PURPOSE: The purpose of this resolution is to concur with the Navajo Nation President's acceptance of a \$175,000.00 donation from the family of the late Leo Chischilly for the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration in order to construct he Oak Springs-Pine Springs Veterans Park.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

The Navajo Nation Office of the President and Vice President has been made aware of the \$175,000.00 donation from the family of Leo Chischilly and wish to accept the donation on behalf of the Navajo Nation for the construction of the Oak Springs-Pine Springs Veterans Park. - E. The Oak Springs Chapter Government and the Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization support the acceptance of the donation. See attached Exhibits D and E, respectively.
- F. Accepting the \$175,000.00 donation for the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration for the construction of the Oak Springs-Pine Springs Veterans Park is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation.


SECTION THREE. CONCURRENCE BY THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI COMMITTEE AND DIRECTIVE TO THE OFFICE OF NAVAJO NATION VETERANS ADMINISTRATION

- A. The Naabik'íyáti Committee hereby concurs with the Navajo Nation President's acceptance of the \$175,000.00 donation from the Family of the Late Leo Chischilly, more particularly described in Exhibit A for the construction of the Oak Springs-Pine Springs Veterans Park.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby directs the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration to record the receipt of the \$175,000.000 donation with the Ethics and Rules Office, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1012.
- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1010, all gifts to the Navajo Nation shall be and remain the property of the Navajo Nation.

Re: Donation to Build Oak Springs Veteran's Park

Dear Navajo Nation Veteran's Administration:

I am the attorney representing the family of Leo Chischilly, a Navajo Veteran, who was killed last year when he was rear-ended by a semi-truck on the highway. Before his death, Mr. Chischilly's dream was to build a park in honor of veterans in the Oak Springs Community. He had worked with the Oak and Pine Springs Veteran's Organization to come up with plans for this park. All that was lacking were the funds to build it for the community.

Upon settlement of the wrongful death case involving Mr. Chischilly, the family wanted to do something to honor him. From the settlement proceeds, Mr. Chischilly's three daughters, Gwenda Gorman, Tanya Chischilly and Pamela Puente donated \$175,000 (the estimate for completion of the park) of the wrongful death settlement be paid to the Oak and Pine Springs Veteran's Organization for construction of this park.

Because of confidentiality provisions in the settlement release, I cannot disclose the name of the insurance company which paid this settlement. Because the money came from the amount that would have been awarded to Mr. Chischilly's three daughters it is really a donation from the family.

The donation is directed to the Oak and Pine Springs Veteran's Organization specifically for construction of the Veteran's Park. The funds should only be used to pay selected contractors to complete the park, as directed by the Oak and Pine Springs Veteran's Organization and the Chischilly family. There should be no indirect costs charged to this donation and the funds should not be used for any other purpose. Should you or the tribe reject these stipulations, then the family would request return of the money.

I hope this letter has answered all your questions regarding this generous memorial to Leo Chischilly from his family. Here's hoping it can create a spot to honor veterans like Mr. Chischilly and to benefit the community. Please call if you have any further questions.

Good Afternoon,

My name is Lionel Allen and I am the Commander for the Oak Springs and Pine Springs Veterans Organization. I am writing to you at the request of the Veterans in my Community and on their behalf.

The family of our late Commander, Leo Chischilly, recently donated a large sum of money to our Veterans Organization. These funds were to be used to remodel and renovate an old existing park in Oak Springs. That was one of the things that Mr. Chischilly was working on at the time of his passing. Unfortunately, we have come across a few issues pertaining to the check and thus have led to my Veterans asking me to write to you for assistance.

According to the Oak Springs Chapter Community Services Coordinator (CSC), the account for the Veterans at the Chapter level will be closing soon and therefore we were denied our request of depositing the check into that account. The expiration date for the check is fast approaching and the Veterans of my Organization don't want to lose the money. So that leads to my request. Is there any way we could utilize the account at the Chapter level to deposit these funds? We are currently working on obtaining a 501 C3 tax exemption ID which would make opening a bank account easier. Because that is a long process in itself, we were hoping this would be a better way to manage the funds and

My train of thought is that if the Navajo Nation President's Office accepts the donation on behalf of the Oak/Pine Springs Veterans Organization and then it is released to the Oak Springs Chapter, it could then be deposited into the Veterans account there. In that way, the funds would not be lost and the Veterans Organization would be able to see through the goal of having a park for the Community members and even visitors and tourists as they travel through Navajo Land on Route 12.

SUBJECT: RFS No. 18-0385: Procedures to Receive Gifts/Donations of Private Funds

The Navajo Department of Justice (DOJ) received your Request for Services (RFS) on February 1, 2018. Oaksprings Chapter requested guidance on accepting donations of private funds. We spoke about the RFS on same day.

After our conversation, I understand the facts as follows:

- You met (date unknown) with the relatives of a former community member of the Oaksprings Chapter who passed away. The relatives would like to donate money to the Oaksprings Chapter with restrictions. Specifically, you state the family told you they do not want the Chapter to hold the money but rather would like the \$170,000 donation to go towards the planning, design, and construction of the Veterans Park in Oak Springs.
- 2. On or about January 24, 2018, Ms. Johnson sent an email to the Chapter veterans' organization asking if CPMD is assisting with the plan, design, and construction of the Park. Ms. Johnson provided that additional research would be required to determine where the funds would be kept.

Only the Navajo Nation President can receive donations on behalf of the Navajo Nation with concurrence from the Naabik'iyati Committee.

Only the Navajo Nation President has the authority to accept or decline gifts of property on behalf of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 1010. However, when the value of the gift exceeds \$1,000, it is required that the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council

concur on acceptance of the donation. 2 N.N.C. § 1010. Once accepted, all public officials, regardless of whether the gift is intended for them or the Navajo Nation, must record the gift with the Ethics and Rules office. 2 N.N.C. § 1012.

All gifts to the Navajo Nation are the property of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §1010. It is illegal to sell, gift, loan, exchange or otherwise dispose of Navajo Nation property, unless it is authorized by regulations or the Navajo Nation Council has issued a directive. 2 N.N.C. § 57.

Oaksprings Chapter must follow the appropriate procedures to receive the donation of private funds.

In this case, Oaksprings Chapter states the family will donate \$170,000.00 to the Chapter. However, the Chapter does not have a written document which provides the family will donate the \$170,000.00 or the manner by which funds will be transferred. Because the family is allegedly promising to donate a value over \$1,000, acceptance of this donation requires the Naabik'íyáti Committee's concurrence. Additionally, Title 2 requires approval of the donation by the Navajo Nation President. Oaksprings Chapter must conduct the following steps to formally accept the donation exceeding \$1,000.00:

- 1. Submit a letter to the Office of the President and Vice President (OPVP) requesting that the President accept the donation. Include with that letter, a copy of a letter from the donor detailing the donation. Request a letter from the President to the donors in which he accepts the donation.
- 2. Contact a Council Delegate and provide this Delegate with information regarding the donation. The information you may wish to provide would include: (1) a copy of the letter from the President accepting the donation; (2) a letter and other supporting documentation from the donors which details the donation; (3) the intended use of the funds; (4) any stipulations or restrictions attached to the donation; and (5) any other related information. Ask the Delegate to sponsor legislation for the Naabik'íyáti' Committee to concur on the President's acceptance of the donation.
- 3. Assuming the Delegate you contact agrees to sponsor the Naabik'íyáti' Committee resolution accepting the gift, the Delegate will give the information you provided to the Office of Legislative Counsel (OLC). OLC will draft a resolution for the Naabik'íyáti' Committee's consideration.
- 4. Once the Naabik'íyáti' Committee passes a resolution concurring on acceptance of the donation, the Chapter must record the donated funds with the Ethics and Rules office.

5. Once you receive the donation of private funds, provide the Property Department with the following: (1) the letter from the President accepting the donation; (2) the Naabik'íyáti' Committee resolution; (3) the check or cashier's check made payable the Navajo Nation; (4) a letter that states who is donating the money, who will receive the money, what the money will be used for, how the money will be transferred to the Nation, and when the donation will occur; (5) a letter from the donor/s describing the funds or objects to be donated; and (6) the Chapter resolution accepting the donation.

The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization has been in existence since 1970 and has changed its name from Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Chapter Veterans Organization to Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization which was approved on March 5, 2017 along with its Plan of Operation, which was changed in October 2017; and.

- 3. Pursuant to The Navajo Nation Veterans Act; Title II, Section One (E,I,M,N,O,R,T); SS-1032 (B-5,9,10). The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization is duly recognized by the Navajo Nation; and
- 4. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Council Resolution CMA-25-71; The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization is established under the Department of Navajo Nation Veterans Affairs with falls under the Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation Government; and
- 5. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization recognizes and acknowledges that it is entrusted to strive toward unification of all Navajo Nation Veterans and Local Leadership to provide leadership and coordinate with the needs of the veteran; and

NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT;

- 1. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization accepts the donated money from the Chischilly family in the amount of \$175,000 (one hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars); and
- The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization understands and acknowledges that this money is to be strictly
 utilized for the design, development, construction and completion of the Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Park in
 Oak Springs, Arizona; and
- 3. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization acknowledges that there will not be an indirect rate applied to these funds and that the entire amount will be utilized for the Veterans Park; and

- 4. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization acknowledges that the money will be deposited into the Veteran Organization's account; and
- 5. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization understands and acknowledges that the balances and expenditures of the account and funds will be reported to the Organization membership at a duly called Veterans Meeting; and
- 6. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization offers its deepest and sincerest appreciation and gratitude to the Chischilly family for their donation and continued support; and
- 7. The Teel'chinti'/T'iis'iiahi Veterans Organization continues to extend condolences to the family of our late Commander, Leo Chischilly.
