Honorable Crystalyne Curley:

I appreciate the discussion with yourself, Honorable George Tolth, and the guidance from your Legislative Counsel to legally correct Legislation No. 0018-24 to appropriate \$3,850,000 from the UUFB for Chapters Emergency Fund Accounts.

As advised, I request a special session of the Navajo Nation Council to correct the legislation to properly waive 12 N.N.C. § 820 (O) to fulfill the legislative intent of equal distribution of \$35,000 to each chapter. I respectfully request the special session be convened Wednesday, January 31, 2024 at 10:00 am. This is so we can get the chapters their emergency funding as quickly as possible.

I appreciate the assistance of the Office of the Speaker in facilitating this request for a special session to take place as quickly as possible as to not hold up the emergency funds needed by chapters. I am prepared to sign this legislation into law once I receive the corrected legislation. Additionally, my staff stands ready to assist to expedite the distribution of funds once the legislation is enacted.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2024

AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$3,850,000 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE ("UUFB") FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS TO REPLENISH THEIR EMERGENCY FUND ACCOUNTS SO THEY ARE READY TO ADDRESS EMERGENCIES IN THEIR COMMUNITIES; AND PROVIDING \$2,147,317 TO THE NAVAJO NATION DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TO ADDRESS EMERGENCIES ACROSS THE NAVAJO NATION; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), AND § 820(L) TO ALLOW USE OF THE UUFB FOR RECURRING EXPENSES AND WAIVING § 820(M) REGARDING THE ANALYSIS REQUIRED BY THE OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A). As such, the Council may consider emergency legislation. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16). "[M]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, . . . or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council." 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16).
- B. As the governing body of the Navajo Nation, the Council may approve supplemental appropriations during the fiscal year. "Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)." 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- C. A "supplemental appropriation" is defined as: "[a]n appropriation of funds from the UUFB during the fiscal year, outside of the annual Comprehensive Budget Process." See Section XIV.33 of the FY2023 Budget Instructions Manual.
- D. Further Title 12 restrictions on supplemental appropriations, including all amounts from the UUFB include:

- 1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues, and payment of nonrecurring government expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. § 820(E); § 820(F).
- Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(J); § 820(L).
- 3. Nonrecurring revenues funds may be used only after the Controller determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues will be added to the UUFB. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
- 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F); 12 N.N.C. § 880.
- 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller, to ensure compliance with 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 6. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.
- E. This resolution is being offered as an emergency action because, due to heavy precipitation this winter, the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters have significantly depleted their Emergency Fund accounts by various amounts, and some accounts are completely exhausted. These critical Emergency Fund accounts are used by the 110 Chapters to respond to weather-related and other emergency situations in their communities.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. After recent snowstorms and heavy precipitation, the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters have depleted their Emergency Fund accounts, which are used by the Chapters to respond to weather-related and other emergency situations in their communities.
- B. As soon as possible, these Chapter accounts need to be replenished because further emergencies are expected across

- the Navajo Nation due to anticipated winter weather, muddy roads, and other difficulties.
- C. The Division of Community Development ("DCD") has provided a list of the dollar amount needed by each of the 110 Chapters to replenish each Chapter's Emergency Fund account. This list prepared by DCD is attached hereto as EXHIBIT A.
- D. For this UUFB funding request, the required Navajo Nation Budget Forms and the required Appendix J "Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary" from the FY2024 Budget Instructions Manual, are attached hereto as **EXHIBIT B**.
- E. The Office of the Controller has provided a memorandum regarding the requested UUFB funding, as required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). This memorandum indicates that the proposed expenditures are recurring. **EXHIBIT C.**
- F. The Office of Management and Budget has provided a memorandum regarding the proposed expenditures for the 110 Chapters. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M). **EXHIBIT D**.
- G. This legislation is offered as an emergency measure because of the current "pressing public need" for this funding for all 110 Chapters. These funds will enable Chapters to provide local services to quickly mitigate dire weather-related emergencies and prevent potential disasters, property damage, and injury or loss of life to people and livestock.
- H. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People to approve the needed emergency funds from the UUFB for all 110 Navajo Nation Chapters.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$3,850,000 FROM THE UUFB FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS TO REPLENISH THEIR EMERGENCY FUND ACCOUNTS

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$3,850,000 from the UUFB to the Division of Community Development for the 110 Chapters' Emergency Fund accounts. **EXHIBIT A**.
- B. This supplemental appropriation shall be from those funds that exceed the minimum fund reserve balance in the UUFB required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(J), as determined by the Controller.
- C. Upon the effective date of this Action, the approved UUFB funds shall be transferred to the Division of Community Development, and DCD shall then promptly provide the approved with \$35,000 distributed to each Chapter, in equal amounts.

D. As provided in 12 N.N.C. § 820(N), the UUFB funds approved herein shall not lapse at the end of Fiscal Year 2023, so long as each Chapter budgets these funds in the subsequent fiscal year for the same emergency purposes.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING AN ADDITIONAL \$2,147,317 FROM THE UUFB FOR THE NAVAJO NATION DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves an additional \$2,147,317 from the UUFB to the Navajo Nation Department of Emergency Management for emergency purposes as shown in the attached **EXHIBIT E**.
- B. This supplemental appropriation shall be from those funds that exceed the minimum fund reserve balance in the UUFB required by 12 N.N.C. §820(J), as determined by the Controller.
- C. Upon the effective date of this Action, the approved UUFB funds shall be transferred to the Department of Emergency Management, in accordance with **EXHIBIT E**.
- D. As provided in 12 N.N.C. § 820(N), the UUFB funds approved herein shall lapse at the end of Fiscal Year 2024, unless the Navajo Nation Council decides otherwise by a 7/8 vote.

SECTION FIVE. DIRECTIVE

- A. All 110 Chapters are hereby directed to use the \$35,000 allocation specifically for legitimate emergency activities in accordance with all applicable provisions in the FY2024 Budget Instructions Manual. Chapters shall not transfer any of the \$35,000 allocation to other accounts, or use any such funds for other purposes. Each Chapter shall maintain proper recordkeeping for its expenditures of the \$35,000 and other funds, if any, in their Emergency Fund accounts.
- B. In accordance with the Condition of Appropriation adopted by the Council in CS-78-23, the Administrative Service Centers under the Division of Community Development shall work with the 110 Chapters to ensure each Chapter completes a draft of its Emergency Fund Management Plan to present to the Resources and Development Committee by the end of the 3rd Quarter FY2024 deadline established in CS-78-23.
- C. The Office of the Controller, Office of Management and Budget, and the Division of Community Development shall work together to process and disburse these emergency funds to all the

Chapters within 10 days of the effective date of this legislation. This shall be their main priority until completed.

SECTION SIX. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), §820(J), and §820(L) TO ALLOW USE OF UUFB FUNDS FOR RECURRING EXPENSES and waiving § 820(M) regarding the analysis required by the office of management and budget

The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. \$820(E), \$820(F), §820(J), and §820(L) to allow use of the UUFB for the proposed UUFB expenditures approved herein. Such waivers are necessary because the proposed UUFB expenditures are considered recurring government expenses. In addition, the Navajo Nation hereby waives § 820(M) regarding the analysis required by the Office of Management and Budget, because such memorandum is not available at this time.

SECTION SEVEN. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action shall become effective as provided in 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and 2 N.N.C. \$164(A)(17).

SECTION EIGHT. SAVING CLAUSE

If any portion of this Action is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

Legislation 0018-24 to Appropriate \$1,304,652 from UUFB for Chapters

Emergency Fund Accounts

OMB has been asked to review budget forms in the revised amount of \$3,850,000 which is based on \$35,000 to each Chapter. OMB understands this is intended to amend the original legislation.

- 1. OMB reviewed the original budget forms for \$1,304,652 (Exhibit 'A') and noted the budget forms are not signed by the Division of Community Development (DCD) or the Executive Branch. The DCD is the Division that prepares, monitors, and works with the Chapter budgets. The FY 2024 Budget Instructions Manual refers to this.
 - Instead, the revised Budget forms are signed by Legislative Branch officials (Speaker and Legislative Chief of Staff). The Budget Forms, however, were prepared by DCD.
- 2. In prior years, the DCD or the Auditor General's Office did a report periodically on Chapter Fund balances which was used to make further allocations. OMB does not know if a report was done and is available. This was a factor and was used to calculate the allocations because Chapter balances vary.
- 3. If the equal distribution method is chosen, then Section 820 (O) on the 50/50 percent formula in the Appropriations Act would need to be waived. The 50/50 rule was adopted to ensure fairness in allocations to each Chapter.
- 4. OMB is informed the Department of Emergency Management (DEM) in Division of Public Safety is also seeking funding for their emergency operations. This should be considered to truly address the current emergency.
- 5. The above issues should be addressed, and the involved offices should work together to prepare the appropriate plans and budgets.
