SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. Ms. Denise Delilah Johnson (date of birth January 27, 1984) was an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation. See Exhibit "A," *Certificate of Navajo Indian Blood.* On July 16, 2002, she relinquished her membership with the Navajo Nation. See Exhibit "B," enrollment relinquishment with the Navajo Nation. Subsequently, she enrolled with the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

B. On December 27, 2017, Ms. Denise Delilah Johnson filed for relinquishment of her enrollment with the White Mountain Apache Tribe. See Exhibit "C," *Relinquishment of Tribal Head Rights*. On February 14, 2018, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council approved Ms. Johnson's relinquishment request. See Exhibit "D," resolution number 02-2018-35, *Approval to Grant Tribal Relinquishment Request of Denise Delilah Johnson*. C. On March 19, 2018, the Vital Records Department of the White Mountain Apache Tribe provided the Council's relinquishment notice to Ms. Denise Delilah Johnson. See lower portion of Exhibit "C," *Relinquishment of Tribal Head Rights*. See also, Exhibit "E," subsequent notice of Vital Records Department dated April 9, 2018, White Mountain Apache Tribe.


D. Ms. Denise Delilah Johnson is seeking reinstatement with the Navajo Nation. See Exhibit "F", letter dated July 6, 2018.

E. Ms. Denise Johnson is member of the Chichiltah community. See Exhibit "G," Ms. Johnson's letter dated September 23, 2018, addressed to Ms. Roselyn John, Community Services Coordinator, Chichiltah Chapter. See also, Exhibit "H," letter from Ms. Roselyn John dated October 20, 2018 and addressed to Speaker Seth Damon, Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL FOR REENROLLMENT

Ms. Denise Delilah Johnson, is and shall be reinstated, or otherwise reenrolled, as a member of the Navajo Nation. By this action of the Navajo Nation Council and pursuant to the laws of the Navajo Nation, she shall be entitled to all rights, benefits and privileges associated with membership with the Navajo Nation.

WHEREAS, Tribal Member, Denise Delilah Johnson, has requested that her tribal membership with the White Mountain Apache Tribe be relinquished so that she may become eligible for enrollment with Navajo Nation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Enrollment Committee reviewed and approved the relinquishment requests at a duly called meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with the recommendation of the Tribal Enrollment Committee that the relinquishment from tribal membership be approved for Denise Delilah Johnson.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the tribal relinquishment request of Denise Delilah Johnson, along with any and all privileges accorded to members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe such as, but not limited to, hunting, fishing, and recreational privileges upon the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Office of Vital Records to remove Denise Delilah Johnson from the membership rolls of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event that this Resolution conflicts with a prior Resolution or Policy, this Resolution shall supersede and govern over the conflicting subject matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that in the event this Resolution directly conflicts with the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Ordinances or, any material facts concerning the issues presented are later found to be false, this Resolution shall be deemed null and void and have no legal effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>FEBRUARY 14, 2018</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against with <u>ONE</u> abstaining by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it under the enumerated powers listed in Article IV, Section 1 of the WMAT Constitution, so ratified on September 30, 1993, and federally recognized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


