Dear Speaker Damon,

We appreciate the Navajo Nation Council's approval of CD-93-20 with its foresight to cover the annual cost related to the 500MW use on the NGS transmission line system. With the Navajo Nation moving past the initial stages of the coronavirus pandemic, and to what we hope will be a post-pandemic government operation, divisions like the Division of Natural Resources will refocus on getting their offices to normal operations.

The Division of Natural Resources will heed the Council's advice and directive; however, in response to the vilipend remarks regarding the Division's attention to this matter, let us not forget what the past 10 months has cost the Nation. Responding to the pandemic by protecting Navajo People and racing to spend down federal funds directed at the health and safety of our Nation have been our highest priority. During this time some matters had to become a second priority while still moving forward; in this instance the negotiation for marketing the Nation's 500MW use continues to move forward but at a slower pace due to a various negotiation matters that take time and protect the Nation's interest. We agree on finding new avenues for generating revenue and this 500MW opportunity is one such opportunity. The Division of Natural Resources will meet the timelines set and the Nation will have a new revenue source to support our energy development.

We sign CD-93-20 into law and we look forward to working together with the Council Committees to complete this important project.

## RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24<sup>th</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2020

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-FIVE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED NINETY-SIX DOLLARS AND EIGHTY-THREE CENTS (\$1,985,296.83) FOR THE 2021 TRANSMISSION CHARGE FOR THE NAVAJO NATION'S USE OF FIVE HUNDRED (500) MEGAWATTS OF ELECTRICITY PURSUANT TO THE NAVAJO GENERATING STATION EXTENSION LEASE AND UNDERLYING TRANSMISSION AGREEMENT WITH THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E), (F), AND (J)

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102.
- B. The Navajo Nation Code provides, [m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council." 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(16). A direct attribute of sovereignty and governing is responding quickly to requests from other sovereigns.
- C. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at 12 N.N.C. § 820 (J)."
- D. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

- 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M).
- 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
- 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designation recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
- 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E).
- 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 820 (F).

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. This request for a supplemental appropriation is an emergency for the Navajo Nation since the payment to the Bureau of Reclamation is due no later than December 30, 2020. The consequence of not providing the payment on time will result in a notice of delinquency from the United States Bureau of Reclamation ("BOR"). If the Navajo Nation receives a delinquency notice from the United States, that may result in referral of the debt to the Department of Treasury for collection action, Department of Treasury offsets resulting in a reduction in federal payments made to the Navajo Nation, and litigation.

- B. As part of the Nation's compensation under the Navajo Generating Station ("NGS") Extension Lease, the Nation received the right to use (or market) 500 Megawatts ("500 MW") of electricity belonging to the BOR on the NGS transmission systems for thirty-five (35) years beginning on December 23, 2019. Extension Lease § 8 (A)(i).
- C. The NGS owners agreed to cover the Nation's operation and maintenance costs related to the 500 MW for ten (10) years beginning on December 23, 2019, but the Nation will be responsible for all other costs associated with the 500MW (herein referred to as "Transmission Costs" or "Capital Costs"). Extension Lease § 8 (A)(ii).
- D. On December 13, 2017, the Nation entered into a separate agreement with BOR and the Western Area Power Administration further detailing the Nation's rights and obligations related to the 500 MW (the "Transmission Agreement").
- E. Pursuant to the Transmission Agreement, the Nation will be billed by BOR for annual Capital Costs with payment due within thirty (30) calendar days after issuance of BOR's invoice or by December 31<sup>st</sup>, whichever is later. Transmission Agreement, Operating Procedure 3, Section 6.1.
- F. The Navajo Nation approved Council Resolution CD-53-19 on December 28, 2020 to fund the 2020 payment of the Transmission Charges in the amount of \$1,900,694.10.
- G. On December 01, 2020, the Nation received an invoice from BOR for the 2021 Transmission Charges (aka Capital Costs), in the amount of One Million Nine Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars and Eighty-Three Cents (\$1,985,296.83); payment of the bill is due December 31, 2020. This invoice is attached as Exhibit A, however the Department of Justice has determined that last page of the invoice to be confidential information. The Department of Justice memorandum is included in Exhibit A.
- H. Navajo Nation budget forms, and Appendix K, the Navajo Nation Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary, are attached as **Exhibit** B.
- I. The Office of the Management and Budget has reviewed the budget forms and provided a budget impact analysis, as required by 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M), which is attached as Exhibit C.

J. The Office of the Controller provided a memorandum as required by 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), attached as **Exhibit D**, indicating the balance in the UUFB as of December 11, 2020 is \$16,746,624, and that the 500 MW cost is recurring. As a result of the Controller's determination that the cost is recurring, waiver language is included in this resolution.

SECTION THREE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E), (F), AND (J) TO THE EXTENT THESE PROVISIONS PREVENT THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE TO BE USED TO FUND RECURRING EXPENDITURES OR GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E), (F) and (J) in order to allow UUFB funds to be used for recurring expenditures and government operations.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING THE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ADVANCE FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-FIVE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED NINETY-SIX DOLLARS AND EIGHTY-THREE CENTS (\$1,985,296.83) TO PAY THE 2021 CHARGES FOR THE 500 MW

- A. This supplemental appropriation advance of \$1,985,296.83 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to the Division of Natural Resource, Business Unit Number, New.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation advance from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Division of Natural Resources, Business Unit Number, NEW, for \$1,985,296.83 to pay the 2021 Transmission Charges for the 500 MW, as set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION FIVE. APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE 500 MW REVENUE & REPAYMENT PLAN AND FUND AND DESIGNATING REVENUES GENERATED BY THE 500 MW TRANSMISSION LINE INTO THE REVENUE & REPAYMENT FUND

The Navajo Nation hereby approves and adopts the 500 MW Revenue & Repayment Plan as follows:

A. The Office of the Controller and Office of Management & Budget shall work with the Division of Natural Resources to establish a fund, hereby called the 500 MW Revenue & Repayment Fund ("500 MW Fund"), to receive and hold any and all revenue received by the Nation for the use and marketing of the 500 MW and to fund expenditures as delineated below.

- B. Any and all revenue received from the use and marketing of the 500 MW shall not be deposited in the General Fund and shall instead be designated to fund the 500 MW Fund and deposited therein.
- C. The Office of the Controller shall determine an investment program for the 500 MW Fund wherein interest earnings are reinvested in the Fund.
- D. The Division of Natural Resources shall work with the Office of the Controller and Office of Management & Budget to establish a Fund Management Plan governing the 500 MW Fund, for approval by the Budget and Finance Committee upon the recommendation of the Resources & Development Committee, that establishes, among other things, use of the 500 MW Fund in the following order and priority:
  - 1. Repayment to the Unreserved Undesignated Fund Balance for the supplemental appropriation advances in the amount of \$3,885,990.93, \$1,900,694.10 approved in Council Resolution CD-53-19 for the 2020 annual transmission, and \$1,985,296.83 for the 2021 annual transmission;
  - 2. Payment of the following year Transmission Charges; and
  - 3. Funding of energy-related projects.
- E. If the Division of Natural Resources has not presented a Fund Management Plan governing the 500 MW Fund to the Resources & Development Committee by March 1, 2021, the Department of Justice, with the assistance of the Office of Controller, shall develop the Fund Management Plan governing the 500 MW Fund and present such to the Resources & Development Committee for approval by the Budget and Finance.
- F. After the supplemental appropriation advance of \$1,985,296.83 to the Unreserved Undesignated Fund Balance has been repaid, expenditures of the 500 MW Fund shall be limited to payment of annual Transmission Charges and energy-related projects recommended by the Division of Natural Resources and Office of the President & Vice-President and approved by the Resources & Development Committee.

#### SECTION SIX. DIRECTIVES

A. The Division of Natural Resources shall provide a report to the Resources and Development Committee on its progress in drafting the 500 MW Fund, Fund Management Plan by January 31, 2021. In its report, the Division of Natural Resources shall communicate to the Resources and Development Committee any challenges or material issues that prevent the preparation of the 500 MW Fund, Fund Management Plan.

B. Unless otherwise directed by the Resources and Development Committee, the Division of Natural Resources shall submit the 500 MW Fund, Fund Management Plan for approval by the Resources and Development and Budget and Finance Committees by February 28, 2021.

#### SECTION SEVEN. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C.  $\S$  221 (B).

  - . You may be entitled to an oral hearing if required by statute or if the agency determines that a determination of the validity of your debt cannot be resolved by a review of the documentary evidence.
  - . You may enter into a written agreement with the DOI BOR Region: Lower Colorado Basin (or with the Department of Treasury if the debt is referred to Treasury for collection) to pay the debt.
- 2. Credit Bureau Reporting. In case of non-payment, your debt may be reported to national credit bureaus. Agreement - Confidential Exhibit

In accordance with the terms of the NGS Extension Lease and a Transmission Agreement entered into with BOR, the Navajo Nation owes annual capital costs for the use of 500MW along the NGS transmission systems. It is DOJ's understanding that next year's annual capital costs are approximately \$1.9 million and that legislation is being developed regarding the same. It is also our understanding that BOR's invoice provided to the Navajo Nation will be attached to the legislation.

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(6), DOJ has the authority to deem any exhibit to a piece of legislation as confidential. In accordance with that authority, I deem the last page of the BOR invoice entitled "2021 Navajo Transmission Charge" as confidential and request that the exhibit be treated as such. Release of the information contained on this page of the invoice may negatively impact the Nation's ability to negotiate potential agreements or transactions related to the 500MW.

Balance (UUFB) for \$1,985,297.00 for the 2021 Transmission Charge For Use of 500 MW of

Electricity Per NGS Extension Lease.

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) reviewed the proposed budget documents in accordance with 12 NNC Section 820 (B) and (M) for budget impact analysis and provides the following:

- 1. Per FY 2021 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XII, A., all requests for supplemental funding requests shall be submitted through the Navajo Nation official administrative review process prior to consideration by the appropriate legislative bodies. This document was not reviewed through the Executive Branch review process for proper review by the appropriate offices.
- 2. The Executive Branch, Division of Natural Resources, is responsible for this project. As such, DNR has also initiated the same request. However, the DNR request is for \$2,145,297 allowing for contingencies. DNR needs to be consulted to arrive at an agreed upon amount.
- 3. In FY 2020, per CD-53-19 the Navajo Nation Council appropriated \$1.9 million for Year 1 of the transmission costs. CD-53-19 also adopted the 500 MW Revenue and Repayment Plan ("500 MW Fund"). Further, a fund management plan is to be established to govern the use of the 500 MW Fund with priorities of; 1) repaying the UUFB, 2) provide for subsequent years transmission costs, and 3) fund energy-related projects. The Division of Natural Resources should provide the status of this task.
- 4. With this Year 2 request, will the transmission costs continue to be funded by the UUFB on an annual basis for the next several years since this is a long term obligation?
- 5. Review of the budget forms.
  - a. Correct Business Unit No. is 115041, which was assigned by Office of the Controller in FY 2020. The same business unit no. needs to be used on the budget forms for this year 2 funding request.
  - b. The Authorized signatories on Budget Form 1 and 2 is the Division of Natural Resources, Executive Branch. See FY2021 BIM, Section XII.B.1.a.
  - c. Budget Form 1, Part III, Column (A) should be the FY 2020 appropriation for \$1,900,694.


6. The Appropriations Act requires that non-recurring funds be used for non-recurring purposes (12 NNC Section 820 (E), (F), (J), and (L). The Controller needs to make this determination.

7. The latest OOC memorandum dated October 19, 2020 indicates \$37,189,207 is available in the UUFB as of 9/30/2020. Since then CO-81-20 appropriated \$442,583 to the Election Office. Second, budget resolution CN-88-20 set aside \$20 million of the FY 2020 UUFB for use in FY 2022 budget. As a result, the current UUFB is approximately \$16,746,624 and there is another request for \$17,420,482 for the Health Operations Command Center. There is not sufficient funds. The Controller's Office can provide the official information.

The Office of the Controller has reviewed the above referenced document.

- The balance of the UUFB is \$16,746,624 as of December 11, 2020. There was a
  provision in the FY 21 budget resolution CN-88-20 which approved \$20,000,000 to be
  set aside for the FY 2022 budget process. Unmet needs amounts for all programs
  FY2021 Comprehensive Budgets have yet to be compiled.
- 2. This request is for \$1,985,297 for Capital Cost and Transmission Charges to Bureau of Reclamation under the attendant Transmission Agreement. This bill is due by December 31, 2020. There are no appropriations to pay this cost in the FY 21 budget.
- 3. The Business unit indicated on the budget forms is NEW Administration Office under Natural Resources. In FY 2020 there was a Navajo Nation Council resolution CD-53-19 UUFB approved for these transmission cost. The amount was \$1,900,694.14 and the business unit set up was 115041- DNR-NGS Transmission Costs.
- This request would be considered <u>RECURRING</u> for operational expenses, unmet needs.
   This will need to be funded in future years.
