council Resolution CAP-34-98, also known as the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act and is codified in title twenty-six (26) of the Navajo Nation Code; and
- 2. Title twenty-six (26) of the Navajo Nation Code allows Oak Springs Chapter to make decisions over local matters consistent with Navajo law and is under supervision of Division of Community Development ("DCD") until it becomes an LGA certified chapter. This authority, in the long run, will improve community decision making, allow communities to excel and flourish, enable Navajo leader to lead towards a prosperous future, and improve the strength and sovereignty of the Navajo Nation; and
- 3. The Oak Springs Chapter acknowledges the Oak Springs Chapter House Kitchen Addition and Renovation Project ARPA Expenditure Plan was approved and signed by NN-Division of Community Development, NN Fiscal Recovery Fund Office, and NN Department of Justice (signed 1/17/2023); and
- 4. The Oak Springs Chapter acknowledges the Oak Springs Chapter Resolution OSC-11152022-008 Construction amount of \$2,802,340.00 Million, which was approved by the Oak Springs community members on November 15, 2022; and
- 5. The Oak Springs Chapter acknowledges the approved NN-FRF Expenditure Plan is ready for submittal to the NN Office of Legislative Council to complete the legislation for Approval by the Naabiki'yati Committee, Navajo Nation Council and Navajo Nation President for business unit to be assigned by the N avajo Nation Office of the Controller for the construction project to begin in April 2023; and
- 6. The Oak Springs Chapter is aware the approved NN-FRF Expenditure Plan has not been submitted by Council Delegate Brenda Jesus to the NN Office of Legislative Council to generate the legislation process through the Naabiki'yati Committee, Navajo Nation Council, Navajo Nation President and Navajo Nation Office of the Controller to meet the critical timeline of the chapter house project by April 2023; and
- 7. The Oak Springs Chapter Officials and community members are anxiously waiting for their governmental chapter house project to be completed to enhance a better operation to serve the people and alleviate the stress/ hardship endured from COVID-19 pandemic.
