TITLE OF RESOLUTION: PROPOSED STANDING COMMITTEE RESOLUTION; AN ACTION RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER; AMENDING LOCJN-04-17, WHICH APPROVED JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND PRIORITY LIST, TO INCLUDE THE BLUE GAP/TACHEE POLICE SUBSTATION; AND, RESCINDING LOCO-15-16

PURPOSE: The purpose of the resolution is to approve an amendment to LOCJN-04-17, the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Priority List to include Blue Gap/Tachee, Navajo Nation, Arizona—Blue Gap/Tachee Substation.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authority

The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such gave the Law and Order Committee approval authority to fund public safety facilities from the Navajo Sales Tax revenue. 2 N.N.C. §§ 600(A), *see also* CJA-03-13, and BFD-66-11 approving the JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN, sects. I and II (2011).

Section Two. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation Council established the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund and the fund shall be appropriated pursuant to the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan. 24 N.N.C. § 620(B).
- B. The Law and Order Committee approves a "Fund Priority List" which "shall identify and prioritize five Judicial Branch, Public Safety or combined Judicial/Public Safety facilities at specified locations that may receive funding from the Fund." BFD-66-11

1 Approving the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan, sect. III. (C);
2 BFD-66-11 attached as **Exhibit 4**.

3 C. The Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan, sect. III. (C) states that
4 “Expenditures from the Fund shall be in accord with this Fund Management Plan and
5 restricted to those facilities set forth in the duly approved Fund Priority List.
6 Expenditures from the Fund shall be made in compliance with Navajo Nation law and
7 applicable policies.”

8 D. Pursuant to LOCJN-04-17, the Law and Order Committee approved the Fund Priority
9 List for Fiscal Years 2016 and 2017. LOCJN-04-17 is attached as **Exhibit 1**.

10 E. In 2016, “[t]he Department of Corrections request[ed] for \$301,436.27 for the
11 construction and connection of utilities to the Blue Gap/Tachee Police Substation and
12 bunk house which will be located at the Intersection of BIA Route N4 and N29 in
13 Blue Gap, Arizona.” Pursuant to this request, the Law and Order Committee passed
14 LOCO-15-16, attached as **Exhibit 2**, which approved the allocation from the
15 Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund. The Blue Gap/Tachee project was not on the
16 Priority List approved through Law and Order Committee Resolution LOCJN-04-17.

17 F. In 2019, the Department Manager and the Division Director of the Navajo Nation
18 Division of Public Safety concurred with the Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter to allocate the
19 \$301,436.27 to a “change [in] the Scope of Work from the construction and utility
20 connection to purchase of a modular building for the police substation in Blue
21 Gap/Tachee.” The September 11, 2019 memorandum is attached as **Exhibit 3**.

22 G. The Law and Order Committee recognizes the need to abide by the Judicial/Public
23 Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan requirement that the “*Expenditures from the*
24 *Fund shall be in accord with this Fund Management Plan and restricted to those*
25 *facilities set forth in the duly approved Fund Priority List*”; therefore, the Law and
26 Order Committee will amend LOCJN-04-17, to include the purchase of a modular
27 building for the Blue Gap/Tachee police substation.



AMENDED AGREEMENT

RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF THE JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND PRIORITY LIST FOR FISCAL YEARS 2017 AND 2018 AS PROVIDED BY THE JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS,

The Judicial Branch ("Branch") and the Division of Public Safety ("Division") are joint administrators of the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan.

The Fund requires that a priority listing of facilities for funding be approved beginning with Fiscal Years 2008-2009 and every two years thereafter.

The Navajo Nation District Judicial/Public Safety Master Plan completed in March 2007 serves as a guide for the planning and design of judicial/public safety facilities.

The Chief Justice and the Division Director have reviewed the facility needs for judicial/public safety facilities and have identified projects that may receive funding from the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund.

THEREFORE, The Chief Justice and the Division Director hereby recommend to the Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council ("Committee") that the priorities for the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan be approved as follows:


1. Window Rock, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Division of Public Safety, Window Rock Judicial District and NDPS Headquarters Facility
2. Shiprock, Navajo Nation, New Mexico – Judicial/Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
3. Kayenta, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Judicial Facility
4. Chinle, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Public Safety Training Facility
5. Dilkon, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
6. Pinon, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Judicial/Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
7. Window Rock, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Supreme Court Facility
8. Ramah, Navajo Nation, New Mexico – Judicial Facility
9. Aneth, Navajo Nation, Utah – Judicial/Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
10. Alamo, Navajo Nation, New Mexico – Judicial/Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
11. Pueblo Pintado, Navajo Nation, New Mexico – Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
12. To'hajiilee, Navajo Nation, New Mexico – Public Safety/Correctional Facilities
13. Kaibeto, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Public Safety Substation
14. Cameron, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Public Safety Substation
15. Leupp, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Public Safety Substation
16. Tuba City, Navajo Nation, Arizona – Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services Facility

The Branch and Division further recommend to the Committee that the sequence of construction of facilities may be modified by the timing of approval of financing and upon the shovel- and construction-readiness of each project.

The Branch and Division further recommend to the Committee that from time to time, additional appropriation requests be made to the Navajo Nation Council for deposit into the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund to address construction of judicial/public safety facilities.

The Branch and Division further recommend to the Committee that from time to time, additional appropriation requests be considered for other judicial/public safety facility projects outside of the priority list.




The Department of Corrections requests for \$301,436.27 for the construction and connection of utilities to the Blue Gap/Tachee Police Substation and bunk house which will be located at the Intersection of BIA Route N4 and N29 in Blue Gap, Arizona. This project is a chapter development project to address the need for a Police Sub-Station to be located at this location to respond to request for services to the local communities in this area. Currently, the nearest police district is located in Chinle, Arizona, approximately 40 miles northeast of the Blue Gap/Tachee communities.

For a long time these two communities through the chapter's resolutions to have police presence within their community. This police substation and bunk house will be used by the Navajo Police, Apache County Police and Arizona Department of Public Safety when they are working in the area. This substation will also be available for officers when they need a place to complete reports and to make contact with others resources as they conduct police business in the area. In 2011, the Blue Gap/Tachee obtained a 2 bedroom modular home from the Department of Corrections to utilize for a Police substation. The chapter lacks funds to cover the construction of utility lines from the main line to the modular and hook up costs. The Blue Gap/Tachee is requesting for \$301,436.27 from the Judicial Public Safety Judicial funds to complete this project. BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authority

The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee (LOC) as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such gave LOC approval authority to fund public safety facilities from the Navajo Sales Tax revenue. 2 N.N.C. §§ 600(A); See also CJA-03-13, 22nd Navajo Nation Council, sect. 5, 30 (2013) and BFD-66-11 approving the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan, sects. I and II (2011).

Section Two. Findings

A. A budget reallocation "means the redesignation of appropriated or budgeted funds from one account to another account or to a newly-created account for a different use or purpose." 12 N.N.C. § 810 (D).

B. Reallocating funds between business units, here between Business Unit Number 1310 and NEW, requires LOC's oversight approval. NAVAJO NATION FISCAL YEAR 2017 BUDGET INSTRUCTIONS MANUAL § VI (2017).

C. The revenue from the Navajo Sales Tax is deposited into the Judicial/Public Safety Fund that is managed by a Fund Management Plan. BFD-66-11.

D. The Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Management Plan requires the Law and Order Committee to approve a Fund Priority

List. Id.; See also **Exhibit A** (Memorandum from Lisa Jymm, Principal Budget Analyst, to Delores Greyeyes, Department Manager III, July 25, 2016).

E. The Department of Corrections is requesting \$301,436.27 on behalf of the Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter for the construction and connections of utilities to the Police Substation and bunk house which will be located at the intersection of BIA Route N4 and N29. See **Exhibit B** (Memorandum from Delores Greyeyes, Department Manager III, to 164B Reviewers, July 13, 2016); See also **Exhibit C** (Estimate from Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, July 8, 2016).

F. The Police Substation is a chapter development project to address the need for police presence to respond to request for services within the community. *Id.*

G. Chinle Police Department is the nearest police district in the area located approximately forty (40) miles northeast of the Blue Gap/Tachee community. *Id.*

H. The Police Substation and bunk house will be utilized by Navajo Nation, Apache County, and Arizona Department of Public Safety Police Officers. *Id.*

I. The Office of the Controller confirmed the available unreserved balance for the Judicial Public Safety Fund as of August 19, 2016 is \$1, 286,951 available for appropriation. See **EXHIBIT D**.

J. The LOC accomplishes their purpose of improving the quality and effectiveness of the justice system within the Navajo Nation by providing the Blue Gap/Tachee Police Substation with funding for the construction and connection of utilities. 2 N.N.C. § 600 (C)(2).

K. In order to establish and develop the substation in Blue Gap/Tachee community the funding to construct and connect utilities to the Police Substation is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation.


Section Three. Approving the Budget Reallocation

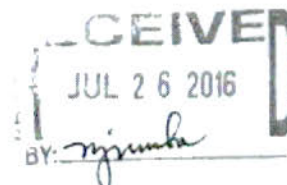

RE: Cost Estimate for Proposed Water Main Extension, Public Safety Building Project, Blue Gap, Apache County, AZ

Dear Ms. Draper,

The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) is providing a cost estimate to install a water main extension to serve a new Public Safety Building at the intersection of BIA Route N4 and N29 in Blue Gap, Arizona. This cost is for the utility right of way acquisition and construction services to install a water main extension commencing from the NTUA waterline to the project site. This estimate may be used for budgeting purposes only. Water service line to the building is not included in the cost as the site layout and design are not completed.

The following table shows a breakdown cost for the water main extension:

The Blue Gap Chapter Government will be responsible for the total cost to complete the work estimated at **\$167,328.00**. The estimate includes all materials, labor, equipment and permitting to install the water main. NTUA does not operate a wastewater system in this area. Therefore, you may hire an engineer to design a septic tank and drainfield system for the building.



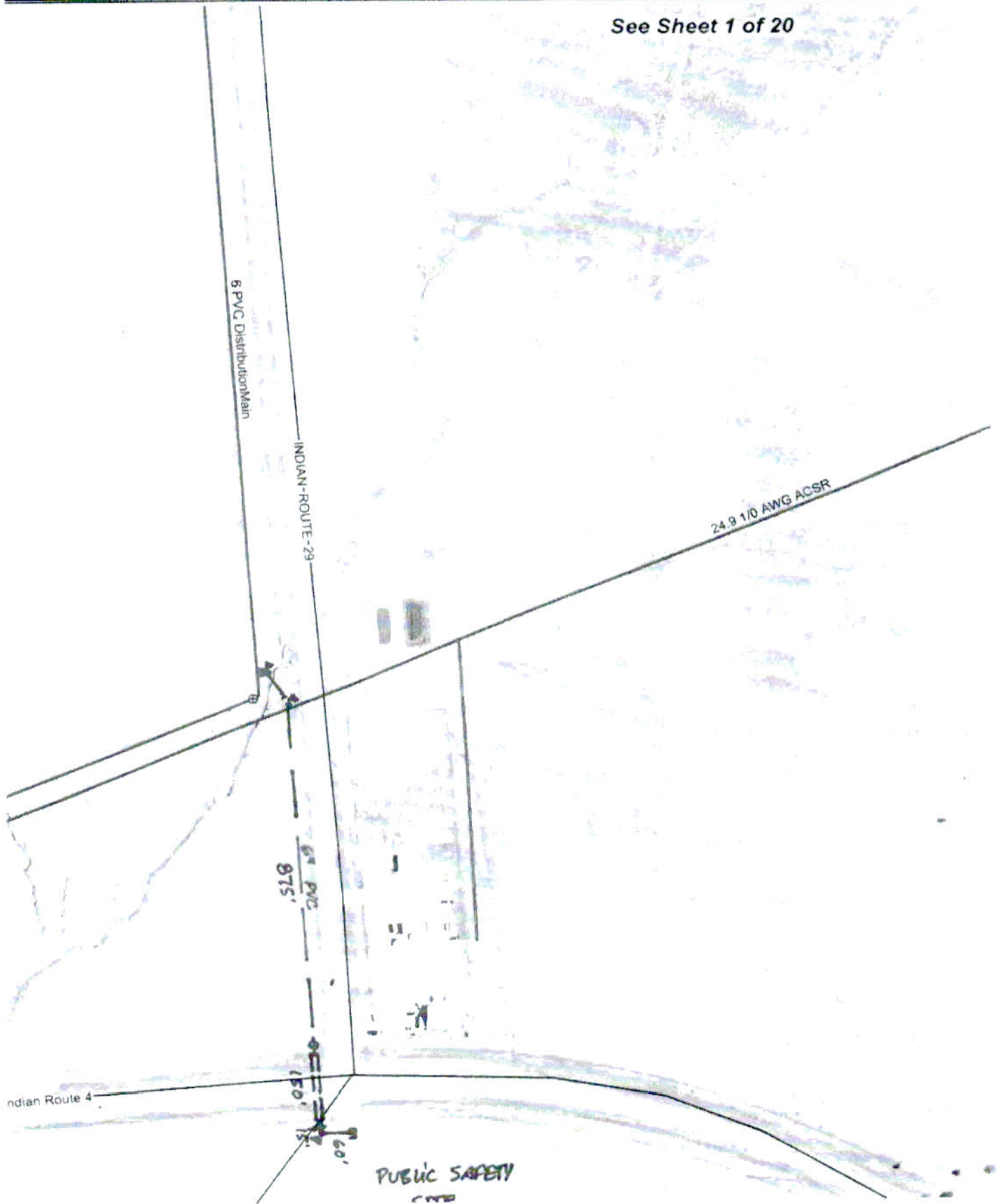

The gross General Fund Revenues, see Exhibit "A", as of April 30, 2016 is \$158,359,160 which includes a \$13,000,000 transfer from the Sales Tax Trust Fund. The total set asides is \$43,704,649. The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$114,654,511 which is 70.17% of the projection. The total expenditures by branch are shown on Exhibit "B". The Legislative Branch has expenditures of \$8,960,780, encumbrances of \$797,446, with a remaining budget of \$9,292,435. The Executive Branch expenditures are \$106,407,719; encumbrances are \$12,435,453 with a remaining budget of \$70,733,053. The Judicial Branch expenditures are \$7,504,398, with encumbrances of \$2,014 and remaining budget of \$6,623,039. Total General Fund expenditures are \$122,872,897; total encumbrances are \$13,234,913 with an overall remaining budget of \$86,648,528. The updated UUFB as of May 27, 2016 is \$9,569,087, attached Exhibit "C."

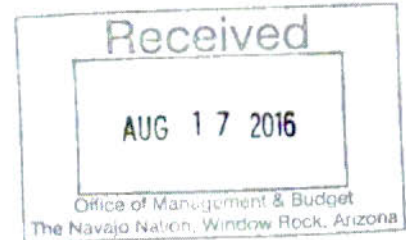



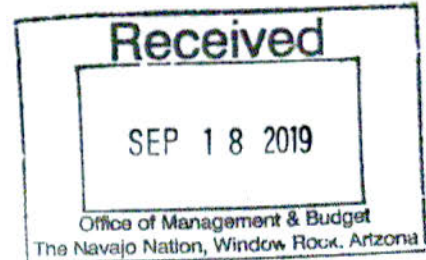

JUDICIAL/PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN

I. Establishment

The Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund ("Fund") was established by Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJA-03-07. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the revenue from the Navajo Sales Tax shall be deposited into the Fund in accord with 24 N.N.C. §620. Additional appropriations may be made from time to time by the Navajo Nation Council. All funds deposited into the Fund shall be used only as provided herein.

II. Purpose

The fund is established as a special revenue fund to provide funding for judicial and public safety facilities as approved by the ~~Judiciary Committee and Public Safety~~ Law and Order Committee in the Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Priority List ("Fund Priority List"). Projects or activities which may be funded by the Fund include, but are not limited to:

- A. Planning, site clearance, and development;
- B. Site improvement and landscape development;
- C. Utility access;
- D. Street access and parking area;
- E. Construction, maintenance, renovation and repair; and
- F. Debt service for the financing of the above activities.

III. Administration

A. Administration

The Judicial Branch ("Branch") and the Division of Public Safety ("Division") shall jointly administer the Fund or, either the Branch or the Division may independently administer the fund pursuant to a written agreement between the Branch and the Division. The Controller shall establish a Fund account and provide assistance with Fund administration.

1 B. Expenditures

2 Expenditures from the Fund shall be in accord with this Fund Management Plan and
3 restricted to those facilities set forth in the duly approved Fund Priority List. Expenditures
4 from the Fund shall be made in compliance with Navajo Nation law and applicable
5 policies.

6 C. Judicial/Public Safety Facilities Fund Priority List

7 Every two years the ~~Judiciary Committee and Public Safety~~ Law and Order Committee
8 shall approve ~~an identical~~ a Fund Priority List to cover a two fiscal year period beginning
9 with Fiscal Year 2008 and Fiscal Year 2009. The Fund Priority List shall identify and
10 prioritize five Judicial Branch, Public Safety or combined Judicial/Public Safety facilities
11 at specified locations that may receive funding from the Fund.

12 D. Quarterly Reports

13 The Branch and Division shall submit quarterly written reports to the ~~Judicial~~
14 ~~Committee, Public Safety~~ Law and Order Committee and the Budget and Finance
15 Committee on the status of the Fund, including all projected and realized Fund revenue and
16 expenditures.

17 E. Annual Audit

18 The Fund shall be audited annually by independent auditors as part of the overall audit
19 of the Navajo Nation government.

21 **IV. Amendments**

22 The Fund Management Plan may be amended by the Budget and Finance Committee,
23 upon recommendation by the ~~Judiciary Committee and the Public Safety~~ Law and Order

**SCOPE OF WORK
FOR
BLUE GAP/TACHEE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING**

The Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter (Chapter) was funded by Navajo Nation Council, Law and Order Committee Resolution LOCO-15-16 title "Approving an Allocation of \$301,436.27 from the Judicial/Safety Facilities Fund, Business Unit Number 1310, for the Construction and Connection of Utility at the Blue Gap/Tachee Police Substation, Business NEW". This Law and Order legislation was to fund the Construction and Connection of Utility to the Blue Gap/Tachee Police Substation (Substation) with the intention of connecting utility to existing Substation. Previous months earlier, Chapter accepted an offer from Nation's Correction Office of their excess modular buildings after the completion of their new Judicial Building in Crownpoint, NM. The Chapter quickly accepted and had it delivered. The modular building came in two sections, an octagon Hogan type structure. Since the delivery of the modular building, the building has remained in place on Chapter ground. Chapter's plan for the modular building was to move the two sections(modular Building) to a site south of Blue Gap C-Store and across N-4 Road, a location for Substation. After re-evaluation and re-assessment of the location, as determined by the Chapter Officials the site will require addition funds to fully develop the Substation and Chapter does not have the fund to fully construct the Substation.

After much discussion by Chapter Officials considering all cost and location, the Chapter Officials decided to request the Law and Order Committee to amend the funding legislation LOCO-15-16 from original purpose for construction and utility connection at Blue Gap/Tachee Police Substation to purchase a new Blue Gap/Tachee Police modular building to be the Police Substation. We have changed the Substation location site also. We approached the Navajo Nation Oil and Gas Company(NNOGC) if possible to relinquish/re-assign an acre of their unused north business tract to Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter. Their north business tract had water, electric and sewer line within the tract. If NNOGC is agreeable to our proposal their cooperation will relieve vast electric, water and sewer connection cost. There after we began talks with NNOGC, the discussions resulted in development of Limited Landuse Agreement and Memorandum of Agreement. We also received full support from NNOGC Board of Director to relinquish/transfer an acre of the business site lease to our chapter. To improve the business, NNOGC recently received 2.4 million to build new C-Store next to existing old store. Their fund includes new water and sewer line, relocate fueling station and turn old store into laundromat.

The Chapter intends to provide this building to house Public Safety Officers who may have responded to a late hour call to our area or Pinon. Most always officers who have gone beyond

their duty hours that this building will provide the much needed rest and recuperation place for officers before continue on to their next assignment. The Chapter will furnish bedding, shower, relaxing area, internet and other amenities. Chapter may consider establishing Memorandum of Agreement with other law enforcement agencies or internally with the Nation force. Our objective is to provide comfort and convenience for our Police Officers. The Chapter will secure the site, if needed repair chain link fence, a gate with a lock and security cameras. The entrance to the site will be separate from the NNOGC and the Chapter will install a culvert pipe at turn-off.

The Chapter will design a simple building plan and announce in local newspaper for Request for Proposal for Modular building to comply with Navajo Nation Procurement Act when the cost exceeds \$50,000. After we have found creditable contractor, contract will be develop and route through SAS process. We expect the process to be completed within three(3) months. Since Chapter has NNOGC's agreement, we have the site surveyed and identified the one acre site. Also through our MOA, NNOGC requested thirty feet of Row of Way be reserved for sewer line upgrade construction. Our Council Delegate Kee A. Begay has dropped legislation for Relinquishment or Re-assignment of NNOGC's one acre of land to Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter.



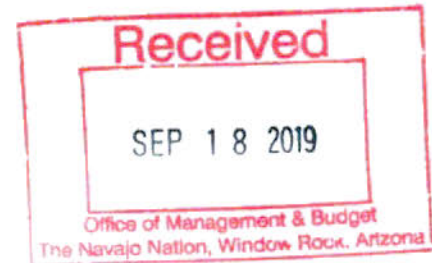

3. Therefore, the correct signature block would be under Section 164 (A), budget reallocation or amendment, for approval by the appropriate oversight committee.

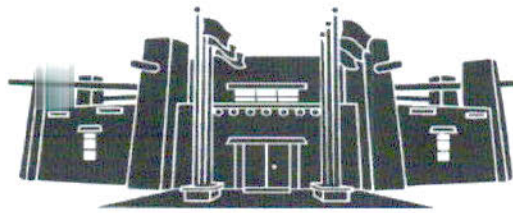

Nevertheless, "the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall introduce [the proposed resolution] into the legislative process by assigning it to the respective oversight committee(s) of the Navajo Nation Council having authority over the matters for proper consideration." 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(5).
