SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Fish and Wildlife Department is within the Division of Natural Resources. The Resources and Development Committee serves as the oversight committee for the Division of Natural Resources. 2 N.N.C § 501 (C) (1).
- B. The Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife, Proprietary/Enterprise Fund, Fund Management Plan, which is included in **Exhibit C** indicates the legislative oversight and authority for the Fund is the Resources and Development Committee and the Budget and Finance Committee. **Exhibit C**, Section III, Legislative Oversight and Authority.
- C. A budget modification is an increase or decrease to an existing business unit budget in a previously approved budget. Budget modifications require oversight approval before

1 the modification can be processed. Navajo Nation Budget Instruction Manual, Fiscal
2 Year 2024, Section 12 (C)(3).

4 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

5 A. The Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife Proprietary/Enterprise Fund, Fund
6 Management Plan, states that the purpose of the Fund is to “will facilitate the
7 Department to receive and expend revenue and fees collected from hunting, fishing and
8 other wildlife management activities and services provided to improve Department
9 capabilities in wildlife management, project planning and implementation,
10 infrastructure and development and operations.” **Exhibit C**, Section II.

11 B. The Navajo Nation Fish and Wildlife Department has requested a budget increase of
12 \$1,108,500 to Business Unit 915008. Budget forms supporting this request are
13 included in **Exhibit A**.

14 C. The Executive Branch Section 164 Review is attached as **Exhibit B**.

17 The Navajo Nation hereby approves the budget modification increasing Navajo Nation

The Fish and Wildlife unaudited balance sheet and income statement are attached, Exhibit A.

- 1) The Fish and Wildlife program has generated \$4,582 of revenue as of October 31, 2023. There are \$13,495 of expenditures and a net loss of \$8,913.
- 2) The unappropriated fund balance as of October 31, 2023 is \$1,443,610.
- 3) The Fish and Wildlife program budgeted \$825,000 during the FY 24 budget period. The program is requesting to access an additional \$1,108,500. This would leave an amount of \$335,109.81 of fund balance remaining.

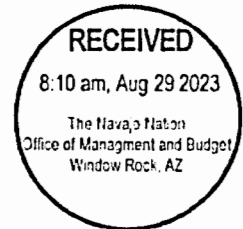

Pursuant to Executive Order No. 06-2023, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) reviewed the proposed document and deems the document sufficient with the following comments:

1. The Fiscal Year 2024 approved budget for business unit no. 915008 is \$825,000.
2. On August 23, 2023 the Controller issued a revised Revenue Projection for business unit no. 915008 for \$935,000.00; an increase of \$110,000. A revised budget was never presented and approved during the FY 2024 budget process. Hence, the budget remains at \$825,000.
3. This proposed "supplemental funding" for \$1,108,500 seems to be a request to access the fund balance for BU#915008 for capital purchases (building and vehicles).
4. What is the correct funding level considering the above? The Controller's Office should advise, and issue a new FY 2024 funding level for BU#915008, if necessary.
5. Budget Forms: Correction need to be made to Budget Form 1, Part III, before proceeding to the next reviewer.

ACI has worked with the aquaculture engineers at Tetra Tech to develop the conceptual design of what will be an indoor rearing facility at the Navajo Nation Fish Hatchery. ACI provided Tetra Tech with pertinent data about the current rearing program, water quality, and facility infrastructure. ACI facilitated a meeting with Tetra Tech, ACI, and the hatchery staff to talk about operating history, confirm the production program, biological design criteria, and fish culture practices. ACI, hatchery staff, and Tetra Tech, examined two other production scenarios prior to settling on the conceptual design presented.

ACI also provided Tetra Tech with confirmed water flow rates from the well and spring. Additionally, ACI provided the following:

Tetra Tech will engineer the slab, building, and provide architectural plans, elevations, and details. They will also design site demolition, grading, erosion control, and restoration. Additionally, they will provide site piping outside the building envelope. Tetra Tech will provide design for backup power (generator and ATS) and building power systems as well. ACI will construct the building according to Tetra Tech specifications.

Mechanical Building

Tetra Tech will engineer the slab, building, and provide architectural plans, elevations, and details for the approximately 28'x19' (532 sq/ft) building. 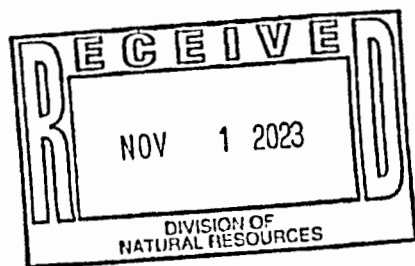

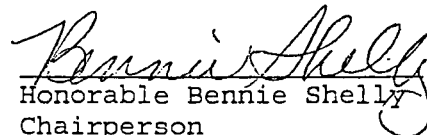

BE IT ENACTED:

1. The Budget and Finance Committee, in accord with 23 N.N.C.§506, approves the Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund Management Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit A.
2. The Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife is hereby directed to submit to the Resources Committee and the Budget and Finance Committee for recommendation to the Navajo Nation Council the annual budget for the Division of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund, in accord with the Budget Instructions and Policies Manual for each Navajo Nation fiscal year.
3. The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall establish an account for the Division of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund and manage the account in accord with the Division of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund Management Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit A, and the eligibility criteria for the expenditure of revenues generated by programs and departments, as set forth in Resolution BFN-187-03.

**NAVAJO NATION DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE
PROPRIETARY/ENTERPRISE FUND
FUND MANAGEMENT PLAN**

I. Establishment

The Department of Fish and Wildlife proprietary/enterprise fund is hereby established within the Division Natural Resources of the Executive Branch. The Enterprise Fund is for use by the Department of Fish and Wildlife in carrying out its mandated responsibilities to manage, conserve and protect the Navajo Nation's fish, wildlife and plant resources and their habitats.

II. Purpose

The Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife Proprietary/Enterprise Fund will facilitate the Department to receive and expend revenues and fees collected from hunting, fishing and other wildlife management activities and services provided to improve Department capabilities in wildlife management, project planning and implementation, infrastructure development and operations.

III. Legislative Oversight and Authority

- A. Pursuant to 2 NNC §695 (B) (14), the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is the oversight committee for the Division of Natural Resources within which the Department of Fish and Wildlife is established. The Government Services Committee, pursuant to GSCF-3-94 approved the Plan of Operation for the Department.
- B. The Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to coordinate, oversee and regulate the fiscal, financial, investment, contracting and audit policies of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to 2 NNC §372.

IV. Administration

- A. Department of Fish and Wildlife

The Department of Fish and Wildlife shall:

- 1. Collect and deposit all hunting, fishing and related revenues/fees; and
- 2. Prepare an annual budget and expenditure plan for recommendation to the Navajo Nation Council;
- 3. Provide hunting and fishing opportunities and other outdoor recreation activities to the general public; and provide wildlife management/data management services to the general public; and

4. Periodically review and update user fees, permit fees and fees charged for services, pursuant to RCJN-118-93.

B. Office of the Controller

The Controller of the Navajo Nation or designee shall:

1. Establish an enterprise fund account for the Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund to address the collection of revenues and fees collected from hunting, fishing and other wildlife management activities and services provided; and
2. Review and regulate expenditures from the Department of Fish and Wildlife to ensure compliance with Navajo Nation laws and policies relative to the enterprise fund account;
3. Maintain an accurate accounting of all transactions in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and Navajo Nation policies and procedures; and
4. Provide the Director of the Department of Fish and Wildlife a monthly report detailing revenues deposited/received, expenditures and open commitments.

V. Sources of Revenues

Permit fee recommendations are made by the Department of Fish and Wildlife to the Executive Director, Division of Natural Resources, pursuant to RCJN-118-93, where the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council delegated this responsibility to the Division of Natural Resources, for final approval. Permit fee recommendations are based upon market value of the resource, comparable local market values, product demand, departmental operational needs and willingness to pay. The Department distinguishes between Navajos and non-Navajos and sets permit fees according to these categories. Pursuant to RCJN-118-93, Navajo big game permit fees will increase no more than 15% annually, except upon the approval of the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. There are no limits placed upon increasing non-Navajo big game permit fees. Pursuant to RCAP-82-95, Navajo fishing and small game permit fees may not increase more than 25% annually and non-Navajo fishing and small game permit fees may not increase more than 50% annually without approval by the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation council.

VI. Annual Budget/Expenditure Plan

Expenditures from this account shall include salaries, payroll taxes, fringe benefits, vehicle, per diem and other travel expenses such as helicopter and fixed wing needs for wildlife and habitat surveys, radio telemetry and habitat enhancement projects, supplies and materials, equipment rental, utilities and

communication expenses, repairs and maintenance, contractual services, matching funds and capital expenditures.

Expenditures from the Enterprise Fund shall be made in accordance with established Navajo Nation budget policies and procedures.

On an annual basis, an amount will be determined as expenditure to be applied to the construction a new office building.

VII. Accounting, Revenue Intake and Expenditure Control

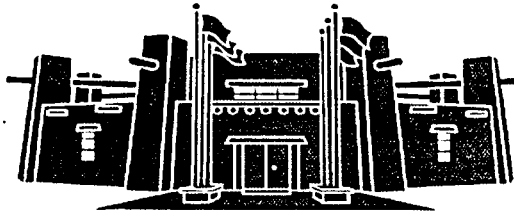
- A. All books of account for the Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund shall be maintained by the Office of the Controller in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and Navajo Nation policies.
- B. All revenues shall be accepted in the form of bank or cashier's checks, bank or United States Postal Service money orders, and Navajo Nation internal payment documents. No cash or personal checks will be accepted as payment.
- C. All revenues received shall be deposited in appropriate depository accounts on a daily basis, if practicable. In no case shall the deposit be delayed past the close of business on the next business day following the receipt of revenue.
- D. All expenditures shall be made by Navajo Nation check and processed in accord with Navajo Nation policies.

VIII. Audits and Reports

- A. The books of account for the Department of Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund shall be subject to periodic audit in conjunction with the annual Navajo Nation audit.
- B. The Director of Department of Fish and Wildlife shall make quarterly written reports to the Navajo Nation Council on the status of the Department of the Fish and Wildlife Enterprise Fund.
- C. The Department of Fish and Wildlife shall report at least annually on the use of the fund revenues to the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. All fees, charges, and revenue projections will be subject to periodic review at least annually. This periodic review will include the participation of the Controller to review the fees, charges and projected revenue, historical cost data, level of service, demand, and forecasting methods.

IX. Amendments

This fund management plan may be amended from time to time by the Budget and Finance Committee of the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Resources Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, as deemed appropriate.
