TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$1,808,538 IN SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS' EMERGENCY FUND ACCOUNTS; WAIVING 12 N.NC. § 820 (O)

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will allocate \$1,808,538 from the UUFB to bring all Navajo Nation Chapter Emergency Fund account balances to \$25,000.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$1,808,538 IN SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS' EMERGENCY FUND ACCOUNTS; WAIVING 12 N.NC. § 820 (O)

BE IT ENACTED:

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SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY.

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation with the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 2 N.N.C. §102(A) and 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
- B. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(16).
- C. This proposed Resolution is offered as an emergency due to the decimation visited on

Chapter's Emergency Fund accounts by the COVID-19 pandemic and the vital need to have emergency funds available to respond to seasonal emergencies at the local level.

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D. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)."

E. The Navajo Nation Appropriations Act requirements regarding Supplemental Appropriations include:

- All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).
- 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for the designation of recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).

4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).

5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five

year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, nonrecurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. On behalf of the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters, the Division of Community Development ("DCD") has submitted a Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary, dated October 13, 2021. With this form, DCD is requesting \$1,808,538 out of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to provide the 110 Chapters enough funds to replenish their Emergency Fund accounts back to the established amount of \$25,000. See Budget Instruction Manual ("BIM") Appendix K attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- B. A comprehensive list showing each Chapters' funding need is attached as Exhibit B.
 If the total requested amount of \$1,808,538 is approved by the Navajo Nation Council, different Chapters will receive different dollar amounts as shown in Exhibit B but all 110 Chapters will end up with the same balance of \$25,000 in their Emergency Fund accounts.

C. On behalf of the Chapters, DCD has provided the required Navajo Nation Budget Forms, attached as **Exhibit C**.

- D. The OOC has not yet reviewed this supplemental funding request for the amount of \$1,808,538 as required by 12 N.N.C. §820(L). However, OOC has provided a memorandum dated August 20, 2021 regarding a previous DCD request for Chapters' emergency funds in the amount of \$1,685,344. Exhibit D. OOC can present an updated memorandum with a review of this \$1,808,538 funding request when this legislation is presented for consideration by the Navajo Nation Council. The Controller has identified the Chapters' emergency funding as non-recurring expenditures.
- E. The Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") has not yet reviewed this \$1,808,538 funding request for a budget impact analysis as required by 12 N.N.C. §820(M). However, the OMB has provided a budget impact analysis dated October 12, 2021 regarding a previous DCD request for Chapters' emergency funds in the amount of

\$1,838,798. Exhibit E. OMB can present an updated budget impact analysis for this \$1,808,538 funding request when this legislation is presented for consideration by the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$1,808,538 FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$1,808,538 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters Emergency Fund accounts. Each Chapter shall receive the designated dollar amount as shown in **Exhibit B**, so as to bring each Chapter's Emergency Fund account balance to \$25,000.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,808,538 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Controller.
- C. The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. § 820 (O) (Chapter 50/50 formula) to allow for this supplemental appropriation to all 110 Chapters.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and with 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(17).

SECTION FIVE. SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any provision of this Action is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation or by any Navajo Nation District Court, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Act shall remain valid as the law of the Navajo Nation.

SUBJECT: Legislation No. 0206-21: Division of Community Development Budget for 110 Navajo Nation Chapters' Emergency Response plans in amount of \$1,838,798 from UUFB.

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M) requiring OMB reviewed the subject document and provides the following information:

- 1. The Exhibit 'A' Supplemental Fund Summary page is signed by DCD in early August, 2021, and it refers to 'flood relief for monsoon season. It seems the rainy season is over and perhaps winter snow and freezing will soon be the need. OMB recommends the document be updated.
- 2. The Appropriation Act, Section 820, O; Distributions to Chapter, provides guidance on this. The language is: "Where not otherwise prohibited by existing law, any appropriation intended for distribution to all chapters of the Navajo Nation shall be allocated as follows: fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation voters as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation...." As proposed, a waiver of this section may be required. DOJ should advise.
- 3. Some Chapters have deficit spending in FY 21: e.g. Churchrock (\$9,672.49). Crownpoint (\$11,434.93), Dilkon (\$46,801.68), Iyanbito (\$16,194.74), Thoreau (\$99,688.88). Additional funding would cover these deficits and leave a balance of \$25,000. How do these deficits occur and what controls are used to prevent this? It appears Chapters are allowed to go into deficit and the main government simply covers it.
- 4. Some Chapters have balances far exceeding the \$25,000 threshold amount: e.g. Forest Lake \$56,544, Lukachukai \$50,185, Tsaile/Wheatfields \$40,433, Counselors \$79,693, St. Michaels \$50,130, Beclabito \$56,866, Shiprock \$31,749, Red Valley \$62,518, Oljato \$69,299, and others.
- 5. The Office of Auditor General issued a Report (No. 21-29) on Chapters available balance as of 6/30/21. Some of the balances differ from Exhibit 'A'.
