PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will confirm the appointment of six (6) members, (5 Council Delegates and 1 Presidential appointee) to the Eastern Navajo Land Commission.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

19	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C.

21	B. A proposed resolution that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be	
22	assigned to the Naabik'iyati' Committee before it is heard by the Navajo Nation

- D. The six (6) Council Delegate representatives on the Eastern Navajo Land Commission shall consist of one Navajo Nation Council member from each of the following areas:
 - 1. Area I: Counselor, Huerfano and Nageezi Chapters;
 - 2. Area II: Becenti, Crownpoint, Lake Valley, Nahodishgish, Standing Rock and White Rock Chapters;
 - 3. Area III: Ojo Encino, Pueblo Pintado, Torreon/Star Lake and White Horse Lake Chapters;
 - 4. Area IV: Baca/Prewitt, Casamero Lake, Iyanbito, Smith Lake, Littlewater, Mariano Lake, Pinedale, and Thoreau Chapters;
 - 5. Area V: Bread Springs, Chichiltah, Rock Springs, Churchrock, Manuelito, Red Rock, and Tsayatoh Chapters;
 - 6. Area VI: Alamo, Ramah and Tohajiilee Chapters.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation Council was reduced in membership from 88 delegates to 24 delegates, which required a change in standing committees, Resolution C0-45-12, but also resulted in a realignment of Chapter representation which currently provides for five (5) Council Delegates representing Chapters in the Eastern Agency, otherwise known as the so-called Checkerboard Area. Resolution CMA-10-15, incorporated herein by reference, first implemented the chapter realignment for the Eastern Navajo Land Commission.
- B. Each of the Navajo Nation Council Delegates shall serve as a member of the Commission concurrent with his or her term as a Council Delegate and until his or her successor is confirmed. 2 N.N.C. § 862(D).
- C. The President of the Navajo Nation shall also select an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation, skilled in land and/or energy matters, to sit on the Commission; the President's selection shall be confirmed by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 862 (C).
- D. The Commission shall appoint a Chairperson and Vice- Chairperson from among its members, and may establish committees from among its members if deemed

My name is Edmund E. Yazzie. I am a former Council Delegate for the Chapters of Thoreau, Mariano Lake, Smith Lake, Pinedale, Churchrock, and Iyanbito. I have served 4 terms on the Council, first being elected in 2007.

Throughout the years of my service to my communities and constituents, I have served on various committees to help the people of our Nation. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve in such offices, either as a member, or as a chairperson.

One such office I have served as Chairperson is the Eastern Navajo Land Commission (ENLC). Currently, the ENLC is comprised of the five Navajo Nation Council Delegates who represent their communities respectively in the Eastern Navajo Agency. And, as you may know, one person can be appointed by the Navajo Nation President to serve on this commission. This is the reason I am writing this letter to you today.

I believe the work of the Commission is very important for the benefit of the communities and the people of the Eastern Navajo Agency. During my tenure as first a Commission member, and then the Commission's Chairperson, important and crucial work has been accomplished for the benefit of the Navajo Nation as a whole, and its people. I am proud of the work that was accomplished by the ENLC, but I am confident there is much more the commission still needs to get done. One such project that is at a critical juncture is the Navajo Exchange Legislative Initiative (NELI) project. NELI is a project that started in 2007 and has been heavily invested with time and research.

Since 2007, NELI, for the *first* time will be introduced to the United States Congress within this year. Currently, New Mexico U.S. Senators Ben Ray Lujan and Martin Heinrich are aware of the NELI project, and have been briefed extensively by staff with the ENLC. Mr. Lujan's office is working with the ENLC staff to write and draft the bill, which will be finalized for introduction, hopefully by the spring session of Congress.
