With this memorandum, I am respectfully requesting that you withdraw Legislation No. 0083-16, an action relating to the confirmation of Mr. Marvin Murphy to serve on the Navajo Housing Authority Board of Commissioners. Mr. Murphy was interviewed on June 2, 2016 and was not selected by the interview panel. Ms. Kenneth Peterson was selected and recently confirmed by both Resources and Development Committee and Naabi'Iyati Committee.

In fact, Naabi'Iyati Committee confirmed Mr. Peterson with Resolution No. 0202-16 to serve on the NHA Board as the New Mexico Tenant/Homeowners representative; thereby the vacant position is filled and no longer available.

Legislation # 0085-16 is currently still pending with Resources and Development Committee and needs to be withdrawn. Thank you for your understanding.

25	A. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C.	. § 602 (A), The Navajo Nation established a public body of

- B. The affairs of the Authority shall be managed by a Board of Commissioners composed of eight persons. See 6 N.N.C. § 605.
- C. A Commissioner shall be a member of the Navajo Nation. See 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).
- D. Three of the Commissioners shall represent the tenants and homebuyers participating in programs administered by the Authority, one shall reside in the State of New Mexico, one shall reside in the State of Arizona, and one shall reside in the State of Utah. See 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).
- E. These individuals shall have some formal education or at least three years of leadership experience in a local unit of government. See 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).
- F. The term of office shall be four years and staggered. When a Board is first established, one member's term shall be designated to expire in one year, another to expire in two years, a third to expire in three years, and the last two in four years. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for four years. See 6 N.N.C. § 607.
- G. Mr. Marvin P. Murphy has expressed his interest in being reappointed as a member of the Navajo Housing Authority Board of Commissioners to continue representing the New Mexico tenants and homebuyers program. *See* Exhibit A (Letter of Interest); *See also* 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).
- H. Mr. Marvin P. Murphy is an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation. *See* Exhibit B (Certificate Indian Blood); *See also* 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).
- I. The Navajo Nation confirmed Mr. Marvin P. Murphy to represent the tenants and homebuyers program as a resident of the State of New Mexico, for a term of four years. *See* Exhibit C (Legislation 0337-14) and Exhibit D (Letter from LoRenzo Bates); *See also* 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).

- J. Mr. Marvin P. Murphy satisfies the education and three years of leadership experience working with various government offices on the Navajo Nation. *See* Exhibit E (Resume); *See also* 6 N.N.C. § 606 (B).
- K. The reappointment of Mr. Marvin P. Murphy shall be for four years. See also 6 N.N.C. § 607.

#### SECTION THREE. CONFIRMING RE-APPOINTMENT

Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. 606 (B), the Navajo Nation hereby confirms the reappointment of Mr. Marvin P. Murphy to serve on the Navajo Housing Authority Board of Commissioners as a representative for the New Mexico tenants and homebuyers for a term of four years.

#### **LETTER OF INTEREST:**

FOR THE RE-APPOINTMENT OF MARVIN P. MURPHY CURRENT NAVAJO HOUSING AUTHORITY (NHA) BOARD OF COMMISSIONER (BOC) FOR A FULL-TERM OF FOUR YEARS REPRESENTING THE NEW MEXICO TENANT AND HOMEBUYERS (NMT&H)

Yá'át'ééh Honorable Council Delegates, NNC. At this time, I am graciously requesting through your power and authority in re-appointing me as the New Mexico Tenant and Homebuyers representative as their Board Of Commissioner for Navajo Housing Authority, pursuant to 6 N.N.C. §606 (A) & §607. Also, I personally want to thank you in allowing me the privilege in serving as a BOC for the past 14 months. While being a BOC, I oversaw the day-to-day operations NHA has to officiate. The challenges created and solutions produced by NHA have been beneficial to the people. The passion I have in listening to all 368 employees and how their role plays in the Indian Housing Plan (IHP) is vital to NHA. Learning the Essentials of NAHASDA and using that experience benefit NHA to a higher level. Learning quickly and gaining information about HUD and our LOCCS balance has made NHA a huge powerhouse.

From day one, we encountered a 26 item list of Major Concerns directed to the NHA appointees during the Naabi'kiyati' meeting held in December 2014. Within accordance the BOC addressed over 70% of items by the first quarter through policy updating or BOC Directives. Today, over 90% of these issues are resolved and 10% are in the plans. As well as having a working BOC we have been developing new policy or updating outdated policies to fit the current needs of the Navajo people.

In my 59-Chapters in NM, it is a goal this year to visit the communities and gain trust with Chapter Resolutions for land withdraws so sufficient homes can be built to their satisfaction. Next, to continue and fulfill my duties as BOC by attending all required meeting and trainings by means of the least expensive fare.

Learning there is a \$9 Billion housing need and I plan for the next 30-60yrs to see these funds be spent on; building homes for our new-families, students, working-class, veterans, elderly and to the less fortunate, the next things are Self-Sustaining Communities. Within this past year I asked a lot of questions and I will enhance those answers by advancing homes in accordance to NHA's Mission, Values and Goals.

Section One. Findings

- A. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(A), as revised by the Navajo Nation Housing Authority Reform Act of 2014, the Naabik'iyati' Committee has authority to appoint, and to reappoint, members of the Board of Commissioners. A resolution of the Naabik'iyati' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council as to the appointment or reappointment of any Commissioner shall be conclusive evidence of the due and proper appointment of the Commissioner. See also CAP-26-14.
- B. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 602, there is established an Authority of the Navajo Nation known as the Navajo Housing Authority (NHA) whose purposes pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 604(A)-(D) are remedying unsafe and unsanitary housing conditions that are injurious to the public health, safety and morals; alleviating the acute shortage of decent, safe and sanitary dwellings for persons of low income; providing employment opportunities through the construction, improvement, extension, alteration or repair and operation of low income dwellings; and promoting economic growth and development activities within and near the Navajo Nation.

- C. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 605 the affairs of the Authority shall be managed by a Board of Commissioners composed of eight persons.
- D. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(B), a Commissioner shall be a member of the Navajo Nation, and no more than two Commissioners shall be members of the Navajo Nation Council. Three of the Commissioners shall represent the tenants and homebuyers participating in programs administered by the Authority, one shall reside in the State of New Mexico, one shall reside in the state of Arizona, and one shall reside in the State of Utah. There shall be one representative on the Board from each of the five agencies comprising the Navajo Nation. These individuals shall have some formal education, or at least three years of leadership experience in a local unit of government.
- E. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(B), Mr. Marvin Murphy is the representative for the New Mexico Tenants and Homebuyers. See attached Letter of Interest and Resume marked as Exhibit A; Bachelor's Degree Diploma attached as Exhibit B; and Certificate of Indian Blood marked as Exhibit C.
- F. Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 607, term of office shall be for four years and staggered.

  When the Board is first established, one member's term shall be designated to expire in one year, another in two years, a third to expire in three years, and the last two in four years. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for four years.
- G. Due to the fact that the issue of appointments to the Board have been in litigation for the past several years, and some terms for old Board members expired over thirteen years ago, the Board members shall be appointed at staggered terms in the spirit of compliance with 6 N.N.C. § 607.
- H. Therefore, the Board members' terms have been chosen at random at one-year, two-year, three-year and four-year intervals.
- I. Therefore, in the spirit of compliance with 6 N.N.C. § 607, Mr. Marvin Murphy shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year.

#### Section Two. Approval of Appointment

Pursuant to 6 N.N.C. § 606(B), the Navajo Nation hereby confirms the appointment of Mr. Marvin Murphy to serve on the Navajo Housing Authority Board of Commissioners as a representative for the New Mexico Tenants and Homebuyers for a term of one (1) year.
