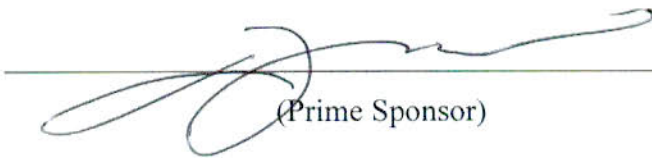

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council established the Arizona Gaming Subcommittee through Resolution NABIO-62-15, on October 8, 2015. See Exhibit A.

B. The Arizona Gaming Subcommittee is charged, among other responsibilities, with negotiating the renewal of appropriate amendments to the current gaming compact between the Navajo Nation and Title II Reform Subcommittee is to be composed of two members from each Navajo Nation Standing Committee. See Exhibit A

C. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council appoints delegates to serve at the pleasure of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee on the Arizona Gaming Subcommittee.

RESOLUTION OF THE

23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL—FIRST YEAR, 2015

AN ACTION

RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; ESTABLISHING THE
NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' ARIZONA GAMING SUB-COMMITTEE

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' as a Navajo Nation standing committee and empowered the committee to "[t]o coordinate all...state programs with other standing committees and branches of the Navajo Nation government to provide the most effective delivery of services to the Navajo Nation." 2 N.N.C. §§ 700(A) and 701(A)(4) (2012) see also CJA-03-13.
- B. The Navajo Nation Council gave Naabik'íyáti' Committee the authority to delegate its authority as appropriate for efficiency and streamlining of government process to appropriate entities. 2 N.N.C. § 701(B) (2012) see also CJA-03-13.
- C. Naabik'íyáti' Committee holds the authority to establish the Arizona Gaming Subcommittee and such subcommittee shall exist until its assigned tasks are completed and a report and recommendation is made to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. § 186 (2012) see also CJA-03-13.
- D. Indian Gaming in Arizona includes 19 Tribes who, collectively, have contributed close to Seven hundred and fifty million dollars (\$750,000,000) to the State of Arizona and support Tribal operations and programs to benefit reservation communities; it is vital that the Navajo Nation continue to remain involved in state gaming issues. See Arizona Indian Gaming Association, 2012 Annual Report.

- E. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to establish an Arizona Gaming Subcommittee of dedicated members to stay active in the gaming issues related to the Navajo gaming.

Section Two. Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee Establishment

- A. The Navajo Nation establishes the Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee to negotiate the renewal of appropriate amendments to the current gaming compact between the Navajo Nation and the State of Arizona and to address related issues to protect Navajo gaming.
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee shall:
1. Work in cooperation and in coordination with the Navajo Nation President, Attorney General, and the Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise or the designees from these respective offices; and
 2. Report monthly to the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council on the Task Force's activities; and
 3. Transfer information and recommendations to the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, the Naabik'iyáti' Committee, appropriate Navajo Nation Council standing committees, and appropriate Legislative Branch boards, commissions, agencies, offices and programs; and
 4. Submit to the Naabik'iyáti' Committee for final review and approval any and all amendments and/or compacts which are negotiated.
- C. The Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee shall consist of six members who reside and represent the State of Arizona. The Navajo Nation Council Speaker shall appoint delegates to serve on the subcommittee. The appointed delegates serve at the pleasure of the Naabik'iyáti' Committee. The Navajo Nation Council Speaker appoints the following delegates to the subcommittee, EXHIBIT A:
1. Alton Joe Shepherd, Resources and Development Committee

2. Otto Tso, Law and Order Committee
 3. Jonathan L. Hale, Health, Education and Human Services Committee
 4. Dwight Witherspoon, Budget and Finance Committee
 5. Tuchoney Slim, Jr., Naabik'iyáti' Committee
 6. Walter Phelps, Navajo-Hopi Land Commission
- D. The Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee may include members from the Executive Branch with the Navajo Nation President's recommended appointments to serve on the subcommittee, including but not limited to Navajo Gaming Regulatory Office and Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise.
- E. The Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee by majority vote shall select a chairperson and vice-chairperson at their first meeting. The chairperson and vice-chairperson shall serve at the subcommittee's pleasure; replacement shall be by majority vote.
- F. The Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee shall establish a regular meeting day(s) of the month and shall meet more frequently during tribal-state compact negotiations. Due to the economic importance of the compact negotiation work, Subcommittee members absent from two or more meetings may be replaced at the recommendation of the Chair of the Subcommittee.
- G. The Naabik'iyáti' Gaming Subcommittee may retain a legal consultant through the Office of the Speaker to render legal advice regarding negotiations.

Section Three. Subcommittee Term

The Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee shall exist until their assigned tasks are completed and shall report on the recommendations to the Naabik'iyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. § 186 (2012) see also CJA-03-13.

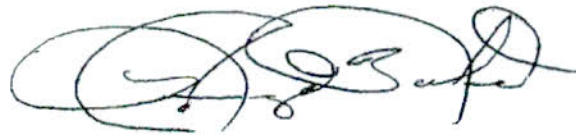
Section Four. Directives

- A. The Speaker's Chief of Staff shall assign one policy analyst to assist the Naabik'iyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee.

- B. The Legislative Services' Executive Director shall assign two Office of Legislative Services staffers to assist the Naabik'íyáti' Arizona Gaming Subcommittee.
- C. The Speaker shall determine a Subcommittee budget and identify the funds.

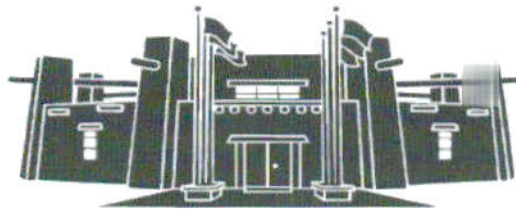
