BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 601(B)(14), reviews and makes recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments to and enactments in the Navajo Nation Code.
- B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, among other duties and responsibilities, has oversight authority over matters related to education within the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §401 (6) (a)
- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A) (9), the committee reviews proposed legislation which requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council enacts laws and sets policy for the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS



- 1 A. The Navajo Nation Code provides that the Navajo Nation Board of Education shall  
2 consist of 11 members. 10 N.N.C. §106 (B) (1)
- 3 B. The Navajo Nation Code requires that of those 11 members of the Board, five members  
4 shall be elected from the five agencies. 10 N.N.C. § 106 (B) (2)
- 5 C. The Navajo Nation Code also requires that of those 11 members of the Board, six  
6 members shall be appointed by the President of the Navajo Nation and confirmed by the  
7 Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 10  
8 N.N.C. § 106 (B) (3)
- 9 D. The Navajo Nation Code requires that should vacancies occur among the six appointed  
10 members of the Board for any reason the President of the Navajo Nation shall make  
11 appointments to fill such vacancies for the unexpired term, subject to the confirmation of  
12 the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 10  
13 N.N.C. §106 (B) (5)
- 14 E. Appointment vacancies exist on the Board thereby reducing the number of members  
15 available to provide a quorum for the conduct of the official business of the Navajo  
16 Nation Board of Education
- 17 F. The Navajo Nation Council finds it in the best interest of the Navajo People to revise the  
18 requirements for a quorum so the work of the Navajo Nation Board of Education can  
19 proceed unimpeded by vacancies created by a delay or failure to appoint.
- 20 G. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds it in the best interest of the Navajo People to  
21 now enact the following amendments to the Navajo Nation Code concerning the  
22 Navajo Nation School Board.

24 **SECTION THREE. AMENDING TITLE 10**

25 The Navajo Nation hereby amends the Navajo Nation Code at 10 N.N.C. § 106 (E) as

## SUBCHAPTER 2. DINÉ EDUCATION

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### § 106. Navajo Nation board of Education

#### A. Establishment-Navajo Nation Board of Education.

There is hereby established the Navajo Nation Board of Education (hereinafter, "the Board"), with the Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation government for the specialized purpose of overseeing the operation of all schools serving the Navajo Nation, either directly if under the immediate jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, or if operated by another government, by joint powers agreements, memoranda of understanding/agreement, cooperative agreements or other appropriate intergovernmental instruments.

#### B. Membership.

1. The Board shall consist of 11 members.

2. Five Board members shall be elected to four year terms, one at-large from each of the following agencies: Western, Chinle, Fort Defiance, Shiprock and Eastern. If vacancies occur in any of the five elected Board positions, for any reason, the vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as provided in the Navajo Election Code for school board members in 11 N.N.C. § 161(E).

3. Six Board members shall be appointed to six year terms by the President of the Navajo Nation and confirmed by the Education Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. These members will be appointed in order to ensure that a variety of experience and knowledge is present on the Board.

4. The six appointed members of the Board shall serve as the Board from the time of the confirmation of all six appointed members by the Education Committee until the five elected Board members are elected in the 2006 Navajo Nation General Election.

5. If vacancies occur in any of the six appointed Board positions, for any reason, the President of the Navajo Nation shall make appointments to fill such vacancies for the unexpired remainders of the vacant Board position term, subject to confirmation by the Education Committee.

#### C. Qualifications of appointed/elected Board members.

1. The six appointed Board members shall meet the following qualifications:

- a. Two appointed Board members will be individuals who are recognized for their knowledge of traditional Navajo culture;
- b. One appointed Board member will be a school administrator working on the Navajo Nation;
- c. Two appointed Board member will be parents of at least one child enrolled in a Kindergarten, elementary, or secondary program on the Navajo Nation;
- d. One appointed Board member will be a teacher employed in a Bureau of Indian Affairs funded or state public school operating on the Navajo Nation.

2. The five elected Board members shall have at least a four year academic degree from an accredited college or university.

D. Qualifications of all Board members.

All Board members shall meet the following qualifications:

1. All Board members shall be enrolled members of the Navajo Nation;
2. All Board members shall be at least 25 years of age;
3. All Board members shall not be delegates to the Navajo Nation Council, a member of a school board of a school operating on the Navajo Nation, or an employee of the Department of Diné Education.
4. All Board members shall not have been convicted of a felony or of any crime involving child abuse or neglect.

E. Meetings.

1. All meetings of the Board shall be public, and shall be held at a variety of locations either on or in immediate proximity to the Navajo Nation so as to make it possible for interested Navajo public and Navajo educators to attend.

2. The Board shall meet on such schedule as is necessary to carry out its responsibilities, or at the call of its presiding officer.

1           3. An electronic record of the procedures of the Board shall be kept, and shall be  
2 made available to the public in accord with the Navajo Nation Privacy and Access to  
3 Information Act.

4           4. During meetings of the Board an opportunity shall be made available for the  
5 public to speak on any issue before the Board.

6           5. A quorum for the purposes of conducting official business, shall consist of a  
7 majority of the sitting members; the number of vacant seats awaiting appointment not  
8 withstanding.

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13 **SECTION FOUR. CODIFICATION**

14           The provisions of the Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code  
15 shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall  
16 incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

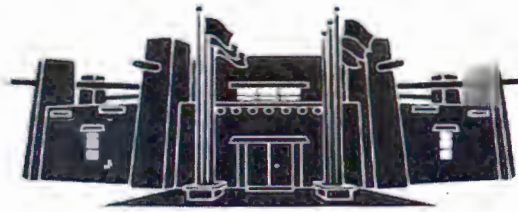

18 **SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE**

19           Should any provision of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme  
20 Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation  
21 Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

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23 **SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE**

24           The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).  
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


