

**TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF THIRTY-TWO MILLION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FOURTEEN DOLLARS (\$32,193,514) TO THE NAVAJO NATION GAMING ENTERPRISE, NAVAJO TRIBAL UTILITY AUTHORITY, NAVAJO NATION HOSPITALITY ENTERPRISE, NAVAJO NATION SHOPPING CENTERS, INC., AND NAVAJO ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E), (F), AND (J) OF THE APPROPRIATIONS ACT**

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this resolution is to approve a supplemental appropriation for enterprises of the Navajo Nation.

**This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.**

CENTERS, INC., AND NAVAJO ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION  
AUTHORITY; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E), (F), AND (J) OF THE  
APPROPRIATIONS ACT

BE IT ENACTED:

**SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY**

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing of body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. The Navajo Nation Code provides, “[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or

1 Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an  
2 emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and  
3 must be a matter requiring final action by the Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(16).  
4

5 **SECTION TWO. TITLE 12 FINANCE ACT SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION**  
6 **REQUIREMENTS**

- 7 A. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12  
8 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), “[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt  
9 and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the  
10 fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year  
11 are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or  
12 current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve  
13 amount set forth at § 820(J).”
- 14 B. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the  
15 Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).
- 16 C. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the  
17 initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by  
18 the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 19 D. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for  
20 non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820(F). The Controller of the  
21 Navajo Nation shall be responsible for the designation of recurring and non-recurring  
22 revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 23 E. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance,  
24 from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating  
25 expenses. 12 N.N.C. § 820(E).
- 26 F. The Navajo Nation Code provides, “[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to  
27 budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted  
28 only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are  
29 subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures  
30 may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating

1 deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the  
2 Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. This provision may be amended or waived by  
3 a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council.” 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).  
4

### 5 **SECTION THREE. FINDINGS**

- 6 A. The novel coronavirus (or “COVID-19”), is a highly contagious and potentially fatal  
7 respiratory virus, that has severely impacted the Navajo Nation’s and the Navajo Nation  
8 Enterprises’ ability to generate revenue for the Navajo Nation and to maintain employment  
9 for Navajo People.
- 10 B. This Resolution is offered as an emergency due to the damaging economic impact COVID-  
11 19 has had within the Navajo Nation. The Navajo Nation Enterprises provide employment  
12 throughout the Navajo Nation, and should the enterprises be forced to close, or be unable to  
13 end layoffs, it will directly threaten the Navajo Nation’s sovereignty.
- 14 C. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency  
15 related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020; and the World Health  
16 Organization declared a global pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020.
- 17 D. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the concurrence of  
18 Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, declared a Public Health State of Emergency on  
19 the Navajo Nation on March 11, 2020 due to COVID-19 in Resolution No. CEM 20-  
20 03-11. The Navajo Nation Department of Health subsequently issued numerous Public  
21 Health Emergency Orders. Public Health Emergency Orders 2020-001 through 2021-02  
22 (“Public Health Emergency Orders”) are incorporated by reference into this resolution.
- 23 E. Navajo Nation Enterprises have worked with Navajo leaders to reduce the spread of  
24 COVID-19 by closing their operations or restricting their operations to essential  
25 employees. As a result of closures caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Navajo  
26 Nation Enterprises are struggling to meet financial business obligations and keep  
27 employees in the work force.
- 28 F. The Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise has implemented a layoff twice within  
29 approximately a 10-month period of nearly 1,000 members of the Navajo Nation  
30

1 currently on layoff status until further notice, or until immediate relief funding can be  
2 received by the NNGE.

3 G. If the Enterprises do not receive COVID-19 relief funding, the Nation will risk the health,  
4 safety, and well-being of many Navajo People vulnerable to job loss and loss of health  
5 insurance, including the many dependent children, elders and other relatives who are also  
6 covered by the Enterprises' health benefits.

7 H. The Navajo Nation Enterprises listed below have submitted requests for supplemental  
8 funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance, along with budget forms,  
9 supplemental funding proposal summaries, and grant applications, for a total of  
10 \$32,193,514:

11 1. Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise has requested funding of \$15,000,000 as  
12 indicated in **Exhibit A**;

13 2. Navajo Tribal Utility Authority has requested funding of \$7,830,191 as  
14 indicated in **Exhibit B**;

15 3. Navajo Nation Shopping Centers, Inc. has requested funding of \$903,541 as  
16 indicated in **Exhibit C**;

17 4. Navajo Engineering and Construction Authority has requested funding of  
18 \$6,996,576 as indicated in **Exhibit D**; and

19 5. Navajo Nation Hospitality Enterprise has requested funding of \$1,463,206,  
20 as indicated in **Exhibit E**.

21 I. Support for the Navajo Nation Enterprises is a priority in order for the Navajo Nation to  
22 remain competitive within their respective industries and to help recover from the  
23 devastating impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

24 J. The Controller has updated the balance of the UUFB and indicated that as of January 21,  
25 2021, \$63,795,352 is available for supplemental appropriations in Fiscal Year 2021.

26 K. In its approval of the Navajo Nation Budget Instruction Manual ("BIM") for Fiscal Year  
27 2021, the Budget and Finance Committee recognized the difficulties involved in obtaining  
28 signatures on budget forms related to requests for appropriation. The Fiscal Year 2021  
29 BIM, therefore, reflects that divisions and departments are encouraged, rather than  
30

required, to have written concurrence from the appropriate Branch Chief or Division Director. Navajo Nation BIM, Fiscal Year 2021, Section XII.B.1.a.i.

L. The Office of the Controller has been requested to provide a memorandum to satisfy the requirements in 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L). Due to the emergency nature of this legislation, the memorandum was not ready at the time of drafting this resolution, but will be included as an exhibit when it is available.

M. The Office of Management and Budget has been requested to provide a memorandum to satisfy the requirements in 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M). Due to the emergency nature of this legislation, the memorandum was not ready at the time of drafting this resolution, but will be included as an exhibit when it is available.

**SECTION FOUR. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E), (F), AND (J), TO THE EXTENT THESE PROVISIONS PREVENT THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE TO BE USED TO FUND RECURRING EXPENDITURES**

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(E), (F) and (J) to allow UUFB funds to be used for recurring expenditures.

**SECTION FIVE. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF THIRTY-TWO MILLION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FOURTEEN DOLLARS (\$32,193,514) TO THE NAVAJO NATION ENTERPRISES**

A. This supplemental appropriation of \$32,193,514 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller, and as shown in **Exhibit A-E**.

B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$32,193,514 for funds as indicated in the documents in **Exhibit A-E**.

1 **SECTION SIX. DIRECTIVE TO THE OFFICE OF THE CONTROLLER AND THE**  
2 **OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET**

3 In order to carry out the intent of the Navajo Nation Council in the approval of this  
4 legislation, expeditious implementation of this Resolution is of utmost importance. The  
5 Office of Management and Budget and the Office of the Controller are directed to take all  
6 steps necessary to give effect to this Resolution immediately after it becomes effective in  
7 Section Seven, below.

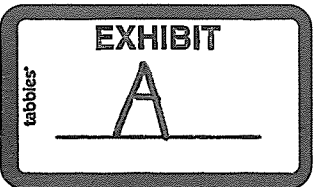
8  
9 **SECTION SEVEN. EFFECTIVE DATE**

10 The provisions of this Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

11  
12 **SECTION EIGHT. SAVING CLAUSE**

13 Should any provision(s) of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme  
14 Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation  
15 Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

## PART II. REASON FOR REQUEST AND STATEMENT OF NEED:

The Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise (NNGE) is requesting funds to cover expenditures incurred during the closure of its casinos due to the COVID-19 public health mandate. NNGE is a cash-based business, and because of the closure is not able to generate revenues to cover fixed costs (including labor & benefits) and debt service.

## PART III. LIST ALTERNATIVE FUNDING SOURCES BEING PURSUED AND CONTINGENCY PLAN IF REQUEST IS NOT FUNDED:

- 1) PPP Loans from SBA: \$4,000,000 (maximum award for any corporate group is \$4M)
- 2) Sihasin Fund: \$15,000,000 (Requires a change to the fund management plan in order to receive funding for use on operating expenses during closure.)
- 3) Master Trust Fund Loan: \$15,000,000 (Requires the refinancing of NNGE's existing senior loan with the Navajo Nation and concurrence of subordinate debt lenders.)

If UUFB request is not funded, NNGE will begin the process of permanent layoffs of 1,000 employees which includes an immediate loss of healthcare benefits for the employee and their dependents. (Employees are currently on temporary layoff wherein healthcare coverage remains intact). With the permanent layoff, all employees will be stripped of their gaming license certification. Upon reopening, the employee will need to go through the gaming licensing process.

NNGE will only have funds to pay for limited security staff to guard the casino properties and perform limited maintenance on the facilities.

NNGE will sit idle until the green light is given to reopen and rehire staff. Rehiring after a permanent layoff is projected to take 6-12 weeks at a cost of \$1.5M or \$1,500 per employee for licensing.

Prior to reopening, the Navajo Nation will still be required to infuse a minimum of \$25M into NNGE to replenish its cages and working capital. (If closure extends beyond April 2nd.)

The process of obtaining funding through Sihasin fund and/or loan from Master Trust Fund is a lengthy process. NNGE does not have the time or cash to pay staff, legal counsel, or consultants during the closing process that could last 2-6 months.

<p>Describe the entity or organization requesting the grant.</p> <p>The Navajo Nation Gaming Enterprise was created by NNC CS-34-06 as the tribal gaming enterprise to conduct gaming operations within the Navajo Nation under the auspice of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act of 1988 (P.L. 100-47), the NN Gaming Ordinance (5 N.N.C. Sec. 2001 et seq), the gaming compacts with Arizona and New Mexico, and to generate gaming revenues.</p>		
<b>PROBLEMS/NEEDS STATEMENT</b>		
<p>Describe the problems and needs identified to be addressed through this funding request. Include relevant data such as the number and location of the Navajo population to be served.</p> <p>NNGE was forced to close its 4 casinos on March 17, 2020 due to Navajo Nation public health orders related to COVID-19. As of January 17, 2021, a full 10-months later, NNGE's casinos still remain closed.</p> <p>NNGE has fully exhausted its capital set asides, PPP Funds, and CARES Allocation to maintain operations and employees during closure. During the closure period, the Enterprise has NOT generated any revenue which translates into lost cash flow of approximately \$47.8M. During normal operations of the Enterprise, this cash flow is used to pay debt service to the Navajo Nation, fund development projects that create new jobs and reinvest in vital infrastructure to support present and future operations of the Enterprise.</p> <p>NNGE has temporarily laid off nearly 1,000 employees until funding is made available to replenish its cage and working capital requirements, and the Navajo Nation authorizes the reopening.</p>



NTUA is an essential business for the Navajo people. NTUA provides utility services in regards to electricity, water, wastewater, gas, photovoltaic, telecommunications, and solar generation.

The Coronavirus (COVID-19) has battered the Navajo Nation especially hard, and the Navajo Nation government responded with shelter-in place orders, mandatory curfews, weekend lockdowns and work-from-home orders for all non-essential employee

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (2020) (the "CARES Act"), the Navajo Nation received \$714,189,631.47 Navajo CARES Fund as the Nation's share of the U.S. Treasury's initial distributions of the CARES Act, of which NTUA received \$147,116,561 under Legislation No. CJY-67-20



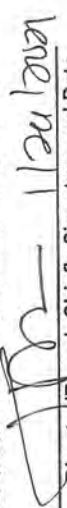
