PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to appoint Doreen N. McPaul as Navajo Nation Attorney General.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate review the proposed resolution in detail.

SECTION THREE. Appointment of the Navajo Nation Attorney General

- A. The Navajo Nation Council appoints Doreen N. McPaul as the Navajo Nation Attorney General.
- B. Ms. McPaul's appointment shall be effective upon the Navajo Nation Council's approval. 2 N.N.C. §1962(B).
- C. Ms. McPaul's term shall be concurrent with the Navajo Nation President's term. 2 N.N.C. §1962(B).

Dear Ms. McPaul,

The Nez-Lizer Administration was elected on a mandate of change for the Navajo Nation. This change involves appointing qualified, motivated and experienced individuals who will move the Navajo Nation forward by "Working Together" to serve the Navajo people. This letter shall serve as a formal notification to your appointment as Attorney General of the Navajo Nation. This appointment will take effect on January 28, 2019 at 8:00AM. Please note that this position is subject to confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council.

Your duties as Attorney General are outlined at 2NNC §1961-1965. You shall be responsible for the administration and management of the Navajo Nation Department of Justice and supervision of all personnel. This includes ensuring compliance with all applicable Navajo Nation laws and policies.

You will be compensated at the negotiated salary of \$165,006.40, including medical benefits and deferred compensation. Following your appointment, you will report to the Navajo Nation President, Vice President and Chief of Staff until confirmation by the 24th Navajo Nation Council. Again, we thank you for your commitment to serve the Navajo people. Ahéhee'.
