PURPOSE: Approving a mission site permit and terms and conditions for religious and community services facility for the Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter., located in the Nageezi Chapter.

Section One. Authority

- A. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1151 (C), the Resources Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give approval for permits for mission sites on behalf of the Navajo Nation.
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section 501 (B)(2), the Resources Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to give final approval for all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

Secton Two. Title 16 of the Navajo Nation Code Provisions with Respect to Mission Sites

- A. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1153 (A) No permit to enlarge the area of Navajo Nation land presently under permit to a missionary or mission body, and no permit to

1 grant Navajo Nation land for a new mission site will be granted by the Resources
2 Committee unless the application for such permit has first been reviewed by the
3 Navajo Land Department of the Navajo Nation.

4 B. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. Section 1153 (B) the application for a mission site shall
5 contain:

- 6 1. An exact description of the Navajo Nation land for which application is made.
- 7 2. A detailed statement of the purpose or purposes for which the said Navajo Nation
8 land shall be used. If a missionary or mission body proposes to establish facilities
9 for educational, medical, or other non-religious activities, the application shall set
10 forth fully the extent and character thereof.
- 11 3. A signed petition of a substantial number of Navajos residing in the vicinity of the
12 proposed site endorsing the proposed permit.
- 13 4. An endorsement of Navajo Nation Council Delegates of the District in which the
14 proposed site is located.
- 15 5. A description of buildings and improvements to be placed on Navajo Nation lands
16 and an estimate of the cost thereof. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1155 the Resources
17 and Development Committee is authorized to deny or grant, on behalf of the
18 Navajo Nation, any permit with special consideration to the establishment of too
19 many missions in any one area or at any one point.

20 C. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B) the following acreage limitations shall apply to all
21 applicants for permits:

- 22 1. Mission site for purely religious activities: one and one-half (1 1/2) acres;
- 23 2. Mission site for religious activities and community services facilities: three and
24 one-half (3 1/2) acres;
- 25 3. Mission site for religious activities and either substantial medical or accredited
26 educational programs: eight (8) acres; and
- 27 4. The Resources and Development Committee may, in the case of applications for
28 mission sites in or near areas withdrawn for townships in the Navajo Nation, limit
29 site acreage to less than two and five-tenths (2 5/10) acres, and may set rental fees
30

1 with due regard for present or future competing demands for land use in such
2 areas.

3 D. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (C) "community service facilities" shall be deemed to
4 include only those permanent improvements upon the permitted site which are for the
5 purpose of providing recreational programs, non-religious educational programs,
6 including adult education, and other non-religious programs of benefit to the
7 community.

8 E. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (A), the acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. §
9 1159 may be waived by the Resources and Development Committee upon a showing
10 by the applicant that planned programs will be of sufficient benefit to the Navajo
11 People to justify waiver of acreage limitations. No waiver of acreage limitations shall
12 be granted unless the applicant has complied with 16 N.N.C. §§ 1153 and 1161, and
13 all other procedures provided by law.

14 F. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1160 (B) no waiver of acreage limitations shall be granted in
15 cases of applications subject to acreage limitations established by 16 N.N.C. §
16 1159(B)(1) (regarding a mission site for purely religious activities which is limited to
17 one and one-half (1 1/2) acres).

18 G. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1161 no application for a mission site permit for an area of
19 Navajo Nation land in excess of the limitations established in 16 N.N.C. § 1159 shall
20 be granted by the Resources and Development Committee unless the application for
21 such permit has been reviewed and approved by the Division of Community
22 Development of the Navajo Nation, and by the Navajo Land Department of the
23 Navajo Nation.

24 25 **Section Three. Findings**

26 A. The Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter, Post Office Box 295,
27 Nageezi, New Mexico has applied for a Mission Site Permit within the Nageezi
28 Chapter, as further described in **Exhibit C**, attached hereto and incorporated herein
29 by this reference.

- 1 B. The proposed mission site is located on 3.5 acres, more or less, within the vicinity of
2 Nageezi Chapter, Navajo Nation (New Mexico). The land description appears on the
3 survey plat attached hereto and incorporated as **Exhibit D**.
- 4 C. The Grazing Official identified two land users who gave their consents which are
5 attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.
- 6 D. The Nageezi Chapter Resolution NC-18-049 dated March 4, 2018 entitled
7 "*Supporting Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter in Renewing*
8 *Their 3.5 Acres Mission Site Lease*" and the petition signed by the local residents are
9 also attached herein as **Exhibit F**.
- 10 D. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B) the acreage limitations for permits for a mission
11 site for religious activities and community services facilities is three and one-half (3
12 1/2) acres. The Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter request is
13 for three and one half (3.5) acres.
- 14 E. The Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter request for three and
15 one-half (3 1/2) acres is stated in the application. The accompanying Letter of
16 Justification from the Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter
17 Secretary and the application are attached as **Exhibit C**. The Letter of Justification
18 states that "*The organization plans to build small arbors with picnic tables; a*
19 *basketball court and volleyball court as a recreation center to benefit the youth and*
20 *children as community services facilities and to build a cultural center to provide*
21 *'Non-religious' adult education programs to improve the way of life; and any other*
22 *improvements as needed.*"
- 23 F. The Resources and Development Committee finds that the planned programs are
24 sufficient to demonstrate the use of the three and one-half (3.5) acres for community
25 service activities pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1159 (B).
- 26 G. The Department of Fish and Wildlife Biological Resources Compliance Form is
27 attached as **EXHIBIT G**; the Cultural Resources Compliance Form is attached as
28 **Exhibit H**; the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency Surface and Ground
29 Water Protection Department Memorandum is attached as **Exhibit I**; and, the Navajo
30 Business and Procurement Clearance is attached as **Exhibit J**.

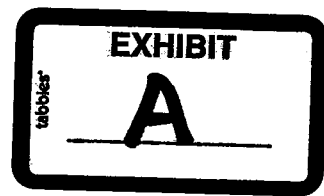
1 H. The application for the revocable use permit for a mission site has been reviewed by the
2 Navajo Land Department of Fish and Wildlife; Historic Preservation; Navajo Nation
3 Environmental Protection Agency; Division of Natural Resources; the Division of
4 Community Development and the Department of Justice and found "Sufficient" or
5 "Approved." See **Exhibit B**.

6 E. The Terms and Conditions for the Mission Site Permit is attached as **Exhibit A**.

7
8 **Section Four. Approval**

9 A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby
10 approves and consents to the Mission Site Permit for the Native American Indian
11 Religion of Eastern Diné Chapter subject to but not limited to the attached Terms and
12 Conditions contained herein as **Exhibit A** which is attached hereto and incorporated
13 herein by this reference.

14 B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby
15 authorizes President of the Navajo Nation to execute all documents to affect the
16 intent and purpose of this resolution.
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**TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR MISSION SITE PERMIT
NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN RELIGION OF
EASTERN DINE CHAPTER (PERMITTEE)**

1. This Mission Site Permit is issued to the **Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Dine Chapter** to use and occupy Navajo Nation Trust Lands for religious purposes, and shall be subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. The term of the Mission Site Permit is effective beginning on the date the permit is approved by the Resources & Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council or authorized representative. The Permit is authorized by Resources and Development Committee No. _____.
2. This permit is revocable at the discretion of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. The permit shall immediately be revoked for the failure to use the land herein described for religious purposes. It is understood and agreed that this instrument is '**NOT A LEASE**' and is not to be taken or construed as granting any leasehold interest or right in or to the land herein described, but is merely a temporary permit, terminable and revocable.
3. The Permittee shall be given at least thirty (30) days written notice before this Mission Site Permit is terminated and revoked. Upon termination of the Mission Site Permit, the Permittee shall have ninety (90) days in which to remove from the site to dispose of any and all buildings, structures, materials and equipment and other personal property owned by the religious organization. After the expiration of the ninety (90) days, the Permittee shall peacefully and without legal process deliver the possession of the premises to the Navajo Nation. All improvements not removed after ninety (90) days will become the property of the Navajo Nation, unless the Navajo Nation demands in writing that the improvements be removed.
4. This Permit is not transferable, except with the consent of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
5. This Permit shall be reviewed every five (5) years to reevaluate the rent and compliance with the terms and conditions.
6. The legal land description of the premises is described as follows:

TRACT DESCRIPTION

A three and one-half (3.50) acre tract of land in the Southeast one-quarter (SE ¼) of Section one (1), Township twenty-three (23) North, Range eight (8) West, N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico, and being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING N 60°36'28" W 2136.24 feet from the Southeast corner of said Section 1;
THENCE S 56°33'31" W 483.82 feet;
THENCE N 36°18'32" W 316.77 feet;
THENCE N 56°40'19" E 480.65 feet;

THENCE S 36°53'25" E 315.99 feet to the point of beginning.

7. The annual rental rate will be \$ 45.00 per year and is due on or before the first day of December each year the Permit remains in effect. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1157, if the Permittee fails to pay the rent when due, this permit shall automatically terminate. The Permittee is responsible to make direct payments to the Navajo Nation Accounts Receivable Section, Post Office Box 3150, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
8. The Permittee may develop, use and occupy the area under the permit for the purpose(s) of Mission Site. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any other purpose without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. The Permittee may not develop, use or occupy the area under the permit for any unlawful purpose.
9. In all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 162;
 - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;
 - c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ et seq., and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Law, 5 N.N.C. §§ et seq.; and
 - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq. Permittee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
10. The Permittee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the permit.
11. The Permittee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the permit area to the extent compatible with the purpose of the permit, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.
12. The Permittee shall at all times during the term of the permit and at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the permit and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
13. The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and their respective authorized agents, employees, land users and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy or use of the permit area by the Permittee.

14. The Permittee shall not assign, convey or transfer, in any manner whatsoever, the permit or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the permit, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer of the permit without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon condition or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
15. The Navajo Nation may terminate the permit for violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the permit shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation or authorized representative for any of the following causes:
 - a. Failure to comply with any terms and conditions of the permit or of applicable laws or regulations;
 - b. Non-use of the permit; and
 - c. The use of the land subject to the permit for any purpose inconsistent with the purpose for which the permit is granted.
16. At the termination of the permit, the Permittee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Permittee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Permittee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
17. The Permittee shall give written notice to the Navajo Nation Land Department regarding any change to the Permittee's contact information, address, leadership, organizational name, or any other substantial change to the organization. The notice shall be given within thirty (30) days and delivered to the Navajo Land Department at Post Office Box 2249, Window Rock, Arizona 86515.
18. Holding over by the Permittee after the termination of the permit shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Permittee any rights hereunder or in or to the land subject to the permit or to any improvements located thereon.
19. The Navajo Nation shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the permit, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.
20. By acceptance of the grant of permit, the Permittee consents to the full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction to levy fines and to enter judgements for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by the Permittee within the Navajo Nation or which have a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.
21. By acceptance of the grant of the permit, the Permittee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the

general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the permit or to the Navajo Nation.


22. Any action or proceeding brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the permit shall be resolved administratively under the laws of the Navajo Nation and no action or proceeding shall be brought by the Permittee against the Navajo Nation, in any court of any state.
23. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
24. Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.
25. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Permittee, and the term "Permittee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.
26. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the area under the permit; and the area under the permit and all lands burdened by the permit shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.

The Tuba City Christian and Missionary Alliance Fellowship is seeking a 2.36 acres mission site permit. The Navajo Nation Code provides in relevant part that:

Acreage Limitations - Generally

- A. It shall be the policy of the Navajo Nation that acreage used for each mission site shall be the minimum acreage required for the conduct of mission programs thereon.
- B. The following acreage limitations shall apply to all applicants for permits
 - 1. Mission site for purely religious activities: one and one-half acres (1½);
 - 2. Mission site for religious activities and community services facilities: three and one-half acres (3½);

3. Mission site for religious activities and either substantial medical or accredited education programs; eight acres;

. . .

- C. For the purpose of this Subchapter, "community service facilities" shall be deemed to include only those permanent improvements upon the permitted site which are for the purpose of providing recreational programs, non-religious educational programs, including adult education, and other non-religious programs of benefit to the community.

(emphasis added)

16 N.N.C. § 1159

The Code limits mission site permits to one and one half (1½) acres where a religious organization engages in purely religious activities. In order to be eligible to use a larger area of Navajo trust land, the Tuba City Christian and Missionary Alliance Fellowship must commit to providing some type of non-religious community service such as recreation, education or medical services. There is nothing in the church's application indicating it is committed to doing this. Although the Code does allow for waivers of the acreage limitation, no waiver is permitted for churches engaging in purely religious activities. See 16 N.N.C. § 1160.B.

This is a permanent foundation set in 1987 with a hogan structure which is used to conduct prayer meetings and manage business meetings. There are additional buildings arbor, parking lot and nine (9) teepee spots which can be used for ceremonies and used for National Convension Day. This is all open to the community.

Description of building and improvements to be placed on tribal land and the estimated cost thereof:

The permanent hogan structure has a 30 feet diameter. There is a 14 x 24 ft Kitchen which is located 50 yards away. Also, the parking lot takes up about an acre of the 3.5 acre total. Earthern foundation for nine (9) teepees covers a 12 foot diameter. This is all established within the 3.5 acres and there is no plans for improvement or additional structures at the moment.

plans for development of water and sewer:

Currently, there are no utilities powering this establishment. Haul water from neighboring church or chapter house in 200 gal. barrel. Once Mission Site is updated, Temez Electric will provide power.

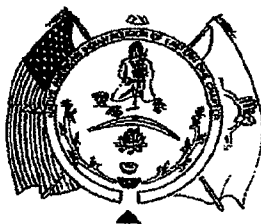

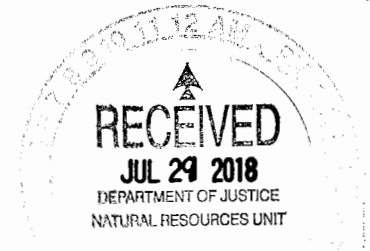

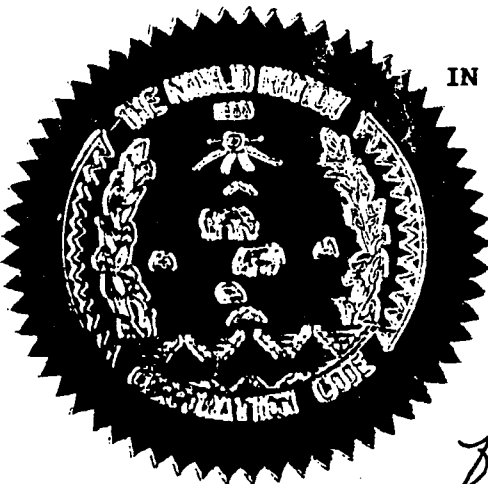

Sliding Fee Scale for Navajo Nation Mission Site Permits

Purpose: These policies serve as a guide for the Navajo Land Department to determine Mission Site Permit fees in order to assure that a fair cost-determination has been made.

Policy: A sliding scale for permit fees will be provided to Mission Site Permit applicants, and based on their ability to pay. Ability to pay is determined by the size and annual income of the mission, as well as the number of acres utilized. The sliding scale is not a comprehensive formula, but is used for guidance to determine permit fees. The Navajo Land Department shall determine the permit fee for each mission on a case-by-case basis. The Navajo Land Department has the authority to adjust the sliding scale and permit fee as they see fit, in accordance with Navajo Nation and federal law.

Scope: These policies apply to all Mission Site Permits in the Navajo Nation.

Procedure:

1. Entities applying for Mission Site Permits must provide written verification of income.
2. Self-declaration may only be used in special circumstances. Entities that are unable to provide written verification must provide a signed statement of income, and why they are unable to provide independent verification. This statement will be presented to the Navajo Land Department for review and final determination as to the sliding fee percentage.
3. Permit fees will be determined at the discretion of the Navajo Land Department on a case-by-case basis for entities unable or unwilling to provide any level of documentation.
4. Pursuant to 16 N.N.C. § 1157 the Navajo Land Department will require a minimum charge of \$15.00 per acre per year for all mission sites in the Navajo Nation.
5. Permit cost will increase based on the annual income of the mission and the number of acres used, pursuant to Table 1 below. An additional \$15 will be assessed for each acre and each \$10,000 increase in annual income. An additional fee may also be added for missions with large congregations.

The Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency's Public Water Systems Supervision Program ("PWSSP") reviewed Document No. 009968, Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Dine Chapter Mission Site. Currently, there is no water or wastewater infrastructure at this facility. When the Native American Indian Religion of Eastern Dine Chapter plans to install water and wastewater facilities, construction permits will be required. PWSSP recommends approval of this document.

All proposed drinking water projects will need to be permitted by the PWSSP-NNEPA. All proposed drinking water projects (extensions, upgrades, new wells, new public water systems, etc.) must also comply with the design review and construction permit requirements of the PWSSP pursuant §§1501 and 1601 of the Navajo Nation Primary Drinking Water Regulations.

All proposed wastewater projects will need to be permitted by the Domestic Wastewater Program-NNEPA. Extensions, upgrades, new sewer infrastructure, septic tanks, and other wastewater infrastructure must comply with the design review and construction permit requirements pursuant to §201 of the Domestic Wastewater Program.

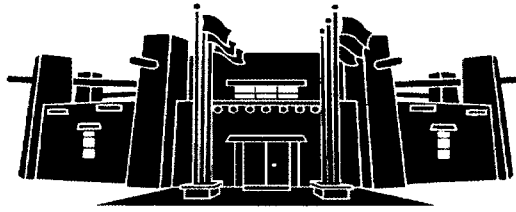
