18	SECTION 1. AUTHORITIES	
19	A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
20	2 N.N.C. § 700(A). Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), a proposed resolution that requires	
21	final action by the Navajo Nation Council must be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee	
22	before it is considered by the Navajo Nation Council. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 701(A)(5),	
23	the committee oversees commissions under the legislative branch.	
24	B. The Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §972(A), confirms appointments to	
25	the Commission on Navajo Government Development.

27	SECTION 2. FINDINGS	
28	A. The Commission on Navajo Government Development consists of 12 Navajo	
29	members. Regarding appointments to this commission, Navajo Nation law mandates -	
30	"Commission members shall be chosen from among individuals who have demonstrated	

scholarship, a strong sense of public interest, knowledge of Navajo history and cultural heritage, spiritual leadership, leadership in the Navajo government and abilities likely to contribute to the fulfillment of the duties of the Commission." 2 N.N.C. § 972(D).

- B. Once appointed, members of the Commission on Navajo Government Development are confirmed by and serve at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A).
- C. Concerning nomination and qualifications for the Commission on Navajo Government Development, Navajo Nation law provides "One member shall be nominated by the Executive Branch through the President of the Navajo Nation to serve a term of two years from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council." 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(1).
- D. The President of the Navajo Nation nominates Mr. Robert K. Black, Jr. to serve on the Commission on Navajo Government Development as provided at 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(1). See **Exhibit A.** The nominee meets all the necessary qualifications to serve on the Commission. See **Exhibit B**, letter of interest/resume.

#### SECTION THREE. CONFIRMATION

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 972(A)(1), the Navajo Nation Council hereby confirms the nomination of Mr. Robert K. Black, Jr. to the Commission of Navajo Government Development as the Executive Branch representative. The term shall be served consistent with Navajo Nation law.


