18	A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee as a

D. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (2015); CO-45-12.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. There are a total of 110 chapters within the Navajo Nation; and twenty-four (24) Council Delegates (Delegates) who serve as representatives to the Navajo Nation local government units.
- B. Delegates as representative of the Navajo Nation Council regularly attend chapter planning meetings and chapter meetings.
- C. When the local chapter conducts a meeting during a Naabik'íyáti' Committee meeting or the Navajo Nation Council session, the Delegates who opt to attend their chapter planning meeting or a chapter meeting are unable to perform their duties as a Delegate, therefore not serving their respective communities (i.e., not being able to vote on their communities behalf).
- D. It is imperative due to the limited number of Council Delegates that all delegates are able to attend the Naabik'íyáti' Committee meetings as well as the Navajo Nation Council sessions, without conflicting meetings being held at the same time, to prevent loss of quorum.
- E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 700 (C), the Naabik'íyáti' Committee shall meet at least once per month at the call of the Chairperson on the second and fourth Thursday of each month until such time as the Committee adopts an annual meeting schedule and posts such schedule on the Council's website.
- F. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 162, there shall be four regular sessions of the Navajo Nation Council each year. Such sessions shall commence at 10 a.m. on the fourth Monday of January, the third Monday of April, July and October of each year.
- G. It is within the Navajo Nation's best interest to amend Title 26, Navajo Nation Local Governance Act.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING NAVAJO NATION CODE TITLE 26

The Navajo Nation amends the Navajo Nation Code, Title 26 as follows:

NAVAJO NATION CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 26. NAVAJO NATION LOCAL GOVERNANCE ACT CHAPTER 2. CHAPTER GOVERNMENT SUBCHAPTER 5. NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS, OFFICIALS AND ADMINISTRATION—GENERALLY

§ 1002. Meetings; Meeting notice requirement; Compensation of chapter officials

- A. Number of meetings. Each chapter shall determine the number of meetings to be held each month and the time and place for such meetings (subject to the right of the chapter president to call special or emergency meetings when necessary).
 - 1. <u>No chapter meetings shall be held during a regularly scheduled Naabik'íyáti'</u> Committee meeting or the Navajo Nation Council sessions.

SECTION FOUR. CODIFICATION

The provisions of the Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION FIVE. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any provision of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221 (B).
