17	Section One. Findings	
18	A. The Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund was established by the CJY-53-85.	
19	B. Each year, the Navajo Nation Council is mandated to "budget a sum equal to at	
20	least twelve percent (12%) of any and all projected revenues of the Navajo Nation"	
21	12 N.N.C. § 901.	
22	C. The fund principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund is defined as	
23	follows:	
24	"Fund principal" shall consist of all Navajo Nation Council contributions	
25	made pursuant to the twelve percent (12%) yearly commitment of all	
26	revenues of the Navajo Nation, including, but not limited to, revenues	
27	received from taxes, oil and gas mining/minerals, timber, land rentals,	
28	interest/dividends, gain on sale of securities and other revenue producing	
29	activities, plus any additional contributions from any source. 12 N.N.C.	
30	§903(A).	

D. The *fund principal* and the *fund income* of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund are defined as follows:

"Fund income" shall consist of all earnings generated by the principal of the Fund. 12 N.N.C. §903(B).

E. Navajo Nation law applicable to the Permanent Trust Fund provides -

"Fund principal shall not be expended except pursuant to a referendum adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of those voting in an election open to all registered Navajo voters or as set forth in § 909 of this Chapter. The Navajo Nation Council may place such a referendum on the ballot of any general or special election by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Council." 12 N.N.C. §904(C).

- F. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 301(B)(2), the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, among other duties and responsibilities, "review[s] and recommend[s] to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of funds."
- G. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9), the Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council reviews all proposed resolutions prepared for Navajo Nation Council consideration.
- H. Pursuant to 11 N.N.C. §403(A), referendum measures are referred to Navajo Nation voters through the Navajo Nation Council.

# Section Two. Referring a Referendum Measure and Ballot Language on Use of Fund Principal of the Permanent Trust Fund

The Navajo Nation Council hereby refers a referendum measure and ballot language on the use of the fund principal of the Permanent Trust Fund as follows:

**Official Title:** "Use of Fund Principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund to fund certain programs and services."

**Descriptive Summary:** The use of the fund principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund requires a referendum vote of registered voters of the

Navajo Nation. The referendum ballot question from the Navajo Nation Council is to give Navajo voters the opportunity to decide by majority vote on whether the fund principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund in the amount of \$206,164,213 should be used to fund certain programs and/or services as provided in the text and budget provided hereof.

### **Brief Statement of Legal Effect:**

A "YES" vote is in favor of using \$206,164,213 of the fund principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund for purposes of funding certain programs and/or services as described in the text and budget provided hereof. A "NO" vote is against using the fund principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund for purposes stated in the attached text and budget. A 'NO" vote will not expend any fund principal of the Permanent Trust Fund.

"Should the fund principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund in the amount of \$206,164,213 be used for purposes of funding certain programs and/or services as described in the complete text herein provided?

# Section Three. Complete Text of Proposed Legislation Referred by Referendum Measure to use Fund Principal of Permanent Trust Fund

The Navajo Nation Council hereby refers the complete text of the referendum measure to use the Fund Principal of the Navajo Nation Permanent Trust Fund in the amount of \$206,164,213 as follows.

The amount of \$206,164,213 from the fund principal of the Permanent Trust Fund, if the use of such fund is approved by voters of the Navajo Nation will be used to fund the Judicial and Public Safety Priority Listing, including:

- 1. Chinle Judicial and Public Safety facility \$1,100,000
- 2. Chinle Regional Public Safety Training Academy \$8,064,213
