RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 24th Navajo Nation Council --- Third Year, 2021

AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT; APPROVING THE GRANT OF RIGHT-OF-WAY TO CONTINENTAL DIVIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC., FOR THE CHICHILTAH SINGLE PHASE 14.4 KV ELECTRICAL POWERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT LOCATED ON NAVAJO NATION TRUST LANDS IN CHICHILTAH CHAPTER VICINITY (MCKINLEY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section §501 (B)(2), The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to grant final approval for all land withdrawals, nonmineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc., P.O. Box 1087, Grants, New Mexico 87020, has submitted a right-of-way application to renew right-of-way number E-NM-99-22, a 14.4 kV electrical distribution line, on, over and across Navajo Nation Trust Lands in Chichiltah Chapter vicinity, McKinley County, New Mexico. The application request is attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit D**. The Terms and Conditions document is attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit A**.
- B. The proposed right-of-way is described in map and description attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit B**.
- C. The Grazing Committee/Land Board Member of District Number 16 has identified land users who consent to the use of the land by the Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc. The "Consent to Use, Navajo Nation Lands" and the "Field Clearance Checklist" documents are attached as **Exhibit C**.

- D. A waiver of valuation of the right-of-way and waiver of compensation for a twenty year right-of-way is requested. See, 25 CFR § 169.110 (a)(1), (2) and (3). Exhibit A, the terms and conditions states that the compensation for a twenty year right-of-way is \$755,233.06.
- E. The Resources and Development Committee, through resolution number RDCF-08-20 allowed for one-hundred (100%) waiver of right-of-way consideration for non-profit electric utility companies that provide service to Navajo residents on Navajo Trust land in the Eastern Navajo Agency.
- F. The requested right-of-way is located on Navajo trust land in the Eastern Navajo Agency and Continental Divide Electric Company is a non-profit electric company.
- G. A waiver of the bond, insurance, or alternative form of security on the part of Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc. is requested.
- H. The environmental studies and archaeological clearances, including the Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) dated October 7, 1997, are attached as **Exhibit E**.
- I. The application for the right-of-way as submitted by the Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc., has been reviewed Executive Official Review process, including review by the Department of Justice and "Approved" or found "Sufficient.". See documents included in Executive Official Review Document No. 009791, Exhibit F.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the Grant of Right-of-Way to Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc. for a 14.4 kV electrical distribution line, on, over and across Navajo Nation Trust Lands in Chichiltah Chapter vicinity, McKinley County, New Mexico. The location is more particularly described on the survey map attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.
- B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives valuation and waives compensation of one-hundred percent (100%) of the assessed \$755,233.06 for the right-of-way project for 20-year term because it has been

determined that accepting the agreed-upon compensation and waiving valuation is in its best interest of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to Title 25 CFR § 169.110.

- C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives the requirement for a bond, insurance or alternative form of security on the part of the Grantee, based on the determination that the project benefits the Navajo Nation and such a waiver is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to Title 25 CFR § 169.103 (f) (2).
- D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the right-of-way subject to, but not limited to, the following terms and conditions incorporated herein and attached as **Exhibit A**.
- E. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes the President of the Navajo Nation to execute any and all documents necessary to affect the intent and purpose of this resolution.

NAVAJO NATION RIGHT-OF-WAY TERMS AND CONDITIONS <u>CONTINENTAL DIVIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.</u> (GRANTEE) Chichiltah, Single Phase 14.4 kV Electrical Power Line Extension

- 1. The term of the right-of-way shall be for <u>twenty (20)</u> years, beginning on the date the right-of-way is granted by the Secretary of the Interior.
- 2. Consideration for the right-of-way is assessed at \$<u>755,233.06</u> and shall be paid in full to the Controller of the Navajo Nation, in lawful money of the United States, and a copy of the receipt for such payment provided to the Navajo Nation Minerals Department, or its successor, within ten (10) days of approval of and consent to the grant of the right-of-way by the Navajo Nation.

If consideration has been waived, the Navajo Nation contributes the amount listed above to the project because the project serves a public purpose and will benefit Navajo residents.

On April 21, 2016, Bureau of Indian Affairs revised and implemented the updated Right-of-Way Regulations. As part of this update, a bond, insurance or alternative form of security is now required for all Right-of-Ways. The Bureau of Indian Affairs, pursuant to 25 CFR § 169.103 (f) (2), may waive the requirement ". . . for tribal land, deferring to the maximum extent possible, to the tribe's determination that a waiver of a bond, insurance or alternative form of security is in its best interest."

The Resources and Development Committee finds that the waiver of the requirement for a bond, insurance, or alternative form of security for all projects of the Continental Divide Cooperative, Incorporation requiring a Right-of-Way is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation.

The Resources and Development Committee hereby waives the requirement for a bond, insurance or alternative form of security for all projects of Continental Divide Cooperative, Incorporation requiring Right-of-Way, based on the determination that such a waiver is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation.

- 3. The Grantee may develop, use and occupy the right-of-way for the purpose(s) of <u>construction</u>, <u>operation</u>, <u>and maintenance of a 14.4 kV electrical distribution line</u>. The Grantee may not develop, use or occupy the right-of-way for any other purpose, nor allow others to use or occupy the right-of-way for any other purpose, without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. The Grantee may not develop, use or occupy the right-of-way for any unlawful purpose.
- 4. In all activities conducted by the Grantee within the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect, including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 169; subject to the terms of this right-of-way.
 - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly

identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;


- c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ 601 <u>et seq.</u>, and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Act, 5 N.N.C. §§ 201 <u>et seq.</u>; and
- d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 <u>et seq.</u>, Grantee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
- 5. The Grantee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the right-of-way.
- 6. The Grantee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the right-of-way to the extent compatible with the purpose of the right-of-way, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.
- 7. The Grantee shall reclaim all surface lands disturbed related to the right-of-way, as outlined in a restoration and revegetation plan, which shall be approved by Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA) prior to any surface disturbance. The Grantee shall comply with all provisions of such restoration and revegetation plan and shall notify the Director of the NNEPA immediately upon completion of the surface disturbance activities so that a site inspection be can made.
- 8. The Grantee shall at all times during the term of the right-of-way and at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the right-of-way and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
- 9. The Grantee shall obtain prior written permission to cross existing rights-of-way, if any, from the appropriate parties.
- 10. The Grantee shall be responsible for and promptly pay all damages when they are sustained.
- 11. The Grantee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior and their respective authorized agents, employees, landusers and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy or use of right-of-way by the Grantee.
- 12. The Grantee shall not assign, convey, transfer or sublet, in any manner whatsoever, the right-of-way or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the right-of-way, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation and the Secretary of the Interior. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
- 13. The Navajo Nation may terminate the right-of-way for violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the right-of-way shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation for any of the following causes:
 - a. Failure to comply with any terms and conditions of the grant or of applicable laws or regulations;


- b. A non-use of the right-of-way for the purpose for which it is granted for a consecutive two-year period; and
- c. The use of the land subject to the right-of-way for any purpose inconsistent with the purpose for which the right-of-way is granted.
- d. An abandonment of the right-of-way.
- 14. At the termination of this right-of-way, the Grantee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
- 15. Holding over by the Grantee after the termination of the right-of-way shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Grantee any rights hereunder or in to the land subject to the right-of-way or to any improvements located thereon.
- 16. The Navajo Nation and the Secretary shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the right-of-way, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.
- 17. By acceptance of the grant of right-of-way, the Grantee consents to the full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction of levy fines and to enter judgments for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by the Grantee within the Navajo Nation or which have a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.
- 18. By acceptance of the grant of right-of-way, the Grantee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the right-of-way or to the Navajo Nation.
- 19. Any action or proceeding brought by the Grantee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the right-of-way shall be brought only in the Courts of the Navajo Nation, and no such action or proceeding shall be brought by the Grantee against the Navajo Nation in any court of any state.
- 20. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- 21. Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 22. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of


the Grantee, and the term "Grantee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.

- 23. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the right-of-way; and the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.
- 24. The Navajo Nation reserves the right to grant rights-of-way within the right-of-way referenced herein for utilities, provided that such rights-of-ways do not unreasonably interfere with the Grantee's use of the right-of-way.







FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT DOCUMENT EA-97-148 Location: Township 12N, Range 20W, T13N R2OW, T12NR19W, T13NR19N, T12NR11N, T11N, R20W, & T11N R19W ChiChilTah, McKinley County, New Mexico

The proposed action addresses the ChiChilTah 14.4 KV Overhead Powerline project, encompassing 63.07 acres of Indian lands. The project is sponsored by the Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc. of Grants, New Mexico.

The project environmental assessment (EA) has been reviewed by the Navajo Area Branch of Environmental Services. On the basis of the information contained in the applicant's proposed action, including the proposed mitigation measures as specified in the document, it is determined the proposed project will not have a significant impact on the natural and human environment. Therefore, in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act, Section 102 (2)(c), an environmental impact statement will not be prepared. The following references serve as the basis for this decision and are incorporated in the project environmental assessment.

- 1. Agency and public involvement was conducted and environmental issues related to the development of the 14.4 KV powerline extension project were identified. Alternative courses of action and mitigation measures were developed in response to environmental concerns and issues.
- 2. The EA disclosed the environmental consequences of the proposed action and five potentially viable alternatives which includes the no action alternative.
- 3. The Eastern Agency Branch of Natural Resources will be consulted, as needed, for disturbed areas of trust lands should the areas require regrading and reseeding.
- 4. Impacts to floodplain and wetlands effected by the proposed alternative have been evaluated in accordance with Executive Orders 11988 and 11990 respectively.
- 5. Protective measures will be levied to protect noise and air as outlined in Sections 9 & 10 respectively, see Mitigation Measures.
- 6. In compliance with the Endangered Species Act and informal request for an endangered & threatened (T&E) species list was acquired by the project sponsor from the Navajo Nation Natural Heritage Program. A field survey was performed and a biological assessment crafted in the Effected Environment Section of the EA. Mitigation is provided for T&E species in Section 8. 

The following information on species of concern is provided in response to your 9 May 1997 request concerning the subject project, which consists of several service lines scattered throughout the ChiChilTah Chapter.

"Species of concern" include protected, candidate, and other rare or otherwise sensitive species, including certain native species and species of economic or cultural significance. For each species, the following tribal and federal statuses are indicated: Navajo Endangered Species List (NESL); federal Endangered Species Act (ESA), Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA), and Eagle Protection Act (EPA). No legal protection is afforded species with only ESA candidate or NESL group 4 status. Please be aware of these lower-priority species during surveys and inform the Navajo Fish and Wildlife Department (NFWD) of observations. Documentation that these species are more numerous or widespread than currently known, and addressing these species in project planning and management, is important for conservation and may contribute to ensuring they will not be uplisted in the future. Group 4 species and species of concern without tribal or federal status are only included in responses on an irregular basis and may not be included in the list provided below. Please refer to the NESL for a list of group 4 species.

No species are known to occur on the project sites. Species known to occur within a five-mile radius of the sites include:

- 1. <u>Felis concolor</u> (mountain lion). Known from near the Manuelito Chapter House.
- 2. <u>Geococcyx californianus</u> (Greater Roadrunner). Historic record (1944) known from "Puerco River near Lupton".
- 3. <u>Vulpes vulpes</u> (red fox) Known from Hunting Canyon.

Additional species with **potential** to occur on the 7.5-minute quadrangles (Lupton, Jones Ranch School, Chi Chil Tah, Vanderwagen Draw, and Manuelito) containing the project boundaries include:

4. Aquila chrysaetos (Golden Eagle); NESL group 3; MBTA; EPA.

- 5. Charadrius montanus (Mountain Plover); NESL group 4; ESA Lundidute; MBTA.
- 6. <u>Empidonax traillii extimus</u> (Southwestern Willow Flycatcher), ESL group 2, ESA endangered; MBTA.
- 7. Falco peregrinus (Peregrine Falcon); NESL group 3; ESA end ... gered, MBTA.
- 8. <u>Mustela nigripes</u> (black-footed ferret); NESL group 2; ESA et langered. Potential should be evaluated if prai.ic dog towns of sufficient size (per NFWD lidelines) occur in the project area.
- 9. Strix occidentalis Incida (Mexican Spotted Owl); NESL group , ESA .hreatened; MBTA.

Your project biologist should determine if habitat for the species listed bove cours at the project sites.

The powerlines should be designed according to "Suggested Practices - it Rap.or Protection on Power Lines: The State of the Art in 1981" (Raptor Research Report 2.0, 4, haptor Research Foundation, Inc.).

Also of concern are impacts to any wetland or riparian habitats and their associated species, such as those of Vanderwagen Draw and Manuelito Canyon and its tributaries.

The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's National Wetlands Inventory (NW1) maps must be examined to determine whether areas classified as wetlands are present on or near the project sites. In cases where the maps are inconclusive (e.g., due to their small scale), field surveys must be completed. For field surveys, wetlands identification and delineation nethodology contained in the "Corps of Engineers Wetlands Delineation Manual" (Technical Report Y-87-1) should be used. When wetlands are present, potential impacts must be addressed in an environmental assessment and the Army Corps of Engineers, Phoenix office, must be contacted.

Surveys should be conducted during the appropriate season for the species list d above. Surveyors on the Navajo Mation must be **permitted** by the Director, N. WD. Contact Jeff Cole at (520) 871-7068 for permitting procedures. Questions pertaining to mixely should be directed to the NFWD Botanist (Daniela Roth) for plants at 871-7639, and Zoomgist (David Mikesic) for animals at 871-7638.

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Executive Summary

This document has been prepared as required by Sections 101 and 102 of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, As amended.

The environmental assessment (EA) is an instrument required by federal law and regulations to determine if an action by a federal Agency will result in environmental impacts of such significance as to require the preparation of an environmental impact statement (EIS).

The federal action addressed in this document is the approval of rights-of-way across U. S. Administrative Reserve, Navajo Tribal Trust, PLO 2198 and Individual Navajo Indian Allotted lands by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA). The applicant, Continental Divide Electric Cooperative of Grants, New Mexico is requesting the rights-of-way for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining 31.51 miles of electrical power line. The requested rights-of-way encompasses 76.41 acres, more or less.

The proposed project is located within the boundaries of the ChiChilTah Chapter, in the Eastern Navajo Agency on Navajo Trust, U. S. Administrative, BLM and New Mexico State lands.

Consultation has been conducted with the Navajo Nation Natural Heritage Program, Fish and Wildlife Program to identify federally listed threatened and endangered species and other species of concern that may exist within the project area.

Consultation has been completed with the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Officer and the New Mexico State Historic Preservation to determine the significance of impacts to cultural resources in the project area.

The EA identifies potential impacts; gives consideration to measures which will minimize or eliminate adverse impacts; and will allow for a final federal decision as to the need for the preparation of an EIS. Assessments and determinations of impacts contained in this EA were developed in accordance with the CEQ Guidelines 40 CFR 1500.

Approval of the requested rights-of-way by Continental Divide Electric Cooperative will not result in an irreversible commitment of other resources or irreversible long term impacts to the project area or other resources.

A. Description of Proposed Action

Sec. 102(2) of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, As amended, (NEPA) mandates an environmental impact statement (EIS) be prepared for major federal actions significantly affecting the quality of the human environment. 40 CFR 1501.4 (c) provides that an environmental assessment (EA) of the proposed action may be made to determine whether an EIS may be required for the proposed action. If it is determined, by the EA, that an EIS will not be required, a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) shall be prepared and signed by the responsible federal official.

The purpose of this EA is to identify and assess the potential environmental impacts which may result from a federal action by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA). The federal action is the approval of 26.86 miles of rights-of-way proposed for use for the construction of electrical distribution lines. These rightsof-way are located on U. S. Administrative Reserve, Individual Navajo Indian Allotted, PLO 2198 and Navajo Tribal trust lands. BIA approval of rights-of-way on these trust lands is a mandated federal responsibility. In addition to the lands under the jurisdiction of the BIA the proposed project includes 1.91 miles on private land, 2.25 miles on New Mexico State land and 0.51 miles on Public Lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The State of New Mexico and BLM will make a separate assessment of environmental impacts to the lands under their jurisdiction.

Approval of the requested rights-of-way will allow Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc. (CDEC) the right of ingress and egress to construct, operate, maintain, repair, replace and remove, poles, wires, cables, conductors, markers and other necessary fixtures and appurtenances as may be required to provide electrical service to families residing in the ChiChilTah Chapter community.

1. Project Description

The proposed electrical distribution line project consists of 18 lines, including short drops to individual residences.

The electrical distribution lines will be located within a 20 foot right-of-way corridor. Rights-of-way for the proposed distribution line project will require a total of 76.41 acres, more or less. The following table shows the distribution of rights-of-way on the various land jurisdictions.

The proposed lines will be single-pole, overhead 14.4 kV electrical distribution lines. Construction will consist of placing class 3 and class 5 power poles approximately 400 feet apart. Poles will vary in height from 35 feet to 40 feet and are approximately 12 to 14 inches in diameter. A truck-mounted auger will be used to excavate holes 18 inches in diameter and from five to six feet in depth. Similar holes will be augured for anchors. Upon completion of the pole setting operation, the conductor (wire) will be reeled from truck mounted cable spools and strung on the poles.

Surface disturbance will be restricted to the area required to auger holes for the poles and anchors, less than 2 square feet per pole, and 28 square feet per mile. It will not be necessary to cut trees or clear brush for this project. No significant surface disturbance is anticipated, however should significant disturbance occur, either inadvertently or as a result of unanticipated construction requirements. The areas on trust lands will be re-contoured and re-seeded as directed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Navajo Nation.

Existing roads in the area will be used for access. New access road construction road will not be required. Only rubber tired equipment will be used for power line construction.

All construction debris will be removed from the project location and disposed of at a disposal site approved of by the Navajo Nation.

2. Purpose and Need

The purpose of this power line project is to provide electrical service to families residing an area of the ChiChilTah Chapter for the Navajo Indian Reservation. Approximately 42 families are to be served by the proposed project.

There is a need to provide the families in the project area with electrical service so they my enjoy and realize positive benefits and impacts on their lifestyles which is taken for granted by the majority of the population today.

It is expected that electric service for the families to be served will have a positive economic impact. Less frequent trips to trading centers will be required. For example refrigerators will allow greater quantities of food to be purchased and kept fresh; washing machines will eliminate the need for trips to laundromats. Not only will this reduce the amount of money spent on fuel for automobiles, but also wear on vehicles from traveling over the unimproved roads in the area. Electricity will allow families to enjoy entertainment and educational opportunities provided by television in the comfort of their own homes.

The quality of life for the families to be served by this project will be significantly improved.

3. Location

The proposed power lines are located within the ChiChilTah Chapter, in southwest McKinley County, New Mexico. Land status and lengths of each line is shown in appendix A.

More exact locations and photographs taken in the project area are shown in Fig. 1 - 15.

B. Alternatives

1. Approval of the Requested Rights-of-way (Preferred Alternative)

The preferred alternative is the approval of the requested rights-of-way for the ChiChilTah Community power line extension project.

The approval of the requested right-of-way will allow CDEC ingress and egress for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining electrical service to families residing in the ChiChilTah Chapter of the Navajo Indian Reservation.

2. Solar Energy

Direct conversion of solar radiation to electricity can be accomplished on a small scale. However, solar-power systems, as a primary source of providing fully adequate electrical service has not achieved great success because of the irregularity of operations and excessive cost.

In remote areas where access to major distribution systems are unavailable, solar energy systems may be considered as a viable alternative. This alternative would provide limited electrical services to the families who wish to invest in the equipment necessary to generate electricity by this method.

The preferred alternative is a more feasible and economical alternative since a dependable, major distribution system exists in the area.

Since solar energy is not considered a feasible alternative to the proposed action, environmental impacts related to this alternative will not be addressed in this document.

3. Wind Energy

Generation of electricity by wind has long been used in remote areas where no other means of electrical power is available. This method requires expensive and voluminous equipment and is not considered an economically feasible means of providing power in areas where direct conductive electrical distribution systems are in place.

Since a reliable, conductive distribution system is available on the ChiChilTah Chapter area, wind generated electricity is not considered a viable alternative.

This alternative will not be addressed in this environmental assessment.

4. No Action

If the "No Action" alternative is selected by the BIA, the requested rights-of-way will not be approved. This alternative will deny electrical service to families residing in the proposed project area.

This alternative is considered unacceptable because of the adverse socioeconomics effects to the families to be served by the proposed project.

5. Alternatives Beyond the BIA Authority

Alternatives beyond the authority of the BIA would be the installation of individual family solar energy systems or wind chargers.

There are no other alternatives "Beyond the BIA Authority" which will serve the purpose and need of the proposed power line. Any other measures which will provide adequate and economical electrical service on the to families in the ChiChilTah community requires BIA concurrence for rights-of-way for an electrical distribution system.

C. Affected Environment

Only those components of the environment which will be affected by the proposed action will be discussed in detail.

1. Land Resources

a. Topography

The topography throughout the project area is slightly sloping to nearly flat. No escarpments or sandstone cliffs are found within one mile of any of the project alignments except near the end of Line 18.

Elevation of the proposed project ranges from 6700 to 7000 feet.

b. Soils

The proposed project is located on lands which have been the subject of a soil survey conducted by the United States department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service and the New Mexico Agriculture Station. Soils in the majority portion of the project have been classified as Penistaja-Valen-Palma. This association includes deep and well to excessively drained soils. The soils are forming predominately in coarse to moderately fine-textured alluvial and eolian sediments of mixed origin.

Soils in these groups are suitable for tall and short-grass wildlife habitat. They are also suitable for semidesert shrubs and grasses wildlife habitat. Effective rooting depth is 60 inches or more. Soils in this complex support range and wildlife habitat.

The soils are not listed as hydric soils in AD-A176734, corps of Engineers Wetlands Delineation Manual, Jan 87.

2. Hydrology

a. Surface Water

Three major drainages in the project area are Manuelito Canyon to the north, Vanderwagen Draw near the southeast edge of the project area, and the Whitewater Arroyo which runs through the middle of the project. These three drainages drain the project area.

None of the proposed power lines cross any of these drainages. The lines are located on the high plains, on rolling to nearly level terrain, above the drainages.

No lakes, ponds, springs, seeps or wetlands are located within or adjacent to the project rights-of-way.

b. Ground Water

There are no shallow ground waters in the project area. Aquifers producing potable water require deep wells.

3. Biota

The project alignment is located in Pinon-Juniper and Pinon-Juniper-Oak habitat. The difference in the habitats is the importance of oak to animals like turkey, chipmunks, and mule deer.

Dominate trees are pinon and one-seed juniper. Important understory plants include blue grama, dropseed and shrubs such as mountain mahogany, wild currant, sumac and banana yucca. Other plant species include snakeweed, big sagebrush, rabbit brush and prickly pear cactus. Sagebrush is the dominant species found throughout a large part of the project area.

Most abundant mammals include jack rabbits, cottontails, deer mice, pinon mice, valley pocket gophers, and Ord's kangaroo rats.

Breeding birds include horned larks, mourning doves, common night hawks, common flickers, western kingbirds, Say's Phoebes, common ravens, starlings, house sparrows, brown towhees, lark sparrows, Brewer's blackbirds, lark sparrows, chipping sparrows, and grey-headed juncos.

Lesser earless lizards are common, short-horned lizards and whiptails may be found in the area.

4. Resource Use Patterns

Grazing by sheep, goats, cattle and horses has been and continues to be the primary use of the land by local inhabitants in the project area.

Rangeland may be classified by its carrying capacity in sheep units; that is, the amount of land needed to graze one sheep for one year (one cow requires four sheep units; one horse, five sheep units). According to studies conducted in the area, the best grazing areas would require 20 to 30 acres per sheep unit. In poorer grazing areas, as many as 50 acres would be required per sheep unit. Rangeland in the project area may be considered fair to good.

5. Socioeconomics

From the time the Navajo Reservation was established until the early 20th century, Navajo social and political organization were based on the extended family, the clan, and related clans; with informal local leaders or headmen. The chapter system, now a strong element in social and political life was introduced as a bureaucratic substitute for the headman system in the late 1920s. The Chapter, District and Agency system that has developed, operates simultaneously as an instrument of the BIA and the Navajo Tribal political system. The proposed project is located in the ChiChilTah Chapter, Eastern Navajo Agency.

The tenuous subsistence of the marginal lands that make up the Navajo Reservation dictates a mutual dependence for survival and it is the clan group which serves to promote economic cooperation. Because a nuclear family could scarcely survive without reciprocal relationships, the clan system is continually reinforced. Withdrawal of group or clan support is an economic, as well as, a psychological threat. It is an insult among Navajos to say that a person "acts as if he has no relatives".

The 1990 Navajo Nation census placed the population of the ChiChilTah Chapter at approximately 1,442 persons.

In general, housing conditions in the ChiChilTah community are good. Most dwellings which have been built by their owners have three rooms or fewer. However, more modern homes and standard dwelling units have been and are now being developed the Navajo Housing Authority under HUD programs. Mobile homes are becoming a source of improved housing for those who can afford to purchase them. Living standards of Navajo People in this area may be better than what may be considered average throughout a large part of the Navajo Nation. This is afforded because of the availability of educational opportunities and wage work in Gallup, N.M. and the surrounding area.

Social services, law and order, secondary schools, Gallup Branch of the University of New Mexico, health services, retail outlets are available at Gallup, New Mexico approximately 30 miles northeast of the project area. The main highway to Gallup is paved. The area is served locally by the BIA ChiChilTah Elementary School and David Skeet Elementary Public School. The secondary school students are bussed to Gallup or attend boarding schools.

Road construction and maintenance are provided by McKinley County, the BIA, and the State of New Mexico.

Utilities available in the area are provided by the Navajo Tribal Utilities Authority, Indian Health Service, Universal Telephone Company of the Southwest and Continental Divide Electric Cooperative, Inc..

6. Cultural and Religious Values

The Navajo of today is subject to a fluidity and change that appears to characterize Navajo culture. There may not be, in fact, a single Navajo culture; rather a continuum from most traditional to most "modern", that is, most like the anglo culture.

The sources of change within the Navajo society are education, proximity to the anglo society, political organization, economic relationships and other social relationships with non-Navajos.

In American culture, one is accustomed to thinking of certain activities as religious, or economic or political; in Navajo society, these divisions do not necessarily exist nor are they perceived.

For Navajos, man, nature, and supernatural forces are inextricably interwoven, and everyday acts are infused with the concept of the supernatural. Animals, plants, minerals, mountains, and places frequented daily; can all be endowed with power so that spiritual and supernatural forces surround the Navajo wherever he goes and in whatever he does. Most traditional families have an area marked by a bush or plant where family members leave offerings of used material and paraphernalia from sings or ceremonies.

Christian and the Native American Church practices preach primary responsibility to one's nuclear family and only secondary responsibility to other kin. Many Navajos who subscribe to belief in these non-traditional religions, are still strongly bound by tradition to their kinship and community groups through Navajo religious practices. Navajos are influenced by a world view which anchors them within a rich cultural and religious tradition.

Major geological features considered sacred include, mountains, mesas and canyons. Other areas may be known only to individual families, medicine men or singers. Such areas are numerous and can only be identified by inquiry in each community. Despite changes in Navajo society, traditional practices are still strong.

Personnel from the Capital Improvement Department of the Navajo Nation division of Community Development conducted cultural resource inventories for all proposed project rights-of-way. Data regarding Traditional Cultural Properties (TCPs) and sites with religious or spiritual significance were collected throughout the project area. ChiChilTah Chapter officials and the Council delegate were interviewed regarding cultural properties and project impacts. The majority of the individual homeowners located along the project rights-of-way were interviewed regarding TCPs.

A more detailed report of work conducted for each individual line is included in respective Cultural Resource Inventory reports. These reports are on file in the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department, Cultural Resource Compliance Section, Window Rock, Arizona.

Navajo Indians III (Van Valkenburgh, 1974) and Dine Bikeyah (Van Valkenburgh 1941) were reviewed for information regarding TCPs in the project area.

No significant TCPs were identified within project rights-of-way as a result of this work.

7. Archeological Resources

A records search for all proposed power line rights-of-way alignments was conducted at the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Office in Window Rock, Arizona.

Field surveys were conducted by archaeologists from the Capital Improvement Department, Navajo Nation Division of Community Development. Survey work consisted of an intense survey of a 30 m wide (100 ft.) corridor along the staked power line alignments.

A complete description and evaluation of archeological and cultural resources discovered in the intensive surveys conducted for this project may be found in the final reports on file with the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Officer in Window Rock, Arizona.

Due to the confidentiality of the reports only the Cultural Resource Compliance Forms have been attached as an appendices to this EA (Appendix B). However, the reports are considered integral in the final determination of significance of impacts to the cultural and archeological resources in the project area.

8. Threatened and Endangered Species and Other Species of Concern

Consultation with the Navajo Nation Fish and Wildlife Program (NNFWP) was conducted to identify federally listed threatened and endangered and other species of concern (Appendix C).

Tribal and federal status for species is indicated as follows: Navajo Endangered Species List (NESL); federal Endangered Species Act (ESA); federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA); and federal Bald Eagle Act (BEA).

No legal protection is afforded ESA candidate or NESL group 4 status species.

No species were **known** to occur on the project sites. Species of concern **known** to occur within a fivemile radius of the site include the following:

Mountain lion (Felis concolor) NESL group 4

A large, tawny to grayish, cat with dark brown on tip of long tail and on backs of ears and sides of nose. Eye shine greenish gold.

Dens in concealed, sheltered spot. Chiefly nocturnal. Young may be born anytime of the year. Feeds largely on deer, but takes hares, rodents and occasionally domestic animals; caches uneaten portions of kills.

~

Habitat rugged mountains, forests and swamps.

Known from near the Manuelito Chapter House.

Greater Roadrunner (Geococcyx californianus)

A cuckoo that runs on the ground. Slender, heavily streaked; long, maneuverable, white-tipped tail, shaggy crest, strong legs. In flight the short rounded wings display a white crescent.

Nests is a shallow saucer in bush, cactus or low trees.

Habitat is open country with scattered cover, stony deserts, dry brush, open pinon-juniper.

Historic record (1944) known from "Puerco River near Lupton".

Red fox (Vulpes vulpes)

Appearance of a small dog; normally reddish yellow, darkest on the back; belly white; bushy tail mixed with black hairs and tipped with white; legs and feet black. There are many color variations.

Most active at night, early morning and late evening. Often active during the day. Food consists of available animals ranging from insects to hares. Berries and other fruits round out the diet. Catches rabbits, mice or other animals near trails.

Preferred habitat is a mixture of forest and open country.

Known from Hunting Canyon.

Additional species with **potential** to occur on the 7.5 minute quadrangles (Lupton, Jones Ranch School, Chi Chil Tah, Vanderwagen Draw, and Manuelito) containing the project boundaries include the following:

Federally Listed Endangered Species:

Southwestern willow flycatcher (Empidonax traillii extimus) NESL group 3; USESA endangered; MBTA

This species is a sparrow sized, olive green flycatcher with a dark head, whitish throat, olive breast and yellow belly. It has no eye ring and its wings have two white bars.

Habitat is riparian woodlands and brushy areas in pastures. Breeds in willows and alder thickets in low valleys, swamps, canyons or in high mountain meadows; brushy bogs, muskegs. Nest is a loose cup in the fork of shrubs.

American peregrine falcon (Falco peregrinus anatum) NESL group 3; ESA Endangered; MBTA

The American peregrine falcon is a reclusive, crow-sized falcon; slatey blue-gray above, whitish below. The head is black with a vertical "bandit's mask" pattern over the eyes. Wings are long and pointed.

Habitat is primarily areas with rocky, steep cliffs, preferably near water where bird concentrations are high. Dense bird populations provide the primary food source for the falcon.

Black-footed ferret (Mustela nigripes) NESL group 2; ESA endangered

The Black-footed ferret is a weasel-like mammal that has yellow-buff coloration with black feet, tail tip and eye-mask; a blunt, light colored nose. Body length 15 to 18 inches, tail length 5 to 6 inches.

Habitat is grassland plains and surrounding mountain basins to 10,500 feet in elevation. The ferret is found in conjunction with prairie dogs, which provide their primary food source; and abandoned burrows for habitat.

Mexican spotted owl (Strix occidentalis lucida) NESL group 3; USESA threatened; MBTA

A large dark-brown forest owl with a puffy round head. The large dark eyes and heavily barred and spotted underparts identify this rare bird.

Its habitat is heavy forest, conifers, wooded canyons. Nests in tree cavities, nest of hawks or caves in canyon walls.

Other Species of Concern:

Golden eagle (Aquiline chrysaetos) NESL group 3; MBTA; BEA.

Wing spread 6-7 feet. Majestic, flat-winged gliding and soaring with occasional wingbeats. Evenly dark below, or with a slight lightening at base of tail. When the bird wheels, a wash of gold on the hind neck may be noticed.

Habitat is open mountains, foothills, canyons and plains. Nests are a mass of sticks on cliff ledges or trees.

Mountain plover (Charadrius montanus) NESL group 4; ESA candidate; MBTA

A bird similar to the Killdeer, but with no breast rings.

Habitat for this species is semiarid grassland, plains and plateaus and often associated with prairie dog towns. Nest sites are chosen in flat country with sparse and low-lying vegetation.

9. Noise

In acoustics noise is defined as any undesired sound. Usually, noise is a mixture of many tones combined in a non-musical manner. The measurement of any sound stimulus is commonly made with a sound-level meter and a frequency analyzer. The results are given in decibels (db).

The normal ambient noise level in the ChiChilTah Chapter area between 0 db (soft whisper) and occasionally 90 db (heavy truck).

10. Air Quality

Air quality is affected by pollutants which include almost any composition of matter capable of being airborne. It is usual to consider as pollutants only those substances added in sufficient concentrations to produce measurable effects. These effects include visibility reduction, damage to materials such as structural metals, paint and fabrics, damage to vegetation, and physiological damage to man and animals.

The proposed project is located within the Zuni Air Shed. Nearest major emission sources are the Gallup Sand and Gravel operation and the Hamilton Brothers hot plant operations, over fifteen miles north of the proposed project location. These sources have no effect on air quality in the project area.

The Revised 1991 - 1993 New Mexico Air Quality Report by the New Mexico Air Quality Bureau include the following data.

An ambient air monitoring station is located on the roof of the city hall in Gallup, New Mexico, approximately six miles northeast of the project area. This air monitoring station is identified as station Gallup 1D. Total suspended particulate matter (TSP) has been replaced by inhalable particulate matter (PM_{10}) as the federally mandated measure of air borne particulate matter since PM_{10} has been more closely correlated to negative health effects than TSP.

No studies for air quality have been conducted in ChiChilTah Chapter. However, ambient air quality may be regarded as good to excellent, that is, near pristine. Primary pollution in the project vicinity is from wind blown dust, common during times of high winds, and dust from vehicular traffic.

D. Environmental Consequences and Measures for Mitigation

1. Land Resources

a. Topography

Minimal surface disturbance will result from the construction of the power line. Disturbance will be limited to pole locations and as required to auger holes for the poles (18 inches in diameter and approximately 400 feet apart, less than 2 square feet per pole).

Minor disturbance may result from rubber-tired equipment used for placing power poles and stringing line. Work will be limited to placement of poles and improvement of existing roads at minor drainages.

If it should occur that a line is no longer required, all fixtures can be removed and the area reclaimed to near pristine conditions.

No major excavation or modification of the topography will be required. No irreversible or long term impacts to the topography will result from BIA's approval of the requested rights-of-way.

b. Soils

Minimal surface and subsurface disturbance will be required. No release of hazardous or toxic materials will occur.

The proposed project will not have an effect the soils.

2. Water Resources

a. Surface Water

No hazardous or toxic materials will be released or disposed of on site. No contamination or containment of surface water will result from the project. Surface waters in the project area are intermittent and naturally high in sediments.

The quality and quantity of surface waters will not be affected by the proposed project.

b. Ground Water

Subsurface work will be limited to the excavation of holes for the power line poles and anchors. Depth of excavation will not exceed a depth of six feet.

Ground water will not be affected by the approval of the rights-of-way for the proposed project.

3. Biota

Due to the nature of the project and construction practices to be implemented, only minor short term impacts may be expected should the power line be constructed. Impacts to flora will be limited to the auguring of 18-inch diameter holes approximately 400 feet apart (less than 28 square feet per mile of line), and rubber-tired vehicle traffic.

Fauna in the area will not be disturbed or displaced for extended periods of time. Disturbance will be of short duration, generally less than one-half day in any site specific area.

Habitat of flora and fauna will not be adversely affected.

4. Resource Use Patterns

The project area is used exclusively for grazing. No significant surface disturbance will occur and the rights-of-way will not be fenced. There will be no impact to the present resource use of the area.

5. Socioeconomics

Construction of the proposed power line is considered to be beneficial to the people of ChiChilTah. Families receiving electrical services from the proposed project will realize positive benefits and impacts on their lifestyles.

It is expected that with electric service in individual homes that less frequent trips to trading centers will be required. Examples are: Refrigerators which will allow greater quantities of food to be purchased and kept fresh; washing machines which will eliminate the need for trips to laundromats. Television will provide entertainment and educational opportunities for many.

The approval of the requested rights-of-say for the proposed action will have a beneficial impact on the Navajo families residing in the ChiChilTah community.

6. Cultural and Religious Values

No TCPs or other resources holding cultural or religious significance were identified along the project alignment.

Approval of the requested rights-of-way will not have adverse effects on cultural or religious resources or values.

7. Archeological Resources

Significant surface or sub-surface disturbance will not be required for the construction of the proposed project. Poles will be placed to avoid archeological resources.

An intensive archeological survey was conducted for the proposed undertaking. The final report was subject to review by the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Officer and consultation with New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officer.

As a result of the review and consultation an archeological clearance was issued by the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Officer and BIA Navajo Area Director (Appendix B).

The respective *Cultural Resources Compliance Forms* for each line (Appendix B) provides conditions and stipulations to assure the proposed project will have no effect on the archeological resources in the area. CDEC will comply with these stipulations and conditions.

8. Threatened and Endangered Species and Other Species of Concern

The project area was visited on March 12, 1997.

The power line has been designed and will be constructed to conform with the publication Suggested Practices for Raptor Protection on Power Lines - State of the Art in 1981, Raptor Research Report No. 4, Raptor Research Foundation, Inc., Department of Veterinary Biology, University of Minnesota, St. Paul, Minnesota 55108.

Mountain lion (Felis concolor) NESL group 4 Greater Roadrunner (Geococcyx californianus) Red fox (Vulpes vulpes)

> These species may migrate through areas where the proposed rights-of-way are located. However, the nature of the proposed project and the length of time spent in any one area by construction crews will not have an adverse effect on the species or their habitat.

Federally Listed Endangered Species:

Southwestern willow flycatcher (*Empidonax traillii extimus*) NESL group 3; USESA endangered; MBTA American peregrine falcon (*Falco peregrinus anatum*) NESL group 3; ESA Endangered; MBTA Black-footed ferret (*Mustela nigripes*) NESL group 2; ESA endangered Mexican spotted owl (*Strix occidentalis lucida*) NESL group 3; USESA threatened; MBTA

Critical habitat for these species is not found within or adjacent to any of the requested rights-ofway for the proposed ChiChilTah Community power line project. The proposed action will not have an adverse effect on these species or their habitat.

Other Species of Concern:

Golden eagle (Aquiline chrysaetos) NESL group 3; MBTA; BEA. Mountain plover (Charadrius montanus) NESL group 4; ESA candidate; MBTA

These species may migrate through areas where the proposed rights-of-way are located. However, the nature of the proposed project, the length of time spent in any one area by construction crews and measures for mitigation to be implemented in the design and construction of the project assure no adverse effects on these species or their habitat.

9. Noise

Power line construction activities will not generate noises which are not considered normal for the area. Noise levels in the 90 to 100 db range may be generated by the operation of construction equipment. These levels are common for such equipment when measured approximately 20 feet from the source. Outdoors, sound levels decrease six db each time the distance between the source and point of measurement is doubled. At 500 feet the sound levels from the road construction activities may be expected to decrease to approximately 70 db to 80 db. This is equivalent to the noise of an automobile at 20 feet or heavy traffic at 25 to 30 feet.

Construction work will be short term and limited to daylight hours. Noise from construction activities will not have an adverse effect on the environment.

10. Air Quality

Air quality may be affected by dust and a negligible amount of hydrocarbons generated by construction equipment for the short period of time that the power line is under construction. However, these pollutants will not be generated in sufficient quantities or concentrations to produce measurable effects to structural metals, paint and fabrics, damage to vegetation, or physiological damage to man and animals.

Power line construction activities will not have a significant or long term effect on the ambient air quality in the project area.

E. Conclusions Regarding Significance

Areas disturbed by project activities may be reclaimed to existing conditions when and if the power line is no longer required.

The power line rights-of-way will remain in near pristine condition except for power poles.

No adverse impacts to health or safety will result from the construction of the proposed power line.

No threatened or endangered species, species of concern or their critical habitats will be adversely affected by the proposed project.

Archeological or cultural resources will not be impacted or affected.

The approval of the rights-of-way, for the ChiChilTah Community power line extension by the BIA will not have a significant effect on the human environment.

This action does not require preparation of an environmental impact statement.

F. Consultations and References

Consultation has been conducted with the Navajo Nation Natural Heritage Program, Fish and Wildlife Program to identify federally listed threatened and endangered species and other species of concern that may exist within the project area.

Consultation has been completed with the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Officer and the New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officer to regarding impacts to cultural resources in the project area.






Figure 1 CHI-CHIL-TAH CHAPTER POWER LINE PROJECT CONTENETAL DIVISE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, ENC.





Figure 2 CHICHILTAN CHAPTER POWER LINE PROJECT CONTINUETAL DIVIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.

















Figure 8 CH-CHR-TAR CHAPTER NOWER LINE PROJECT CONTINUETAL DIVIES ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.








Figure 9 CHI-CHID-TAB CHAPTER FOWER LINE PROJECT CONTINUETAL DEVELO ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, DVC.








Figure 10 CHI-CHIL-TAN CHAPTER FOWER LINE PROJECT CONTINUETAL DIVIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, ISC.




















Figure 12 CHI-CHIL TAB CHLYTER POWER LINE PROJECT CONTINET & DIVIDE PLECTRIC COOPERATIVE, ISC.









Figure 13 CHI-CHIL-TAH CHAPTER POWER LINE PROJECT CONTINETAL DIVIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.











Figure 14 CHE-CHEL TAH CHAPTER POWER LINE PROJECT CONTINETAL DIVIDE ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, EVC.










Figure 15 CHI-CHIL TAB CHAPTER POWER LINE PROJECT CONTINETAL HYDP ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.
