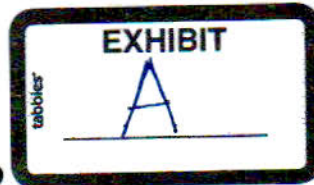

XI. PLAN OF OPERATION

Article I. ~~APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE~~

I. ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby established the Navajo Traditional Apprenticeship Project within the Department of Diné Education of the Navajo Nation Government Executive Branch.

Section 1. ~~Establishment~~

~~The Apprenticeship Committee is hereby established in the Division of Diné Education of the Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation government.~~

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Traditional Apprenticeship Project is to train apprentices of Navajo traditional healing ceremonies, particularly those Navajo ceremonies most in danger of being lost. The project is intended to serve eligible apprentices to complete their training of Navajo traditional healing ceremonies and become healing practitioners.

Section 2. Purposes

~~The Apprenticeship Committee's general purpose is to assist in the development, implementation, and appeal process of the Traditional Apprenticeship Project.~~

III. STAFFING & ORGANIZATION

A. STAFFING

- a. There is hereby established the position of Senior Education Specialist ~~Education Program Manager~~ within the Navajo Traditional Apprenticeship Project. The Senior Education Specialist ~~Manager~~ shall be the administrator of the Project.
- b. The Senior Education Specialist ~~Manager~~ shall be under the general direction and guidance of the Education Program Manager of the Office of Standards, Curriculum & Assessment Development Superintendent of Schools of the Department of Diné' Education in accordance with the Navajo Nation Personnel Policies Manual.
- c. The Senior Education Specialist ~~Manager~~ shall be authorized to recommend additional professional, technical and clerical positions as needed to carry out the organizational purpose(s) stated herein. Additional positions shall be acquired in accordance with applicable Personnel Policies and Procedures and applicable budget rules established for conducting the annual Navajo Nation budget process.
- d. All personnel shall be employed and compensated pursuant to applicable Personnel Policies and Procedures of the Navajo Nation.

B. ORGANIZATION

- a. The organization chart for the Navajo Traditional Apprenticeship Project is attached as Exhibit "A".

~~Section 3. — Membership; selection; appointment; chairperson~~

~~A. The Committee shall consist of six (6) members from various Navajo Nation Department and organizations as follow.~~

~~(1) One (1) member from the Education Committee. If members do not meet the qualification, the committee may appoint another person with the specified qualification from another committee.~~

~~— (2) One (1) member from the Diné Cultural and Spiritual Society.~~

~~(3) One (1) employee from Diné College Indian Studies. If employees do not meet qualification, the college may appoint another person with the specified qualification from another office or organization.~~

~~(4) One (1) employee from the Navajo Nation Historical Preservation Office. If employees do not meet the qualification, the office may appoint another person with the specified qualification from another office or organization.~~

~~(5) One (1) employee from the Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship and Financial Assistance. If employees do not meet the qualification, the office may appoint another person with the specified qualification from another office or organization.~~

~~(6) One (1) employee from the Office of Diné Culture & Language, and Community Services. If employees do not meet the qualification, the office may appoint another person with the specified qualification from another office or organization.~~

~~— B. The Committee shall select a chairperson from among its members.~~

IV. RESPONSIBILITY & AUTHORITY

The Navajo Traditional Apprenticeship Project is authorized to:

- A. Execute and accomplish the purpose and goals of the Project;
- B. Administer and manage the Program personnel, budgets, resources and facilities;
- C. Recommend to the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council the list of Navajo ceremonies that are or near extinction;
- D. Train eligible apprentices to become Navajo traditional healing practitioners;
- E. Ensure the practitioners and apprentices adhere to the cultural and social protocols as established by traditional concepts of ke', awareness, respect and reverence;

- F. Abide by all policies and procedures as established by the Navajo Nation Council.
- G. Review and recommend to the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council all applicable laws, rules, regulations, guidelines and policies as may be deemed necessary to implement and accomplish the Project goals;
- H. Report to the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council as requested by the Committee.

Section 4. Qualification

- ~~—— A. Shall speak and comprehend the Navajo language.~~
- ~~—— B. Shall be knowledgeable about the different Traditional Navajo ceremony(s).~~
- ~~—— C. Shall be knowledgeable about the Traditional Navajo value and clan system.~~
- ~~—— D. Shall be knowledgeable about the Traditional Navajo culture.~~

V. LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT

The Health, Education and Human Service Committee of the Navajo Nation Council shall provide legislative oversight for the Department of Dine' Education pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 400 (D) (1).

Section 5. Term of Office

~~—— Each member to the Apprenticeship Committee shall serve a term of two years provided that the member is employed by or a member of the organization he/she represents on said Committee. When a vacancy exist, a successor shall be appointed to the position in the same manner provided in Section 3 above to serve the remainder of the term.~~

VI. AMENDMENTS

Sections I. through V. of the Navajo Traditional Apprenticeship Plan of Operation may be amended upon recommendation by the Navajo Nation Board of Education to the Health, Education and Human Service Committee of the Navajo Nation Council as deemed necessary.

Section 6. Compensation

~~—— Each member shall have such power as are necessary and proper for the accomplishment of the purposes set forth above.~~

Section 7. Powers

- ~~A. The Committee shall have such power as are necessary and proper for the accomplishment of the purposes set forth above.~~
- ~~—— B. The enumerated powers of the Committee are:~~

~~(1) Review and recommend to the Education Committee of the Navajo Nation Council regulations, policies and procedures to implement the Traditional Apprenticeship Project.~~

~~(2) Recommend the list of Navajo ceremonies that are near extinction to the Education Committee.~~

~~(3) Receive and review project monitoring, evaluation, and other quarterly reports from the Education Specialist.~~

~~(4) Reports to the Education Committee of the Navajo Nation Council the state of the Traditional Apprenticeship Project as requested by said Committee.~~

Section 8. Meetings; quorum

~~A. The Apprenticeship Committee shall conduct one regular meeting at the end of the Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer Terms as provided below:~~

~~(1) Fall Term — August, September, and October~~

~~(2) Winter Term — November, December, and January~~

~~(3) Spring Term — February, March, and April~~

~~(4) Summer Term — May, June, and July~~

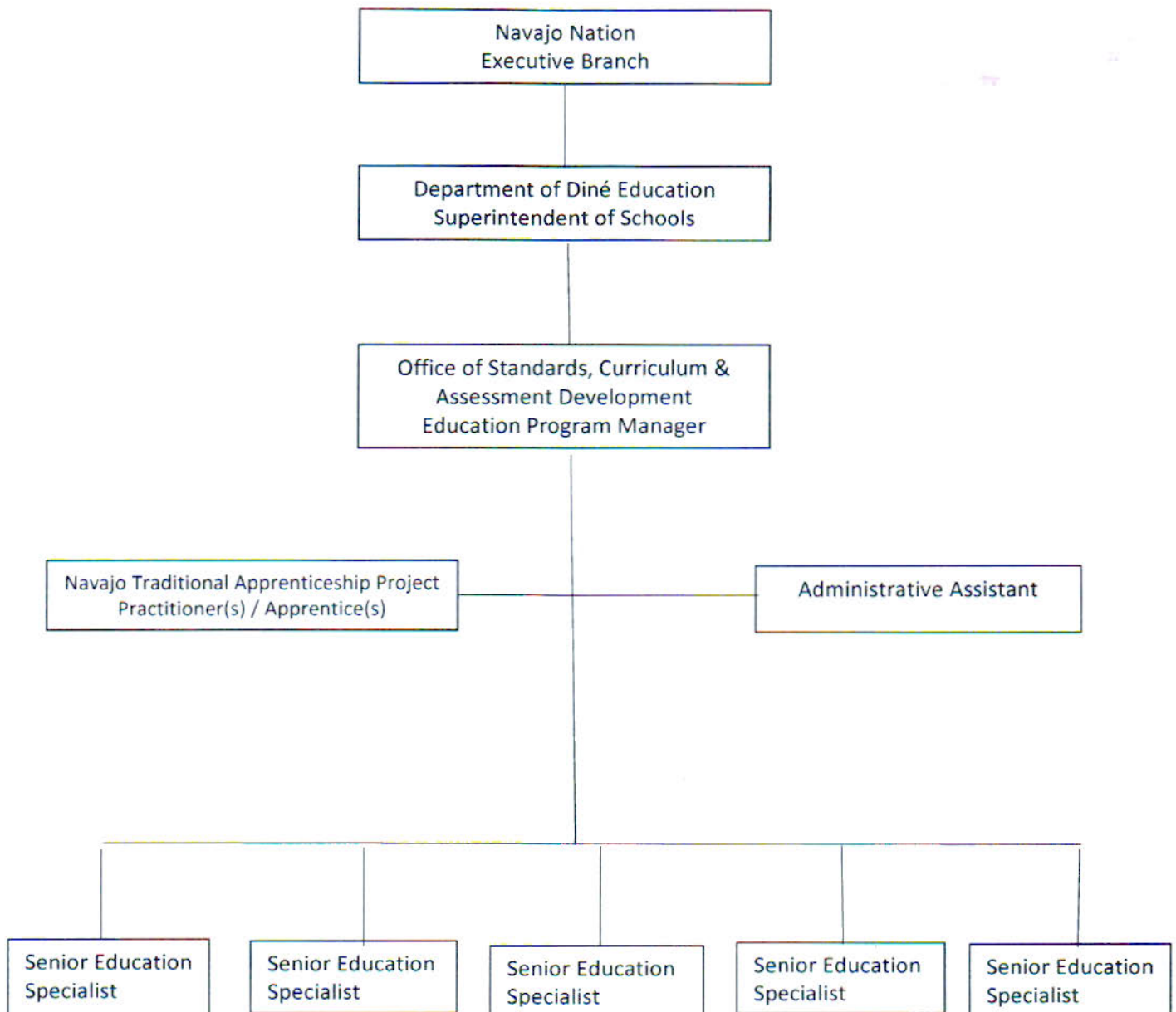
~~B. The Apprenticeship Committee shall meet periodically to review and decide on the appeal process.~~

~~C. At any meeting, a quorum of the Apprenticeship Committee shall consist of four (4) members of the Committee.~~

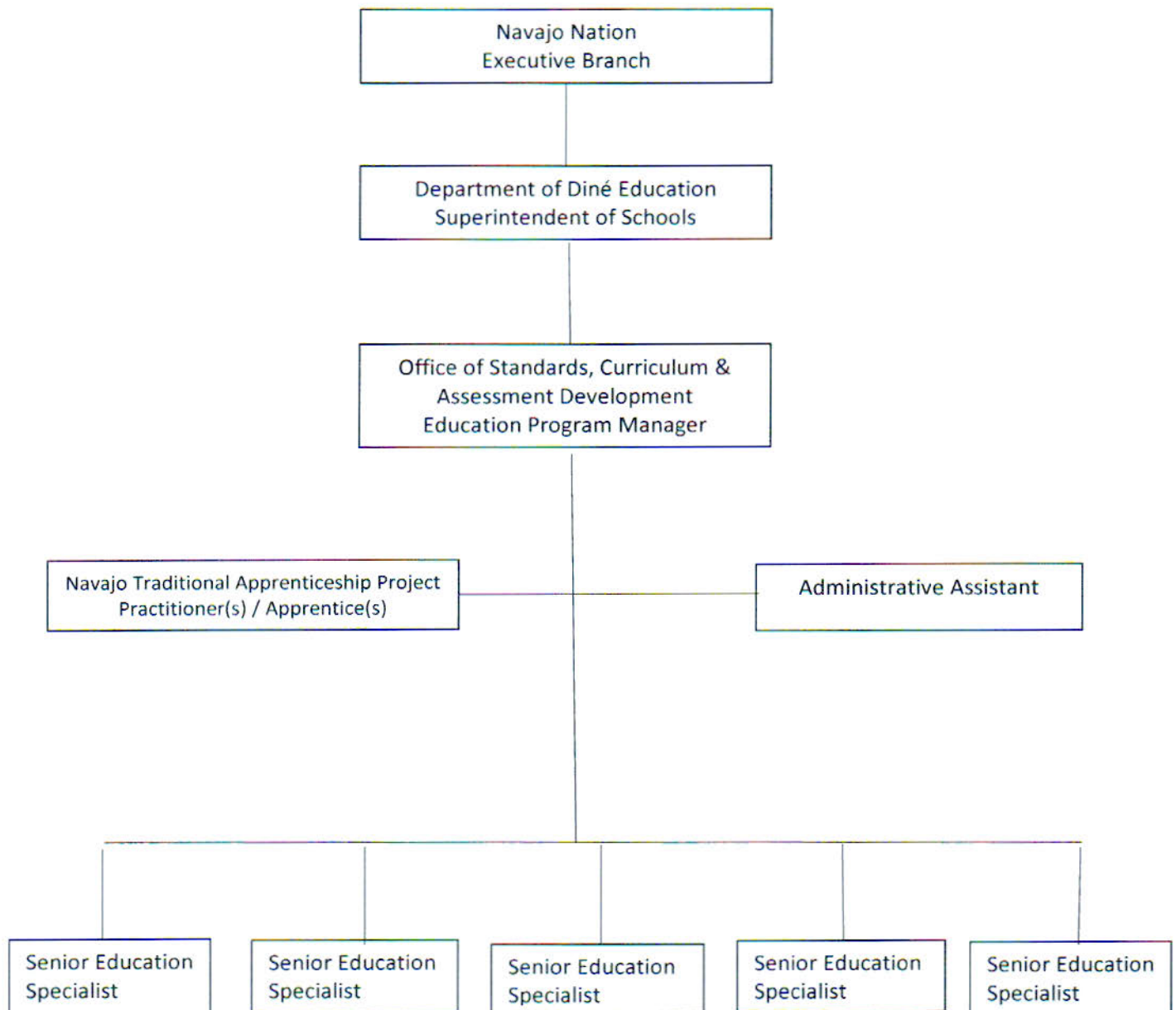
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ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

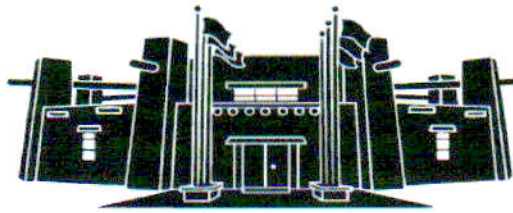


