**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this legislation is to proclaim the third week in June as Diné Pride Week on a recurring annual basis.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

28	C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a standing


## **SECTION 2. FINDINGS**

A. The Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council issued a Diné Pride Week Proclamation designated for the week of June 22, 2020 through June 28, 2020. Diné Pride Week Proclamation attached as Exhibit A.

- B. The 2020 Diné Pride Week Proclamation states that "President William J. Clinton proclaimed June 2000 as Gay and Lesbian Month and President Barack H. Obama proclaimed June 2016 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Pride Month to acknowledge the importance of respect and fair treatment for all people[.]"
- C. The 2020 Diné Pride Week Proclamation states that "the Navajo Nation recognizes that lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, two-spirit people (LGBTQ+) are important to our livelihood and diversity since time immemorial[.]"
- D. The 2020 Diné Pride Week Proclamation further states that "the Navajo Nation will continue to protect its citizens from discrimination based on age, race, disability, ethnicity, family or marital status, gender identity or expression, language, national origin, physical and mental ability, religion, sexual orientation, veteran status and other characteristics that make our citizens unique under the law[.]"
- E. The 2020 Diné Pride Week Proclamation further states that "the Navajo Nation is committed to fostering, cultivating, and preserving a culture of inclusion, fairness and equality[.]"
- F. The 2020 Diné Pride Week Proclamation further states that "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, two-spirit people (LGBTQ+) are ni'hookáá' diyin diné'é bíla' ashdla'ii, who are five-fingered, earth-surface holy people who are sacred[.]"
- G. The 2020 Diné Pride Week Proclamation further states "the Navajo Nation stands behind LGBTQ+ members and will continue to uplift all people, both young and long-lived, in their pursuit of basic civil and human rights[.]"

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation recognizes that lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and two-spirit people (LGBTQ+) are important to our livelihood and diversity since time immemorial;

WHEREAS, President William J. Clinton proclaimed June 2000 as Gay and Lesbian Pride Month and President Barack H. Obama proclaimed June 2016 as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Pride Month to acknowledge the importance of respect and fair treatment for all people;

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation will continue to protect its citizens from discrimination based on age, race, disability, ethnicity, family or marital status, gender identity or expression, language, national origin, physical and mental ability, religion, sexual orientation, veteran status and other characteristics that make our citizens unique under the law;

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation is committed to fostering, cultivating and preserving a culture of inclusion, fairness and equality;

WHEREAS, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and two-spirit people are *ni'hookáá' diyin dine'é bíla' ashdla'ii*, who are five-fingered earth-surface holy people that are sacred;

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation stands behind LGBTQ+ members and will continue to uplift all people, both young and long-lived, in their pursuit of basic civil and human rights;

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation shall honor the diverse identities among the Navajo People, who are worthy of love, respect, and fairness under the law;

**WHEREAS**, the community-driven Diné Equality and Diné Pride organizations continue to promote the interests of all Indigenous LGBTQ+ peoples throughout the country;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, SETH DAMON,** Speaker of the Great Navajo Nation, do hereby proclaim June 22-28, 2020 as **Diné Pride Week** throughout the Navajo Nation upon approval of the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee and the 24th Navajo Nation Council.
