25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- First Year, 2023

AN ACTION RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; SUPPORTING ARIZONA HOUSE BILL 2800 TITLED "AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 15-189.05. ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES: AMENDING TITLE 15. CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-248.01; AMENDING SECTIONS 15-747 AND 15-903, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 41-5706; APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS."

WHEREAS:

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered the Naabik'íyáti' Committee to coordinate all requests for information, appearances and testimony relating to proposed county, state and federal legislation impacting the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §§ 700(A), 701(A)(6).
- B. The Health Education and Human Services Committee is empowered to recommend and review resolutions relating to education. 2 N.N.C. § 401(B)(6)(a).
- C. The Navajo Nation has a government-to-government relationship with the State of Arizona.
- D. During the First Regular Session of 2023, Arizona State Representative Matt Gress from LD 4 introduced House Bill 2800 to the 56th Legislature, the text of which is included in Exhibit A.
- E. The Arizona House Engrossed Summary Sheet for House Bill 2800, attached as Exhibit B, provides, in relevant part, that "each school district and charter school to increase the base salary of all eligible teachers and creates Pay Teachers First Fund."

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby supports Arizona House Bill 2800 titled "AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 15-189.05. ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES: AMENDING TITLE 15. CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-248.01; AMENDING SECTIONS 15-747 AND 15-903, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 41-5706; APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL," in accordance with Exhibit A.

- B. The Navajo Nation hereby authorizes the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council, President of the Navajo Nation, and their designees, to advocate the Navajo Nation's support of Arizona House Bill 2800.

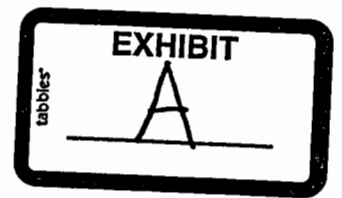

AMENDING SECTION 15-189.05, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-248.01; AMENDING SECTIONS 15-747 AND 15-903, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 41, CHAPTER 56, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 41-5706; APPROPRIATING MONIES; RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

1 C. NOTWITHSTANDING SECTIONS 15-502 AND 15-544, A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR
2 CHARTER SCHOOL MAY NOT REDUCE THE BASE SALARY OF ELIGIBLE TEACHERS WHO ARE
3 OR WILL BE EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL BELOW THE
4 BASE SALARY SCHEDULE REPORTED TO THE DEPARTMENT IN FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025.
5 THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT RESTRICT A SCHOOL DISTRICT'S OR CHARTER SCHOOL'S
6 AUTHORITY TO ADJUST AN INDIVIDUAL TEACHER'S SALARY IN A MANNER THAT IS
7 CONSISTENT WITH THE APPLICABLE BASE SALARY SCHEDULE, INCLUDING AN
8 ADJUSTMENT FOR ANY CHANGE IN EMPLOYMENT STATUS.

9 D. A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE
10 MONIES FROM THE PAY TEACHERS FIRST FUND ESTABLISHED BY THIS SECTION IF THE
11 SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL COMPLIES WITH THE REQUIREMENTS
12 PRESCRIBED IN SECTION 15-747. MONIES DISTRIBUTED FROM THIS FUND MUST BE
13 USED FOR THE SALARY INCREASES FOR ELIGIBLE TEACHERS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION
14 A OF THIS SECTION. MONIES IN THE FUND MAY BE USED FOR UP TO FIFTY PERCENT
15 OF ASSOCIATED EMPLOYEE-RELATED EXPENSE COST INCREASES.

16 E. THE PAY TEACHERS FIRST FUND IS ESTABLISHED CONSISTING OF
17 LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATIONS. MONIES IN THE FUND ARE CONTINUOUSLY
18 APPROPRIATED AND EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 35-190 RELATING TO
19 LAPSING OF APPROPRIATIONS. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND AND
20 ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR DETERMINING WHETHER SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND CHARTER
21 SCHOOLS ARE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE MONIES FROM THE FUND. THE DEPARTMENT
22 SHALL ALLOCATE MONIES FROM THE FUND TO EACH ELIGIBLE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR
23 CHARTER SCHOOL AS FOLLOWS:

24 1. IN FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024, \$5,000 PER ELIGIBLE TEACHER AS
25 REPORTED PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 15-189.05 AND 15-903 TO FUND THE INCREASES
26 MADE UNDER SUBSECTION A OF THIS SECTION IN FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024.

27 2. BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR
28 THEREAFTER, \$10,000 PER ELIGIBLE TEACHER AS REPORTED PURSUANT TO SECTIONS
29 15-189.05 AND 15-903 TO FUND THE INCREASES MADE UNDER SUBSECTION A OF THIS
30 SECTION IN FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025.

31 F. ON OR BEFORE MAY 30 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL FURNISH
32 TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE BUDGET COMMITTEE AN ESTIMATE OF THE AMOUNT
33 REQUIRED TO FUND THE PAY TEACHERS FIRST FUND ALLOCATIONS PRESCRIBED BY
34 SUBSECTION E OF THIS SECTION FOR THE FOLLOWING FISCAL YEAR.

35 G. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADD THE AMOUNT ALLOCATED TO EACH SCHOOL
36 DISTRICT AND CHARTER SCHOOL PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION E OF THIS SECTION TO
37 THE BASE SUPPORT LEVEL THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE COMPUTED FOR THE SCHOOL
38 DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR PURSUANT TO SECTION 15-943
39 OR 15-943.02.

40 H. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

41 1. "CLASSROOM TEACHING" INCLUDES ANY NONADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES
42 THAT PROVIDE INSTRUCTION TO STUDENTS OR THAT SUPPORT STUDENT ACADEMIC
43 ACHIEVEMENT AS PRESCRIBED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD OR
44 CHARTER SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY.

1 (i) THE AMOUNT ALLOCATED FOR EACH CURRENT AND PROSPECTIVE CAPITAL
2 PROJECT OR FACILITY EXPENSE AND ALL FUNDING SOURCES FOR EACH PROJECT OR
3 EXPENSE.
4 ~~6-~~ (j) Any other information that is necessary for a transparent
5 comparison between schools with respect to their revenues, expenditures,
6 student demographics or academic achievement.
7 3. CONTAINS A COMPREHENSIVE DATABASE OF RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES
8 BY EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT AND EACH INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL OPERATED BY A SCHOOL

10 B. THE COMPREHENSIVE DATABASE PRESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION A, PARAGRAPH
11 3 OF THIS SECTION MUST ALLOW USERS TO:
12 1. SEARCH AND AGGREGATE PAYMENTS BY INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL, CATEGORY OF
13 EXPENSES AND SCHOOL DISTRICT.
14 2. SEARCH AND AGGREGATE PAYMENTS TO INDIVIDUAL VENDORS, INCLUDING
15 THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDING AWARDED TO INDIVIDUAL VENDORS BY EACH
16 INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT OR ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN THIS
17 STATE.
18 3. DOWNLOAD INFORMATION YIELDED BY A SEARCH OF THE DATABASE.
19 4. ACCESS ELECTRONIC VERSIONS OF CONTRACTS THAT RELATE TO
20 EXPENDITURES.
21 C. THE COMPREHENSIVE DATABASE PRESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION A, PARAGRAPH
22 3 OF THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE EACH ENTRY INTO THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS'
23 GENERAL LEDGER, INCLUDING RECEIPTS OF REVENUES, EXPENDITURES AND
24 DISBURSEMENTS. THE EXPENDITURE DATA PRESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL
25 LIST:
26 1. THE MANNER OF PAYMENT, INCLUDING CHECK, WARRANT OR CREDIT, DEBIT
27 OR OTHER PURCHASE CARD.
28 2. THE FUNDING SOURCE FROM WHICH THE EXPENDITURE IS APPROPRIATED.
29 3. A STANDARDIZED DESCRIPTIVE TITLE OF THE TYPE AND PURPOSE OF THE
30 TRANSACTION.
31 4. THE DATE AND AMOUNT OF EACH PAYMENT.
32 5. THE INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL OR SCHOOL DISTRICT MAKING THE PAYMENT.
33 6. THE NAME OF THE PERSON OR ENTITY RECEIVING THE PAYMENT,
34 INCLUDING TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE A PARENT ENTITY OF THE RECIPIENT IF
35 THE RECIPIENT IS OWNED BY ANOTHER ENTITY.
36 7. THE PRIMARY LOCATION OF PERFORMANCE UNDER THE CONTRACT,
37 INCLUDING THE COUNTY, CITY OR TOWN AND LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT.
38 D. THE COMPREHENSIVE DATABASE PRESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION A, PARAGRAPH
39 3 OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT INCLUDE:
40 1. PAYEES' ADDRESSES OR TELEPHONE NUMBERS, BUT THE DEPARTMENT MAY
41 ALLOW PUBLIC ACCESS TO THE DATABASE INFORMATION IDENTIFYING THE COUNTY IN
42 WHICH THE PAYEE IS LOCATED.
43 2. WORK PRODUCT IN ANTICIPATION OF LITIGATION OR INFORMATION
44 SUBJECT TO ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE.

1 Sec. 4. Section 15-903, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
2 read:

3 15-903. Budget format; prohibited expenditures; annual report

4 A. The superintendent of public instruction in conjunction with the
5 auditor general shall prepare and prescribe a budget format to be utilized
6 USED by all school districts.

7 B. The budget format shall be designed to allow all school
8 districts to plan and provide in detail for ~~the use of~~ USING available
9 funds MONIES. The budget format shall contain distinct sections for, but
10 need not be limited to, maintenance and operation, debt service, special
11 projects, capital outlay, adjacent ways and classroom site fund. The
12 maintenance and operation section shall include, but need not be limited
13 to, separate subsections for regular education programs, special education
14 programs and operational expenditures for pupil transportation. Each
15 subsection shall clearly distinguish classroom instruction expenditures.
16 The special education program subsection shall include a subtotal for the
17 disability classifications as defined in section 15-761 and programs for
18 gifted, vocational and technical education, remedial education and
19 bilingual students. The total expenditures for each of these programs
20 shall be included on the budget form. The pupil transportation subsection
21 shall include all operational expenditures relating to ~~the transportation~~
22 of TRANSPORTING pupils, including all operational expenditures within a
23 contract if the school district contracts for pupil transportation.

24 C. The capital outlay section of the budget shall include a
25 subsection for unrestricted capital outlay. The unrestricted capital
26 outlay subsection shall include budgeted expenditures for acquisitions by
27 purchase, lease-purchase or lease of capital items as defined in the
28 uniform system of financial records and shall include:

29 1. Land, buildings and improvements to land and buildings,
30 including labor and related employee benefits costs and material costs if
31 work is performed by school district employees.

32 2. Furniture, furnishings, athletic equipment and other equipment,
33 including computer software.

34 3. Pupil and nonpupil transportation vehicles and equipment,
35 including all capital expenditures within a contract if the school
36 district contracts for pupil transportation.

37 4. Textbooks and related printed subject matter materials adopted
38 by the governing board.

39 5. Instructional aids.

40 6. Library books.

41 7. Payment of principal and interest on bonds.

42 8. School district administration emergency needs that are directly
43 related to pupils.

1 8. THE SALARY SCHEDULE OR SCHEDULES FOR ELIGIBLE TEACHERS AS
2 DEFINED IN SECTION 15-248.01 WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR
3 THE CURRENT YEAR.

4 F. The special projects section shall include budgeted expenditures
5 for state special projects, including special adult projects, career
6 education, deficiencies correction fund projects and new school facilities
7 fund projects, such federal special projects as ESEA title programs,
8 vocational education and title IV Indian education, and other special
9 projects.

10 G. A school district shall not make expenditures for campaign
11 literature associated with school district or charter school officials.
12 If the superintendent of public instruction determines that a school
13 district has violated this subsection, the superintendent of public
14 instruction may withhold any portion of the school district's
15 apportionment of state aid.

16 H. The budget format shall include an electronic format that shall
17 be submitted for each proposed, adopted and revised budget.

18 I. On or before November 30 of each year, the department of
19 education shall electronically submit to the joint legislative budget
20 committee and the governor's office of strategic planning and budgeting a
21 report that compiles the information required by subsection E, paragraphs
22 3 through ~~6~~ 8 of this section for all school districts statewide.

23 Sec. 5. Title 41, chapter 56, article 1, Arizona Revised Statutes,
24 is amended by adding section 41-5706, to read:

25 41-5706. School districts; facilities master plans;
26 requirements

27 A. BEGINNING JULY 1, 2025, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD
28 SHALL DEVELOP AND ADOPT A LONG-TERM FACILITIES MASTER PLAN THAT INCLUDES
29 THE FOLLOWING COMPONENTS FOR THE TWENTY-YEAR PERIOD FOLLOWING THE YEAR IN
30 WHICH THE PLAN IS ADOPTED:

31 1. A PROFESSIONAL ASSESSMENT ANALYZING THE ACADEMIC FACILITY
32 CONDITIONS, INCLUDING BUILDING CONDITIONS, SITE FEATURES, MAINTENANCE
33 ISSUES, FUNCTIONALITY AND UTILITIES.

34 2. PROJECTED CAPITAL FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS, RENOVATIONS, REPAIRS
35 AND REPLACEMENTS, INCLUDING THE PRIORITY LEVEL THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT
36 GOVERNING BOARD ASSIGNS TO EACH PROJECT.

37 3. THE ROUTINE PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE GUIDELINES DEVELOPED BY THE
38 SCHOOL DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION 41-5702 AND PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE
39 PLAN REQUIRED BY SECTION 41-5731.

40 4. THE CAPITAL PLAN AND ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS DEVELOPED PURSUANT
41 TO SECTION 41-5741, AS UPDATED IN THE YEAR IN WHICH THE LONG-TERM
42 FACILITIES MASTER PLAN IS ADOPTED OR UPDATED.

43 5. OPTIONS FOR ADDRESSING ANY IDENTIFIED DEFICIENCY, INCLUDING EACH
44 DEFICIENCY THAT IS IDENTIFIED BY THE ASSESSMENT CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO
45 PARAGRAPH 1 OF THIS SUBSECTION.

1 B. The sum of \$2,000,000 and 14 FTE positions are appropriated from
2 the state general fund in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the division of school
3 facilities within the department of administration for inspecting school
4 facilities and reviewing the long-term facilities master plans and
5 short-term facilities master plans required by section 41-5706, Arizona
6 Revised Statutes, as added by this act.

7 C. The following sums are appropriated from the state general fund
8 in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the department of education:

9 1. \$5,000,000 to develop and maintain the online transparency
10 portal prescribed by section 15-747, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended
11 by this act.

12 2. \$10,000,000 to hire a third-party contractor to audit the
13 administrative and operational efficiency of school districts in this
14 state. The department of education shall post the audit reports on the
15 online transparency portal prescribed by section 15-747, Arizona Revised
16 Statutes, as amended by this act.

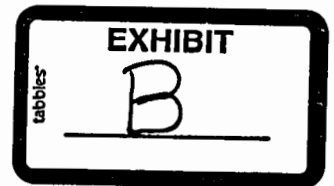
17 D. The sum of \$2,000,000 is appropriated from the state general
18 fund in fiscal year 2023-2024 to the state board for charter schools to
19 conduct financial reviews and inspections of charter schools.

20 E. The appropriations made in subsection A of this section are
21 exempt from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes,
22 relating to lapsing of appropriations.

23 F. The legislature intends that the appropriation made in
24 subsection A, paragraph 2 of this section be considered ongoing funding in
25 future years.

26 Sec. 8. Conditional enactment

27 This act does not become effective unless House Bill 2533,
28 fifty-sixth legislature, first regular session, relating to classroom
29 instruction, becomes law.

Overview

Mandates each school district and charter school increase the base salary of all eligible teachers and creates the Pay Teachers First Fund. Expands the school level data that must be included in the School Online Transparency Portal. Directs each school district to establish a long-term and short-term facilities master plan. Makes multiple appropriations from the state General Fund (GF) for outlined purposes.

History

A school district's and charter school's budget must contain the average teacher salary for the current and previous years, as well as the dollar and percentage increase in the current year average teacher salary. This information must be prominently posted on the school district's or charter school's website home page. The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) must annually compile this average teacher salary information and submit it to specified entities (A.R.S. §§ 15-189.05, 15-903).

The Arizona Department of Administration (ADOA) must contract with a third party to develop a school financial transparency portal that includes school level data for charter schools, school districts and district schools, such as: 1) weighted student count revenues; 2) federal, state and local revenues; 3) allocation of Classroom Site Fund monies; 4) amounts allocated for teacher pay and benefits, classroom supplies, student support and other expenditures; 5) a comparison of the funding information for each school in the same local education agency; and 6) any other information necessary. ADE and the Arizona State Board for Charter Schools (ASBCS) must provide any necessary data or financial information requested for the portal (A.R.S. § 15-747).

A school district must develop routine preventive maintenance guidelines for its facilities and submit these guidelines to the Division of School Facilities (Division). The Division uses these guidelines to determine if a facility was inadequately maintained (A.R.S. § 41-5702). Additionally, to be eligible to receive Building Renewal Grant (BRG) Fund monies, a school district must submit a preventive maintenance plan to the Division (A.R.S. § 41-5731).

A school district governing board (governing board) must annually update a capital plan that includes enrollment projections for schools. This capital plan is used by the School Facilities Oversight Board to determine if the school district requires capital funding from the New School Facilities (NSF) Fund (A.R.S. § 41-5741).

Provisions

Teacher Salary Increases

1. Requires each school district and charter school, regardless of whether it receives Pay Teachers First Fund monies, to revise its salary schedules to increase the base salary of all eligible teachers who are or will be employed by:
 - a) \$5,000 above the FY 2023 base salary in FY 2024; and
 - b) \$10,000 above the FY 2023 base salary in FY 2025. (Sec. 2)

School District and Charter School Budgets

19. Includes in each school district's and charter school's budget:
 - a) the salary schedule for eligible teachers employed for the current year; and
 - b) a statement identifying the number of eligible teachers employed for the current year. (Sec. 1, 4)
20. Requires the FY 2024 budgets of school districts and charter schools to include:
 - a) the salary schedules for all eligible teachers for the current fiscal year without the required teacher salary increases; and
 - b) the revised salary schedules for eligible teachers for the current fiscal year with the required teacher salary increases. (Sec. 6)
21. Mandates school districts and charter schools include in total compensation statements:
 - a) in FY 2024, a statement notifying eligible teachers that the Legislature provided them a \$5,000 base salary increase; and
 - b) in FY 2025, a statement notifying eligible teachers that the Legislature provided them an additional \$5,000 year-over-year base salary increase, for a combined total of \$10,000 base salary increases since FY 2023. (Sec. 6)

School Online Transparency Portal

22. Renames the School Financial Transparency Portal to the School Online Transparency Portal (Portal). (Sec. 3)
23. Transfers the Portal from ADOA to ADE. (Sec. 3)
24. Requires the Portal to be electronically searchable by the public at no cost. (Sec. 3)
25. Expands the school level data that must be contained in the Portal to include:
 - a) the number of full-time equivalent (FTE) positions at each individual school, disaggregated by position type;
 - b) the average salary and salary range for each type of FTE position reported at each individual school;
 - c) links to each school district's or charter school's proposed, adopted and revised budgets as outlined; and
 - d) the amount allocated for each current and prospective capital project or facility expense and all funding sources. (Sec. 3)
26. Adds that the Portal must contain a comprehensive database of receipts and expenditures by each school and district school that allows users to:
 - a) search and aggregate payments by individual school, expense category and school district;
 - b) search and aggregate payments to individual vendors as specified;
 - c) download information yielded by a database search; and
 - d) access electronic versions of contracts that relate to expenditures. (Sec. 3)
27. Mandates the comprehensive database include each entry into the school district's general ledger, including receipts of revenues, expenditures and disbursements. (Sec. 3)
28. Specifies the expenditure data included in the comprehensive database must list:
 - a) the manner of payment;
 - b) the funding source from which the expenditure is appropriated;
 - c) a standardized descriptive title of the type and purpose of the transaction;
 - d) the data and amount of each payment;
 - e) the individual school or school district making the payment;
 - f) the name of the person or entity receiving the payment; and
 - g) the primary location of performance under the contract. (Sec. 3)
