18	A. The Navajo Nation Council established the Law and Order Committee (LOC) as a
19	Navajo Nation standing committee and, as such, empowered LOC to review and
20	make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed Navajo Nation

- D. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (2012) see also CJA-03-13.
- E. Elected officials were chosen by the Navajo People "to preserve, protect and enhance the Diné Life Way and sovereignty of the [P]eople and their government..."
  1 N.N.C. Chapter 2, ¶ 3.
- F. Elected officials give considerable time and commitment to the Navajo Nation government in service to the People while often foregoing personal commitments to family and relatives, spending numerous hours in travel both on and off the Navajo Nation, and attending the various meetings to gather information to make informed decisions for constituents.
- G. During the elected officials' time in office they are issued Navajo Nation property to aid in accomplishing their elected duties including home furnishing and related items for the President, Vice-President and Speaker, and communication equipment for Council Delegates so each may stay in touch with the People.
- H. Upon leaving office, the elected officials return the Navajo Nation property to Navajo Nation Property Management.
- I. The Navajo Nation elected officials, in providing public service, make constant use of the Navajo Nation property issued to them and after their public service is complete that property should stay with the public official, with conditions, as both in gratitude for their service and so they may retain the information they created as a public servant.
- J. To recognize the gratitude for the public service of the President, Vice-President, Speaker and Navajo Nation Council Delegates it is necessary to amend 2 N.N.C. § 57.

#### Section Two. Amending Navajo Nation Code Title 2

The Navajo Nation Council amends 2 N.N.C. § 57 as follows:

# NAVAJO NATION CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 2. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT CHAPTER 1. ESTABLISHMENT SUBCHAPTER 2. PROPERTY CONTROL

#### § 57. General provision concerning the Nation's property

\*\*:

C. The sale, gift, loan, exchange, or other disposition of any of the Navajo Nation's property, not specifically authorized by regulations or other directives issued by the Navajo Nation Council, is illegal. Navajo Nation President, Navajo Nation Vice-President, and/or Navajo Nation Council Delegates may purchase officially issued Navajo Nation property at fair market value upon the Budget and Finance

Committee's recommendation to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. Navajo Nation

property is defined in 2 N.N.C. § 56.

#### Section Three. Codification

The provisions of this Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions into the next codification or supplement of the Navajo Nation Code.

#### Section Four. Savings Clause

Should any provision of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

#### Section Five. Effective Date

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).



#### COMMENT

The sale, gift, loan, exchange, or other disposition of any of the Nation Nation's property, not specifically authorized by regulation is illegal. Fleet Management does not support allowing the Navajo Nation President, Navajo Nation Vice-President, and/or Navajo Nation Council Delegates the opportunity to purchase officially issued Navajo Nation property at fair market value upon the Budget and Finance Committee's recommendation to the Naabik'iyat' Committee for Navajo Nation property defined in 2 N.N.C. § 56.

Non-expendable property includes vehicles and all Navajo Nation owned vehicles are assigned to Navajo Nation divisions, departments, programs, and Branches for use to conduct official Navajo Nation business, see 2 N.N.C. § 3555 A., and Navajo Nation Motor Vehicle Operator's Handbook, Chapter 4 Vehicle Assignments, 4.1. The vehicles are not assigned to any specific individual or individuals. Additionally, if an opportunity to purchase a vehicle based on proposed legislation #0134-15, is allowed, this will create budgetary challenges to the various Navajo Nation divisions, departments, programs, and Branches left without a vehicle to conduct official Navajo Nation business.

Moreover, the Navajo Nation Council in adopting the current fiscal year 2015 budget included a condition of appropriation, #12, whereby the Office of the Controller, Property Management Department, (B.U. #107021) was to present a plan for the sale of equipment, vehicles and property to the public to its oversight committee by the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter. 2 N.N.C. § 57 allows for regulations to be adopted and Property Management must propose a set of regulations to control the manner in which property can be sold. Additionally, before Property Management Department can proceed with any plan, an approved plan of operation for Property Management must be completed.
