TITLE OF RESOLUTION: A PROPOSED NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL RESOLUTION; AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (O), DISTRIBUTIONS TO CHAPTERS

PURPOSE: The purpose of this resolution, if passed, is to approve amendments to the Navajo Nation Code, Title 12, Section 820(O), to provide chapter official stipends on an equal basis to all 110 chapter's officials regardless of the percentage of registered voters in the chapter.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

21	A. The Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is empowered to

6	Section 2. Findings
7	A. Navajo Nation Chapter Officials for all one hundred and ten (110) chapters
8	perform valuable functions for local government. This proposed amendment
9	would explicitly state that the Navajo Nation Overall Budget Policy is to
10	provide chapter official stipends on an equal basis to all 110 chapter's officials
11	regardless of the percentage of registered voters in the chapter.
12	B. The Resolution of the Commission on Navajo Government Development
13	supporting the proposed amendment is attached as Exhibit A.

15	Section 3. Amendments to Title 12 of the Navajo Nation Code
16	The Navajo Nation hereby approves amendments to the Navajo Nation Code, Title
17	12, Section 820(O), as follows:

27	O. Where not otherwise prohibited by existing law, any appropriation intended for
28	distribution to all chapters of the Navajo Nation shall be as follows: fifty percent
29	(50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the
30	remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters

using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation voters as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation, except that appropriations for chapter official stipends shall be equally divided equally among all the chapters regardless of the percentage of registered voters in the chapter.

Section 4. Effective Date

The amendments enacted herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221.

Section 5. Codification

The provisions of the Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

Section 6. Saving Clause

Should any portion of the amendment enacted herein be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Court of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSION ON NAVAJO GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT

AN ACTION TO RECOMMEND AMENDMENTS TO 12 N.N.C § 820(O), DISTRIBUTIONS TO CHAPTER, TO REMOVE APPROPRIATIONS MADE TO ALL CHAPTERS INTENDED FOR CHAPTER OFFICIAL STIPENDS FROM THE 50/50 DISTRIBUTION FORMULA IN ORDER TO STREAMLINE FUNDING APPROPRIATIONS INTENDED FOR CHAPTER OFFICIAL STIPENDS.

WHEREAS:

- Pursuant to CD-68-89, the Navajo Nation Council established the Commission ("Commission") on Navajo Government Development including the Office of Navajo Government Development with the quasi-independent authority to accomplish the Navajo Nation Council's project of instituting reforms necessary to ensure an accountable and responsible government; and,
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C § 971 (A), the purpose of the Commission on Navajo Government Development shall be as follows, "To review and evaluate all aspects of the existing government structure of the Navajo Nation including laws, rules and regulations, practices, functions, goals and objectives of the central government as it relates to Chapters, and local communities and the relationship of Chapters and local communities and the relationship of Chapters and local communities to the central government." And,
- The Navajo Nation Council passed Resolution CJN-22-19 recognizing the need to create stable funding mechanisms to enable Chapter officials to perform their official duties; and,
- 4. The Commission and Office of Government Development recognizes that the current 50/50 chapter distribution formula stated in 12 N.N.C § 820(O) does not appropriate Chapter funding for Chapter official stipends equally among all Chapters, resulting in Chapters with too little funding and Chapters with too much funding for stipends at the beginning of each fiscal year; and,
- 5. The Commission and Office of Government Development recommends amendments to 12 N.N.C § 820(O) to exempt funding intended for chapter stipends from the 50/50 formula in order to allow for the equal distribution of funding for Chapter official stipends for all Navajo Nation Chapters.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT THAT:

 The Commission on Navajo Government Development hereby recommends amendments to 12 N.N.C § 820(O), distributions to chapter, to remove appropriations made to all chapters intended for chapter official stipends from the 50/50 distribution formula in order to streamline funding appropriations intended for chapter official stipends.


