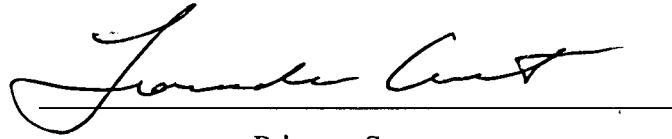

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the delegated responsibility to hear proposed resolution(s) that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, incorporated herein by reference, mandates that Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

2 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

3 A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO
4 THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL;
5 ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY
6 FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND
7 EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC
8 SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL
9 ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS;
10 HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS;
11 BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND
12 ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING PROJECTS AND
13 MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION
14 PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED
15 ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo
16 Nation on July 15, 2022.

17 B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that

- 18 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter
19 and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal
20 Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two
21 hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148)
22 to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the
23 amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty
24 dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate
25 Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and
26 signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation . . . See CJN-29-22,
27 Section Three (B).
- 28 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo
29 Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community
30 Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department,

1 to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. *See* CJN-29-
2 22, Section Three (D).

3 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of
4 Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or
5 Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region
6 Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation
7 Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through
8 sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but
9 shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate
10 Region Project Plans. *See* CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).

11 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund
12 eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF
13 Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region
14 Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not
15 exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two
16 thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). *See* CJN-29-22, Section
17 Three (F).

18 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight
19 entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ
20 initial eligibility determination. *See* CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and
21 (L)(6).

22 C. All projects listed in the Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan,
23 attached as **Exhibit A**, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ.
24 In addition, Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan does *not* exceed
25 the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).

26 D. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo
27 Nation and the Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Chapters and communities
28 to approve and adopt the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region
29 Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide
30 Ruins, Houck, Lupton, Nahata Dziil) as set forth in **Exhibit A**.

2 **SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF HON. LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE**
3 **REGION PROJECT PLAN**

- 4 A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project
5 Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins,
6 Houck, Lupton, Nahata Dziil) set forth in **Exhibit A**.
7 B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable
8 provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
9 C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the
10 individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed
11 by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).
12

13 **SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS**

14 Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein
15 shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the
16 President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005
17 (C) (10), (11), and (12).
18

19 **SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE**

20 This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C.
21 § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).
22

23 **SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE**

24 If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court,
25 or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court,
26 those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo
27 Nation.

This project promotes a strong healthy community. The 25 acre dumpsite is currently, and during the COVID-19 lock down, being used as an illegal trash dumpsite. The Navajo EPA has identified the site as a contamination zone for the Klagetoh underground aquifer and affects the communities underground aquifer. The site is located 2.7 miles west of Greasewood Rd (NR28-2) and US-191, Klagetoh, Arizona. Funding will cover cost of cleanup, disposal, equipment, and labor.

This project will transform an area of the town to a clean and safe environment for the people to enjoy. The road currently affects the overall community of 500 home sites. This project ensures a clean underground aquifer that is safe for consumption by the people of Klagetoh and the passing through public.

ILLEGAL DUMPSITE REMEDIATION ON GREASEWOOD RD - SCOPE OF WORK

SCOPE OF WORK - OVERVIEW

Remove debris from 25 acres of open space land in 12 months or less. Site is located in Klagetoh, 0-500ft off main county road (gravel) and has variety of household waste from furniture to vehicle parts. This project is a Navajo Nation Chapter and Navajo Nation Office of Business Management project. Cleanup company must provide all means, methods, labor, materials, and equipment to perform all cleanup and waste removal work. (The word "Provide" means to furnish all labor, materials, equipment, accessories and incidental items required complete the item correctly).

PAYMENT OVERVIEW

Payments to company is on a 4 Phase schedule (see timeline overview). Company is expected self manage cost of labor, waste removal, and subcontractor services.

SCOPE OF WORK - ITEMS

1. Provide all construction work, materials, and labor to complete the project. May work in cooperation with the community.

The existing structure has passive heating, outdated plumbing and electrical systems and does not adequately meet the building codes and requirements for a public facility. Currently the plumbing for the facility is not working due to tree roots in the sewer line leading away from the building. As a result, the building does not have restrooms available inside, but provides porta-johns on the exterior of the building. There are no adequate hand washing sinks available in the Community Building as well. The Community Building uses passive heating to heat up the main room and uses outdated wall mounted heaters which are inadequate for the rooms and offices they serve.

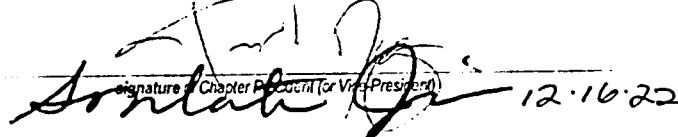

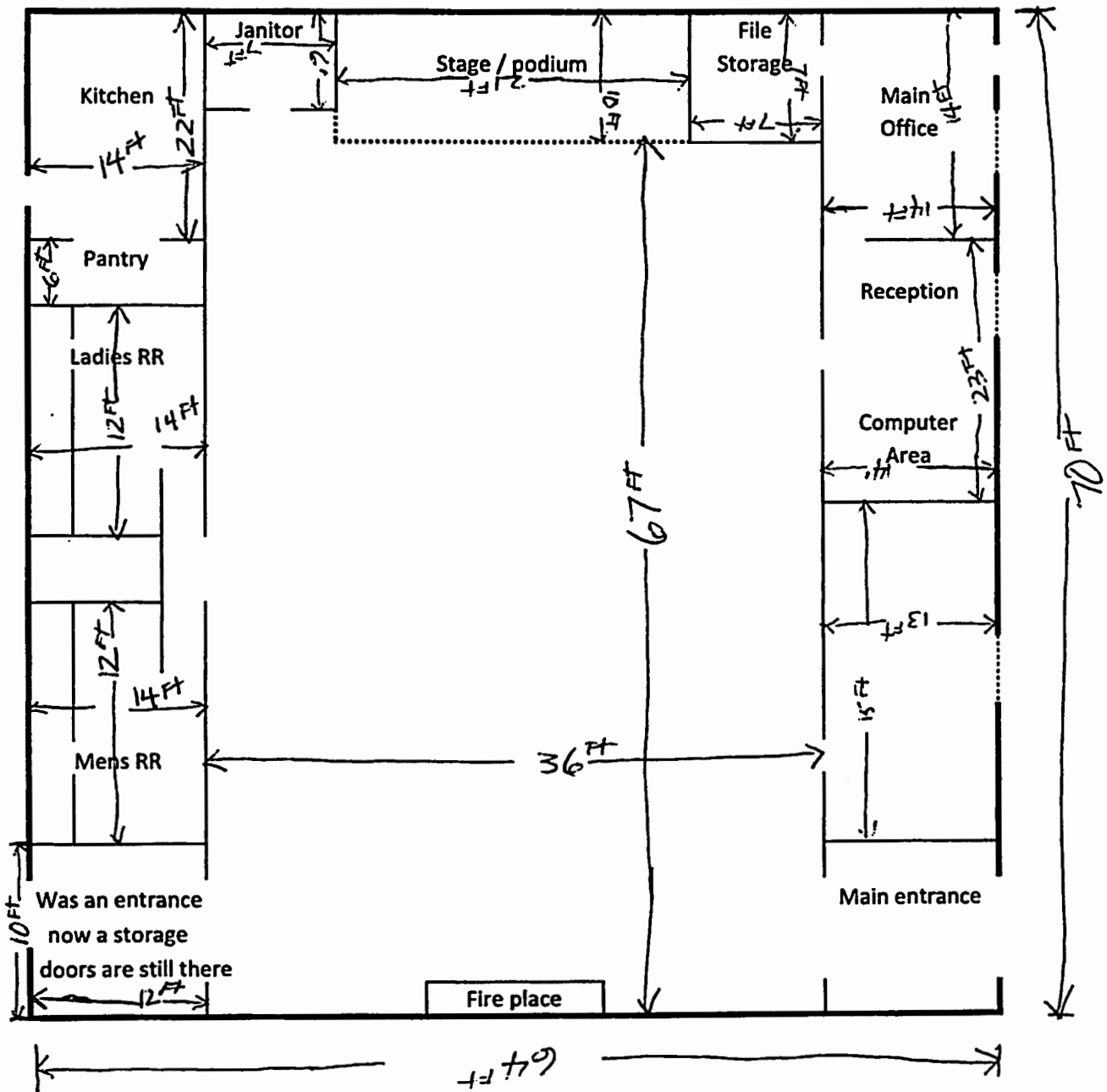

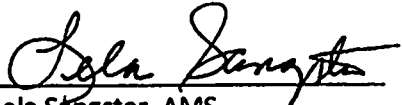

(a) Describe the Program(s) and/or Project(s) to be funded, including how the funds will be used, for what purposes, the location(s) to be served, and what COVID-related needs will be addressed:

To meet the CDC guidelines, the Community Building needs to have, and HVAC system installed to properly circulate the air inside the building and allow for fresh air to be introduced to the building periodically. The existing structure does not have "barriers" to prevent direct contact with individuals in the main office. As a result, the community members are asked to remain on the exterior of the building and the Chapter Staff provide services through what was a standard window. For the safety of the chapter staff and community members using the community building, it is important to renovate the main office section to have a pass-through window and other features recommended for public buildings by the CDC and other organizations. Its also important to renovate other areas such as the restrooms, kitchen, podium, entrance/exits, and the main meeting room so it meets CDC guidelines for public meeting spaces.

(b) Explain how the Program or Project will benefit the Navajo Nation, Navajo communities, or the Navajo People:

During times of inclement weather, the Community Building serves as the Emergency Operations Center when weather related emergencies are declared. When the Community Building is being used during declared emergencies, it is also used to provide shelter for community members whose homes become inaccessible. The Community Building also serves as the meeting facility for those families who may have lost loved ones. The aforementioned are some of the necessary activities and services provided to the community of Klage-toh. The renovation of this building will essentially serve the entire community and beyond for many more years.

SUPPORTING AND APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND, AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT TO DESIGN, PLAN AND CONSTRUCT THE RENOVATION OF KLAGETOH CHAPTER COMMUNITY BUILDING (CHAPTER HOUSE) FOR THE PROJECTED AMOUNT OF EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR DOLLARS AND TWENTY-NINE CENTS (\$827,774.29).

WHEREAS:

1. The Klagetoh Chapter, pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution CAP-76-00, is a certified Navajo Nation Chapter Government, is a delegated government, and authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Nation Laws, including custom, tradition and final matters; and

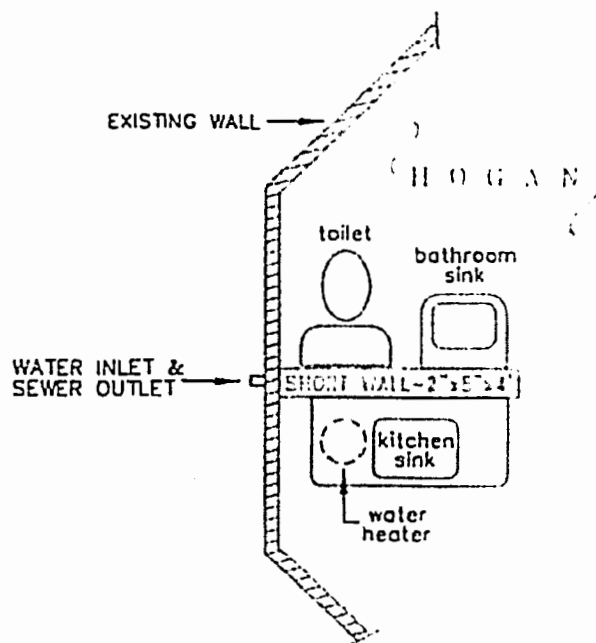

Comment: The ARPA Housing Assistance Application were utilized for the three (3) applicants (see attachments) which provided all relevant information to justify the acute living condition and environment and the need to obtain safe and sanitary home and provide suitable living environment for themselves and their families.

Question 1: One of the criteria used was these existing homes are dilapidated, substandard & overcrowded conditions; and deficient in kitchen and plumbing facilities. Secondly the applicants are low-income and have no immediate resource (mortgage loans) to obtain standard housing. Lastly, these families are living under one/roof causing multi-generational & overcrowded condition which leads to a risk of COVID-19 and under-housed.

Question 2: The Total Development Cost for Affordable Housing under the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 (NAHASDA) was utilized to develop or acquire affordable housing under the SW Regional ONAP Office for Navajo Nation with a TDC cost of \$443,234 for a 3-Bedroom unit.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is the primary provider of new housing on Indian Reservation (Navajo).

Question 3: The HUD cost of homes were established by family size and determined the bedroom size. The applicants lack of resources to mortgage a home are not affordable.

Question 4: The secondary provider of housing is the BIA Housing Improvement Program (HIP) who provides new home to qualified applicants who “do not own a home”.

Another resource is the Southwest Indian Foundation Housing who concentrate of building homes for the homeless & transport to predetermined homesite location within a 50 miles radius of Gallup, NM and Wide Ruins is over 65 miles.
