RESOLUTION OF THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

25TH NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - Second Year, 2024

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE; APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUND APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND FORMS, AS APPROVED IN BFS-31-21 AND AS AMENDED IN BFMY-08-23

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic that began in early 2020, and the resulting widespread negative economic effects, on March 11, 2021 President Joseph Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") into law.
- B. Section 9901 of the ARPA established the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (together the "Fiscal Recovery Funds" or "FRF") by amending Title VI of the Social Security Act, which provided \$362 billion in federal funds for state, local, and tribal governments, including \$20 billion designated for tribal governments.
- C. In July of 2021 the Navajo Nation Council adopted Resolution No. CJY-41-21 that established the Navajo Nation's own Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF"), into which the Navajo Nation's allocation of federal ARPA funds were deposited.
- D. In CJY-41-21 the Council directed the Office of Management and Budget, in consultation with the Office of the Controller and the Department of Justice, to develop formal FRF application and review procedures as well as an expenditure plan template, that is used for preparing, submitting, and approving requests for Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds.
- E. Also in CJY-41-21 the Council delegated to the Budget and Finance Committee the authority to approve the Navajo Nation's FRF application procedures and expenditure plan

template to be used by parties seeking FRF money. The Council's delegation of FRF authority is consistent with the Budget and Finance Committee's authority to promulgate rules and regulations regarding financial matters, as set forth in 2 N.N.C. § 300(B)(1) and § 300(B)(2).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation's FRF application procedures were formally approved by the Budget and Finance Committee in Resolution No. BFS-31-21, thereby fulfilling the Council's directive in CJY-41-21. A copy of BFS-31-21 is attached hereto as EXHIBIT A.
- B. Said procedures, with respect to Chapter FRF-funded projects, were most recently amended by the Budget and Finance Committee in Resolution No. BFMY-08-23. A copy of BFMY-08-23 is attached hereto as **EXHIBIT B.** BFMY-08-23 removed the requirement for an approving Chapter resolution for Chapter FRF projects, and also changed the Chapter signatures' requirement on the FRF application forms from "Chapter President and Chapter CSC or Chapter Manager" to "Chapter Official."
- C. Pursuant to the ARPA, all of the Navajo Nation's Fiscal Recovery Funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and all of the Navajo Nation's FRF-funded projects must be completed by December 31, 2026.
- D. Given that fast-approaching deadline to obligate FRF funds and complete FRF-funded projects, there is now an urgent need to further amend the FRF procedures approved in BFS-31-21 and amended in BFMY-08-23, to remove Chapter Official signatures altogether. Such amendment is necessary to expedite the Navajo Nation's obligation and expenditures of FRF funds for Chapter projects, and without such amendment the Navajo Nation faces the prospect of returning significant ARPA/FRF funds back to the federal government.
- E. Given the above, the Budget and Finance Committee has determined that revising the FRF procedures, instructions, and forms approved in BFS-31-21, and amended in BFMY-08-23, is in the best interests of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUND APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND FORMS

Pursuant to its authority under CJY-41-21, the Budget and Finance Committee hereby approves amendments to the Navajo Nation's Fiscal Recovery Fund application procedures, instructions, forms, and appendices, as approved in BFS-31-21 and as amended in BFMY-08-23. Said amendments shall remove any/all requirements for Chapter Officials' signatures on any/all FRF documents that govern any/all Delegate Region Project Plan requests for FRF funding.

SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVE

- A. The Budget and Finance Committee hereby directs the Navajo Nation Department of Justice, in cooperation with the Navajo Nation's FRF Office, to revise the existing FRF procedures, instructions, forms, and appendices pertaining to all Delegate Region Project Plans, in accordance with the amendments approved in this Action. The Department of Justice is also directed to prepare clean, new forms/appendices for use in seeking FRF funds for all Delegate Region Project Plan projects or purposes.
- B. All applicants for FRF-funded Delegate Region Plan projects or purposes shall use the revised FRF forms/appendices prepared by the Department of Justice in accordance with the amendments approved in this Action.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(C).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

RELATING TO THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND APPLICATION PROCEDURES, FORMS, AND EXPENDITURE PLAN TEMPLATE, PURSUANT TO CJY-41-21

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to promulgate rules and regulations regarding financial matters. 2 N.N.C. § 300(B)(1) and § 300(B)(2).
- B. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council has the power to delegate its authority to the standing committees of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 102(G).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The World Health Organization ("WHO") declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern related to the Coronavirus ("COVID-19"), a highly contagious and sometimes fatal respiratory virus, on January 30, 2020; the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020; and the WHO declared a global pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020.
- B. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the concurrence of Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, declared a Public Health State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation on March 11, 2020, due to the COVID-19 outbreak. See

20-03-11, Resolution No. CEM incorporated herein bv · reference. The Navajo Nation Department of Health has subsequently issued numerous Public Health Emergency Orders. Orders 2020-001 through 2021-016 Public Health are incorporated herein by reference. These Public Health Emergency Orders are available at www.ndoh.navajo-nsn.gov.

- C. The coronavirus pandemic of 2019 has caused large scale infections and loss of life throughout the world, the United States, and within the Navajo Nation. As of August 9, 2021, the Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center has confirmed 31,650 COVID-19 cases and 1,383 COVID-related deaths on the Navajo Nation. COVID-19 variants have recently emerged that threaten to increase these numbers and continue the pandemic's assault on the Navajo People.
- D. The devastating effects of COVID-19 continue throughout the Navajo Nation, and include widescale negative financial effects, such as employment losses, business closures, food and housing insecurity, and other economic disruptions.
- E. In response to the pandemic, on March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") into law. Section 9901 of ARPA established the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (together the "Fiscal Recovery Funds" or "FRF") by amending Title VI of the Social Security Act, which provided \$362 billion for state, local, and tribal governments, including \$20 billion designated for tribal governments.
- F. As of August 16, 2021, the United States Department of Treasury allocated \$2,079,461,464.93 to the Navajo Nation under the Fiscal Recovery Funds provisions of ARPA. The Fiscal Recovery Funds are designed to build on and expand the relief provided in the 2020 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act or CARES Act.
- G. The ARPA/Fiscal Recovery Funds are intended to support governmental efforts to mitigate and contain the spread of COVID-19, as well as to respond to the health, social and economic impacts of COVID-19 suffered by residents and businesses.
- H. In accordance with Section 9901 or ARPA, Fiscal Recovery Funds shall only be used:

- To respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and non-profits; or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;
- 2. To respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers;
- 3. To provide government services to the extent of the reduction in Navajo Nation revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency; and
- 4. To make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.
- I. Pursuant to ARPA:

Fiscal Recovery Fund costs must be incurred by December
 2024, meaning the Navajo Nation must obligate FRF funds
 by that date; and
 the Fiscal Recovery Fund period of performance runs

until December 31, 2026, meaning all FRF - funded projects must be completed by that date.

- J. While its acceptance of the Fiscal Recovery Funds obligates the Navajo Nation to comply with ARPA and other federal laws and regulations, the Navajo Nation can and will fulfill these obligations while retaining and exercising its tribal sovereignty in allocating and disbursing Fiscal Recovery Funds.
- K. On July 23, 2021 the Navajo Nation Council adopted Resolution No. CJY-41-21 that established the Navajo Nation's own Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF"), into which the Navajo Nation's allocation of \$2,079,461,464.93 has been deposited. CJY-41-21 also approved a general expenditure authorization process for Fiscal Recovery Funds. On August 2, 2021 the Navajo Nation President signed Resolution No. CJY-41-21 into law.

- L. In Section Four (A) of CJY-41-21, the Navajo Nation Council directed the Office of Management and Budget, in consultation with the Office of the Controller and the Department of Justice, to develop formal FRF application and review procedures, as well as an expenditure plan template, that shall be used for preparing and submitting requests for Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds, all of which shall be adopted by the Budget and Finance Committee. This Budget and Finance Committee legislation is intended to fulfill the Navajo Nation Council's directive in CJY-41-21.
- M. To ensure the Navajo Nation's compliance with ARPA in Section Four (B) of CJY-41-21 the Navajo Nation Council directs the Navajo Nation Department of Justice to "do an initial determination of whether a NNFRF funding request satisfies the legal requirements of the Fiscal Recovery Funds provisions of ARPA and applicable Navajo Nation laws, regulations, and policies and procedures."

SECTION THREE. ADOPTION OF APPLICATION AND REVIEW PROCEDURES

The Budget and Finance Committee hereby approves and adopts THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR REQUESTING FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS UNDER THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021 ("ARPA"), as follows:

- 1. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT UNITS attached as Exhibit 1;
- 2. NON-GOVERNANCE-CERTIFIED CHAPTERS attached as Exhibit 2;
- 3. GOVERNANCE-CERTIFIED CHAPTERS attached as Exhibit 3;
- 4. NAVAJO NATION-OWNED ENTITIES attached as Exhibit 4;
- 5. EXTERNAL ENTITIES attached as Exhibit 5.

SECTION FOUR. ADOPTION OF APPLICATION FORMS AND EXPENDITURE PLAN TEMPLATE FOR FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS

- A. The Budget and Finance Committee hereby approves and adopts THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS REQUEST FORM & EXPENDITURE PLAN, which consists of five templates, as follows:

- B. The Budget and Finance Committee hereby approves and adopts NAVAJO NATION PROGRAM BUDGET SUMMARY (BUDGET FORM 1) Form, which consists of five templates, as follows:
 - 1. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT UNITS attached as APPENDIX B to Exhibit 1;
 - 2. NON-GOVERNANCE-CERTIFIED CHAPTERS attached as APPENDIX B to Exhibit 2;
 - 3. GOVERNANCE-CERTIFIED CHAPTERS attached as **APPENDIX B** to **Exhibit 3**;

- C. The Budget and Finance Committee hereby approves and adopts THE NAVAJO NATION OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET - BUDGET REVISION REQUEST Form, which consists of five templates, as follows:

SECTION FIVE. DIRECTIVES

The Office of Management and Budget and the Office of the Controller shall post the Procedures and Forms approved herein, and Resolution No. CJY-41-21, on their respective websites.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221 (C).

SECTION SEVEN. SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

RELATING TO THE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE; APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUND APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND FORMS, AS APPROVED IN BFS-31-21

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council that is authorized to review matters and make recommendations concerning the budgeting and management of all Navajo Nation funds. 2 N.N.C. § 300(A), 2 N.N.C. § 301(B)(2).
- B. In Resolution No. CJY-41-21 (signed into law on August 2, 2021) the Navajo Nation Council established the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Office to administer and manage expenditures of Fiscal Recovery Funds ("FRF") received by the Navajo Nation from the federal government under the 2021 American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA").
- C. In Section Four (C) of CJY-41-21 the Council delegated to the Budget & Finance Committee the authority to develop and approve application procedures to be used by parties seeking FRF/ARPA money. CJY-41-21 is incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. In accordance with its authority under CJY-41-21, in Resolution BFS-31-21(signed into law on September 1, 2021) the Budget & Finance Committee approved FRF application procedures and instructions, along with forms and templates, for parties to use in applying for funds from the Navajo Nation's FRF/ARPA allocation. A copy of BFS-31-21 (Resolution only) is attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A**.

- B. Specifically, BFS-31-21 approved FRF application procedures, instructions, and forms/templates for Chapters not localgovernance certified under 26 N.N.C. § 102 ("Non-Governance-Certified Chapters") and for Chapters that are localgovernance-certified ("Governance-Certified Chapters"). See items 2 and 3 under Section Four of BFS-31-21, and items 2 and 3 under Section Four of BFS-31-21.
- с. Regarding Chapter FRF applications, the Executive Director of the FRF Office has found that the procedures, instructions, and forms/templates approved in BFS-31-21 are too restrictive and cumbersome in practice. This has caused concern among some Chapters because they fear that funding delays may result in the loss of FRF funds for needed projects in their In particular, the existing requirement for communities. language Chapter resolutions, with specific mandatory included therein, and Chapter Officials' signatures on application forms, has proved unworkable. The Executive Director's explanatory memorandum is attached hereto as EXHIBIT B.
- D. In addition, after Chapter applications are approved, often modifications must be made to the funded Chapter projects, which requires new Chapter resolutions and revised FRF Expenditure Plans. This has caused significant delays in the completion of Chapter projects. **EXHIBIT B**.
- E. As explained by the Executive Director, the Navajo Nation is quickly approaching the deadline to use the FRF/ARPA funds provided to the Navajo Nation by the federal government. According to U.S. Department of Treasury Guidelines, all FRF funds must be encumbered by December 31, 2024, or the Navajo Nation may be required to return the FRF/ARPA funds back to the federal government. **EXHIBIT B.** It will be difficult for Chapters to meet this December 31, 2024 deadline under the current FRF procedures.
- F. Given the above, the Budget & Finance Committee has determined that revising the FRF procedures, instructions, and forms/templates approved in BFS-31-21 is in the best interests of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUND APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND FORMS, AS APPROVED IN BFS-31-21

- A. Pursuant to its authority under CJY-41-21, the Budget & Finance Committee hereby approves amendments to the Navajo Nation's FRF application procedures, instructions, and forms/templates, as approved in BFS-31-21. Said amendments are shown in paragraphs B and C below.
- B. Amendments pertaining to "Non-Governance-Certified Chapters." On page 4 of 8 in the EXHIBIT 2 attached to BFS-31-21, in paragraph (B)(3), make the following changes: (B)(3) provide a duly-approved Chapter Resolution-that
 - includes a statement supporting the Project and statement affirming that the Chapter will only use awarded Funds in compliance with the ARPA, the ARPA regulations, and all other applicable Navajo Nation and federal laws and regulations

On page 4 of 8 in the EXHIBIT 2 attached to BFS-31-21, in paragraph (C)(1), make the following changes:

(C) (1) Required Signatures. Before submitting its Funding Request Package to DCD, the Non-Governance-Certified Chapter shall obtain the signatures of <u>a</u> the Chapter President and the Chapter Community Services Coordinator Official on its FRF Request Form & Expenditure Plan and on its FRS Expenditure Plan Budget.

Replace the <u>APPENDIX A</u> under the EXHIBIT 2 attached to BFS-31-21, with a new FRF REQUEST FORM & EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR NON-GOVERNANCE CERTIFIED CHAPTERS that reflects the amendments shown above. See EXHIBIT C attached to this Action.

C. Amendments pertaining to "Governance-Certified Chapters." On page 4 of 9 in EXHIBIT 3 attached to BFS-31-21, in paragraph (B)(3), make the following changes: (B)(3) provide a duly approved Chapter-Resolution-that . includes a statement supporting the Project and statement affirming that the Chapter will only use awarded Funds in compliance with the ARPA, the ARPA regulations, and all other applicable Navajo Nation and federal laws and regulations.

On page 5 of 9 in the EXHIBIT 3 attached to BFS-31-21, in paragraph (C)(1), make the following changes:

(C) (1) Required Signatures. Before submitting its Funding Request Package to DCD, the Governance-Certified Chapter shall obtain the signatures of <u>a the Chapter President and the Chapter Manager</u> <u>Official</u> on its FRF Request Form & Expenditure Plan and on its FRS Expenditure Plan Budget.

On page 5 of 9 in the EXHIBIT 3 attached to BFS-31-21, in paragraphs (D)(1) and (D)(2), make the following changes:

- (D) (1) Governance-Certified Chapter submits individual request. Before submitting its Funding Request Package to DOJ, the Governance-Certified Chapter shall obtain the signatures of the <u>a</u> Chapter <u>President and the Chapter Manager</u> Official on its FRF Request Form & Expenditure Plan and on its FRF Expenditure Plan Budget.
 - (D) (2) DCD submits individual request. Where an individual Funding Request is being submitted to DOJ by DCD, the Governance-Certified Chapter shall obtain the signatures of <u>a</u> the Chapter <u>President-and the Chapter Manager Official</u> on its FRF Request Form & Expenditure Plan and on its FRF Expenditure Plan Budget before submitting its Funding Request to DCD.

Replace the <u>APPENDIX A</u> under the EXHIBIT 3 attached to BFS-31-21, with a new FRF REQUEST FORM & EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR GOVERNANCE CERTIFIED CHAPTERS that reflects the amendments shown above. See EXHIBIT D attached hereto.

SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVES

- A. The Executive Director of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Office shall prepare revised FRF application procedures, instructions, and forms/templates, consistent with the amendments approved herein. The revised/amended documents shall promptly be made available on the *navajonationarpa.org* website.
- B. All applicants for FRF funds shall use the revised/amended FRF application procedures, instructions, and forms/templates, as approved herein.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(C).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this Action is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.
