RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2023

AN ACTION

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF HEATHER CLAH AS THE NAVAJO NATION DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. The Law and Order Committee has oversight over the administration of justice on the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 600(C)(1)
- C. A proposed resolution requiring final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyátí Committee. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation President recommends a person as the Navajo Nation Deputy Attorney General. 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B).
- B. The Navajo Nation President recommends Heather Clah as the Navajo Nation Deputy Attorney General. Heather Clah's appointment letter and résumé are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- C. The Navajo Nation Council appoints the Navajo Nation Deputy Attorney General at the recommendation of the Navajo Nation President. 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B).
- D. The recommended Navajo Nation Deputy Attorney General serves at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B).

SECTION THREE. APPOINTMENT OF THE NAVAJO NATION ATTORNEY GENERAL

- A. The Navajo Nation Council appoints Heather Clah as the Navajo Nation Deputy Attorney General.
- B. Heather Clah's appointment shall be effective upon the Navajo Nation Council's approval. 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B).

C. Heather Clah's term shall be concurrent with the Navajo Nation President's term. 2 N.N.C. § 1962(B).
