APPOINTING DANA BOBROFF AS CHIEF LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL

PURPOSE: If approved by the Navajo Nation Council, this legislation would confirm the appointment of Ms. Dana Bobroff as Chief Legislative Counsel.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authorities

- A. Naabik'iyati' is a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such recommends to the Navajo Nation Council the Chief Legislative Counsel's appointment. 2 N.N.C. § 700 (A) and 2 N.N.C. § 963 (A).
- B. The Navajo Nation Council appoints the Chief Legislative Counsel. 2 N.N.C. § 963 (A).

Section Two. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation Code at 2 N.N.C. Section 963 states the manner and requirements for the appointment of a Chief Legislative Counsel. Specifically, 2 N.N.C. §§ 963 (A), (B) and (C) state:

2 N.N.C. § 963. Personnel

- A. There is hereby established the position of Chief Legislative Counsel, who shall be a state-licensed attorney, appointed by the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Naabik'iyati' (formerly, Intergovernmental Relations) Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.

1 The Chief Legislative Counsel shall serve at the pleasure of the Navajo
2 Nation Council at a negotiated salary. The appointment shall be effective
3 upon the approval of the Navajo Nation Council. The Chief Legislative
4 Counsel shall not be allowed to engage in the private practice of law.

5 B. A state-licensed attorney or firm, selected in accordance with
6 Navajo preference laws, may be hired as the Chief Legislative Counsel
7 under a contract. Such contract shall not exceed one year and shall be
8 approved by the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the
9 Naabik'iyati' (formerly, Intergovernmental Relations) and the Budget and
10 Finance Committees of the Navajo Nation Council. Such attorney
11 contract shall require the training of a qualified Navajo replacement within
12 the term of the contract.

13 C. A non-Navajo licensed attorney may be hired only if a licensed
14 Navajo attorney cannot be found to fill the position of Chief Legislative
15 Counsel.

16 B. The Department of Personnel Management received applications from persons
17 interested in the position of Chief Legislative Counsel. The Department of
18 Personnel Management stated in its memorandum attached as **Exhibit A**:
19 "Pursuant to your request, the Chief Legislative Counsel position was
20 advertised from May 24, 2019 to June 10, 2019. A total of 3 application(s)
21 were received at our office on or before June 10, 2019. Our qualification
22 assessment revealed that there [were] 2 who met the minimum qualification
23 requirements established for the position." The two applicants deemed
24 qualified by Department of Personnel Management were both non-Navajo.

25 C. The Speaker and the Selection Committee selected applicant, Ms. Dana
26 Bobroff, a non-Navajo. Memorandum of Department of Personnel
27 Management, as well as employment documents, attached hereto as **Exhibit**
28 **A**.

1 **Section Three. Appointment**

2 The Navajo Nation Council appoints Ms. Dana Bobroff as the Chief Legislative
3 Counsel, Office of Legislative Counsel, to serve at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation
4 Council. 2 N.N.C. § 963 (A).

5
6 **Section Four. Effective Date**

7 The appointment shall be effective upon the Navajo Nation Council's approval. 2
8 N.N.C. § 963 (A).

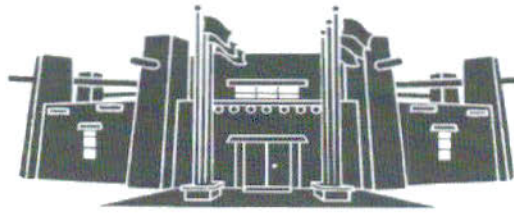
