RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL, CONSENTING TO JESSE DELMAR AS NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation President appoints a person as the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director. 2 N.N.C. § 1353.
- B. The appointed Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director serves at the Navajo Nation President's pleasure. *Id*.
- C. The Navajo Nation Council gave the Law and Order Committee legislative oversight over the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety. 2 N.N.C. §§ 601(C)(1) see also CJA-03-13, 22nd Navajo Nation Council (2013) and 1355.
- D. A proposed resolution requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- E. The Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director shall fulfill the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety's purposes and objectives found at 2 N.N.C. §1352.

Section Two. Appointment of the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director

The Navajo Nation President appoints Jesse Delmar as the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director. Mr. Delmar's appointment letter and resume are attached as EXHIBIT A.

Section Three. Consenting to the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director

- A. The Navajo Nation consents to the Navajo Nation President's appointment of Jesse Delmar as the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety Executive Director.
- B. Mr. Delmar shall serve at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation President. 2 N.N.C. § 1353.
