TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING THE NAVAJO NATION CODE TITLE 10 AT 10 N.N.C § 2003 (B), DINÉ COLLEGE BOARD OF REGENTS; SELECTION

PURPOSE: This resolution if approved amend Title 10 of the Navajo Nation Code at 10 N.N.C. § 2003 (B), Diné College Board of Regents membership from a HEHSC member to an appointee who is a member of the Navajo Nation with a Masters or Doctorate degree and five (5) to ten (10) years of work experience in post-secondary education.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed legislation in detail.

19	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY			
20	A. The Navajo Nation established the Health, Education and Human Services Committee			
21	(HEHSC) as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such empowered the HEHSC to			
22	review and recommend resolutions relating to education. 2 N.N.C. §§ 400 (A) and 401			
23	(B)(6)(A) (2012); CO-45-12.			
24	B. The HEHSC serves as oversight over colleges within the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 401			
25	(C)(3) (2012); CO-45-12.			
26	C. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee (LOC) as a Navajo Nation			
27	standing committee and as such empowered LOC to review and make recommendations			
28	to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed Navajo Nation Code amendments and			
29	enactments. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 600 (A), 601 (B)(14) (2012); CO-45-12.

- D. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A) (2012); CO-45-12.
- E. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (2012); CO-45-12.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is authorized to consider and grant final approval on behalf of the Navajo Nation to any amendments or modifications to this Chapter [19]. This authority, however, is subject to and limited by the continuing integrity of the portions of this Chapter entitled "Bonds" and any other portion justifiably relied upon by any purchaser of bonds or holder of bonds issued by Diné College or any other evidences of indebtedness issued by Diné College to the extent that any modifications or amendments hereafter approved by the Navajo Nation Council may not have the effect of prejudicing the rights of such purchasers or holders, or detract from the validity of such bonds or evidences of indebtedness and their enforcement. 10 N.N.C. § 2022 (1997); CAP-35-97.
- B. The HEHSC provides legislative oversight over health, social service, education, general governmental services and human services, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 400 (C)(1).
- C. Due to the HEHSC members responsibilities concerning the additional five (5) legislative oversight areas the HEHSC members determined appointing a member of the Navajo Nation to the Diné College Board of Regents, with a Masters or Doctorate degree and five (5) to ten (10) years of work experience in post-secondary education, would qualify as a Board of Regent in lieu of the HEHSC Chairperson or committee designee.
- D. The HEHSC finds it in the best interest of the Navajo people to amend the Diné College Board of Regents membership from a HEHSC member to an appointee who is a member of the Navajo Nation with a Masters or Doctorate degree and five (5) to ten (10) years of work experience in post-secondary education.

SECTION THREE. AMENDMENT TO TITLE 10

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NAVAJO NATION CODE TITLE 10. EDUCATION CHAPTER 19. DINÉ COLLEGE

§ 2003. Board of Regents; selection

B. The Board of Regents shall consist of eight members, including the Chairperson of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee or the committee's designee appointee who is a member of the Navajo Nation with a Masters or Doctorate degree and five (5) to ten (10) years of work experience in post-secondary education, the Navajo Nation Superintendent of Schools, and the President of the Diné College Student Body who shall be full official members. Five shall be enrolled members of the Navajo Nation and subject to confirmation and removal by the Government Services Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation. In the event that the Government Services Naabik'íyáti' Committee within 30 days declines or fails for any reason to pass a resolution confirming an appointment made by the Navajo Nation President, the appointee shall not sit as a Regent and the President shall submit an alternative appointee within two weeks of the Government Services Naabik'íyáti' Committee action declining to confirm the appointment, or the expiration of the 30 day period for confirmation.

SECTION FOUR. CODIFICATION

The provision of this Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative

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Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions into the next codification or supplement of the Navajo Nation Code.


SECTION FIVE. SAVINGS CLAUSE

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Should any provision of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain in the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

This provision of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221 (B).
